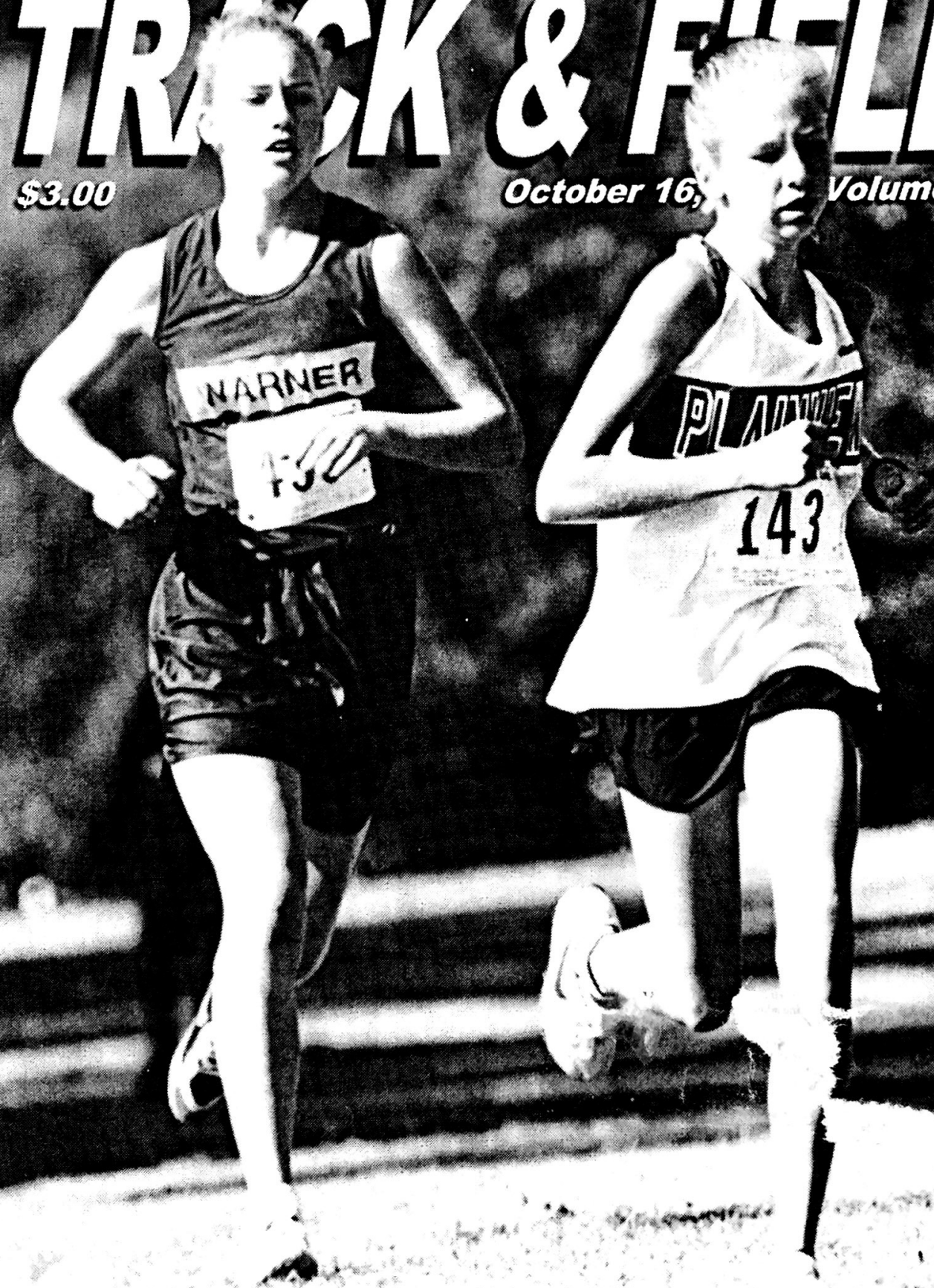

I'm planning on going to the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival Oct. 17 and hope to see some great races with the top teams from Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas, Kansas and Missouri planning to attend. This has always been one of my favorite events and everyone interested in cross country should make an effort to go at least once. The pre-state meet at Oral Roberts University has adopted the cross country festival theme, with high school, college and open races. ORU coach Joe Dial did a great job in the first year for this format and we're looking forward to seeing this event develop as one of the premier races in the region.

Speaking of All-Star competition. The coaches for the Oklahoma All-Star Team—Barry Klein, Little Axe and David Morton, McGuinness are still looking for nominations. The info was in the last issue but just in case it got lost:

OKLAHOMA/ARKANSAS/KANSAS ALL-STAR MEET: this annual meet sponsored by the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association is set for November 14 in Fayetteville, Arkansas on the University of Arkansas' home course. Coaches for the Oklahoma teams are Little Axe's Barry Klein (boys—405-579-2936 or 329-2156 school/405-769-6536 home) and McGuinness' David Morton (girls—405-842-6638 school/405-341-0877 home). Nominations need to be phoned to either coach by Wednesday, October 28. Only runners whose coaches are members of the OTCA are eligible. There will be a small participation fee but will include a full uniform. The teams will be announced following the state meet at Oral Roberts University.

Rankings in this issue were done early in the week, prior to all of the conference meets listed in this issue. The next ranking is the easiest of all since it comes out after the regionals but, the best thing is that the final ranking is up the runners themselves!

Bret Rider, the athletic director at Guymon, is trying to get a new meet established out in the panhandle. He is looking for interested teams and hopes to have a date set by November 1. Give him a call at 580-338-4350 if you're interested.

The next issue will be dated October 30 and will contain full regional results and the final pre-state rankings. It will be available at the state meet.

Regionals Next Stop For State Teams

Only two more weeks of competition remain before the state meet at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Saturday, October 31. This is the last issue before regionals which will be held October 24 in Elk City, Tishomingo, Norman (Reaves Park) and Tulsa (Mohawk Park). There is still one more week of open competition, including the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville, Ark., Oct. 17. This will be the last chance to see some of the top teams and individuals go against each other regardless of class.

As in the past, the big pre-state meet at Oral Roberts University on October 10 drew most of the state's top teams for a head-to-head clash on the state meet course and is the primary factor in the team and individual rankings in this issue. There were only a few notable absences in the top classes while 2A and A were fairly sparse. Several conference meets are reported in this issue but were received too late to be factored into the individual and team rankings.

5A Boys

Edmond Memorial, undefeated all season, turned in their best performance of the year at ORU, with a convincing win over all the 5A powers. It looks like the real battle will be for second here with three teams—Jenks, Moore and Mustang—in a close battle for the hardware. If the Bulldogs have a bad day or lose one of their top five things might get very interesting.

Individually, Moore's Chris McWatters continues to inch his way to the final race with the No. 1 ranking. He had his toughest challenge so far this season at ORU with defending champion Clay Cosby of Jenks right on his shoulder until 400 meters from the finish. Broken Arrow's Chris Wright holds down the No. 2 spot, notching a win over Cosby at the Cowboy Jamboree.

5A Girls

The Westmoore girls, top-ranked from the start, look very likely to finish the season undefeated, though both Owasso and Mustang have the talent to keep them hon-

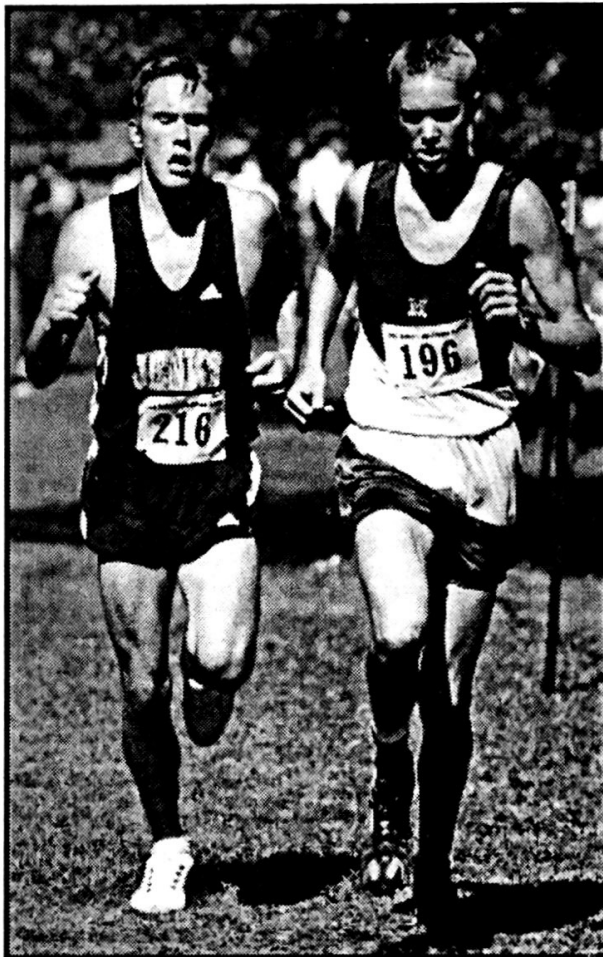
est. The Jaguar's Camille Herron dropped out of the No. 1 spot for the first time this season, fading from first to sixth in the last 200 meters at ORU, but teammate and defending champion Summer Suchy took up the slack. Mustang's Wendy and Mindy Scott and Owasso's Mary Ryser and Jamie German will all be in the hunt for the title as well.

4A Boys

McGuinness is untouchable again in this race, putting on a very impressive show at ORU with five of the top seven, including a one-two-three sweep, just like they did at state last year. The Irish are looking to become the first school in the state to capture four straight double titles (boys and girls) after tying Jenks mark last year when they took their third "double-double." Senior Kevin Connolly is gunning for his third individual title and will be only the second boy to accomplish the feat if he wins, as he should. Teammates Brett Lowry—runnerup last year—and John Hamilton lead the chase pack with Western Heights Phillip Semien a top contender as well. Guthrie has a good grip on the runnerup spot but both Edison and Weatherford will be looking to slip away with a trophy.

4A Girls

It's all Irish in this race as well. McGuinness has held down the top ranking since the beginning of the season when they topped No. 2 Weatherford at Marlow but the two teams have not met since, with the Eagles a no-show at the pre-state meet. With the top team spot probably

out of reach, three teams look to contend for the runnerup spot: Weatherford, Kelley and Guthrie.

Individually, McGuinness sophomore defending champ Amanda Jordan is in a class of her own. No one has even come close this season and she has consistently had the top time of the day by huge margins. While Jordan runs away with the title the rest of the top ten will be up for grabs. Weatherford's Jennifer Shaffer and Carmen Zamora, Pryor's Melissa Corlett and Abby Nutter, Lindsay Peterson of McGuinness, Tracy Kmetz of Kelly, Jamie Lucero of Guymon and Kim Thomas of McAlester and will be in the hunt for All-State.

3A Boys

Elk City has held down the top ranking since the beginning of the season but perennial end of the season power Little Axe showed they are a force to be contended with as they took a strong second at the pre-state meet. Plainview could sneak into the runnerup spot if the race goes their way and Anadarko is a dark horse, maybe even with the potential for an upset win.

Plainview freshman Patrick McGuire has held the No. 1 ranking since the beginning of the season and is undefeated in this class. Anadarko's Jesus Rubio, Elk City's Travis Johnson and

Little Axe's Chuck Staton round out the top five at this point.

3A Girls

Plainview is back up to 3A after a brief stay in 2A and the Indians are looking very comfortable at the top. Led by freshman phenom Jesse Gordon they were 15-point winners over Elk City at the pre-state meet. Marlow and Little Axe both have the capabilities of challenging for a runnerup spot.

Gordon has lost only to one runner in the state—and that was at SMU in Dallas when she was beaten by McGuinness' Jordan. She had the second fastest time at the pre-state meet and should be at the Chile Pepper along with Jordan and Westmoore's Suchy and Herron for a head-to-head showdown. Little Axe's Susan Morford and Elk City's Amy Kilhoffer are the best of the rest of 3A at this point.

2A Boys

This is going to be a tough class to call with Chisholm, Riverside Dickson and Tahlequah Sequoyah all capable of putting together a winning effort. Chisholm gets the No. 1 spot on the strength of their showing at the pre-state meet but they were mixed in with 3A and A at that meet and it will be different at the state meet.

Alva's top-ranked Ryan Bickerstaff earned his spot back with a win at the pre-state meet after losing to Victory Christian's Jason DiMauro at the Cowboy Jamboree the week before. Dickson's Alex Ratcliff, Chisholm's Steve Sawyer, Watonga's Jim Bob Coleman round out the top five.

2A Girls

Two-time defending champion Lexington is back in the No. 1 slot here with a narrow finish

ahead of Warner at the pre-state meet after spending the early part of the season elsewhere in the rankings. Warner still has serious intentions on winning the title and Tishomingo may be up for the challenge as well, just haven't seen much of them this season so far.

Defending champ Miley Turnbull held on to her No. 1 ranking with a pre-state meet win over 3A defender Carrie McFall of Cascia Hall, now that the Commandos are down to 2A. Purcell's Amy Dunaway, Lindsay's Marda Traylor and Dickson's Lindsey Hicks round out the top five.

A Boys

Oklahoma Christian School has been moving up in the rankings all season and served notice at the pre-state meet that they seriously want to win. They finished way ahead of Velma-Alma and could easily go 1-2-3 individually at state with Steve May, Taylor Miles and Ben Craycraft. Not much is known about the western Oklahoma teams but Oklahoma Bible Academy seems to be the best of the rest, with Braman and Timberlake still in the hunt.

With 1996 and '97 winner Herbie Pebeashy transferred to Weatherford, '96 champ Mylo Miller of Velma-Alma will be looking to crack Oklahoma Christian's hold on the top spots along with Carnegie's Lucian Bliss.

A Girls

Velma-Alma seems to have a strong hold on the top spot here but, as is usually the case, the western Oklahoma teams are hard to get a grip on. Laverne is finally back in the running with a full team and Canton has been close. All three have two runners ranked in the top ten.

Individually it looks like Canton freshman Beth Hooten may be the top runner. Laverne's Kristin Barby and Tonya Bentley along with Velma-Alma's two time champ Rae Ann McCurry and defender Amber Thacker and Healdton's Sonja Peterson all have the capability of winning the title.

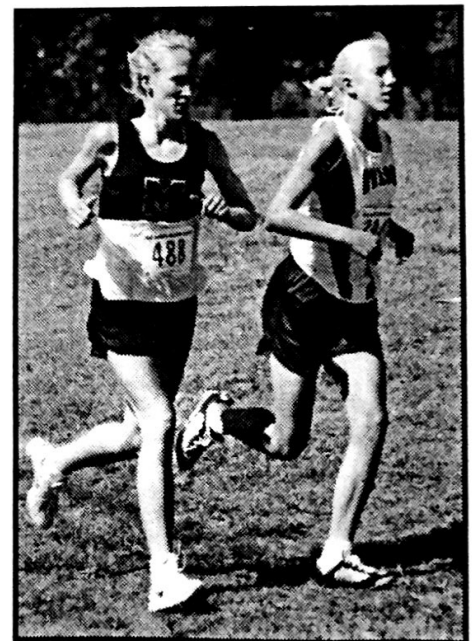

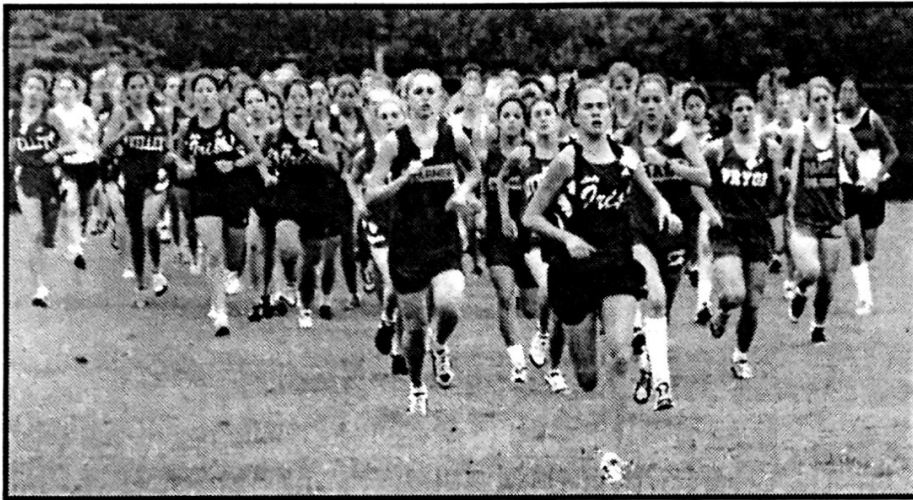
