An act to add Section 14632 to the Government Code, relating to the State Capitol.

## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2358, as amended, Hagman. State Capitol: Ronald Reagan Memorial. statue.

Existing law prescribes various duties for the Department of General Services in connection with development and maintenance of the park around the State Capitol Building.

This bill would authorize the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation, in consultation with the department and a specifically

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ereated committee Department of Finance, to-construct and maintain plan a memorial to statue of Ronald Reagan in the State Capitol Building Annex. It—The bill would require the Department of General Services and the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation to approve the design and any other aspect of the statue. The bill would require that the planning, construction, and maintenance of the memorial statue be funded with private donations through the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation. It—The bill would prohibit construction of the memorial statue until the Joint Committee on Rules has approved and adopted the plan for the statue, and the Joint Committee on Rules and the Department of Finance—has have determined that sufficient private funding is available to construct and maintain the—memorial statue.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 14632 is added to the Government Code, 2 to read:
- 14632. (a) The Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation
  may, in consultation with the department Department of Finance,
  plan-and construct a memorial to statue of Ronald Reagan in the
  State Capitol Building Annex.
  - (b) The Ronald Reagan Memorial Review Committee is hereby established and shall include as members all of the following:
  - (1) The director, or his or her designee.
- 10 (2) The State Historic Preservation Officer, or his or her 11 designee.
- 12 (3) A Member of the Assembly appointed by the Speaker of the 13 Assembly.
  - (4) A Member of the Senate appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules.
- (e) The committee shall consult with the Ronald Reagan
  Centennial Capitol Foundation to identify an appropriate location
  for the memorial in the State Capitol Building Annex and review
  a memorial design.

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- 21 (b) The department Department of Finance, in consultation with
- 22 the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation, shall
- 23 accomplish the following goals:

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(1) Review of the preliminary design plans to identify potential maintenance concerns.

- (2) Ensure Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12101 et seq.) compliance, and other safety concerns.
- (3) Review and approval of proper California Environmental Quality Act (Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code) documents prepared for work at the designated historic property.
- (4) Review of final construction documents to ensure that all requirements are met.
- (5) Prepare the right-of-entry permit outlining the final area of work, final construction documents, construction plans, the contractor hired to perform the work, insurance, bonding, provisions for damage to state property, and inspection requirements.
- (6) Prepare a maintenance agreement outlining the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation's responsibility for the long-term maintenance of the memorial statue due to aging, vandalism, or relocation.
- (7) Inspect the construction performed by the contractor selected by the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation.

(c) If the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation undertakes responsibility to construct a memorial statue under this section, it shall, in consultation with the department, establish a schedule for the design, construction, and dedication of the memorial statue, implement procedures to solicit designs for the memorial statue, devise a selection process for the choice of the design, and establish a program for the dedication of the memorial statue.

(d) The department and the Ronald Reagan-Memorial Review Committee Centennial Capitol Foundation shall approve the design and any other aspect of the memorial statue.

(e) If the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation undertakes responsibility to construct a memorial statue under this section, it shall not begin construction of the memorial statue until the Joint Committee on Rules has approved and adopted the plan for the statute, and only if the Joint Committee on Rules and the

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1 Department of Finance has have determined that sufficient private 2 funding is available to construct and maintain the memorial statue.

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4 (f) The planning, construction, and maintenance of the memorial statue shall be funded exclusively through private donations to the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation.

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8 (g) If the Ronald Reagan Centennial Capitol Foundation 9 undertakes responsibility to construct a-memorial statue under this 10 section, it shall sign a maintenance agreement with the state, as 11 created under paragraph (6) of subdivision-(d) (b), to maintain the 12 memorial statue with private contributions.
