## KINGS TAKE

The Kayhi Kings returned this year to swim another victorious season. The first team to take both Southeast and State Championships three years in a row, Kayhi's swimmers have brought fear into the hearts of Northern lappers.

Sitka, the Kings closest rivals at Southeast, scored 217 points for their girls and 268 points for their boys, while Kayhi's boys scored 308 points and Kayhi's giris scored a splashing 342 points.

For the State Competition in Fairbanks, the girls team from Diamond came closest to the Kings with a score of 55 points to our girls 67 points. West Anchorage topped Kayhi's guys with a total of 62 points to our 45 points.

The 1979-80 school year was a busy and pleasant one for Kayhi musicians. In November, the largest contingent ever from our community travelled to Anchorage to perform in the Alaska State Honor Band, Orchestra and Choir. Twenty-five local musicians were selected, the largest number from any high school in Alaska, with Kayhi students earning eleven first and second chair positions. Among these were the first five trombonists in the group of nine selected by audition for the band. Another $31 \mathrm{mu}-$ sicians participated in the Southeast Honor Band and Choir in Petersburg.

In the spring, the Kayhi Concert Band, with help from the Freshman Band and choir members, raised over $\$ 10,000$, with their MARATHON ' 80 . The money was used for a concert tour of Washington and Oregon, a stop at Oregon State University and with concerts in the Portland and Seattle areas.

The Kayhi Jazz Ensemble was busy also, releasing their second recording (a double album containing music from their Monterey trip in 1978 and from concerts and Music Festival last year.), and being selected from among auditioning groups nationwide to perform for the National School Board Convention in San Francisco. They toured first with the Concert Band, then flew into Central California for several concerts before playing in front of about 10,000 people at the convention.

The Pep Band was active, as usual, performing for basketball games, pep assemblies and wrestling matches. In all, it was a very good year.
