Public Spotlight Turned On Alleged Reds' Trial

New Haven, Oct. 14 (AP)—A town of 10,000 people where the public spotlight has been turned on a trial which will get a lot of public attention here today.

Seven men and one woman are charged with conspiracy to teach or advocate the overthrow of the government by force.

The trial follows 18 months of legal moves, the latest an injunction sought by the defendants to be tried by court rather than a jury.

Here are some facts about some of the people concerned in the trial, the judge, the prosecutor, and the defense attorneys.

U.S. District Judge Robert F. Anderson, 49, was faced with the case about a month after his appointment by President Eisenhower. Over six feet tall, graying at the temples, Anderson has an easy-going manner. A native of Connecticut, he lives in Middletown with his wife, the former Elizabeth Pittard. He has one son in Yale, another at Harvard.

Anderson himself graduated from Yale College and Yale Law School. He became a federal judge less than a year after he was named to the Superior Court bench.

A former state senator, Anderson served as a lieutenant colonel in the second world war. He won the Bronze Star and the order of the British Empire for service in the Mediterranean theater.

When retired Connecticut Superior Court Justice Christopher J. Avery administered the oath as a federal judge, he described Anderson as "a man of character, and of honor."

Before his appointment to the Superior Court, Anderson was state attorney in New London County.

When he was asked why he preferred the federal court, at the time he was appointed, Anderson made this comment: "The enjoyed going around from court to court, the Superior Court is a circuit court, but after a time this business of living out of an suitcase can become tiring. The fact that a federal clerk has his own court, his own library, his own staff and his own clerk is attractive."

ANPA Official Hits Cost Hike For Newsprint

New York, Oct. 14 (AP)—If newsprint prices are raised, it could result in the closing of some American newspapers and the improvement of others, Cranston Williams, general manager of the American Newspaper Publishers Assn., said today.

Williams, in a statement on behalf of the organization representing more than 500 daily newspapers in the United States, and Canada, called upon publishers to protest to their suppliers any rise in the price of newsprint on the gray market.

Last week, Sir Eric Bowater, chairman of the Bowater Paper Corp. Ltd., one of the world's greatest newsprint manufacturers, predicted a rise in the price of newsprint production had risen appreciably and "we can't continue to absorb these mounting costs." He had noted that the general price of newsprint had not been raised since the middle of 1952.

Williams declared that any increase in newsprint now being enjoyed by newspaper publishers is unprecedented in the history of the industry. He said that American newspaper production costs in recent years have far outdistanced receipts from advertising and circulation.

One of the other two publishers, privately retained by the defendants, is Miss Catherine G. Rosbach of New Haven.

She is a niece of the late J. Henry Rosbach, long-time Republican leader in Connecticut politics.

Frank Donner of Stamford is the other privately retained attorney. He is a graduate of Clark's Law School and practiced law in New York City.

On the first ballot each member nation had three votes because there were three vacancies on the Council. Poland got 34 and the Philippines 33.

On succeeding ballots each country had only one vote. A two-thirds total of four votes was necessary for election.

The Philippines received 30 on the second ballot and Poland 29. On the third, the Philippines climbed to 33—one short of election—and Poland to 34.

On the fourth, the vote was 36 for the Philippines and 20 for Poland with two invalid ballots cast.

During the recess, the Soviet bloc delegates were reported to be feeling out others on the possibility of withdrawing to Yugoslav communist candidates.

This was borne out on the first ballot after the recess, which virtually eliminated Poland. The vote got 30 votes for the Philippines, the fifth and Yugoslavia got 28. Poland got only one vote.

Word spread that in the event of a deadlock, the vote might be split between the Yugoslav and the Polish bloc.

Russia and Poland had depicted the contest as a test of the "Eastern spirit" and warned that defeat of Poland would endanger the newly developing "East-West harmony."

"Agreement" An issue between the Communist states has been charged by backing an Asian state. The United States and the United Kingdom have backed an agreement of London big power agreement of 1948 allocating an equal number of seats to the Eastern European, the United States and the United Kingdom.
