How to access SPR data

- Complete the SPR request access form found on the SPR health professionals website. <u>http:/phsa.ca/health-professionals/professional-resources/bc-surgical-patient-registry</u>
- 2. Submit completed form to your health authority SPR administrator:

- The health authority SPR administrator will submit your completed request form to SPR central office. SPR central office will assign your SPR access and email you when complete.
- 4. Log into your health authority/hospital intranet with your usual health authority username and password.
- 5. Enter this URL into your work station web browser: https://spr.healthbc.org/SPR/Shared/AcceptPolicy.aspx
- 6. Enter your health authority domain\username (e.g., SFHR\janedoe) and your health authority system/Windows password.

Review this information carefully and click either "*I agree*" to continue or "*I disagree*" to discontinue. *If you agree, you will only be asked this the first time you log into SPR.*

The BC Surgical Patient Registry is a provincial system that collects information about patients waiting for and receiving surgery in British Columbia. The purpose of the program is to provide more accurate and complete information for surgeons, hospitals and the Ministry of Health Services to improve surgical services for the people of BC. The BC Surgical Patient Registry is a joint program of the regional health authorities, the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA) and the Ministry of Health Services, and is managed by the PHSA.

The majority of Data for the Surgical Patient Registry is automatically received from the OR booking Systems in each health authority. Patient priority for sugery is identified through the specialty specific patient condition and diagnosis descriptions that are submitted by the Surgeon on the OR booking form.

10. Under Reports, select Advanced Reporting and Analysis, then SPR Data Mart.
