APRIL SCHOLARSHIP MEETING Linda Happel

Columbia College Scholarship Report

Our Scholarship recipient this year is Jon Handrock. He was selected by the membership at our March meeting. Jon is a 57 year old Columbia College student majoring in art. He has maintained a 4.0 grade point and is currently enrolled full time. Jon is married and has two children living at home. He wrote the following regarding his Educational Objectives:

"My educational objective when I applied to Columbia was to earn enough credits to fulfill requirements for my California State Water Control Board Grade II Waste Water Treatment Plant Operators Certificate of Compliance. I have my Grade I Operators Certificate and subsequently passed the state test for my Grade II but have been unable to accumulate the work hours needed to obtain the Grade II. That is what I intended when I started at Columbia but the class I needed wasn't offered the summer I started."

"Over the past two semesters, I was exposed to Political Science, American History, Art History, Humanities, Psychology, Life Drawing and Sculpting. In every class, I found myself enthralled with new and stimulating ideas and information. I also found within myself talents and abilities I never knew I had. I see how education can transform lives. With that insight I have decided to pursue a teaching degree."

As a beginning art student, he had found his own style and love of all arts. I was impressed with his enthusiasm and drive to succeed. It is difficult and courageous to start a new life at age 57 but something we can all take a lesson from. It is never too late to start something new!

This week I received the following letter from Jon: "I want to thank you and the Mother Lode Art Association for allowing me to share my work and acknowledging me with the award of your scholarship. The day I received your letter couldn't have had better timing. I am sure you are aware of how life has those moments when you know that someone is watching out for you. As I read your letter, I did an undignified dance around the living room accompanied by a few whoops and yells. The news couldn't have come at a better time! As I said during the interview, this money will make it possible for me to continue my education and achieve my artistic aspirations."

I believe this says it all. My heart swelled to know that we had helped a dedicated student continue towards his life goal. Thanks to you members who helped pick our winner this year. I hope that you feel as proud as I do that the Mother Lode Art Association has continued to support blooming artists with our MLAA Scholarships.

Donald Hukari

Don Hukari will demonstrate his serigraph techniques on Monday, May 20th from 2 pm to 3 pm. Demonstration will include stencil techniques (photographic, hand-cut, torn paper and glue tusche) and finish with the printing of a simple paper print. Hukari will have sample prints to show and Town Hall Arts Galerie Copper will be showing his framed serigraphs.

For Don, the silkscreen media offers a large brush to simplify the fast-paced world of details in which we live. Working in series of fewer than 100, plus monoprints and proofs, Don has developed a varied body of work. Every print is hand printed by the artist and is unique with subtle variations in transparent colors.

Don Hukari's serigraphs are often loose, free-color pieces like his Sunset print, which is the 2007 calendar print, a 30 year tradition. Other pieces can be hard edged contemporary graphics or manipulated photographs. Honors include awards at local shows including the Mother Lode Fair and Calaveras County Fair. His Yosemite Renaissance serigraph was selected by Yosemite Association for their poster calendar, Clavey published for Confluence was Tuolumne River promotions and Pinecrest was adopted by the US Forest Service for development programs. Don was born in Hood River, Oregon. He completed his BS in Industrial

Design at San Jose State University and moved to Sonora in 1974, opening a commercial graphic design studio in the Bradford Building in downtown in 1978. In 1988, Hukari Designs began publishing the Central Sierra Seasons Magazine. Don now does his art and commercial design from his home studio on Yosemite Road near Sonora.
