

Farm Income Here Is High

In Spite of Size This State Is National Agricultural Top

Third from the bottom in land area, Connecticut is at the top when it comes to dollar value of its agricultural enterprises. Recent figures show that this state ranked second among all 48 states in dollar value of its farm production per acre. The total farm income averaged \$112 per acre, compared with \$65 per acre in Iowa and \$11 in Texas, two giants in agricultural production.

Because Connecticut ranks forty-sixth among the states in area and has a population of 2,000,000, the importance of its agriculture is sometimes overlooked. Actually, there are 90,000 people in the families who carry on the Nutmeg State's farming operations, and their annual production amounts to a value of \$180,000,000. All Connecticut counties at various times have ranked among the top 100 in the nation in agricultural achievements.

Connecticut contains within its borders 22,000 farms, whose total value in land, buildings, and livestock is estimated to be nearly \$75,000,000, equivalent to a \$187 interest in agricultural production for each of the 2,000,000 persons living in the state. Pride of ownership is strong among Connecticut farmers. The last census indicated that 84 per cent of them owned their farms and only seven per cent were tenants. In Minnesota, only 55 per cent of the farmers were owners while 22 per cent were tenants.

Connecticut dairy products are worth \$50 million yearly. Few states exceed Connecticut's average annual production of nearly 6,000 pounds of milk per cow, a figure almost 1,000 pounds greater than the national average.

Poultry Farms
The products of poultry farms are valued annually at between \$45 and \$50 million. Over 100 hatcheries produce each year some 35 million chicks that are shipped to new homes all over the country and abroad. Connecticut's poultrymen produce about 1,000,000 and 2,000,000 layers each year. Their average annual production is 335 eggs per bird, substantially above the national average of 165 eggs.

In broiler production, two counties, Windham and New London, have become known as the "Turkey Capital of the World." The value of turkey production is valued at \$13 to \$14 million. This state's most important agricultural enterprises is the production of apples, peaches, strawberries and blueberries. Ranking third in dollar value among the state's agricultural commodities is the production of the apple, which is valued at approximately \$9,000,000. Potatoes, \$6 million, and fruit, \$4 million.

Concerns Given Time To Control Pollution

Local Firms Have 30 Days to Take Steps to Abate Conditions in Area

Three Manchester concerns were given 30 days in which to start definite steps for the abatement of pollution on Lyall brook and the Hookanum river yesterday as the State Water Commission held a hearing in Hartford, in an effort to find ways to correct the local pollution conditions, complained of over a period of many years.

Director Richard Martin of the commission said that the Colonial board company, Lyall and Foulds, Cas Brothers, Bagge products manufacturers, were not able to represent in regard to stream pollution, but he said, the local concerns are fortunate in being located on small streams where the effects of industrial waste damage are most apparent.

Martin said that factories located on large bodies of water often "get away with" a minimum primary treatment of effluent which much more often has to be done on smaller streams. In this connection he also mentioned a domestic sewage treatment which has been found on a point located at a city, located on a large river, might dispose of sewage with only primary treatment.

Manchester, located on a smaller stream, will eventually be forced to do the additional cost of secondary treatment.

Town is Represented
Besides the three local firms called officially to the hearing, the representatives were present as were the Town of Manchester by General Manager George H. Waddell, the Manchester Improvement Association by Walter Hibbard, and area citizens George Lyall, Helen Pittsford and Helen Pittsford.

Director Martin stated his belief that the town's sewage disposal plant is now working at capacity. The town's South End disposal plant is being overhauled and within a short time additional disposal means must be found. There were overtones at the hearing which indicated that the town's problem will be next on the state list for correction.

Demand Prompt Action
The hearing was called by Director Martin said, in an effort to clear up the situation on Lyall brook, demanded particularly offensive, and on the south branch of the Hookanum river in Manchester. It was pointed out that particularly in the case of the Lyall brook, complaint has been long standing and vehement, and that the growth and demand, and residential factors demand prompt action to eliminate the condition.

The state recognized the engineering problems involved in the Lyall brook, but wanted a definite immediate start made that would be carried through to completion to abate the pollution and clean up the water and the air in the brook and the Union Pond neighborhoods.

More Time Needed
A. The hearing progressed and 30 days was mentioned as a limiting time in which to make a start. Attorney Raymond A. Johnson for Lyall and Foulds and Colonial Board stated that while he had not been engaged in the matter, he was of the opinion more time might be necessary in the preliminary stage. Accompanying engineers said they thought that before a definite plan could be presented, several months might pass.

General Manager Waddell stated that he also thought the problem might take time to solve, and he asked that full time be taken for that the town could study its problem of sewage disposal in connection with the local paper plants. He said that perhaps 30 months might be necessary.

The state, agreeing that complete details might take long to draft, held that a month was sufficient time in which to take the wheels moving and to show definite progress. Director Martin also stated that the problem of the mills is in no way connected with the town's disposal problem, which, he said, would be taken up separately. He said he could not see where the private and municipal disposal matters are any close relation. After the tributory streams are cleared up, Martin said, then the main Hookanum pollution problem posed by Manchester and Hookanum municipal sewage will be investigated.

Attorney George C. Leazer, for the Rogers corporation, said he was anxious to see the Lyall brook situation cleared up as soon as the firm be represented formally.

Couple Shot In Florida

Fort Lauderdale, Fla., May 25 — A Pennsylvania coal mine operator and his wife were in Broward General hospital today, both shot twice in the abdomen with the same weapon.

Police Lt. J. Lester Holt identified them as Pearson B. Brown, 37-year-old retired army colonel, and his wife, Blanche, 51. The Browns are part owners of a coal mine at Somerset, Pa.

The hospital listed Brown's condition as satisfactory early today. Mrs. Brown's condition was described as fair.

Holt said notes in Mrs. Brown's handwriting indicated she planned the shooting. He said she was "Shot at Point Blank Range."

He said Brown was shot twice in the abdomen but dragged himself to the telephone and dialed police. As he did so, Holt continued, Mrs. Brown went into the kitchen and shot herself twice.

The notes gave instructions for disposal of their house and furnishings and care of the pet dog. They also asked that relatives in Georgia and Washington, D. C., be notified.

Holt said both were shot at point blank range and the slugs passed through their bodies. Brown had just finished shaving when it was reported that the shooting occurred yesterday.

Convict Five In Riot Case

CIO Members Guilty Of Violence in Strike At Bell Aircraft Co.

Lockport, N. Y., May 25 — Five CIO union members have been convicted on charges resulting from violence that broke out during a strike against Bell Aircraft Corp.

Eight other union members were acquitted by the Niagara County Court jury that returned its verdict late last night.

The 13 had been charged with riot and conspiracy. Those convicted included two regional officials of the CIO United Auto Workers Union.

Martin Gerber, 33, of Elizabeth, N. J., regional director of UAW district 4, and Edward F. Gray, 33, of Buffalo, sub-regional director, were found guilty of conspiracy, a misdemeanor. The maximum penalty is a year in prison and a \$500 fine. They were acquitted on the riot charge.

Joseph Ippolito, 21, and Joseph R. Biscione, 41, both of Buffalo, were found guilty of riot, but acquitted on the conspiracy charge. The riot charge, a felony, carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$1,000 fine. Judge John E. Marsh set Monday for sentencing. He was to hear today defense arguments to set aside the jury verdict.

Biscione is a member of UAW Local 501, which called the strike at the gates of the Bell Plant Sept. 7. A number of non-strikers and strikers were injured. The trial began four weeks ago today. The case went to the jury Monday night.
