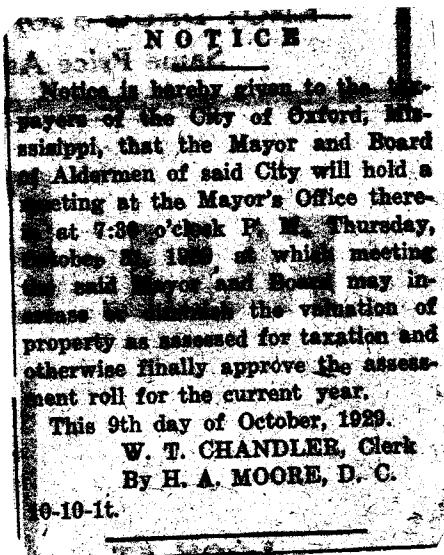

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$20,500.00 REFUNDING LIGHT AND WATER IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, TO RETIRE \$20,500.00 OF LIGHT AND WATER IMPROVEMENT BONDS HERETOFORE ISSUED: FIXING THE NUMBER AND DENOMINATIONS, DATE, RATE OF INTEREST AND MATURITIES OF SAME, AND PROVIDING FOR THE VALIDATION THEREOF :

Whereas, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, at a meeting duly held June 2, 1910, pursuant to an election, by proper ordinance did direct the issuance of \$30,000.00 Water and Light improvement Bonds in which it was provided that \$20,500.00 of said bonds should become due July 1, 1930, as shown by the minutes of said Mayor and Board in Minute Book 4, pages 241-247, and

Whereas, pursuant to said ordinance the said bonds were duly issued and sold on August 31, 1910, as shown by the minutes of said Mayor and Board in Minute Book 4, pages 269-271, and Whereas, said bonds to the amount of \$20,500.00 as aforesaid are existing, outstanding and will be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1930, and this Mayor and Board having investigated the issuance thereof do hereby judicially find that the same are legal, valid and enforceable obligations of the the City of Oxford, and

Whereas, funds available from taxes are not and will not be sufficient to pay said bonds, when the said bonds mature and become due on said date and this Mayor and Board doth so judicially find, and

Whereas, it becomes necessary to issue sufficient refunding bonds to meet the same, now therefore, under the authority of Chapter 206, of the Laws of the State of Mississippi of 1920 ;

Sec.1 Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, that the bonds of the City of Oxford, a municipality in the County of LaFayette, State of Mississippi be issued in the sum of twenty thousand five hundred dollars (\$20,500.00) for the purpose of retiring those certain outstanding Light and Water Improvement Bonds of said City, dated July 1, 1910, in the amount of \$20,500.00 and maturing July 1, 1930. The said Bonds shall be numbered 1 to 41 inclusive, shall be dated July 1, 1930, shall be in denomination of \$500.00 each and shall mature in numerical order, beginning with Bond No.1 and without option of prior payment, \$500.00 on July 1, 1931 and \$500.00 on July 1, in each of the years 1932 to 1935, both inclusive, and \$1000.00 on July 1, 1936 and \$1000.00 on July 1, in each of the years 1937 to 1953 both inclusive; and the said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of 5½ per cent per annum payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year and both principal and interest shall be payable at the First National Bank of Memphis, Memphis, Tennessee.

Sec.2. The said refunding bonds herein ordered to be issued shall be lithographed in two or more colors with suitable devices to prevent counterfeiting, signed by the Mayor, shall be countersigned by the Clerk, who shall impress the corporate seal upon each of said bonds, and each bond shall have interest coupons attached which coupons shall have lithographed fac-similes of the signatures of said Mayor and Clerk and said lithographed signatures shall be as binding upon the said City of Oxford as though they were original signatures.

Sec.3. The said refunding bonds herein ordered to be issued shall specify upon each bond the purpose for which issued, shall be made payable to the First National Bank of Memphis, or bearer, or shall be made payable to bearer alone and for the prompt payment of same the full faith, credit, and resources of said City shall be irrevocably pledged.

Sec.4. The said bonds herein ordered to be issued shall provide that if for any reason the same should ever be declared void by any court of competent jurisdiction then the holders thereof shall be subrogated to all the rights and remedies now possessed by the holders of the aforesaid outstanding bonds which are refunded thereby and such holders are hereby so subrogated to such rights and remedies.

Sec.5. The said bonds shall be registered as issued and shall be in substantially the following form, to-wit :

That the City of Oxford, in LaFayette County, Mississippi, acknowledges itself to owe and for value received hereby promises to pay to _____ or bearer Five Hundred dollars (\$500.00) on the 1st day of July, 1930 without option of prior payment, with interest thereon at the rate of five and one-half per centum (5½) per annum from date until paid, payable semi-annually on January 1st and July 1st in each year on presentation and surrender of the interest coupons thereto annexed as the same severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the First National Bank of Memphis, Memphis, Tennessee for the prompt payment of same both principal and interest at maturity, the full faith, credit and resources of the said City of Oxford are hereby irrevocably pledged.

The said contract shall read as follows, to-wit :

A G R E E M E N T.

This agreement made and entered into this the 2nd day of September, 1930, between the City of Oxford, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Mississippi, acting by and through its duly authorized agents, hereinafter called the "City of Oxford", and the University of Mississippi, an educational corporation organized and existing under the same authority, acting by and through its duly authorized agents, hereinafter called "The University" ;

W I T N E S S E T H

1.

The City hereby agrees and binds itself, its legal representatives, successors and assigns, to furnish and to sell to and for the use of the University electric energy, delivered as hereinafter set forth for the class of electric service whatever, subject only to the terms and conditions hereof, and for a period of five (5) years from date, subject to the two year agreement hereinafter set forth herein.

2.

The aforesaid electric energy shall be delivered by the City to a distributing pannel furnished and/or erected by the University in its power plant on the University Campus, in LaFayette County, Mississippi, at a point to be selected by the University

3.

The City shall furnish all poles, lines, meters, equipment, together with the maintenance and repair thereof, necessary to a proper delivery up to the point of distribution hereinbefore mentioned.

4.

The electric energy furnished under this agreement shall be delivered to the distributing panel at a potential of approximately 2200 volts, 3-phase, 60-cycle, alternating current, and shall be measured by a standard commercial 3-phase, 60-cycle watt-hour metering equipment, the registration of which shall be the basis of computation for bills for energy consumption. The University however upon notice to the City shall have the right in the presence of a designated employee of the City to read and check the said metering equipment and should there be any disagreement as to the correctness of the reading, the parties shall jointly test same and in the event an adjustment is necessary and the parties are unable to agree thereon, it shall be submitted to arbitration and an adjustment made on the basis of average consumption for a prior similar period.

5.

The City shall furnish said electric energy to the distributing panel aforesaid as soon as is practicable after the execution of this contract.

6.

The City shall use all reasonable care and diligence to supply the University with an uninterrupted flow of electric current and energy, but if the service shall be defective, or be interrupted or fail by reason of overloading, acts of God, or acts of any person or circumstances over which the City has no control, or by any emergencies in which the City may be compelled to stop same to prevent injury to life or property, the City shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damages resulting therefrom, but the City shall exercise all reasonable diligence to remove the cause if interruption from whatever source and resume the normal supply of energy as quickly as possible.

7.

In consideration of the covenants, premises and obligations of the City, the University hereby agrees and binds itself to pay to the City for all electric energy consumed, on or before the 10th day of the month following that during which such service is furnished, at the following rates, to-wit:

years in which this contract is in force.

It is agreed that the above rates are based on a minimum of fifty thousand (50,000) KWH during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February, March, April, May, and a minimum of five thousand (5000) KWH during the months of June, July and August, warranted by the University to be used or paid for at the above rates as a service basis even though not actually used.

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8.

The University further agrees to furnish all necessary rights-of-way from the point where the transmission lines of the City enter the University Campus to the point of delivery, all necessary sites for the location of meters, poles and equipment, and license to enter thereupon for for construction, inspection, maintenance and repairs.

9.

The University further agrees to use the electric energy supplied with due regard to securing the maximum efficiency from the apparatus of both the City and the University, to maintain a power factor as near unity as is practicable, to balance the use from the three phases as nearly as possible, and on all induction motors above 25 horse-power to install a power factor correcting device or use only the slip ring or synchronous type, and in all its equipment to conform to standard commercial practice.

10.

It is mutually understood and agreed that all poles, lines and equipment of every nature placed on the University Campus by the City shall remain the property of the City which it shall have the right to remove at the termination of this agreement but before removal the University shall have the option of purchasing same at its then value, which shall be arrived at by three appraisers, appointed one by each party and a third selected by the two previously appointed.

11.

It is mutually covenanted and agreed that the City shall not be liable for damage or injury to property or persons arising or resulting from the receiving, distributing, use or application of electric energy beyond the point of delivery and the University shall hold and save the City harmless from any such damage or injury so sustained and also from any liability, damage or injury arising or resulting from the negligence or misconduct of the University in maintaining or operating its apparatus, appliances or equipment. And the University shall not be liable for any damage or injury to persons or property arising or resulting from the negligence or misconduct of the City in constructing, maintaining or operating its transmission system but the City shall hold and save the University harmless from any liability so sustained.

12.

It is mutually understood and agreed that this contract shall be in full force and effect for a period of two years from its date of execution and shall continue and be renewed automatically thereafter from time to time and up to the full period of five years except that at any time before the end of the first two years either party may notify the other of its intention to terminate the contract by giving six (6) months notice, under registered cover with postage prepaid, and the same having been so mailed this contract shall terminate at the expiration of the said two year period and thereafter be null and void and of no effect and if the contract runs more than two years, the time notice can be given any year and terminate the contract at the end of the next annual expiration date.

This contract shall not be assigned, transferred or sold without the written consent of the Board of Trustees first having been ~~verified~~ *obtained*.

The City hereby agrees and binds itself, its legal representatives, successors and assigns, to furnish and to sell to and for the use of the University electric energy, delivered as hereinafter set forth for the class of electric service whatever, subject only to the terms and conditions hereof, and for a period of five (5) years from date, (subject to the two year agreement hereinafter set forth herein.)

2.

The aforesaid electric energy shall be delivered by the City to a distributing panel furnished and / or erected by the University in its power plant on the University Campus, in LaFayette County, Mississippi, at a point to be selected by the University.

3.

The City shall furnish all poles, lines, meters, equipment together with the maintenance and repair thereof, necessary to a proper delivery up to the point of distribution hereinbefore mentioned.

4.

The electric energy furnished under this agreement shall be delivered to the distributing panel at a potential of approximately 2200 volts, 3-phase, 60-cycle, alternating current, and shall be measured by a standard commercial 3-phase, 60-cycle, watt-hour equipment, the registration of which shall be the basis of computation for bills for ~~like~~ energy consumption. The University however upon notice to the City shall have the right in the presence of a designated employee of the City ~~of~~ to read and check the said metering equipment and should there be any disagreement as to the correctness of the readings, the parties shall jointly ~~that~~ the same and in the event an adjustment is necessary and the parties are unable to agree thereon, it shall be submitted to arbitration and an adjustment made on the basis of average consumption for a prior similar period.

5.

The City shall furnish electric energy to the distributing panel aforesaid as soon as is practicable after the execution of this contract.

The City shall use all reasonable care and diligence to supply the University with an uninterrupted flow of electric current and energy, but if the service shall be defective, or be interrupted or fail by reason of overloading, acts of God, or acts of any person or circumstances over which the City has no control, or by an emergency in which the City may be compelled to stop same to prevent injury to life or property the City shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damage resulting therefrom, but the City shall exercise all reasonable diligence to remove the cause of interruption from whatever source and resume the normal supply of energy as quickly as practicable.

It agreed that the above rates are based on a minimum of Sixteen Thousand six hundred and sixty-six and two thirds (16666 2/3) KWH or \$500.00 per month, during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February, March, April, May, and a minimum of five thousand (5000) KWH during the months of June, July and August, warranted by the University to be used or paid for at the above rates as a service ~~charge~~ basis even though not actually used.

8.

The University further agrees to furnish all necessary rights-of-way from the point where the transmission lines of the City enter the University Campus to the point of delivery, all necessary sites for the location of meters, poles and equipment, and license to enter thereupon for construction, maintenance and repair.

The University agrees to use the electric energy supplied with due regard to securing the maximum efficiency for the apparatus of both the City and the University, to maintain a power factor as near unity as is practicable, to balance the use from the three phases as nearly as possible, and on all induction motor above 25 horse-power to install a power factor correcting device or use only the slip ring or synchronous type, and in all its equipment to conform to standard commercial practice.

It is mutually agreed and understood that all poles, lines and equipment of every nature placed on the University Campus by the City shall remain the property of the City which it shall have the right to remove at the termination of this contract but before removal the University shall have the option of purchasing same at its then value, which shall be arrived at by three appraisers, appointed one by each party and a third selected by the two previously appointed.

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AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND REGULATING PRIVILEGE TAX ON
CALLING, TRADES, OCCUPATIONS AND BUSINESSES IN THE
CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI :

SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, that every person desiring to engage in any business, or exercise and privilege specified in Chapter 88, of the Laws of Session Laws of the State of Mississippi of the Regular Legislative Session of 1930, and the amendments thereto, excepting any person prohibited to be taxed by a municipality or otherwise exempt from the payment of a municipal privilege tax, shall first before commencing same within the corporate limits of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, apply for, pay for and procure from the proper officer a privilege license authorizing him to engage in the business or exercise the privilege specified therein.

SECTION 2.

Be it further ordained that the amount of the tax imposed for the privilege of engaging or continuing in the City of Oxford, in the businesses, callings, trades, or occupations set out therein shall be fifty per cent (50%) of the amount required to be paid for the State license under the provisions of said Chapter 88 and the amendments thereto, excepting those callings, trades, or occupations prohibited to be taxed by a municipality or otherwise exempt from the payment of a municipal privilege tax.

SECTION 3.

Be it further ordained that the proper officer for issuing said privilege licenses and collecting said taxes shall be the Tax Collector for the City of Oxford.

SECTION 4.

Be it further ordained that the Tax Collector shall keep a privilege Tax Register in which the names of all privilege tax payers shall be recorded and in which shall be shown the amount paid, the number of the license, the business, calling trade or occupation licensed, and the time cover by said license. On or before the last day of each month the tax collector shall mail to each privilege tax payer whose license will expire during the following month a notice to that effect but failure on the part of the tax collector to mail same or on the part of the Tax Payer to receive same shall not in any wise excuse or exempt him from any penalties prescribed for non-payment.

SECTION 5.

Be it further ordained that any person liable for privilege tax as hereinbefore provided who shall fail to procure same before engaging in the business or who shall fail to renew same within the month when it shall be due, as the case may be, shall in each or either such instance be liable for double the amount of the tax required for such business and the tax collector shall issue a separate license for the penalty and endorse across the face thereof, "Collected for Damage."

SECTION 6.

Be it further ordained that any person liable for a privilege tax as aforesaid who shall fail to procure same hereinbefore provided shall in addition to the penalty be liable for a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not exceeding \$100.00 and imprisoned not exceeding ten days or both.

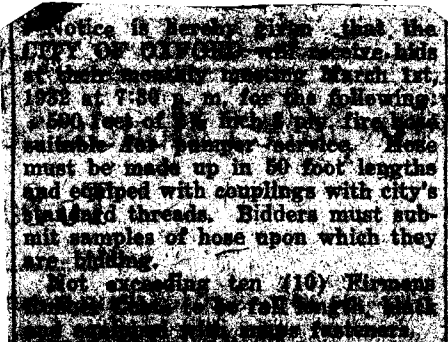

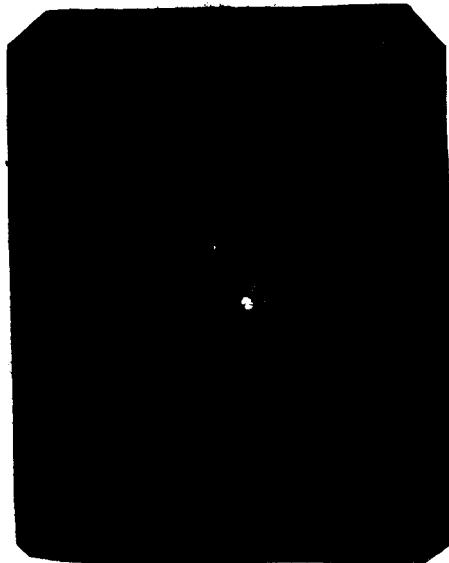

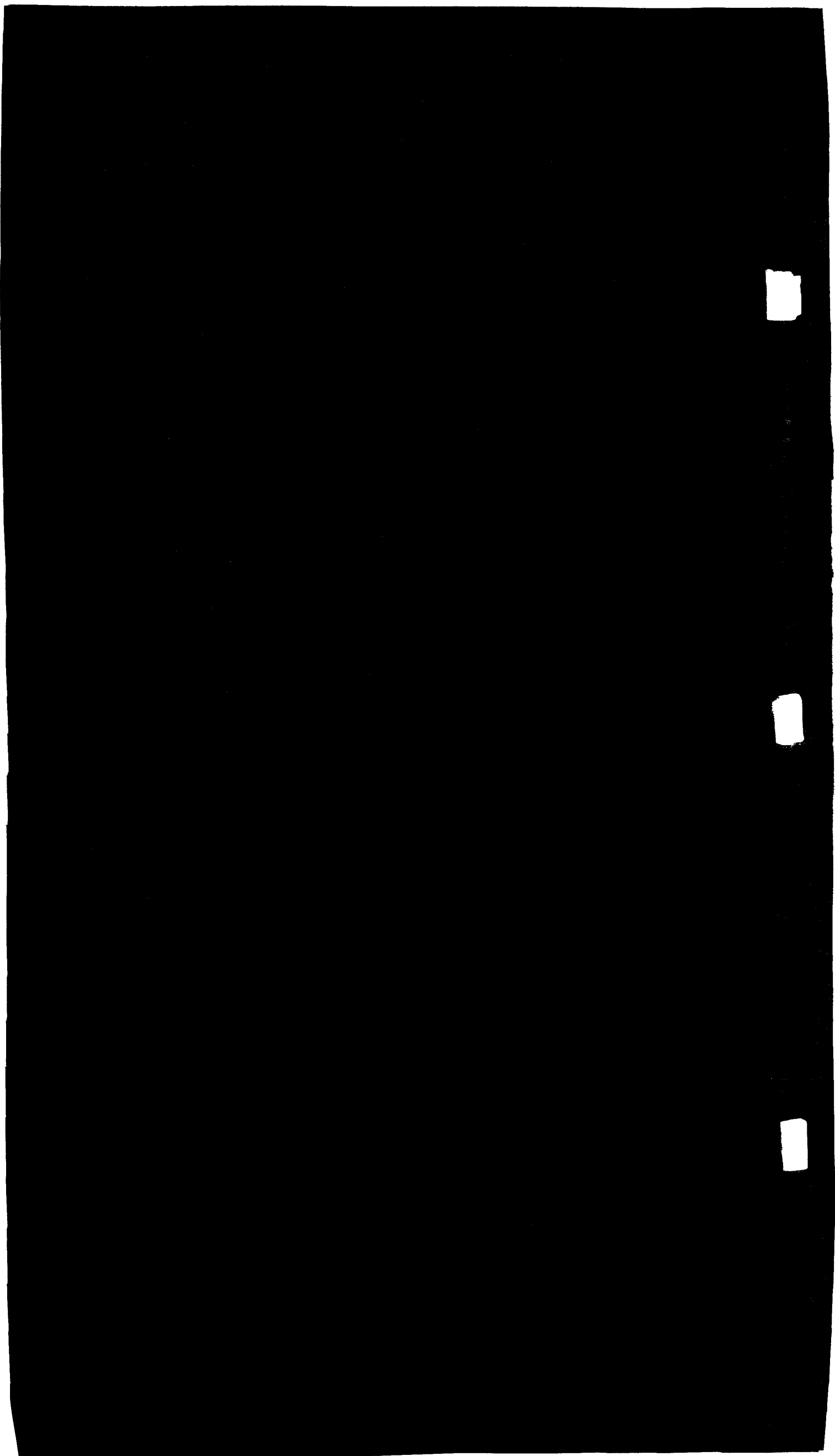

All persons failing to work the streets or pay the street taxes shall be fined six dollars and all costs, or be imprisoned in the jail for ten days or both fine and imprisonment.

The City Clerk shall make an enumeration of all persons subject to street taxes or work each year, on the regular assessment rolls.

This order shall apply to the collection of street taxes for the year 1933.

Due to the fact that this ordinance was passed at the regular November Meeting 1932 and was left off the Minutes by error, it is ordered that same be enrolled in Minute Book at this the January 1933 Meeting.

This day this cause came on for consideration the matter of the proposed reforestation camp in LaFayette County, Mississippi, and the Board having considered the matter, doth find from the proof submitted and after proper investigation that there is an abundance of Idle cut-over lands in said County, and also several thousand acres of State lands in this County from which timber has been cut and are not now being utilized in any way whatever; that a reforestation ~~camp~~ of said lands will result in great benefit to the State and County, as well as the citizens thereof; and that LaFayette is Centrally located in the northern part of Mississippi; that there are now in the City and County a great number of unemployed citizens available for the work of reforestation, and that the location of such a camp in the county would relieve a condition of distress due to unemployment that possible could not be relieved otherwise. The Board having found further that the Fair Ground Association of LaFayette County has offered free of charge the use of the Fair Grounds and all equipment and that the Board of Supervisors of LaFayette County have offered in conjunction with said Board the free use of the fair grounds and equipment, and the further question of supply of electric lights and supply of water being considered in connection with the use of fair grounds and equipments for the reforestation camp. After due consideration of all such matters the Mayor and Board of Aldermen doth find it proper that full authority for the use of said grounds and equipment be authorized, and the free supply of electric lights in a reasonable quantity and a reasonable supply of water free of charge be offered to the proper authorities for the location and maintenance of such a camp in LaFayette County, Mississippi, be authorized in so far as this Board has legal authority to do, and that proper recommendation be duly made to the proper authorities for the location creation and maintenance of a reforestation camp in said County.

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Came on for consideration a contract with the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning for the selling of electrical energy to the University of Mississippi, and this Mayor and Board of Aldermen, having considered the same, it was ordered that the Mayor and Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to sign, execute and deliver the following contract to the said Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning on behalf of the City of Oxford, and this Mayor and Board do hereby adopt the same and bind the City of Oxford to a faithful performance thereof, upon a like adoption ~~thereof~~ and execution of the same, according to law, by the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning, or their authorized agents. The said contract shall read as follows :

A G R E E M E N T.

This agreement made and entered into this the day of June, 1933, between the City of Oxford, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Mississippi, acting by and through its duly authorized agents, hereinafter called "the City"; and the University of Mississippi, an education corporation organized and existing under the same authority, acting by and through its duly authorized agents, hereinafter called "the University";

W I T N E S S E T H

1.

The City hereby agrees and binds itself, its legal representatives, successors and assigns, to furnish and to sell to and for the use of the University electric energy, delivered as hereinafter set forth for any class of electric service whatever, subject only to the terms and conditions hereof, and for a period of three (3) years, beginning September 1, 1933.

2.

The aforesaid electric energy shall be delivered by the City to the Distributing panel furnished and which is now erected by the University in its Power Plant on the University Campus, in LaFayette County, Mississippi.

3.

The City shall furnish all poles, lines, meters, equipment, together with the maintenance and repair thereof, necessary to a proper delivery up to the point of distribution mentioned.

4.

The electric energy furnished under this agreement shall be delivered to the distributing panel at a potential of approximately 2300 volts, 3-phase, 60-cycle, alternating current, and shall be measured by a standard commercial 3-phase 60-cycle, watt-hour metering equipment, the registration of which shall be the basis of computation for bills for energy consumption. The University however upon notice to the City shall have the right in the presence of a designated employee of the City to read and check the said metering equipment and should there be any disagreement as to the correctness of the readings, the parties shall jointly test same and in event an adjustment is necessary and the parties are unable to agree thereon, it shall be submitted to arbitration and an adjustment made on the basis of average consumption for a period similar period.

The City shall use all reasonable care and diligence to supply the University with an uninterrupted flow of electric current and energy, but if the service shall be defective, or be interrupted or fail by reason of overloading, acts of God or acts of any persons or circumstances over which the City has no control, or by any emergencies in which the City may be compelled to stop same to prevent injury to life or property, the City shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damage resulting therefrom, but the City shall exercise all reasonable diligence to remove the cause of interruption from whatever source and resume the normal supply of energy as quickly as practicable,

6.

In consideration of the covenants, promises and obligations of the City, the University hereby agrees and binds itself to pay to the City for all electric energy consumed on or before the 10th day of the month following that during which such service, at the following rates, to-wit :

A minimum charge per month of 4000 KWH at \$150.00, next 6000 KWH at 3¢ KWH, next 10,000 KWH at 2½¢ KWH, next 20,000 at 2¢ KWH, and all over 40,000 KWH at 1½¢ KWH. The minimum charge per month of \$150.00 for which 4000 KWH will be allowed.

It is warranted by the University that 4000 KWH is to be used or paid for at the above rate of \$150.00 per month as a service basis even though not actually used.

7.

The University further agrees to furnish all necessary rights-of-way from the point where the transmission lines of the City enter the University Campus to the point of delivery, all necessary sites for the location of meters, poles and equipment, and license to enter thereupon for construction, inspection maintenance and repair.

8.

The University further agrees to use the electric energy supplied with due regard to securing the maximum efficiency from the apparatus of both the City and the University, to maintain a power factor as near unity as is practicable, to balance the use from the three phases as nearly as possible, and on all induction motors above 25horse-power to install a power factor correcting device or use only the slip ring or synchronous type, and in all its equipment to conform to standard commercial practice.

9.

It is mutually understood and agreed that all poles, lines and equipment of every nature placed on the University Campus by the City shall remain the property of the City which it shall have the right to remove at the termination of this agreement but before removal the University shall have the option of purchasing same at its then value, which shall be arrived at by three appraisers, appointed one by each party and a third selected by the two previously appointed.

It is mutually covenanted and agreed that the City shall not be liable for damage or injury to property or persons arising or resulting from the receiving, distributing, use or application of electric energy beyond the point of delivery and the University shall hold and save the City harmless from any such damage or injury so sustained and also from any liability, damage or injury arising or resulting from the negligence or misconduct of the University in maintaining or operating its apparatus, appliances or equipment. And the University shall not be liable for any damage or injury to persons or property arising or resulting from the negligence or misconduct of the City in constructing, maintaining or operating its transmission system but the City shall hold and save the University harmless from any liability so sustained.

11.

It is mutually understood and agreed that this contract shall be in full force and effect for a period of three years from September 1, 1933. It is further agreed that anytime before the expiration of this contract either party may notify the other of its intention to terminate the contract at the expiration of six (6) months from the date of mailing such notice under registered cover with postage prepaid, and the same having been so mailed this contract shall terminate at the expiration of the said six months period and thereafter be null and of no effect. This contract shall not be assigned, transferred or sold without the written consent of the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher Learning first being obtained.

12.
