Choosing a landscape expert

If you don't happen to have a personal connection to a landscape contractor, it may seem like a daunting task to find one who is a good fit to match your style, tastes, budget and time frame.

Where do you begin? First, ask around. Nearly 50% of landscape jobs come from referrals. If you see a friend or neighbor with a nice landscape, find out who helped them.

Make sure the landscaper you hire is qualified. Ask if they are certified by their state nursery association. If they aren't, they might not know the difference between a ligustrum and a camellia.

Another good bet that you're dealing with a true professional is that they will be licenced and insured.

Check out the work they have done, and not just recent jobs. You'll want to see how well their designs hold up over time as plants grow to maturity.

Most of all, find a landscape pro that inspires you. Your time and investment are worth it. And your yard will thank you.

Shrubs

A Sure Foundation

Shrubs are the backbone of the garden, the starting point for your landscape. Plant them as borders or hedges to define areas, as "foundation plants" to soften the transition from your home to the yard, or as specimens to be a focal point, the center of attention.

Shrubs can be evergreen or deciduous. Some are chosen for their foliage color and texture, others for their flowers or fruit. Some grow as tall as trees while others are groundcovers. Wise placement and use of shrubs can provide privacy, security, order, shade, wildlife habitat and stunning year-round beauty.

We have about 200 to choose from. Your shrub awaits.

Abelia

These mounding shrubs are easy to grow in sun or part shade. They need little more than an annual prune to keep them shaped nicely. Their white or pink flowers attract butterflies. Zone 5 \bigcirc





The smaller varieties are excellent as groundcovers and planting in masses or along borders. The 'Spartan' and 'Torulosa' varieties are taller; Junipers with the 'Torulosa' topping off at 20' Tall. These evergreen conifer shrubs don't need much maintenance and are hardy to at least Zone 5. \odot

Make sure you don't plant them too close together. Due to the fast growth, some folks prune them too aggresively. To keep its form in shape, selective winter pruning is recommended, but please don't stump-cut them...its just not necessary and it shortens its life span. O


Many of the most popular trees are produced by modern methods. Maples, Magnolias, and Crape Myrtles can be easily propagated asexually by rooting cuttings. In recent years, Maples in particular have most commonly been created in laboratories via tissue culture, allowing rapid development and trees that are exact genetic replicas.

But the oak has proven difficult to root, and so far impossible to reliably create via petri dishes. We grow all our oaks from acorns, which means no two trees are the same.


