


Summer is the perfect time to build a sand castle, whether in a sandbox or on the beach. Use this fun idea to add color to your creation.

The Apostle Paul's words remind us that **kindness** should be a part of our Christian nature. The New Shorter Oxford English Dictionary gives the following definition of **kindness:** 1. the quality or habit of being kind, kind nature or disposition: kind behavior.

2. A kind deed, a considerate act. 3. Kind feeling, fondness, affection, good will. Syn. Gentle, compassionate, sympathetic.

<u>Food for Thought:</u> Can we do more as God's ambassadors for Christ to be kind to others? As we pray, is God speaking to your heart about someone who needs an act of **kindness**?



Every Friday of the month six bags of food are distributed to needy families in the Richmond community. The following are some of the items that make up a bag of groceries for the needy: canned fruit (always needed), breakfast cereal, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti, pasta sauce, canned soup and cups of

soup, tuna, packages of pasta or macaroni and cheese, canned meat, rice, and beans. We do accept perishable items but ask they be delivered to the church either on Thursday before 1:00 PM or Friday before 10:00 AM. Items can be brought to the church office during office hours. Tom Welton is our Deacon in charge of the pantry. He does all the preparation of the bags each week and distributes them on Friday morning. If you have any questions regarding this loving ministry ask a Deacon.


Mandatory Meeting - July 22

Property & Finance Committee Minutes -June 16, 2014

Property: The issue of storage was tabled to a later meeting. capital improvements: Furnace replacement (COMPLETED) Thanks to Caesar Flores for oversight of the project. Carpeting for Verkuyl and Sunday school rooms – rooms will be painted and ceiling tiles replaced before new carpet goes in Estimate carpet \$2500 + installation. They discussed having painting projects mapped out and costs figured before July 1 so that it can be included in a grant request. Discussion about Verkuyl projects: Jim will speak with Alcenir and PLM to develop a plan with costs to be forwarded by July 1. Renovation of big kitchen: need to develop plan for renovations. Congregational Life Committee discussion comments include need to better organize existing space, need for grill. Church has been offered a new commercial stove; Marcelino will contact contractor to obtain an estimate for renovations to the kitchen. Replacement Projector (COMPLETED) Thanks to Pat Miles, Marecelino Nuño & Jose Ku for locating vendor and for setting it up! Bike racks: Decided on bike rack to be mounted on end of metal shed in parking lot; cost \$525.00. Approved request to permanently install LED lights along front breeze way for evening activities. Advise Session budget deficit.

Getting to know Cindy Kephart, our new intern:

Thank you for the warm welcome that each of you has extended to me. I am enjoying my time with you and thank God for allowing me to spend this season as a pastoral intern at First Presbyterian Church. Two places define home for me, New England and the San Francisco Bay Area.

Cindy says "The town of 1100 people where I grew up was located in a beautiful river valley. I have happy memories of walking downtown to get our mail at the Post Office and crossing a large green bridge, where it was exciting to watch a train pass below. My grandparents lived "up on the hill", and all of the grandchildren loved to play in the fields and woods of our grandparents' small retirement farm, scooping polliwogs out of the pond to take home and watch grow into tadpoles, or picking beetles off the rows of vegetables in the garden, and then after dark, dash around the front yard catching fireflies in mason jars. In the fall, we would watch Grampie split kindling in the wood shed and in the winter, we built snowmen in the field while Nana knit mittens and scarves to keep us warm.

My mom, pictured with me, was born in my town, as was my grandfather, and great grandfather. Many families lived in our town for multiple generations and it was a wonderful place to grow up, yet in every generation of our family, someone chose to leave and go west

I am the westward traveler in my generation. I went west to attend college in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Then I continued all the way to the Far East to spend two years in the Philippines as a Peace Corps volunteer. Finally, I moved to California. The San Francisco Bay Area has been my home for 34 years. I am delighted to meet each of you and to become familiar with your home of Richmond. Already I have taken many hikes in the beautiful Kennedy Grove, enjoyed the Rosie the Riveter Museum, and have spent many hours in the library, which, to my delight, has a number of

excellent Christian resource books. It is a joy to get to know another region of my San Francisco Bay home, and I thank you again for your warm welcome."

Cindy will be with us at First Pres until December. She is "shadowing" Pastor Jim, as her primary purpose here is "to learn to be a pastor". This will involve her in many of the events and activities of the church, so be sure to greet and get to know Cindy and make her welcome at First Pres.
