## SCANLAN OF THE BARONY OF UPPER CONNELLO, CO. LIMERICK

The "Census" of Ireland in 1659 shows O Skanlane as one of the principal Irish names in the Barony of Connello, Co. Limerick, where it occurs 29 times.

MICHAEL SCANLAN, who would have been living there at that date, was father of,

CORNELIUS (also called Conor) SCANLAN, who would have been born c. 1665. He leased Curra Beg and Curra More, parish of Loughil and Tullaha, parish of Killagholehane, Co. Limerick, in 1703. He was described as "of Ballyknockane," parish of Ballingarry, Co. Limerick in 1723. In his will, proved at Limerick in 1728, he was described as "of Ballynoe," parish of Ballingarry. He had two sons.

- I. Michael, of Ballinaha, ancestor of the Ballinaha and Ballyknockane branch, see below.
- II. Matthew, of Ballynoe, and later of Duckstown, ancestor of the Scanlans of Ballylin, Brook Lodge and Gortnacreha, see later.

### *Scanlan of Ballinaha and Ballyknockane*

MICHAEL SCANLAN, described as of Ballinaha, parish of Ballingarry, in 1721, 1723 and 1740, also of Maine, parish of Mahoonagh, Co. Limerick, d. Feb. 1759, will dat. 23 Feb. 1757, proved 15 June 1759 Prerog. His will names his wife as Eleanor, and mentions a brother-in-law Daniel Lane (who was churchwarden at Ballingarry 1745-50). Eleanor, who is named in the parish register as the mother of the 2 youngest sons, appears to have been a second wife. The *Clare Journal* of 9 March 1809 gives her obituary: "at Athea, Co. Limerick aged 110, Mrs. Eleanor Scanlon mother of the late Batt. Scanlon Esq." This makes her birth year 1699 and she would have lived in three centuries, moreover, from the dates of her children, it appears to be correct! The fact that she is called the *mother of Bartholomew* implies she was *not* the mother of Cornelius or she would more likely have been described as the great-grandmother of Capt. Michael Scanlan of

Ballyknockane, the High Sheriff. Also the baptismal date of the eldest dau. Ellen indicates that *her* mother would have been born before 1699! However, the first wife, if indeed there were two, was *also* named Ellen as a deed of 25 March 1714 from John Pigott of Dublin to Michael Scanlan of Ballinaha names Michael's wife as Ellen and also his brother Matthew. Another deed from Michael of Ballinaha to his brother Matthew of Ballynoe in 1723 was witnessed by Cornelius of Ballynoe, presumably their father, and one Darby Scanlan of Ballynoe, who witnessed other deeds in the same year. Michael Scanlan had issue,

- I. Cornelius, of Ballinaha and Maine, see below.
- II. Ellen, bapt. 22 Feb. 1714 (Ballingarry); m. (set. dat. 24 Nov. 1730, her portion £600) Patrick Furnell, and had issue.
- III. Michael of Ballynakill, parish of Kilfinny, living 1762, will proved 1764, Limerick. He is probably the Michael Scanlan junior who m. Elizabeth Massy (Cloyne MLB 1740) and it would seem they must have been the parents of Eleanor Massy Scanlan who m. 23 April 1761 (Rathkeale) Edward Greatracks. He may have had other issue.
- IV. Honora, m. (set. dat. 25 June 1740, her portion £500) James O'Grady of Limerick, merchant, brother of Standish O'Grady of Cahir, and had issue.
- V. Bartholomew, of Feenagh, Co. Limerick, bapt. 24 Aug. 1730 (Ballingarry), will proved 15 June 1759 Prerog.
- VI. Daniel, bapt. 28 Jan. 1732 (Ballingarry), to whom his father left farms in Co. Kerry.

The eldest son,

CORNELIUS SCANLAN, of Ballinaha and Maine, d. Dec. 1761 (obit. 7 Jan. 1762 *Corke Journal*), his will, undated, was proved 4 Feb. 1762 Prerog., m. (set. dat. 14 Jan. 1740, the bride's portion £600) Mary, eldest dau. of Morgan O'Connell of Kilfinny, Co. Limerick, by Constance Peppard his wife, and had issue,

- I. Michael, of Ballinaha and Maine, see below.
- II. Morgan.
- III. Cornelius.
- IV. Constantia.
- V. Honora.
- VI. Ellen.
- VII. Mary, possibly the Mary Scanlan who m. 14 Sept. 1780 (St. Mary's, Limerick) James Gubbins.

All these children, except Michael, are stated to be under 21 in their father's will.

The eldest son,

MICHAEL SCANLAN, of Ballinaha and Maine, apparently b.c. 1740-1, d. 14 Feb. 1801 at Ballinaha, bur. Ballingarry, will proved 27 May 1801 Prerog; m. (set. dat. 9 June

1762) Elizabeth, eldest dau. of Francis Wheeler of Ballywire, Co. Tipperary. She d. 13 Jan. 1812 at her house in William St., Limerick, and was bur. 18 Jan. at Ballingarry. They had issue,

- I. Capt. Michael, of Ballyknockane, see below.
- II. Elizabeth, eldest dau., d. 4 Dec. 1844; m. 11 Jan. 1792 Hon. George Eyre Massy (3rd son of 2nd Baron Massy), b. 29 July 1772, d. Jan. 1842, and had issue.
- III. Constance, m. William Blacker Bennett and had issue. She was living a widow at Limerick 1832.
- IV. Mary, b. 1772, bur. 12 March 1822 aged 50 (Ballingarry); m. 30 June 1796 (Ballingarry) William Cox, and had issue.
- V. Martha Anne, m. 22 July 1800 (Ballingarry) Wade Foote junior of Kinsale, Co. Cork.
- VI. Connell, Lieut. in the Army, d. a prisoner of war at Bayonne, France, of wounds received at the battle of Vittoria (obit. *Limerick Chronicle* 16 Oct. 1813).
- VII. Charles.
- VIII. John.
- IX. Amy.
- X. Matthew, apparently the Matthew Scanlan of Ballinaha, obit. 10 June 1840 in *Kerry Evening Post*.
- XI. Frances, b. 1778, d. unm, bur. 15 Nov. 1868 aged 90 (Ballingarry).
- XII. Helena (Ellen), youngest dau., b. 1787, d. 16 Dec. 1801 aged 14 at William St., Limerick, bur. at Ballingarry.

A mss. list of unknown authorship found among family papers lists all the above children of Michael and Elizabeth Scanlan except Connell, who is possibly identifiable with Charles. No other evidence has been found naming Charles, John or Amy, and no copy of Michael's will is available.

The eldest son,

CAPT. MICHAEL SCANLAN, b. 1765, High Sheriff for Co. Limerick 1797, who built the present house at Ballyknockane for his residence in 1793-4, and d. 18 Sept. 1823 at the house of his brother-in-law, the Hon. G. E. Massy in George's St., Limerick, and was bur. 20 Sept. at Ballingarry. He m. 13 Jan. 1794 (Ballingarry) Frances, eldest dau. of Col. William Odell of The Grove, M.P., by Aphra Crone his wife (see *The Irish Ancestor* 1969, No. 2, p. 126). She was b. 1774 and d. at Kilbeg and was bur. 15 April 1848 aged 74 (Ballingarry), having had issue,

- I. Michael, bapt. 15 Oct. 1794 (Ballingarry), bur. 22 March 1856 (Ballingarry), described in the burial register as an idiot.
- II. Aphra, bapt. 20 Sept. 1795 (Ballingarry), m. 27 Oct. 1825 (Ballingarry) Richard Daxon, of Carrindotta, Co. Clare, and had issue.
- III. William Odell, bapt. 26 June 1797 (Ballingarry), d. Oct. 1797.
- IV. Elizabeth, bapt. 22 July 1798 (Ballingarry).
- V. William Odell, of Ballyknockane, see below.

- VI. John, bapt. 11 June 1801 (Ballingarry).
- VII. Hugh Wheeler, of Kilbeg, bapt. 20 July 1807 (Ballingarry) and bur. there 27 May 1848 aged 41; m. 14 May 1839 (Ballingarry) his 1st cousin Sarah Pierce, dau. of John Brown by Constance Odell his wife (bapt. 13 April 1806 at Ballingarry and bur. there 26 July 1888, having m. 2ndly . . . Gubbins), and had issue,
- (1) Michael Hugh Wheeler, b. 12 Aug. 1840, bapt. Nov. at Ballingarry; he lived at Kilbeg and was later a farmer at Rosehill, Douglas, Co. Cork, where he d. unm. 19 March 1910, will proved 30 April 1910.
  - (2) Frances Constance, b. 4 May 1844, bapt. 9 June (Ballingarry); m. 27 April 1876 (Ballingarry) Robert Wren, and had issue.
  - (3) John, b. 1846, bur. 25 Oct. 1863 aged 17 (Ballingarry).
  - (4) probably Sarah Pierce. A Sarah Pierce Scanlan of Kilbeg was bur. 7 April 1874 (Ballingarry) aged 16. It would appear that her age should have been 26 and she was a child of this family.
- VIII. Matthew, of Ballinaha and later of Montpelier, Co. Limerick, where he moved in a huff after a frightful row with his brothers over dowries, he and his two brothers having married three sisters who were their first cousins. He was bapt. 10 Dec. 1810 (Ballingarry), and d. 8 March 1872 at O'Brien's Bridge, will proved 26 March 1872; m. Meliora (Emily), dau. of John Brown by Constance Odell his wife, and had issue,
- (1) Constance Fennell, b. 27 July 1836, bapt. 10 Aug. (Ballingarry).
  - (2) Frances, b. 28 March, bapt. 11 April 1838 (Ballingarry), m. Godfrey Bateman, and had issue.
  - (3) Aphra, b. 28 Feb. 1840, bapt. 10 March (Ballingarry) and bur. there 15 Sept. 1842.
  - (4) Michael, b. 28 Oct. 1841, bapt. 13 Jan. 1842 (Ballingarry). In 1909 he had 2 daus. living, Carrie and Hettie Scanlan then residing at Apt. 40, 2836 Rhodes Av., Chicago, Ill.
  - (5) Aphra, b. 7 Jan. 1843, bapt. 1 March (Ballingarry), d. unm. 25 Jan. 1910 in Dublin, will proved 22 Feb. 1910.
  - (6) Mary Isma, d. unm. 7 Nov. 1916 at Monkstown, Co. Dublin, will proved 7 Jan. 1917.
  - (7) Matthew, who in 1909 (cf will of his sister Aphra) was living in Illinois, and had 4 children living.
  - (8) Richard, living 1909, and then had 4 children in Canada.
  - (9) Phoebe Wilhelmina, d. unm. at Kingstown, Co. Dublin, 15 April 1917, admon. 26 June 1917.
  - (10) Elizabeth Wheeler, d. unm. at Monkstown, Co. Dublin, 26 Nov. 1913, admon. with will 23 Jan. 1914.
- IX. Elizabeth Wheeler, b.c. 1814, of Kilbeg Cottage, where she d. unm. 28 Jan. 1897, bur. 27 Jan. (sic) aged 82 at Ballingarry. She was engaged to be married

- to a Brown cousin, but the wedding never took place. Augustin Edouart made their silhouettes as a pair in 1836, which are now in possession of Alicia Evers.
- X. Constance, bapt. 15 May 1818 (Ballingarry), d. in Dublin 1871 aged 52, m. her 1st cousin William Odell, of Dublin, barrister, b. 1812, d. 26 March 1872 and had issue (see *The Irish Ancestor* 1969, No. 2, p. 124).

The third son,

WILLIAM ODELL SCANLAN, of Ballyknockane, barrister, B.A., T.C.D. 1822, generally known as "Counsellor Scanlan," bapt. Aug. 1799 (Ballingarry), bur. 7 July 1859 (Mount Jerome, Dublin); m. (set. dat. 22 Sept. 1834) his 1st cousin Aphra, widow of James Fisher of Limerick, merchant (by whom she had had issue) and dau. of John Brown of Bridgetown, Co. Clare and Clonboy by his wife Constance Odell. Family tradition has it that they were childhood sweethearts but that their parents disapproved of the union: Aphra married James Fisher but the disappointed Counsellor did not marry, so that when Fisher died he and Aphra were eventually able to marry. They had issue.

- I. Michael, of Ballyknockane, b. 25 June 1835, d. 13 Oct. 1898, will proved 5 Dec. 1898, M.I. at Ballingarry; m. 1862 Hannah Jane (Nannie) Fisher, who d. 20 June 1895 (M.I. at Ballingarry). Their only child, a boy, was b. 8 Sept. 1865 and d. same day.
- II. John Brown, b. 20 Feb. 1838, bapt. 21 Feb. (Ballingarry), d. 24 May 1906 in U.S.A. He emigrated to U.S. and married but his wife and only son, a baby, died in an epidemic in Philadelphia.
- III. William, see below.
- IV. Frances, b. 20 Aug. 1836, m. (set. dat. 16 Aug. 1861, her portion £500) Richard Burris, of Ballintemple, Co. Offaly.
- V. Hugh Francis Wheeler, b. 21 Oct. 1841, bapt. 19 Dec. (Ballingarry); m. 21 Oct. 1865 Elizabeth, dau. of Capt. Joseph Dexter, of Ahanagran House, Ballylongford, Co. Kerry. They emigrated to the U.S. where he d. at St. Augustine, Florida, 14 June 1920. She d. 26 July 1931, having had issue an only dau. b. 1866, who d. aged 6 months.
- VI. Matthew, b. 11 Feb. 1843, bapt. 11 March (Ballingarry), emigrated to Australia.
- VII. James Fisher, b. 10 July 1844, bapt. 28 July (Ballingarry), emigrated to Australia.
- VIII. Rev. Thomas Richard, b. 13 March 1847, bapt. 2 May (Ballingarry), curate of Greyabbey, Co. Down 1871-2, Rector of Ardglass 1872-80, of Loughguile 1880-92 and of Annaclone 1892-1902. Author of *The Call of St. Edward*, 1903. He d. 25 March 1915; m. 27 Feb. 1878 (Ballycolter, Co. Down) Georgina, youngest dau. of William W. Thetford, M.D. of Strangford.

The third son,

WILLIAM SCANLAN, b. 20 July 1839, bapt. 2 Aug. (Ballingarry); m. (in a double ceremony) 21 Oct. 1865 Alicia, dau. of Capt. Joseph Dexter of Ahanagran House, Ballylongford, Co. Kerry, by his wife Maria Wren of Litter. They emigrated to the U.S. where he d. at Turner's Falls, Mass. 27 Sept. 1888. His wife, who was b. 29 Dec. 1845 and d. at

Boston, Mass. 13 Jan 1940 in her 95th year, managed the Ballyknockane estate after the death of her son William in 1909 until 1920 when it was sold by her son John Brown Scanlan, and passed out of the family, at which time she returned to the U.S. They had issue,

- I. William Leslie, of Ballyknockane, J.P., b. 25 April 1867 at Greenfield, Mass. He returned to Ireland in the 1890's and inherited Ballyknockane on the death of his uncle Michael, but d.s.p. at New Milton, Brockenhurst, Hants. 24 May 1909.
- II. George Joseph, b. 10 Dec. 1869 at Greenfield, d. at Turner's Falls, Mass. 6 June 1959; m. (1) Katharine, dau. of Patrick Dunn of Turner's Falls; she d. June 1891, having had an only child,
  - Beatrice Mary, b. at New York 3 Dec. 1890, d. 18 June 1929, bur. at Northampton, Mass. She spent part of her childhood at Ballyknockane with her uncle William. She m. (1) Norman Leonardi, from whom she obtained a divorce having had issue by him a son Norman Leslie Leonardi, b. at St. Augustine 8 Nov. 1908, living unm. 1972, and a dau. Eileen Mary, b. at St. Augustine 7 Oct. 1909 who m. (1) her cousin William Leslie Evers (see below) from whom she obtained a divorce, and (2) 24 Dec. 1949 Ralph C. Emerson of Medford, Mass. Beatrice Mary m. (2) Orrie Burt Miller, from whom she obtained a divorce, having had issue by him an only son, George Burt Miller, b. at St. Augustine 10 Dec. 1925, d.s.p. Nov. 1945, and she m. (3) James B. O'Neill, but had no further issue.He m. (2) Katherine McInerney of Springfield, Mass., but had no further issue.
- III. John Brown, b. at Greenfield 8 Feb. 1874, and d. at Turner's Falls 23 Dec. 1945. He inherited Ballyknockane on the death of his brother William in 1909, but came there for the first time in 1919, and sold that property and Kilbeg the following year when he returned to the U.S. He m. Mary, dau. of Luke and Bridget Powers of Bay State, Northampton, Mass., who d. 17 April 1935, and had issue,

- (1) Alicia Esther Evers, b. at Brooklyn, N.Y. 27 Oct. 1898, living at Rockport, Mass., 1972, co-compiler of this lineage. She resided at Ballyknockane from 1905 to 1920.
  - (2) William Leslie Evers, b. at Brooklyn 5 July 1901; m. his 1st cousin once removed Eileen Mary, dau. of Norman Leonardi by Beatrice M. Scanlan (see above), later divorced, and had issue an only dau. Ester, b. at Baltimore, Maryland, 20 Oct. 1935 who m. (1) James Spencer (from whom she obtained a divorce) having issue William James Spencer b. at Boston, Mass., 15 Oct. 1955; Michael Emerson Spencer b. at Boston 8 Jan. 1958 and Judith Ann Spencer, b. at Phoenix, Arizona 15 Sept. 1961. Ester m. (2) Bill McManis and has further issue, Bill McManis junr., b. at Phoenix 23 Jan. 1964, and Jacque Elizabeth McManis, b. at Phoenix 22 Feb. 1969.
- V. Aphra Marie, b. at Turner's Falls 24 Nov. 1882, living at Melbourne, Florida, 1972; m. (1) Truman Lynn, of St. Augustine, who d. 10 Feb. 1909, and has issue,

MICHAEL SCANLAN, of Ballylin, parish of Croagh, will dat. 15 April 1767, proved 24 April 1775 Prerog., m. (Rathkeale) 30 July 1753 Ellen or Elcanor Lane, and had issue (named in his will).

MATTHEW LANE SCANLAN, of Duckstown and later of Ballylin, will proved 1803 Prerog., m. at Croagh (announcement in *Dublin Hibernian Journal* 27 Jan. 1773) Elizabeth Fitzgibbon. By deed dat. 9 Oct. 1777 they agreed "to separate and live asunder because of controversies, disputes and disagreements for some time past." £113-15-0 p.a. was settled on Elizabeth and their 2 sons, who were committed to her care by the separation settlement, of which Gibbon Fitzgibbon of Ballysheeda, Co. Limerick was trustee. She d. 17 May 1815 having had issue,

- II. Thomas, who follows.

THOMAS SCANLAN, of Brook Lodge, b. 1776, bur. 20 Aug. 1822 aged 46 (Ballingarry); m. (set. dat. 20 May 1797) Bridget, 2nd dau. of Philip Nunan of Moyge, parish of Liscarroll, Co. Cork, whose dowry was £20,000! She d. June 1817 (obit. 20 June *Cork Mercantile Chronicle*). They had issue,

- I. Matthew Lane, eldest son, described as "now or late of Brook Lodge" in 1829. The *Kerry Evening Post* of 13 April 1833 reports the deaths of "Thomas Drummond and Anna Leake, children of M. L. Scanlan Esq., Co. Limerick."

- V. Thomas, bapt. 23 April 1809 (Kilmeedy), b. at Gortnacreha parish of Cloncagh; probably the Thomas Scanlan of Craig Cottage, bur. 5 March 1859 (Ballingarry) aged 55 (sic).
- VI. Hayes, bapt. 4 April 1813 (Kilmeedy), b. at Gortnacreha.
- VII. John, bapt. 7 Jan. 1815 (Kilmeedy), b. at Gortnacreha 28 Dec. 1814; m. at Walcot near Bath, Somerset, 4 May 1840 as "John Fitzgibbon Scanlan Esq. of Limerick son of Michael (sic) Scanlan Esq." to Rebekah Elizabeth Massey, dau. of Hugh Wheeler, (then of 8 Burlington St., Walcot) who d. a widow at 8 Burlington St., 15 Sept. 1863, apparently s.p., as by her will dat. 16 Aug. 1862, pd. 9 Oct. 1863, she devised her estate to her brother and nephew.

At the time of the trial it was said that the murderer, who had seduced and eloped with the young lady, was connected to the principal gentry of the county.

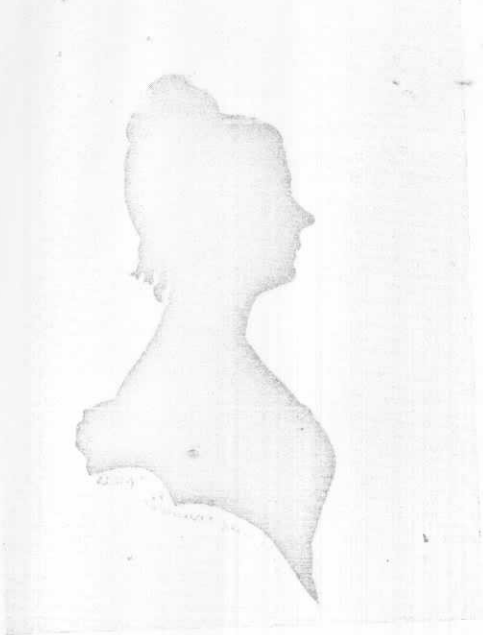

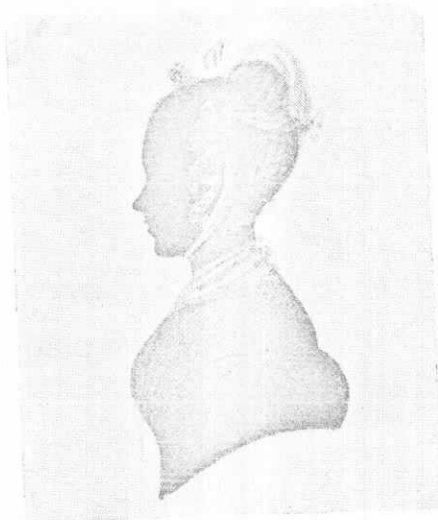

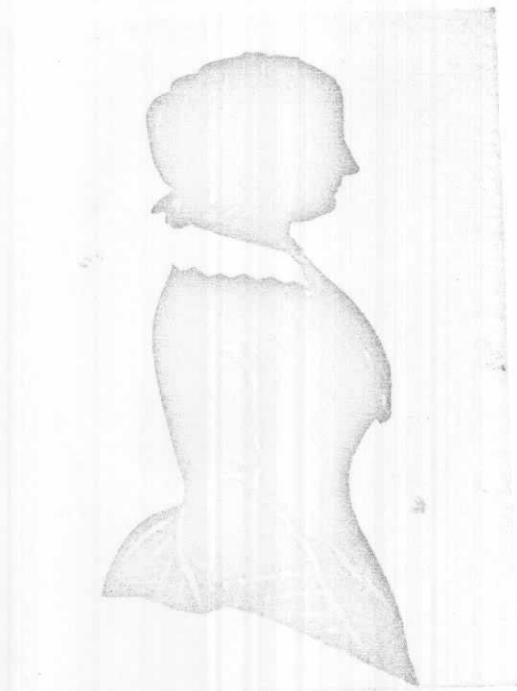
*Elizabeth Wheeler Scanlan (1815-1897).

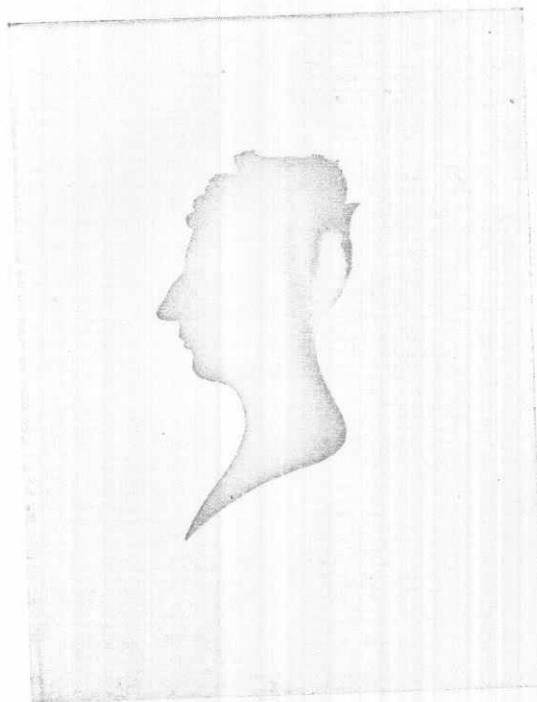
*Constance (1818-1871), dau. of Capt.

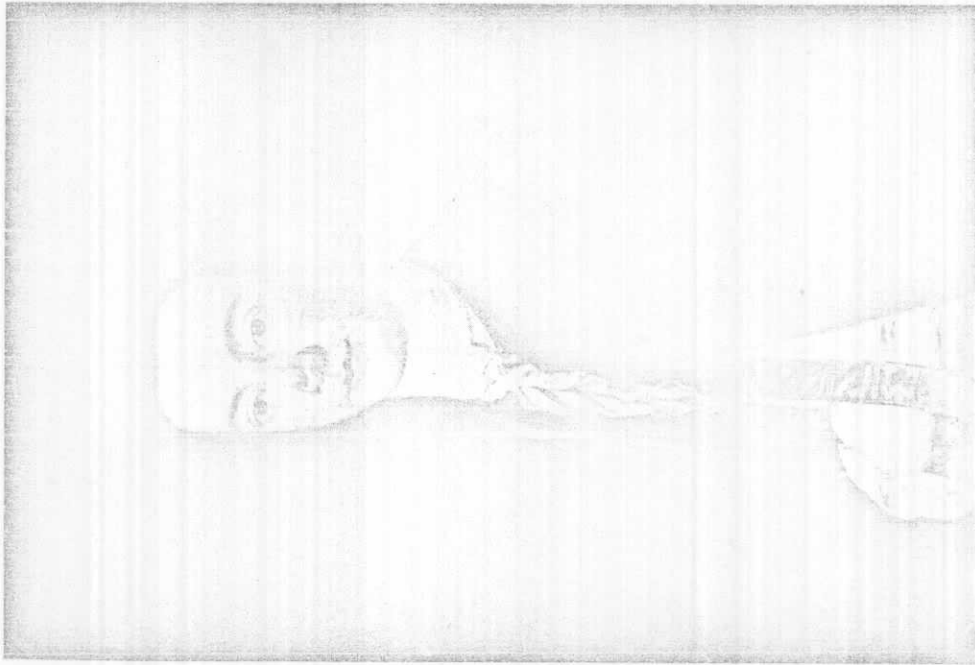
*Frances (1774-1848), eldest dau. of Col.

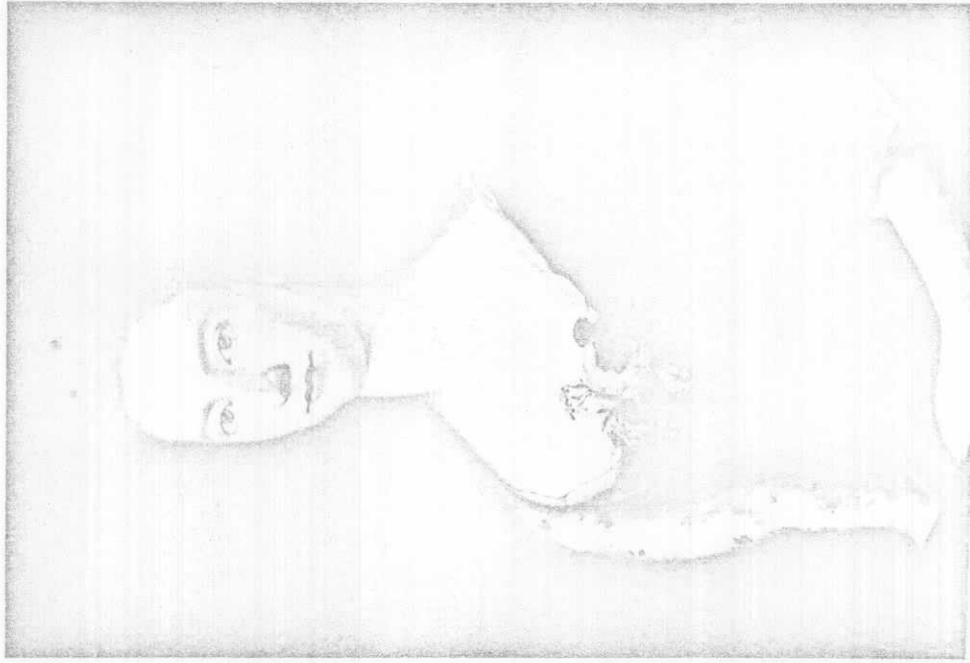


*Sarah Pierce (1806-1888), dau. of Capt. John

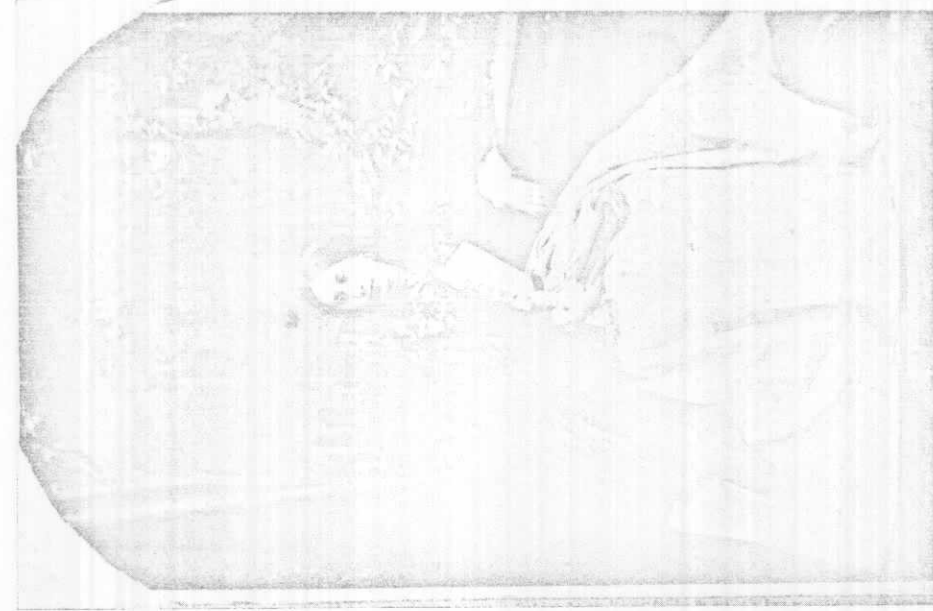

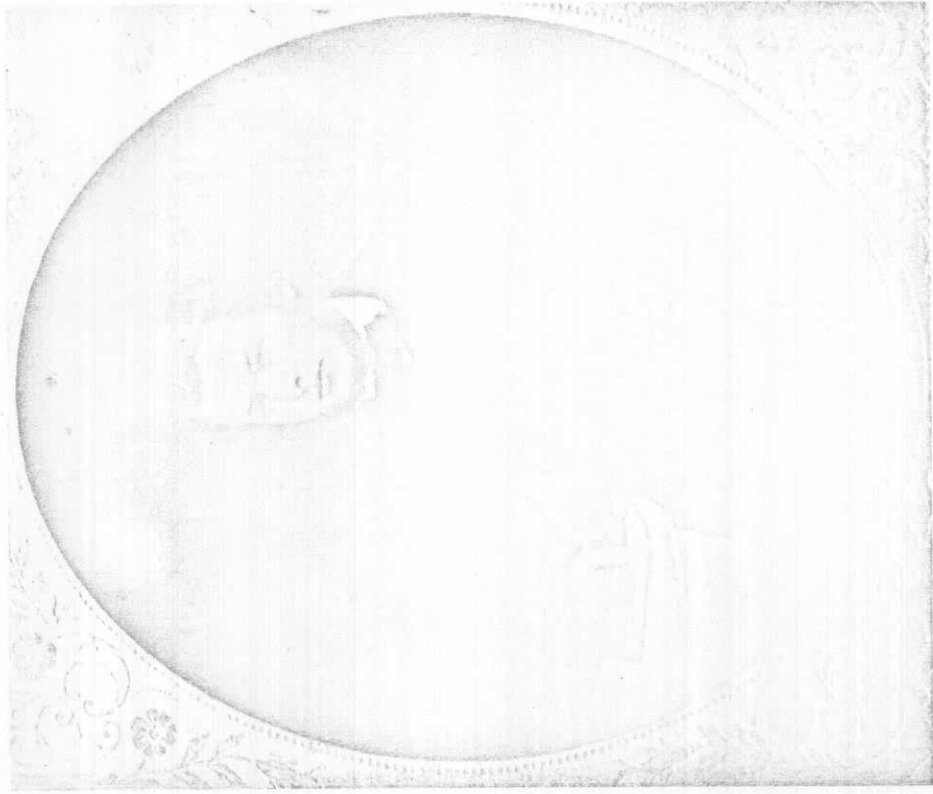
