#### THE PROPERTY:

The Rusco Ranch is a sprawling cow/calf or stocker operation located approximately 10 miles north of Keyes, Oklahoma. The northern boundary of most of the ranch is the state line, however some of the ranch is in Colorado. The ranch is contiguous except for a parcel divided by the county road. The Ranch has over ten miles of frontage on the Cimarron River, which runs west to east across the ranch. Rusco Ranch is made up of the following tracts:


#### **TERRAIN AND VEGTATION:**

As expected a ranch of this size has considerable variation in both terrain and vegetation. At the center of the ranch is the Cimarron River, running West to East and the ranch gently slopes from both North and South to the river at the center of the ranch. The terrain in general gently rolling, and the elevation for this area is 3,950 feet.

The Rucso Ranch has an excellent mixture of native grasses including: Big Bluestem, Blue Grama, Little Bluestem, Side-Oats Grama, Yellow Indian Grass, Buffalo Grass and the soils are sandy.

## **CARRYING CAPACITY:**

The ranch is currently under lease until October 31, 2018. The tenant has been operating the ranch for the past nine years. They are presently running 1,000 spring calving cows during the summer and winter 500 cows on the ranch.



#### WATER:

Rusco Ranch has over ten miles of frontage on the Cimarron River and livestock water is provided by eight Solar pumps, twenty two Windmills and three Submersible pumps. In addition there are seven Irrigation wells and Six center pivot Irrigation systems. There are 1,940 acre feet of Prior Water Rights registered with the Oklahoma Water Resources Board and the state of Oklahoma.

#### **MINERALS:**

7,990 NMA – Executory Rights; 1,660 Subject to ¼ NPRI (Royalty Only) All mineral rights convey to the buyer.

### WILDLIFE:

Mule Deer, Whitetail Deer, Elk, and Pronghorn Antelope are found on Rusco Ranch. There is great potential to develop the hunting on this ranch, with the habitat, river and number of acres under one fence.

# **BULIDINGS & IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT:**


The headquarters is modest but functional with one modern brick ranch style home, bunk house, horse barn and shop plus a set of steel corrals. There are another set of catch pens between Pivots #1 & #2, a small metal barn between Pivots #2 & #4, and a set of corrals at Pivot #6. There are also a set of shipping pens on the northeast side of the ranch.


There are approximately 975 acres under center pivot irrigation. Five of the pivots are newer Zimmatics and one is older, they are powered by Chevy engines running on propane.

The pivots are fenced out of the surrounding pastures. The fence on the ranch is good and in good repair.




