

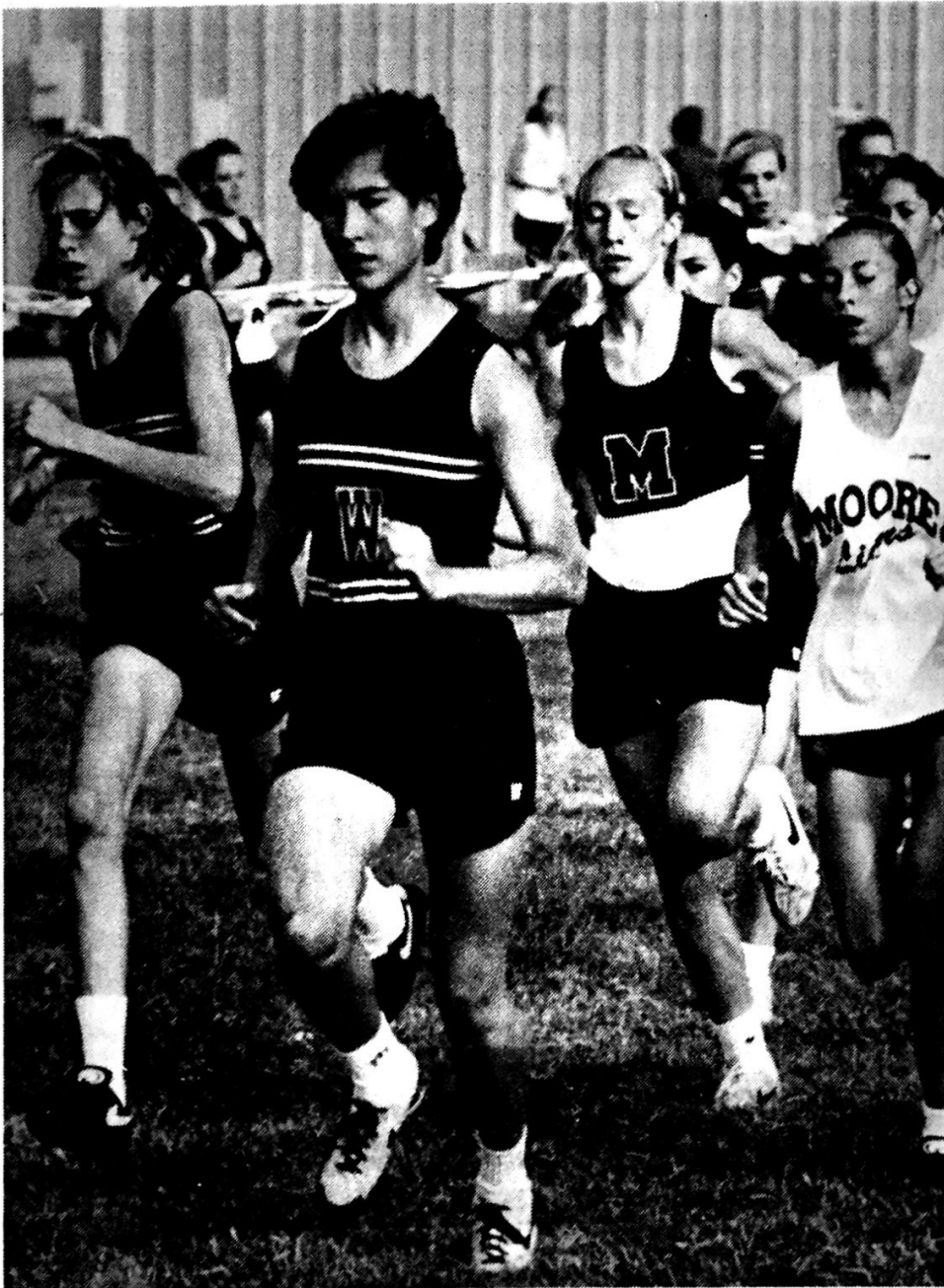

1997 Cross Country Mid-Season Review

The 1997 season has passed the half way mark and there are only five weeks remaining until the state meet November 1st on the Oral Roberts University course in Tulsa. There have been several shifts throughout the rankings, with the top spots in 5A showing new faces as Sapulpa steps up in the girls and Moore takes over the boys.

The Chieftans knocked off struggling defending champion Westmoore at the OBU meet the 23rd while the Lions won over previous No. 1 Bartlesville at Ponca City and No. 2 Edmond Memorial at Western Heights.

With Sapulpa girls the only undefeated 5A team, McGuinness still has a strong hold on both spots in 4A and neither of the Irish teams have been beaten yet in Oklahoma. They travelled to Dallas to compete in the tough SMU Invitational and came away with two individual wins and a second and third place team finish over some of the toughest teams in Texas. It would be nice to see an Oklahoma showdown at the Cowboy Jamboree Oct. 4th in Stillwater but, at this point, the new format has 4A and 5A scoring separated though in the same race. However, both the Chieftans and Irish are scheduled to be at the Chile Pepper in Fayetteville, Arkansas, Oct. 18th, so we should be able to get another chance for a heads up encounter between the state's top teams.

Marlow is still dominating 3A girls, remaining undefeated in Oklahoma but finishing well behind the Irish at SMU and only one place ahead of the rapidly improving Lexington girls. The defending state champion Bulldogs returned to the top of the 2A girls heap with a convincing win over Plainview at the OBU meet.

Defending 3A boys champ, Elk City, still has control but Anadarko has been moving up the ranks. In the 2A boys race, defending champ Dickson still gets the nod for the No. 1 spot but it's only because they haven't gone heads up with a very strong Prague team since the first meet of the season.

Class A, only in its second year, is getting deeper and stronger with every week. The Velma-Alma girls are still dominating the class but are certainly not as invincible as they have been in the past. The same could probably be said in the boys division as well, with Hydro still at No. 1 but looking over their shoulders at

On Track

Cross country season is just about at the half-way point and there are some great meets on the horizon. I'm getting a little more cooperation on results but I'm still not satisfied with the number of meets that don't bother to keep names and times or simply don't send the results. The only way this is going to change is if coaches make an issue out of seeing that results are properly tabulated and submitted to us for publication.

I've been getting a few more calls on rankings this year and I must say that I really appreciate the input--even if it points out mistakes I've made. My goal is to give every runner a chance at the recognition they deserve and I'm not immune to making mistakes. So, don't hesitate to call if you've got some information I might need, or even if you just want to know how it's done. By far, the most common call is to inquire about an absence from the rankings, which is usually a result of not having received the meet results.

Team rankings are being released weekly to the state newspapers and individual rankings every two weeks. If your local paper is not using them, ask them to contact *Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS* to be put on our FAX list.

The OSSAA is going to try to implement admission charges at the regional and state meets again this year, after failing to get a satisfactory system in place last year. Cross country is one of the only sports that does not produce income for the OSSAA and it has to make up the deficit through entry fees, in order to pay for awards, officials and other expenses. So, please make an effort to cooperate, even though it may hurt a little in our pocketbooks, it is ultimately going to benefit our athletes.

So far, this year has started out just as bad as last year ended with the U.S. Postal Service's delivery of *OT&FN*. We do our best to get the issue in the mail on or before the cover date and Oklahoma subscribers should have it in their hands in three to five days. Unfortunately, that doesn't seem to be the norm, so, if you're not getting the issue as quickly as you think you should, call your local post office and complain. For those of you that feel you need the *NEWS* as fast as humanly possible you can send an extra \$10 and we'll send your copy by first class mail. By the way, this issue was held up a couple of days in order to get the OBU results in since there will be three weeks between this issue and the next due to the slightly extended schedule again this year. Look for it October 17th with regional assignments and a pre-regional review.

perennially tough Tahlequah Sequoyah.

In the individual races Moore's Jimmy Martinez is still undefeated while 4A defending champ Kevin Connolly has had to relinquish his spot to teammate Bret Lowry. The Lions and Irish have not faced each other yet but may at least run on the same course at OSU. Hydro's Herbie Pebeashy is the only other defending champ with a No. 1 ranking, in class A, while Prague's Daniel Stone remains atop 2A and Bristow's '96 runnerup Albert Kelly gets the nod in 3A.

On the girls side, McGuinness freshman Amanda Jordan was impressive in winning the SMU race and has not lost a race this season. Hale senior Amy Bratton moves up to No. 1 in 5A with a win over Westmore sophomore Summer Suchy at OBU. Marlow's Leah McCauley still tops 3A as does Victory Christian's Tasha Lance in 2A. A has a new No. 1 with Depew's Angie Payne stepping up over two-time defending champ Rae Ann McCurry from Velma-Alma.

Two of the state's top girls were sidelined as Jenks sophomore Atalie Barber underwent an emergency appendectomy and Kelly freshman Lindsay Metetich is out with a stress fracture.

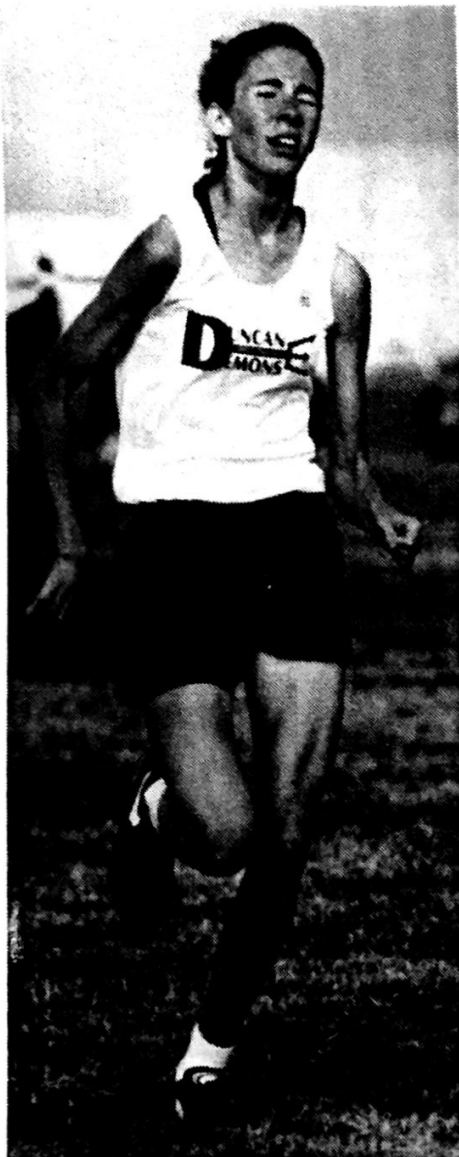

OKLAHOMA COLLEGE CROSS-COUNTRY UPDATE

The 1997 Cross-Country season has been underway for 3 weeks now, and we will attempt to cover the progress of several good Oklahoma schools as they wind their way through the season on the way to their respective national meets in November.

Hurricane Classic -

The Tulsa University women's team scored an impressive first victory in their first outing of the season as Norwegian soph phenom Fride Vullum pulled out all the stops enroute to an 11:32 clocking over the 2-mile course at Tulsa's Mohawk Park. Irish frosh Margaret Danagher was a close third in 11:47, followed by Australian junior Erin Simpson (11:58 - 6th), Dutch frosh Jany Van Gerwen (12:01 - 7th), and Minnesotan soph Sarah Shaw (12:12 - 11th) rounding out the scoring. Also in the team scoring, OU's Sooners were second followed by ORU in third.

In the men's 4-mile Junior College power Butler County, KS came into town from Tornado Alley but had the effect of a hurricane as they grabbed five of the top seven spots, including overall winner Noah Lagat, in running away with the team title over national power Arkansas, Tulsa, ORU, and OU.

Tulsa's Cornelius Mason, a junior from OC-Northeast, finished high for the Hurricane in the 10th spot (20:26), followed by teammates Tim Surface (20:42 - 11th), Cory Stidham (20:46 - 12th), Adam Ellison (20:48 - 15th), and David Bohlen (20:49 - 16th), as they garnered a third-place finish in the meet.

Other notable finishers included ORU's Ian Collings (21:30), and the Sooners' Matthew Roman (21:50).

For their efforts, both Vullum and Mason were named the WAC conference's Cross-Country athletes of the week.

Wichita State Gold Classic

Oklahoma State's men's team scored a perfect 15 points in cruising to their first win of the young season as Danish junior Rene Carlsen nosed out teammate Chuck Sloan for the victory.

Carlsen's 20:23 over the 4-mile course was a second better than Sloan, with Gitogu Churu of Kenya (20:32), Scott Gray (20:37), and Sweden's Eric Framme (21:01) rounding out the top 5.

Oklahoma State Cowboy Duals

TU's women had another fine first place showing at OSU with Fride Vullum scoring a fourth place finish for the Hurricane in a 2-mile time of 11:17. Jany Van Gerwen finished 11th (11:34), with Erin Simpson (11:36), Summer Lamons (11:48), and Margaret Danagher (11:53) closing out the team scoring.

OSU's men dominated as Gitogu Churu (20:08) Chuck Sloan (20:13), Nathaniel Lane (20:22), and Rene Carlsen (20:28) finished 1-2-3-4. They ran as a tight pack for most of the way along with Scott Gray (20:29 - 6th), Brian Young (20:30 - 7th), and Tulsa's Adam Ellison (20:28) in the middle of that pack at 5th place. The Hurricane were able to eke out a second place finish as Cornelius Mason (20:38 - 8th), Cary Stidham (20:54 - 9th), Dwight Davis (20:59 - 10th), and David Bohlen (21:01 - 11th) were not far behind on the tough 4 mile cowpasture, continuing to improve and impress.

Oklahoma Christian Invitational

OCU alum Wayne Strohman, now running for Columbia/Wesley in Wichita, came back for a homecoming of sorts as he breezed to an easy 25:41 victory over the challenging 8,000 meter Eagle's home course. Southwestern Kansas scored an impressive 31 point win over runner-up OBU (56), with OCU (63), SNU (103), UCO (144), and East Central (158) rounding out the scoring. OBU's Ethiopian transplant Awet Tsehaye (25:59) was second, as Velma-Alma junior Zac Johnson (26:33 - 3rd), Foyil's Jason McDonald (27:55 - 16th), James Adams (28:13 - 20th), and Altus soph Brian Whitlock (28:18 - 22nd) finished out the scoring for the Bison. OCU's Rhett Renoud (27:13) and Casey Langdon (27:29) were the top harriers for the Eagles, as Javier Balderas (27:32), and Jared Black (27:39) led the way for SNU. UCO's Josh Gingrich (28:54), and Jared Lovett (29:09) were the top men for the Bronchos, while ECU's Josh Corley (28:30) was the leading Tiger.

The women's race was a definite runaway for the 1996 SAC champion and region champion Lady Bison of OBU, as All-American junior Gabriela Hnilkova from the Czech Republic, who won five races last season won the 5,000 meter race in 18:37. Melissa Flood (19:30) a junior from Moore, and Wakita soph Nickie Lanie (19:32) rounded out the top three overall as they scored an impressive 22 points over SNU (60), SW Kansas (74), SE Okla (107), OCU (120), UCO (155), ECU (162), and SW Okla (216).

Jocks' Nitch Missouri Southern Stampede

The Arkansas Razorbacks put on a clinic for the other six teams as the mighty Hogs dominated over the 8,000 meter course at Joplin. Hog senior Ryan Wilson, showing excellent early season form in his first race, led the way with an excellent 23:43 (4:46 pace) with Catoosa senior Phillip Price, coming off a great junior track season, pushing his way to a fourth place finish in 24:09 (4:51).

The Golden Hurricane of Coach Stanley Redwine brought home a third place performance as the boys from Tulsa had personal bests from 8 out of 10 runners. Cornelius Mason (24:59 - 10th) and Dwight Davis (25:01 - 11th) led the way as Adam Ellison (25:15 - 16th), Jon Pillow (25:35 - 18th), and Jeremy Hollis (25:38 - 19th) completed the scoring.

The Hurricane women were edged out by the Lady Hogs 25 to 45 in the 5-team field as Arkansas claimed the top two spots, with Fride Vullum sailing to a fine 17:21 clocking over the rolling 5,000 meter course.

Margaret Danagher was 8th with an 18:05, with Erin Simpson (18:16 - 10th), Sarah Shaw

(18:22 - 11th), and Jany Van Gerwen (18:25 - 12th) wrapping up the scoring.

UCO Lake Arcadia Cross Country Challenge

The Lady Bison made it two in a row on a more challenging course with an almost perfect score of 19. They placed all five scorers in the top seven. It was Hnilkova (19:55), Flood (20:40), and Lanie (20:47) coming in at 1-2-3 as they did a week earlier, with Jessica Gibson (21:30 - 6th), and Renee Gaines (21:32 - 7th) completing the scoring. OBU outpaced a field including SNU (39), SE Okla (98), OCU (105), UCO (118), EC Okla (130), NW Okla (194), SW Okla (200), Panhandle (254), and Langston (260).

OBU's Awet Tsehaye (27:43) and Zac Johnson (28:05) finished 1-2 again, but the Bison fell short of the team title by six points, as OCU won with 32 points, with SNU (64), UCO (102), and EC Okla (129) rounding out the other teams.
