Andover Meeting Hears Consultants, Region Board Action Pends

Andover, June 28 (Special)—The regional school board meeting in Marlborough last night was addressed by Donald Mitchell, director of the Division of Field Service and Research in the School of Education at Rutgers, and Cyril G. Sargent, a professor at Harvard, who operate as a team of educational consultants. However, the meeting did not vote to employ the services.

Chasnow to Quit U.S. Post for Law

Washington, June 28 (AP)—Abram Chasnow, dismissed from his civilian Navy job last week, has been charged with leaving the Navy now.

The Navy disclosed yesterday that it has abolished Chasnow's job as director of the Distribution Control Office of the Hydrographic Office and has offered him a two-year post at the same \$2,500 a year salary.

Chasnow had agreed with the Navy that the job should be abolished and he preferred to leave with more than 25 years' service under Civil Service retirement law. He estimated he will get a pension of about \$1,500 a year.

He has maintained law offices here and in Greenbelt, Md., and now plans to devote his full time to law practice.

Chasnow was dismissed a year ago last spring. Details of charges against him never were made public. But Chasnow, a 46-year-old Jew, said he suspected anti-Semitism had something to do with it.

He fought his case through the press and with appeals to Congress. He was released to his job last September. It is not known then that informants who gave secret testimony against him had done a disservice to the country.

West Disarmament Held Soviet Policy Shift Aim

Washington, June 28 (AP)—Guessing why the Russians have changed from growl to grin has become a kind of international pastime game which anyone can play, with or without facts. A little wifely thinking helps.

Latest guesser is Gen. Carlos P. Romulo of the Philippines. At the United Nations anniversary in San Francisco last week, during a television interview, he said: "The Kremlin leaders are having trouble among themselves and want a breather."

"There's Been No Break-up"

This was hardly an original contribution. It's a guess that's made wherever there's a major change in Moscow, like the demolition of Gueorgi Malenkov from the premier's job. There has been no evidence to support it, then or later. There's been no break-up.

The Russians themselves have given a more plausible reason, without saying so, for their sudden air of sweet reasonableness. Their foreign minister, V. M. Molotov, pointed it out again in San Francisco.

The Russians want the West to disarm.

For years in one way or another, mostly a tough way, they have desperately tried to break up the western alliance, prevent West Germany's rearmament, and discourage the building of American airbases in friendly countries around Russia.

They failed in all three. The last great hope they had was to keep West Germany disarmed, and the Russians changed their attitude. They were pleasant ever since. Nothing more could be accomplished by threats or toughness. They couldn't live with a Soviet in the neighborhood. They might accomplish more with sounds of peace than they ever achieved with both.
