*Dendrobium Gerald McCraith*

Good old *Gerald McCraith*. A plant that rarely fails to do well. Always best as a specimen plant, and that's exactly how Angie grows them. A primary hybrid between *Dendrobium engae* and *Dendrobium convolutum*, these are known

as Latouria type dendrobiums and are from New Guinea. I think there is a lot more potential from these breeding lines to come in the future.

I don't need to write anything here do I? If you know this plant, you know how stunning it is, and if you don't know it, words will hardly do it justice. A native of Brazil, this *Oncidium* was formerly recognised as being a *Miltonia*. Every year this plant seems to have a larger and larger profusion of flowers and never fails to stop the show!

*Phalaenopsis Unknown*

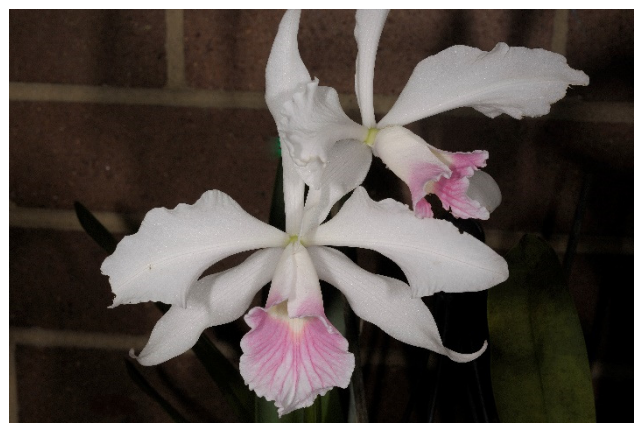
This plant has an unusual colour combination and poses quite a striking imagine, even in amongst a large number of other *Phalaenopsis*
