Field Trial Days Why The Volunteer Brittany Club Never Runs Its Trials On Sunday

There was a time when it was a great deal of fun to go to the trials of the Volunteer Brittany Club. During the 1960's and into the 1970's they were held in the rural community of Longtown, 30 miles or so east of Memphis and near the villages of Somerville and Grand Junction, long well known to field trialers.

The personalities attached to the Volunteer Club were quite unique, and something out of the ordinary usually happened at its trials. In addition to Mr. Ralph Cornwell its leaders included Wiggins Wilder, M.D., who practiced medicine in Somerville, Mr. J.T. Highsmith, a farmer of the region, and Mr. Herb Anderson, of Memphis. There were others equally refreshing whose names I do not now recall.

Mr. Highsmith seldom went to a trial anywhere else, and eventually made Duke a field champion by running him only in the Volunteer Club's semi-annual affairs. J.T.'s usual attire, even in the coldest weather, seemed to be low-cut street shoes, light wool pants, a dress shirt, suede leather jacket, and a felt hat. I do not recall him ever wearing gloves.

So attired, when Duke's turn came to run J.T. would surrender the tractor seat to another, and lead him out on a length of binder twine. The dog usually gave a good account of himself and it was apparent that the two spent a lot of time together, hunting and shooting quail and squirrels. Once in describing one of his squirrel hunts to a dinner group, following a long field trial day, J.T. confessed that with Duke treeing and himself shooting, they took a limit of bushytails "in no time."

Mr. Highsmith was a highly pragmatic man. At one trial the gun dogs were run on a single course with quail scattered along it, rather than in a birdfield. The large wood and wire box in which the supply of birds was kept was secluded in a thicket near the starting point, where it could be visited at need by the mounted club member who was dropping the birds along the course.

One dog was lost soon after the breakaway and not seen again for the duration of its 30 minute heat. When the bird releaser went to the source of his supply at the end of that period, he found the missing canine inside the box with approximately 75 dead quail.

The field trial party gathered around the box in considerable consternation. Finally one said, "boys, what are we gonna do?" Mr. Highsmith, extracting a pocket knife from his trousers, answered, "I don't know about you fellers, but I'm goin' to clean quail."

ABC 2010 Chairmen Reports & Agenda Items



2010 REPORT OF THE ABC PRESIDENT – Hank Hartnek September 15, 2010

2010 has been another year of varied challenges. The ABC continues to function on the consistent efforts of a core of largely volunteers. We need to not lose sight of the fact that ninety-five percent of the clubs work is done by volunteers who have families, jobs and other responsibilities. The directors, officers, and committees at the national level as well as the many regional club officers and workers deserve a pat on the back. We could not maintain a viable level of activity in our shows, field trials, hunt tests, obedience, agility, futurity and other activities without the dedicated efforts of these members. I would urge each of you to say "Thank You" to those in charge of the next event that you attend.

While this year has seen improvements in a number of areas of the American Brittany Club, there have been several problem areas. Mary Jo Trimble, Executive Secretary provides valuable assistance in many areas including the magazine and dog related legislation. The membership database is ably handled by Linda Langford. The database is a difficult task because of the continual changes in membership status and addresses. Linda has created a website which will now allow regional clubs to access their current membership information whenever they wish. The web site continues to improve with the efforts of Steve Ralph. Steve created the FTP site on the ABC website. This website will make it much easier to upload and track field trial and specialty show results.

Our main problem area this year has been the Magazine, particularly its lateness. Also of concern are the decline in the number of articles and advertising. We have spent a great amount of time this year attempting to get the Magazine back on schedule. Earlier this year I brought Bob Fleury onto the Magazine Committee to help get us back on track along with resolving several other issues such as lack of content and a decrease in advertising. Bob was Magazine Committee chairman for 12 years. He brings to the committee a wealth of experience as well as a business-like approach to the Magazine. Getting back on schedule will result in smaller issues with fewer articles and less advertising over the short term. As soon as we are back on schedule, all this should improve rapidly.

Also helping to improve the timeliness and accuracy of the results in the Magazine is the creation of a database system which will allow the magazine publisher and typists to put in just the dog's registration number to get accurate dog and owner information. This will eliminate many errors and result in much less time required proofreading the results. Gil Hopper has stepped forward and is working with us to create this database. Until this is completed, Ken Windom has volunteered to take on the proofreading duties for the Managing Editor to free up her time for the actual layout of the magazine in a format to send to the publisher.

2010 marks The American Brittany Club's twenty-fourth year at Blue Mountain Wild Life Area. This year most of the efforts have been put into vegetation control and improvements in roads and trails. We are very appreciative of the efforts of Larry McAnally and his crew who were able to maintain these excellent facilities.

Other challenges included:

1. Dog Tax. The BMCA decided to increase the amount per entry from this year forward from \$6.00 per entry to \$7.00. This information was passed along to club treasurers. It is the intent of BMCA to increase this fee \$1.00 yearly up to \$10.00. These fees are used to help maintain the Booneville grounds.
2. Quail. There has been a fair holdover of birds from last year. Larry will be purchasing quail from the same vendor used last year at a cost of \$2.95 per bird with \$600 for shipping. There was 2,000 quail released on September 15th with another 1,000 birds to be released just before the start of our AA Nationals.
3. This year, we have moved the site of our National Specialty Show to Kay Rodgers Park in Ft. Smith, the site of the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair. This move will help reduce the costs of putting on our National show.
4. AKC is in the process of establishing rules regarding handicapped handlers in field trials. This would allow handlers using ATVs and/or horses in walking stakes and walking trials. AKC is issuing letters for handicapped handlers to give to host clubs. These letters outline the procedure to follow for that individual handler based on his limitations with considerations for what is permitted by the state or land owner.

As in previous years, the future of sporting dog activities is clouded by repeated attempts at constraining legislation that will place unworkable burdens on our activities. Our problems are compounded by the efforts of some State Wildlife Agencies and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to eliminate horseback field trials. We do not have enough suitable grounds to meet the needs of our regional and championship trials in some areas. I continue to be puzzled by the selective attitude of some state DNRs, their revenues are based on hunting license fees which are declining each year, yet they persist in defining field trials as not being a compatible part of hunting. Also show sites have experienced negative local regulatory laws. The American Brittany Club must continue to oppose each and every one of these pieces of legislation if we want our sport to continue.

Action Items:

1. Qualifications for the 2010 Championships.
2. Continue holding the All Age Championships at Booneville 2011, 2012, 2013.

1st VICE PRESIDENT - Tom White, NO REPORT

2nd VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Judy Robin

September 13, 2010

As mentioned previously, Karen Nelsen approached me by telephone in early March regarding their interest in becoming a recognized ABC/ AKC club. The proposed name of the Club is Grand Canyon Brittany Club (GCBC) and is located in the northern part of Arizona (called the "high country") situated near Prescott and Flagstaff.

Karen submitted a well presented binder with all the information needed to start a new club, and a New Club Profile for Field Trial/ Hunting Test was sent to AKC. GCBC's binder includes: history of their club, constitution and by-laws, letter of agreement indicating they will promote the dual dog and will accept open dates assigned by ABC Regional Dates Coordinator, emails of endorsement from Greater Phoenix and Sahuaro, club officers/directors/ application forms, membership data, and service area maps, minutes of club meetings, club activities, newsletters, advertisements, information about their website (www.grandcanyonbrittanyclub.org), information about the grounds they propose to use for field trials and hunt tests, and information about their financial situation. GCBC has sent in all requested information to become a new club.

My concerns, however, regarding the ABC's recognition of this Club are:

1. They have a statement indicating they started the new Club in September 2009. New Clubs have to be in existence for one year prior to becoming recognized by AKC. I have my doubts that the Club has been in existence this long since no one indicated interest in forming a new club until March of 2010.
2. As of the time of receiving the binder (August 16), GCBC has only \$300 in its bank account.
3. GCBC has no insurance. The Club cannot afford insurance, cannot receive insurance through ABC until recognized and cannot hold fun trials until they get insurance. We have suggested perhaps they could ask one of the other Arizona clubs to sponsor a trial with GCBC doing all the work and funds going to GCBC. Suggestions were also made regarding insurance through The American Field.
4. GCBC has 13 full members, 11 of which are Arizona residents. Nine are associate members and two are comp members. The members have a lot of experience in field trialing.
5. There have been many discussions with Karen as to whether the GCBC members are members of ABC. Some of the members are members of other recognized ABC clubs.
6. To date, the Club has only had two club activities (besides membership meetings) - one training day and rummage sale. They are scheduled to have a snake avoidance clinic in September.

It is my belief that GCBC should work out their insurance situation, increase their activities to bring in more income and define their membership before recognition as a new club.

3rd VP AGENDA REPORT – Chris Ward-Weber

September 2010

2009 National Specialty managed to go off with few problems. Our show site although small got us through with some great grass areas, good access to the trial grounds and great weather. With 2009 bringing ABC our lowest entry in recent years and poor economy, the show still managed to secure a profit of \$205,200! This success is due to great trophy support, and many hard workers.

Our 2010 show site is new and will hopefull increase entries. Our new contract is with the Fort Smith Expo center, giving us 13, 000 square feet, good RV facilities. We have added National Specialty Apparel showing good sales so far. For the 2010 Show I applied and received a \$1500.00 grant to be applied toward our rental costs. I have also order our trophies for 2011 reducing our cost on our large ticket items by 35%. If all things stay on track 2010 should again be in the black.

I posted an online judges list and it met with great success with over a 100 individuals voicing their opinion. The judges have been hired for 2011 and 2013, 2012 pending. Much of our show information has gone on line making things smoother and allowing for more shared information.

In 2011 I will be adding a 12 – 15 month class, and Amateur Owner Handler. Depending on the Obedience & Rally entry Obedience and Rally may be changing to an all breed event.

Barbra Dayton has been handling the summer Specialty and we have coordinated well.

I am hoping for more improvements in the coming year. I appreciate the board's support through the changes I have requested.

DUTIES OF THE 3RD VICE PRESIDENT

1. (Per By-Laws adopted December 2, 1975, Art. VI, Sec. 6d): Shall assume the duties of the President in the event the President, 1st Vice President, or 2nd Vice President are absent or unable to perform the duties of such office. The 3rd Vice President shall be designated as the officer in charge of the affairs of the Club pertaining to the National Specialty Show and the Summer

Specialty Show, and shall be a member ex-officio with vote of any committee dealing with the affairs of such office.

2. National Specialty Show:
 - A. If the 3rd Vice President does not desire to serve as show chairman (secretary), appoint a chairman (secretary) on or before January 15 of each calendar year, such appointment to be approved by the president.
 - B. Approve all committee members to the show committee, to be appointed by the appointed chairman on or before March 1 of each calendar year.
 - C. Notify the executive secretary of the committee chairman and members, and the president of the committee members, not later than March 15 of each calendar year.
 - D. Coordinate with the show chairman (secretary) the selection of a show secretary (note, neither the show secretary nor members of their immediate family can exhibit dogs in such show).
 - E.
 1. If the veterinarian is not being paid, arrange for a gift for him them.
 2. Arrange for local publicity.
 3. Arrange for or notify local newspaper re: photographers for specialty show.
 4. 3rd vice president is responsible for getting show results to 1st vice president directly after the show, for the awarding of the dual dog award.
 - F. Coordinate with the show chairman secretary and show secretary all preparations for the show.
 - G. Coordinate with the ABC Executive Secretary all preparations for the show.
 1. Send the properly completed application for approval of judges, special events, disaster plans and other forms required for the National Specialty Show to the executive secretary for the signature of the executive secretary who will then forward the properly completed and signed applications to the proper department(s) of AKC. *AKC must receive these forms no later than six months prior to the National Specialty Show.*
 2. *The 3rd Vice President is authorized to establish entry fees for the national specialty show subject to the approval of the board of directors one (1) year in advance of when a year is available from the time of the committee formation and the event. During transitions of the office one year is not available, only 4 months from transfer to application need to be filed with AKC. (I would like to add to this section rather than as item #9 page 38 in the Policy Book.)*
 3. Neither the show nor judge can be advertised until AKC has approved such show and judge. *(Would like to revise to) "May not be advertised but can be announced after a signed commitment letter is in hand with the show chairperson." (This will allow ABC to begin coordinating site, hotel, photographer, videographer and other needed contracts.)*
 4. Coordinate with Executive Secretary, editor and field trial secretary for applicable advertisements, etc in the club magazine.
- H. A committee of three (3) people from each region is to be formed to get recommendations for judges for breed, obedience and sweepstakes classes.
 1. The committee names should be printed in "The American Brittany" with a vote being taken or a vote within the committee. The top 5 of 6 names would be used to select judges.
 2. Any judge selected for the national specialty conformation competition would agree not to judge any Brittany classes within six (6) months prior to the national specialty show. No Brittany solely owned or co-owned by the judge may be exhibited at the national specialty show in any class or classes. (2006)
 - a) A short announcement will be placed in the magazine and on the club website with the names of the judges' selection committee along with their e-mail and mailing addresses. The announcement will advise all ABC members that they can submit proposed judges' names to members of the committee. ~~All names submitted must have a brief statement of the person's qualifications for judging at the national specialty show. (Delete as redundant since this is done by the committee when nominations are brought down to 10)~~
 - b) A separate committee of people who compete in obedience and/or rally shall nominate judges for the national specialty show in these areas. Names of judges for obedience and rally must be able to judge both. The procedure for selection shall be the same as indicated in item d below.

- c) A separate committee of people who compete in agility shall nominate judges for the national specialty show in agility. The procedure for selection shall be the same as indicated in item d below.
- d) After the deadline for submission as set by the show chairman, committee members will send to the show chairman a list of ten (10) proposed judges along with qualification statements. The show chairman shall compile a list of the top ten judges (meaning named most often by the committee members) and send the resulting list along with qualification statements for those ten to the committee members for "ranking" from one to ten, with one being the most preferred. After these ranking lists are returned to the show chairman, the show chairman will compile a final list according to the rankings submitted by the committee members. The judge most preferred will be contacted for the proper judging assignment. If that judge is not available for the year proposed, the show chairman shall ask if the next year is available.
- e) After the judges are approved by the AKC, the national show chairman will announce their judging assignment in the magazine and one the website along with a short biography and picture of each judge (if provided by the magazine deadline).
3. Any judge selected for the national specialty sweepstakes competition would agree not to judge any Brittany classes within four (4) months prior to the National Specialty Show. No Brittany solely owned or co-owned by the sweepstakes judge may be exhibited at the national specialty show in any class or classes. (2006) *(Like to add) "A dog owned or co-owned may be shown in classes where winners do not compete for Best of Breed, but not in any sweepstakes class."* *(These would be Stud Dog and Brood Bitch classes.)*
4. No **Breed or Sweepstakes** judge will be allowed to judge more than once within a ten (10) year period, at the national specialty show in the same capacity. (i.e. a judge hired to do sweepstakes shall not be hired for a 10 year period to judge sweepstakes, but could be hired for conformation, obedience, rally and/or agility and vice versa.) (2006) *(I would like to exclude this requirement for Obedience & Rally & Agility, as these are performance events.)*
5. The show chairman may select judges three (3) years in advance of the national specialty show in order to be able to have well-qualified judges available and under contract.
- I. The 3rd Vice President shall then send a contract of acceptance of the judging assignment to the selected judges for their signatures prior to sending the applications to the executive secretary and shall retain the signed copies in the show files.
- J. Coordinate with the show secretary **or superintendent** to arrange for printing of premium lists and catalogs, distribution of premium lists, receipt of entries. *(Show superintendents have been printing the premium the last few years.)*
- K. Coordinate with show secretary **or superintendent** that said secretary obtains show armbands, the AKC book, ring numbers, elastics, the judge's book, AKC approved measuring device, ring, ropes and mats, etc. *(Show superintendents have been doing these things the last few years.)*
- L. Coordinate with the show chairman (secretary) and show secretary the selection of a ring steward it would be advisable not to use a steward who has an entry in the show nor any member of his immediate family.
- M. Coordinate with the show chairman that transportation, **hotel accommodations and meals** to be provided, as required, for the judge. *(Over looked in Policy Book.)*
- N. Coordinate with the managing editor, "The American Brittany" that a photographer has been arranged to provide photographs to the magazine, as well as winners, the write-up for "The American Brittany" magazine.
- O. Select a photographer for the national specialty show, and arrange for the proper photographs to be taken. Follow up with photographer to be sure pictures are sent to the magazine. Select a reporter for the show and check to be sure a write-up is sent to the editor. Arrange with the official photographer to furnish a picture of BOB to the AKC for publication in the "AKC GAZETTE" in "Spot Lighting the Shows". (This is free if AKC receives it in a timely manner and should be utilized by the ABC in advertising the winner of the national specialty show.
- P. Coordinate with the show chairman that arrangements have been made for his committee, or other people, to set up the show ring, then dismantle it at the conclusion of the show.
- Q. Coordinate with the ABC treasurer, as required, for payment of judge's expense, site rental, etc; if independent financial records are being kept by the show committee, insure that detailed financial statement is forwarded to the ABC treasurer within thirty (30) days following such show.
- R. The 3rd Vice President (Show Chairman) shall appoint the following coordinators for the National Specialty Show: Obedience/Rally, Auction/Raffle, Chief Ring Steward, Specialty Trophies, Booths, Hospitality, Equipment and Set-up, Ribbons, Juniors, Agility (when offered by ABC at the National Specialty). [These coordinators in no way replace the National Committee Chairman appointed by the ABC President.
3. Coordinate with the managing editor, "The American Brittany" that appropriate write-ups and photographs appear for the national specialty show, ~~summer specialty show and all regional club specialty shows; coordinate with regional clubs that hold specialty shows to insure appropriate publicity through write-ups and photographs.~~ *(Delete)*
4. Aid, assist, and encourage regional clubs to establish and hold specialty shows under rules and procedures of the AKC. *(It is recommended the following numbering sequence be corrected. I have however left them the same for easier reference.)*
6. Give appropriate guidance and counsel to all committee chairmen and committees that in part, or wholly, deal in affairs pertinent to the office of the 3rd Vice president.
- A. Breed Standards Committee
- B. Trophy Committee
7. With respect to both the national specialty and the summer specialty **shows' information to be provided by the chairperson of that event and copied to the 3rd VP (change)**, prepare and promptly deliver to the ABC Executive Secretary and the ABC executive secretary a show catalogue appropriately marked to reflect the results of each such show.
8. If possible the national specialty show be given its own day between the national open championship and the national amateur. *(It has been recommended item #9 be included in section G 2 above.)*
10. The show committee shall have the authority to name the classes covered by trophies and the number of trophies in each class for the national specialty show. The trophy committee shall be responsible for the actual selection of the trophies. (1973)
11. Any acknowledgments, awards, commemoration, commendations, declarations, salutations, or other documents, gifts, prizes, donations or trophies, when issued or presented in the name of The American Brittany Club and requiring authenticating signature, only bear the signature of the President, Executive Secretary or Secretary of the ABC, or with the knowledge, direction and concurrence of the President, Executive Secretary or Secretary, the signature of that other Officer under whose jurisdiction such matter is issued and distributed. (1977) *(I think some of this could be empowered back to the 3rd VP. This is requiring redundant work.)*
12. The 3rd Vice President may employ the services of a professional show secretary or superintendent upon approval by the president and notification to the board. (1984) **Notification is not required when a current contract is in place.**
13. Submit a report of your activities and recommendations to the agenda chairman in advance of the annual board meeting. This must be done far enough in advance so the agenda chairman can have the agenda in the hands of the directors 6 weeks prior to the annual meeting. (1992)
14. Officers shall be reimbursed for telephone and postage expense when bills are presented, subject to presidential approval, to be paid by the treasurer.
15. The 3rd Vice President shall submit an annual budget to the board of directors for consideration and approval at the annual meeting for the next annual event. *(This is not possible during transitional years when a new 3rd Vice President is elected because the new 3rd Vice president does not take over until January 1st of that year. I would like to add: "or by e-mail vote during those years when a new 3rd Vice president is taking over."*
16. At the National Specialty Show and the Summer Specialty Show the following classes are required: Field Trial Class (dogs and bitches), Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class and Veterans Class (dogs and bitches). (11/93) *(I would like to add) "Additional Classes to be considered are Best Junior, High Scoring Brittany (when Obedience is available) and Hunt Test Classes at the Summer Specialty."*
- ~~17. At the National Specialty Show and the Summer Specialty Show, the following classes are required: Field Trial Classes (dogs and bitches), Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class, Veterans classes (dogs and bitches). (This sentence should be deleted as it is redundant to item #16 above.)~~
- At the National Specialty Show **ONLY** the following **additional** classes are required: Dual Champion Classes and National Qualifier classes. Qualifications for Field Trial classes shall be one field trial placement during the immediate past year. *(I would like to add) "from the date of closing of the Specialty year prior to the current National Specialty Show"* or be a Field Champion, an Amateur Field Champion or Dual Champion of record with AKC. Qualifications for Dual Champion Classes shall be Dual Champion of record with AKC. *(I would like to add) "the Show, Field or Amateur Championship date must be included on the premium."* Qualifications for National Qualifier classes shall be limited to dogs and bitches who have qualified to run in the American Brittany Club National Open Gun Dog Championship field trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur Gun Dog Championship field trial, American Brittany Club National Amateur All-Age Championship Field Trial, and the American Brittany Club Open All-Age Championship field trial for the current and preceding years only. Dogs and bitches who qualify after The show's closing date will be eligible to show the next year only and those that qualify prior to the closing date shall be eligible for that current year and the following year. Dogs and bitches only have to be qualified to run in the National Field Trial events, not actually compete. Dogs and bitches placing first in the Field Trial classes, Dual Champion classes and National Qualifier classes shall be eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition.
18. Regional club shows shall conform to the National Specialty requirements with regard to offering field trial classes. They are not required to offer stud dog and brood bitch classes. Regional clubs are not permitted to offer Dual Champion or National Qualifier classes.
19. The 3rd Vice President may select judges three (3) years in advance of the national specialty show in order to acquire our top show judges.
20. The premium list for obedience exhibitors should state: Refund of entry fees for bitches in obedience that come into season after the closing date of this show may be obtained by sending veterinarian's certificate to the show secretary. This certificate must be postmarked before the opening day of the show or given to the show secretary before the start of the show. *(I would like to add) "Move ups are allowed."*
21. The trophy committee shall accept donations for the show and obedience classes by individuals, breeders, and/or kennels. Donations for rotating trophy/trophies for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex shall be accepted. (1995)
22. The show site selection must be approved by the ABC board of directors. (1996) The 3rd Vice President should present to the Board of Directors as part of their Agenda Report each year the proposed show site for the next two (2) years. (2008)
23. The board approved a trophy offered by Becky Rao for competition at its annual National Specialty Show only, the Becky Rao Trophy to be awarded at the national specialty show each year to the Best of Breed winner. For permanent possession, it must be won three (3) times by the same owner, not necessarily with the same dog, nor at consecutive shows. The name of the winning dog will be engraved on the trophy. The trophy is to be maintained by the current recipient until the next year's specialty. (2006) The previous trophy donated by Dennis P. Jordan DVM Memorial Trophy was retired in 2006 as Andrea Jordan Lane met the requirements.
24. All ABC sponsored events i.e. Futurities, Summer Specialty Show, National Specialty Show, Open All Age Championship, Amateur All Age Championship, Gun Dog National Championships, and Classic or any other events as may arise, coordinate activities related to fund raising with the National Auction Committee and submit all anticipated and contacted solicitation and donor lists to the chairman of that committee. (2000) *(Please clarify what this means. Is there a current list available? If not, why do I need to supply all contacted solicitation and donor lists?)*
25. Vendors will not be allowed to conduct auctions and/or raffles at ABC events. (2000) Exception (Brittany Rescue Organizations) 2002
26. Assign a member of the event committee to promote ABC fund raisers including the national auctions and raffle ticket sales to offset expenses incurred by the event. (2008)
27. The National Show Chairman/3rd Vice President shall be eligible to handle and compete at the National Specialty Show in agility, obedience and rally competitions with dogs either solely owned or co-owned by him/her. The National Show Chairman/3rd Vice President will not handle or enter into conformation competition any dogs solely owned by him/her, but dogs co-owned by him/her but not handled by him/her shall be eligible for conformation competition at the National Specialty Show. (2006) *(I would like to change to) "any dog co-owned by National Show Chairperson that resides with said person shall not be eligible to be entered in conformation. If the 3rd VP/Show Chairperson is competing in Obedience, Rally or Agility when possible finds a Co-Chairperson who can chair Obedience, Rally & Agility."*
28. *(I would like to add) "The show Chairperson should clarify with the Breed Judge as to the handling of the awards of merit before judging, i.e. will the awards of merit be handed out in order or just awarded." (This makes handling of awards of merit easier.)*

SUMMER SPECIALTY SHOW

Summer specialty show: By action of the board of directors in 1968, it was voted affirmatively that each ABC region "be allowed to host a summer specialty show in turn". The 3rd vice president shall have the authority for assigning the sponsoring club(s). *(I would like to add) "or may assign or have assigned that responsibility to another named party such as the Summer Specialty Show chairperson"* for the summer specialty show to insure that the show shall rotate, in order from region to region. (1980) *(This is currently being done.)*

- A. Enforcement of this "rotating policy" by coordinating with the president a permanent five (5) year schedule that the summer specialty show will be held on a region-by-region basis.
- B. Coordinating with regional inter-club councils, where same exist, or communicating with each regional club in a region to determine if the region as a whole, or a club or clubs desire to act as host for the summer specialty show in their region—all such arrangements to be made at least three (3) years in advance, if possible.
- C. Coordinate with the president the appointment of a show chairman for the Summer Specialty *(I would like to add) "and have the premium reviewed by the 3rd VP to insure that the classes, ribbons and ABC's class requirements are correctly put in place."* *(This will ensure all the bases are covered.)*

- D. Coordinate with the show chairman of the Summer Specialty and with the person co-coordinating the event rotations the appointment of a show secretary or superintendent and members of the show committee.
- E. The (I would like to add) **"Show chairperson of the Summer Specialty will notify the 3rd VP"**, president and executive secretary as to the chairman and members of the show committee. (This will ensure all responsible parties are notified.)
- F. The Summer Specialty Show may be held as an Independent Show or as a Designated Specialty Show in conjunction with an All Breed Show in May, July or August. (2002)
- G. (I would like to add) **"The 3rd VP will coordinate with the Summer Show Committee"** the selection of the all breed show and choice of judge. (This will ensure everyone on the committee knows what is happening.)
- H. (I would like to add) **"The 3rd VP will"** approve, with the president's approval, the site, date, type of show to be held and the choice of judge. (2002) (This change will make this requirement more specific as to whose function this is.)
- I. (I would like to add) **"Hosting Club will"** notify the editor of "The American Brittany" of appropriate information for advertisements, etc. (This change will make it more specific as to the responsibilities.)

(The following section comes from "Summer Specialty Show" section of the Policy Book beginning on page XX. This section should be combined with the items above referring to the Summer Specialty Show.)

The summer specialty show committee shall, under the direction of the 3rd vice president (I would like to add) **"or appointed committee chairperson,"** (This is already being done.) arrange for host clubs for the summer specialty show so that each region be allowed to host the show in turn. Efforts shall be toward a permanent five (5) year region-to-region rotating schedule. Arrangements should be approximately three (3) years in advance. The Board shall approve host clubs at its annual meeting each year.

The summer specialty show may be held as an Independent Show or as a Designated Specialty Show in conjunction with an all breed show and shall be held in May, June, July or August. (2002) If held as an independent the Veteran class will be 8 years and older. The Field Trial class will be for dogs who have earned a Field Trial Placement in the calendar year prior to the show's closing date of be a finished Field Champion.

The application for the show shall be sent from the ABC office. The host club shall send the date of the show and the name of the all breed show to the executive secretary as soon as possible so the application may be sent to AKC.

If a sweepstakes is to be held, all the information for that shall be sent to the ABC office for the form to be sent in a timely manner.

The host club is responsible for getting trophy donations themselves, but the ABC shall be responsible for a trophy for Best of Breed with a value of up to \$75 and a Best of Opposite Sex with a value of up to \$50. If the host club's trophy donations cover the cost of all trophies, ABC will NOT buy the Best of Breed or the Best of Opposite Sex trophies. If the host club collects more for trophies than is spent for trophies, the excess shall be passed on to the next host club for the next summer specialty. (1979)

The ad for the summer specialty shall be sent to Managing Editor by the host club. There shall be no charge for this one ad. Any additional advertising for events held in conjunction, is limited to 1/4 of that page. Deadline for the ad shall be the first of the month preceding the issue it is to appear. (I would like to add) **"The completed write up will be sent to the editor with photos of BOB, BOS, WD, WB, BW, Best BBE, Puppy & Junior, if available. (Top winners: BOB, BOS, BW, WD, WB photos will be included at no charge to the event winner.)"** (This will ensure the results are sent to the magazine.)

The official ABC emblem is available by e-mail from the ABC Executive Secretary. The official ABC medallions are also available from the ABC Executive Secretary for replacement costs.

It shall be the responsibility of the summer specialty chairman to notify the next year's host club of the previous year's Best of Breed winner by owner's name and address. This shall enable the next host club to arrange for receipt of rotating trophy for presentation.

Only the Specialty Show held with the National Championships in November shall be called "The National Specialty Show." The winner of the Summer Specialty Show shall be called "the winner of the Summer Specialty Show." The Sequani's Dana Macduff Memorial Challenge Trophy was retired in 1988 by Yoko O'Shell. It was replaced in 1989 by the Jacques Prince Valiant Memorial Challenge Trophy donated by Bob and Curtis Humphrey in honor of their top winning American/Canadian champion. Three Best of Breed wins at the summer specialty (same owner, not necessarily the same dog) will retire the award. It is a cast Brittany on a wooden base. (1989)

The regular classes and the non-regular classes to be held at the summer specialty shall be standardized to be the same as the national specialty, i.e. Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Veterans, and Field Trial classes. The holding of sweepstakes is optional. (1983)

(I would like to add) **"If Obedience is offered, the premium list for obedience exhibitors should state: Refund of entry fees for bitches in obedience that come into season after the closing date of this show may be obtained by sending veterinarian's certificate to the show secretary. This certificate must be postmarked before the opening day of the show or given to the show secretary before the start of the show. Move ups are allowed. Contingent on hosting all breed's policies. (This paragraph is included for the National Specialty Show premium and should be included to make them consistent.)"**

Those clubs hosting ABC events are responsible for attaining/

securing photos of the winners of the event along with the write-up and sending such documents for publication to the managing editor of "The American Brittany" magazine.

The summer specialty is the official title and IS NOT to be referred to as, or in conjunction with the word "Nationals".

Each chairman shall keep a file of the activities of the year to pass on to the next succeeding chairman. The file shall be handed to the president at the nationals to be passed to the next appointee. If such a file is not received, check with the last chairman. If no file is available, start one. Submit a report of your activities and recommendations to the agenda chairman in advance of the annual board meeting. This must be done far enough in advance so the agenda chairman can have the agenda in the hands of the directors six (6) weeks prior to the annual board meeting. (1992)

At the national specialty show and the summer specialty show the following classes are required: Field Trial Class, Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class and Veterans Class. (11/93)

(I would like to add) **"At the Summer Specialty Show, the following classes are required: Field Trial Classes (dogs and bitches), Stud Dog Class, Brood Bitch Class, Veterans classes (dogs and bitches). Additional Classes to be considered Best Junior, High Scoring Brittany when Obedience is available and Hunt Test."** (This makes the classes consistent with what was stated in classes for the National Specialty Show above.)

4th VICE PRESIDENT – Jim Carter, NO REPORT
2010 Executive Secretary Agenda Report- Mary Jo Trimble
September 2010

I find this to have been a difficult year as Executive Secretary of the ABC. I also find it difficult to explain without stepping on toes of individuals who serve our organization but have had personal problems that have allowed them to slip into not fulfilling their obligations to their jobs in a timely manner. I have spent a lot of time trying to deal with troublesome issues and trying to fill in the gaps and/or respond to the membership on these issues.

Magazine: We have spent an inordinate amount of time this year attempting to get the magazine back on schedule. President Hank Hartnek has brought Bob Fleury onto the magazine committee to help with several issues. Bob spent 12 years in the past as Chairman of the magazine committee. He has been bringing himself up to date on the current process and is working to put things on a more defined and business-like approach to its publication. The Magazine has been the tie that has bound members across the US together. It is a history of the breed, its dogs, and its members. We have records in print that tell us things that even AKC has not tracked over the years such as our National Champions. Yes, we have problems we need to resolve and we are working on them, but doing away with the written history is not the solution as some have suggested. If we have problems, we need to address those tough issues rather than trying to shift them to another venue where the same problems will still exist in getting people to fulfill their obligations in a timely manner. With all its problems, our magazine is still one of the best put out by any Parent Club. We always hear rave reviews when it is put on display at the Press Room at the Parent Club Conference. Getting back on schedule has resulted in smaller issues with fewer articles. As soon as we are back on schedule, this should improve rapidly.

Report Distribution: Thanks to our Webmaster, Steve Ralph, an FTP site on the ABC website was created. Instead of sending large email files to the magazine publisher, managing editor, both national field trial secretaries, and several statisticians, I can now upload all those field trial and show reports to the FTP site which those individuals can download in their own time frame. This has certainly made it easier to track which reports have been received and processed and resulted in fewer glitches of emails not going through or mailboxes that are full. Thank you Steve.

Dog Database: During the last 13 years as Secretary, I have been trying to get a database of dogs created so that the magazine publisher & typists did not have to type all the dog's information each time it places in a trial and is published in the magazine. After being told over and over, it couldn't be done or people didn't have time to deal with it, Gil Hopper has stepped forward and is working with us to create this database. This should eliminate many of the errors made by FT Secretaries who can't read the writing on entry blanks, typists who can't read the writing on the result sheets, and result in less time spent having to proofread, add titles, etc. that the Managing Editor has been trying to do. If we can get a correct AKC Registration number on the result sheets, we can get correct information published in the magazine. Until this is completed, Ken Windom has volunteered to take on the proofreading duties for the Managing Editor to free up her time for the actual compiling of information in a format to send to the publisher.

Membership Data: The Membership Chairman, Linda Langford, is working on establishing on the website a password protected program where regional secretaries can check their club's member list whenever the need arises. I hope this will be completed in the next few weeks or possibly days as great progress has been made this week. While we've had our problems, the current system is far better than when I started as Secretary and the Membership List was being maintained by non-Brittany people who didn't know the individuals and did not pursue why errors were made or why people were not getting their magazines. If this system is put into place, it will solve a long standing problem of clubs not knowing when new members have joined until they get their quarterly reports. This is another thing we've been trying to get put into place for many years and should resolve a valid and major complaint from regional clubs.

AKC and Handicapped Handlers: AKC is currently revising their rules regarding handicapped handlers in field trials. At this writing, the revision is not complete to my knowledge. Basically, we will be dealing

with handlers using ATV's or golf carts and/or horses in walking stakes and walking trials. One of our ABC members is currently in negotiations with AKC Performance Department to revise the rules to accommodate handicapped handlers. I will update you at the BOD meeting on what develops during the next few months. Currently, AKC is issuing letters for handicapped handlers to give to host clubs. These letters outline the procedure to follow for that individual handler based on his limitations with considerations for what is permitted by the state or land owner.

Summary: Were the President and Officers of the ABC sitting on their hands and not trying to correct the serious problems and concerns that face us, I would urge the Board to take other actions, but this is not the case. I hope that you will allow these committees and individuals to do what is necessary to get things on track rather than taking actions that will destroy the very things that have made the American Brittany Club one of the most successful parent clubs under the AKC umbrella. At the same time, I urge anyone who accepts a responsibility for serving the national or regional club to know what that job entails and fulfill those obligations in a timely manner as we are all cogs in a complicated wheel that doesn't run smoothly unless everyone does their part starting with owners supplying correct information on entry blanks, field trial secretaries making sure their report forms are legible, complete, and clear enough to be scanned by myself, to the statisticians, and the typists who do the set ups for the magazine and the National Field Trial Secretaries who depend on accurate information in a timely manner to determine qualified dogs. Once again, I urge everyone to use the ABC reporting form which has recently been revised in order to provide the information that ABC needs to determine qualified dogs for the nationals.

TO ALL DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

5-YEAR COMPARATIVE INCOME STATEMENT

A 5-year comparison of income and expense is included for your information. The year 2009 resulted in a small deficit, primarily due to the \$5000 from the general operating fund which the Board voted to contribute to the Ionia, MI fence project. This amount was not budgeted and without this contribution, the year would have been nearly a breakeven.

Significant variances for 2009 compared to 2008:

- Magazine printing and postage costs decreased in 2009 as a result of printing fewer pages in the magazine. This is not necessarily a positive move, but it did impact the bottom line.
- In 2009, the national open and amateur all age championships resulted in a significant deficit, primarily from an increase in expenses.
- The open gun dog and amateur gun dog championships and the national specialty show all resulted in a small profit.

Details of the 2009 nationals were included with my report for the year 2009, which was previously provided to the Board and is available on the ABC website. More detailed information has been provided to the respective vice presidents for their review and to assist them in making adjustments where necessary.

2010 OPERATING RESULTS

Information through 6/30/10 is included with this report; updated information through 10/31/10 will be provided for the Board meeting in November. Magazine advertising income, publishing editor, printing/mailing costs and postage expenses reflect activity for only four months in 2010 since the May and June issues had not yet been printed and mailed as of 6/30/10. If all six months of this income and expense had been recorded, the net profit for the first six months of this year would have approximated the first six months of 2009.

FUTURE GROUNDS AND BREED ISSUES FUNDS

- Detail of transactions in each of these funds for the past two years is included with this report.
- In November, 2009, the Board approved a matching contribution of \$5000 from the future grounds fund to the Ionia fence fund (this was in addition to the \$5000 from operating funds contributed in 2009). The matching funds must be raised by 8/31/10 in order for the ABC contribution to be paid. As of the date of this report, the ABC funds have not yet been disbursed.
- At the November 2010 Board meeting, I'll present a schedule of the estimated additional amount available for disbursement from the Breed Issues fund for the Board's consideration (will be \$2000-\$3000).

2011 BUDGET

My updated report for the Board meeting will include a proposed budget for 2011. To date, I've received no requests for budget increases.

ACTION ITEMS

1. Consideration of any requests for revisions in budget amounts for 2011, if any.
2. Review the current level of disbursements being made from the breed issues fund to determine if any changes are to be made in 2010. Details will be included in my updated report for the meeting.
3. Review financial results of the 2010 Gun Dog National Championships.
4. I plan to gather preliminary information for the purpose of the Board determining the appropriateness or not of ABC forming a foundation to receive tax deductible contributions and bequests from estates.

**AKC Delegate Report, Judith H. Tighe
September, 2010**

Since being elected to the Field Trial and Hunting Test Committee, I have been working on different projects along with the other committee members. Our main focus has been to set-up and obtain funding for research into assessment of CRP planting of grasses with barbed awns. A 501c3 specific fund was set up through the AKC Humane Fund and a grant was requested. I am pleased to announce that the grant was approved for the beginning of the study but donations are also needed. The Springer Spaniel Club has donated \$2,500, Spinoni Italiano's have donated \$1,000. Other private donors have added to the fund. **As an action item, I am requesting the American Brittany Club donate \$2,000 toward this study that affects all field trial and hunting dogs.** I have attached some information about the "mean seeds" as related to animal health.

Last December, Linda McDonald and the California crew, set up and maintained the "Meet The Breeds" booth. They have kindly volunteered to do it again. I visited the booth last year and was very impressed. The "Meet The Breeds" at the Jacob Javits Center in New York was handled at the last minute in 2009 by a great gal that volunteered to do it again this year, Terri Hilliard. A big thanks to both of them and their staff of volunteers.

Group Realignment has been put off until further research can be done. We do have a number of new Sporting breeds that will be recognized by AKC which will make the Sporting Group even larger. So, realignment is something that must be done.

The Grand Champion title is in effect and we have a number of Brittanys that have reached that goal. The idea of the title was to keep good dogs in competition after receiving their championship to attain a title exemplifying a higher excellence.

The new Garmin, D-40, was approved for use by Doug Ljungren, VP Performance Events.

The FT & HT Committee is now working on building a performance events property ownership model thru the AKC Humane Fund. The Committee is working on preparing an official request to be considered by the AKC Humane Fund. We will be setting up guidelines for donations, guidelines for property management and facility use, etc. As work progresses, I will inform the Board in my quarterly delegate report.

AKC is instituting a new program called "Breeder of Merit". The outline of this program for a person to become eligible they must 1) have a history of at least 5 years involvement with AKC events; 2) earned at least 4 conformation and/or performance titles on dogs; 3) be a member of an AKC licensed club; 4) certifies that applicable health screens are performed on the sire and dam as recommended by the Parent Club; 5) demonstrates a commitment to ensuring 100% of puppies produced are AKC registered; 6) maintain accurate AKC records. For this, the Breeder of Merit will receive discounts on goods and a designation on registration papers. The full information is not out yet but is to be posted on the AKC website by October 1st.

We are still in full alert against the animal rights groups pushing legislation in the States but now they are moving to much smaller localities along with the national PUPS bill. AKC had around 800 bills introduced in 2009, over 900 in 2009 and so far this year as of September 1st, there are over 1,100 bills that have been introduced this year. **As another action item, I recommend ABC donate \$500 to the AKC PAC.** AKC has accomplished a lot in fighting these bills along with the help of a lot of good breeders and dog people. AKC recommends that every club appoint a Legislative Liaison - a person to keep track of all bills in their area and state.

Lastly, AKC is trying to assist breeders obtain the 100% registration. New online tools are now readily available. I have attached the flyer "Six Easy Ways To 100% Registration". Instead of the steady decline in registrations, this new program would give the needed boost to that problem.

ACTION ITEMS: 1. \$2000 Donation to AKC Humane Fund designating the 501c3 "Mean Seeds" Fund.
2. \$500 to the AKC PAC (political action committee) to fight bad legislation.

Addendum to report

There is a pilot program being started by AKC called "Breeder of Merit". This is supposed to begin October 1st, 2010. I have attached an overview as presented by AKC.

ACTION ITEMS

1. \$2000 donation to AKC Humane Fund designating the 501c3 "Mean Seeds" Fund.
2. \$500 to the AKC PAC (political action committee) to fight bad legislation.

SIX EASY WAYS TO 100% REGISTRATION

I FULL LITTER PROCESS: Allows breeders to individually register all the puppies in the litter to the breeder(s) at the time of litter registration for a discounted price. As puppies are sold, the breeder will transfer ownership, ensuring that dog's you breed carry your kennel name and have been designated Full or Limited. No subsequent changes can be made to registrations without the breeder's written consent.

II FULL LITTER OFFSPRING: Gives breeders who have already registered their litters with the AKC a second opportunity to individually register all the puppies in the litter to the breeder(s) at a discount, even though the breeder originally selected the traditional litter registration. This is a great opportunity to take advantage of the discounted price and complete the registration process.

III FULL LITTER PLUS: All puppies in the litter are registered at the time of litter registration, however they are registered in the name of the new puppy buyers. AKC will contact the new puppy buyers to get the name of the puppy. This assures that all puppies have been registered and ownership recorded.

IV FULL LITTER OFFSPRING PLUS: Breeders can register all puppies in the litter after the litter registration in the names of the new puppy buyers. AKC will contact the new puppy buyers to get the name of the puppy. This assures that all puppies have been registered and ownership recorded.

V REGISTRATION AT THE TIME OF SALE:
 A. Breeders ask their puppy buyers to fill out the registration application and pay a \$20.00 check made out to AKC when they pick up their puppy, both of which the breeder then submits for them.
 B. Breeders go online with their new puppy buyer at the time of puppy pick-up and help them complete the registration.
 C. As a last resort, breeders would give the signed application to the new puppy buyer at time of pick-up and would follow-up with them on the importance of registering their dog.

VI UNREGISTERED DOG PROGRAM: Add the individual puppy information and new owner information in the AKC's Online Record Keeping System. The new owners will be contacted via AKC's automated unregistered dog program and reminded to register their dog.

- Demonstrates a commitment to ensuring 100% of the puppies produced are AKC registered enabling AKC to maintain accurate records.

The Breeder of Merit is afforded the following benefits:

- Registration applications and Registration Certificates for dogs bred by the Breeder of Merit bear a Breeder of Merit designation and gold border.
- Complimentary access to \$20.00 value per month for free online reports in the AKC online store.
- Access to the AKC Direct toll free number 800-252-5545 PIN 26000.
- Online Record support to ensure that your records are accurate, complete and easily accessible.
- Breeder of Merit will receive a frame able certificate of distinction.
- Free Online Breeder Classified listings along with a special Breeder of Merit designation.
- Acknowledgement on a special page of the AKC website and in the AKC Gazette.
- Free or discounted fees on all secondary transactions such as duplicate registration applications revoke limited status applications, etc.
- Breeder of Merit web banners for display on your web site.
- Breeder of Merit lapel pins.

Please note that during the initial stage of this program, we are only able to ensure that all applications and certificates bear the Breeder of Merit distinctions when the transactions are processed manually via fax or mail. Online transactions will not include your Breeder of Merit title.

There are many registration options available to the Breeder of Merit.

Full Litter - Allows breeders to individually register all the puppies in the litter to the breeder(s) at the time of litter registration for a discounted price. As puppies are sold, the breeder will transfer ownership, ensuring that dog's you breed carry your kennel name and have been designated Full or Limited. No subsequent changes can be made to registrations without the breeder's written consent.

Full Litter Offspring - Gives breeders who have already registered their litters with the AKC a second opportunity to individually register all the puppies in the litter to the breeder(s) at a discount, even though the breeder originally selected the traditional litter registration. This is a great opportunity to take advantage of the discounted price and complete the registration process.

Modified Full Litter - All puppies in the litter are registered at the time of litter registration, however they are registered in the name of the new puppy buyers. 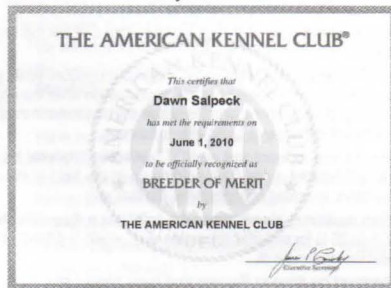

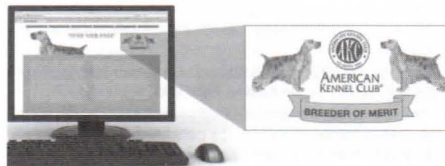

AKC Judges Education, Diana Kubitz September, 2010

We did fewer judges' education seminars, but reached more judges this year. Last year we had concerns, because some of us had traveled great distances to find that there was only one person in attendance. This year we concentrated on doing judge's institutes

and hands on seminars where we knew that we would have more judges in attendance.

Sue Lehosky did the first institute in June and had a good turnout. The committee thanks Sue for her fine work on our behalf. We have turned to Sue many times to do the presentation in her area.

I did the next event at the Sporting Dog Institute in Metamora, Michigan. We had 20 judges in attendance at this event. This was not an ordinary seminar. I had 3 - 4 judges every hour and a half to go over the demonstration dogs that we had on hand. This was a two day event that benefited judges and exhibitors. People bringing demo dogs were: Teresa Richmond and Mike Poehler from Illinois, Ron Auen, Paul Renius, Jeanne and Ron Telfair, Dawn Whitcomb and Ashlee Whitcomb, all from Michigan. We had five champions in attendance, along with 5 class dogs and 5 class bitches. During lunch each breed got to do a field demonstration and on Sunday they added a water retrieve. Mike Poehler got brave with his dual champion and Chip retrieved to the applause of all present! I'm attaching a letter that was written about this event by one of the judges. Judges in the Brittany ring told us that we had better quality demo dogs and far better field demonstration than any of the other sporting breeds. Plans are under way for the 2011 event and some of my committee members are showing interest in attending.

I believe the Sporting Dog Institutes with the hands on and field demonstrations are more beneficial than the usual official seminars that we do. AKC will always require the official breed seminars, but they can see the value of actually "judging" dogs and applying the standard with the mentor in the ring to point out critical points to look for. I'm urging my committee to try to set up similar events across the country to further educate the judges. Two of the judges that attended our event judged Britts this month and did a great job!

My friend Dawn Whitcomb made us aware that there were free conference calls available and gave me the website. To date we have had two conference calls to discuss items of interest to the committee. This is an excellent way for the committee members to talk about problems or discuss changes to the presentation. We will be taking full advantage of this in the future. This feature can be found at freeconferencecall.com.

AKC asked us to come up with a mentor's guide of talking points for the mentors to use when talking with judges. The committee has worked on this and I have attached the list that we have assembled. We will be giving this list to our mentors at their meeting with our committee on Friday, November 26, at the fairgrounds.

Earlier this year the board voted to put into place a policy by which I must report the votes of my committee to the President with reasons why we rejected a mentor, if that were the case. That was one of the first topics of discussion on our first conference call. I can safely say that ALL of the members of the committee are uncomfortable with this process. Obviously if we accept a mentor, there shouldn't be any reason to send the vote to the President. We believe that we need to have categories that a rejection might fall into:

- Insufficient Information: at which point the committee would advise the applicant about the information they require to make their decision.
- Does not meet the qualification at this time: at which point we would advise the applicant what needed to be accomplished to meet the criteria.
- Does not represent the best interest of the American Brittany Club: there are only a few people that I can think of that might fall into that category.

I have attached an updated application that the committee requested of me. They wanted information about the applicant's activities in field trials, Hunt Tests, and their feelings about the dual dog. We had two applicants this year where we needed more information in this regard. The first supplied the requested information and was asked to ride the wagon at either the gun dog nationals or all age nationals and attend a mentors meeting in order to meet the committee's criteria.

The second was known to several committee members so discussions of her field activities were discussed and she was approved.

In 2011 we hope to revise the presentation with new photos and some video. Robin Tomasi was asked to join our committee as she will be taking the lead in adding the video.

ACTION ITEMS

1. We would like board approval of the revised application adding the #7 asking about information about field trials, hunt tests, hunting and feelings about the dual dog.
2. We would like the board to approve a new process concerning the approval of ABC mentors:

Obviously if we accept a mentor, there shouldn't be any reason to send the vote to the President. We believe that we need to have categories that a rejection might fall into:

- Insufficient Information: at which point the committee would advise the applicant about the information they require to make their decision.
- Does not meet the qualification at this time: at which point we would advise the applicant what needed to be accomplished to meet the criteria.
- Does not represent the best interest of the American Brittany Club: there are only a few people that I can think of that might fall into that category.

Information about the votes would be made available to the President if he or the board had questions on any applicants; otherwise that information would remain with the committee.

Write up by Katherine Grant 7-10 Metamora Judges' Education Done Right!
The Michigan Sporting Dog Association Seminars and Field Work Demonstrations

What do you get when you take one dedicated and hard working sporting dog enthusiast and seminar organizer (Kathy Wiecha), 23 sporting breeds, double that number of parent club breeders and mentors and put them in an idyllic hunting and fishing lodge setting for a weekend along with more than 50 judges and aspiring judges? You get an exemplary judges' education experience and surprisingly at no cost to participants!

On June 26-27, 2010 I had the pleasure of attending a judges' education weekend that included presentations by breed experts, hands on learning and field work demonstrations. Several other Canadian judges, including Mel and Joan Beech, Donna Conod, Joe and Janet Lobb, Wendy Schira and Doug Windsor were also in attendance. This educational event was held at the Hunters Creek Club in Metamora, Michigan which is located about an hour drive from the Sarnia/Port Huron border crossing and an ideal setting in which to learn the finer points of form and function of the sporting breeds.

With 22 breeds represented (Barbet, Brittany, Chesapeake Bay Retriever, Clumber Spaniel, American and English Cocker Spaniels, English and Welsh Springer Spaniels, Flat Coated Retriever, Curly Coated Retriever, German Shorthaired Pointer, German Wirehaired Pointer, Golden Retriever, Irish Setter, Irish Red and White Setter, Labrador Retriever, Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever, Pointer, Spinoni Italiani, Vizsla, Weimaraner, Wirehaired Pointing Griffon), it was not difficult to choose 8 different breeds for study over the two days. More difficult, I'm sure, was the scheduling of those breeds and judges into 22 rings whilst ensuring that each participant got their chosen breeds and each study group had no more than 4 people in it. Mel and Joan Beech noted that this format provided a "Great opportunity for intimate conversations with excellent breeders about their dogs. Small numbers allowed for more interaction both ways. We especially enjoyed the field and water exhibitions; seeing the dogs at work was a good overview for the conformation ring."

The highlight of the weekend for me was the opportunity to examine and discuss the merits of about twenty Curly Coated Retrievers that ranged in age from 8 weeks to 13 years with breed mentor, Mary Meek. Sue Clemons, Donna Conod and I enjoyed some lively debates as we tried to come to consensus on our placements of the classes that Mary presented to us. It was a real treat and great learning experience to be able to examine that number of quality dogs in a breed that is seldom seen on this side of the border. Most breeds had half a dozen or more quality dogs of a range of ages present for examination and breed mentors did not just regurgitate the breed standard but instead highlighted the points of conformation that were essential for breed type.

During the two hour lunch break each day, field work demonstrations on both land and water allowed us to observe sporting dogs doing the job they were intended to do and helped cement our learning by increasing our understanding of how form and function are related. From the methodical hunting style of the Clumber Spaniel to the flash and speed of the Brittany, we were treated to the spectacle of sporting dogs doing what they were bred to do. Watching a Chesapeake Bay Retriever work in water and then with a few shakes of its body be nearly dry impressed upon us the importance of proper coat. The Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever demonstrated tolling along the shoreline and the need for an active, agile dog with stamina became clearer. The importance of a biddable, good natured temperament became apparent as we watched dogs of several different breeds working off lead on land and in the water without interfering with one another.

The organizers of this event left nothing to chance...from the coffee and cold drinks that was always available to the tasty lunch provided on site (a bargain at \$12) and the complementary afternoon cakes to the well organized schedule and the pre-event communication, this learning weekend was superb from start to finish. All participants received a large canvas tote bag filled with presentation material on the breeds they had studied as well as certificates of attendance. A big thank you goes out to Kathy Wiecha and the Michigan Sporting Dog Association for a very well organized and well executed weekend of judges' education! I'm looking forward to attending again in 2011!

Kathrine Grant has been involved in showing and breeding dogs since 1978 and has bred Irish Setters and Smooth Fox Terriers and currently lives with two Pointers and husband Dan. She is a licensed judge of Groups 1, 2 and 4 and on permit for half of Group 7.

American Brittany Club Mentors Talking Points

These points are meant to help you in mentoring judges. Our goal in putting this list together is that we all tell the judges the same things about our breed so that we avoid confusion. Keep in mind that mentoring is about giving judges the ABC's version of our breed standard to enable them to judge our breed well and should not reflect our own opinions about the breed or any particular dog.

- The Brittany is first and foremost a DUAL breed. While not all exhibitors may choose to do field work, the dogs should be in condition to go to the field to hunt.
- Structure and conditioning should be such that a dog could step into the field at any moment. Conditioning and muscle mass are part of any dog's conformation.
- It is very important to watch a dog coming and going, but most important is the side movement.
- You must see the reach and drive. Proper reach is the dog's foot reaching out - NOT UP. The upper arm plays an important role in reach. An upper arm that is too short will cause the dog to move the foot up instead of out. A dog with a short upper arm is reaching from the elbow when they should reach from the shoulder. The back foot should come into or beyond the print of the front foot.
- Make sure judges understand how much markings can throw your eye off. For instance, if you think a dog is long in the body; look at the other side to see if it still looks long. Markings can fool you into seeing something that's not there, like a dip in the Topline, etc.
- Color markings on the head and body are not significant in evaluating the Brittany, except black in the coat or nose. Note: the exception is the Tri. Tri-colors are allowed but not preferred. A tri-color is a liver and white dog with classic orange markings on eyebrows, muzzle and cheeks, inside the ears and under the tail; freckles on the lower legs are orange. Anything exceeding the limits of these markings shall be severely penalized.
- The top line should stay level while gaiting and not dip in the middle.
- A Brittany should not be judged in a standing position. While you may need to check some points of conformation while the dog is standing, of far more importance is how the dog looks in motion. Movement is the key to being able to function.
- Please place an emphasis on NOT rewarding structural issues that will prevent a dog from holding up in the field...straight shoulders, knuckled over pasterns, flat feet, etc.
- When mentoring please stress the height as a disqualification. 17 1/2 to 20 1/2 for males and females alike, which is different than most breed standards.
- Comment on dogs in the ring that have proper and improper gait. They should show athleticism, agility and be great ground covers. They should have the ruggedness that they need to run in the field without clumsiness. Proper movement IS breed type for the Brittany.
- When thinking about a Brittany, the word MEDIUM should come to mind.
- This is a square breed; height at the shoulders is the same as the length of his body. Body length is measured from the point of the forechest to the rear of the rump. A long body should be heavily penalized. The length is in the ribcage, not the loin. A Brittany TOO short-backed, taller than long, is severely inhibited in its movement and stamina, so this is no more desirable than being long.
- Expression--Alert and eager, but with the soft expression of a bird dog.
- The eyes should be tight to prevent weed seeds from getting in the eyes while they are running in the field.
- Preference should be for the darker colored eyes, though lighter shades of amber should not be penalized. Light and mean-looking eyes should be heavily penalized.

- A black nose is a disqualification, as is black in the coat. A two-tone or butterfly nose should be penalized.
- Drooping to be heavily penalized.
- Flews to be penalized.
- Bite--A true scissors bite. Overshot or undershot jaw to be heavily penalized. This is the only thing the standard says about the bite, so judges need not count teeth as in some breeds.
- Topline--Slight slope from the highest point of the shoulders to the root of the tail.
- Narrow or slab-sided chests are a fault.
- Any tail substantially more than four inches shall be severely penalized. -- However, this is a man made fault and not as serious as other faults.
- Shoulder blades should not protrude too much, not too wide apart, with perhaps two thumbs' width between. Sloping and muscular. Blade and upper arm should form nearly a ninety degree angle. Straight shoulders are a fault.
- Flat feet, splayed feet, paper feet, etc., are to be heavily penalized. An ideal foot is halfway between the hare and the cat foot.
- Hindquarters should be broad, strong and muscular, with powerful thighs and well bent stifles, giving the angulation necessary for powerful drive.
- Coat, dense, flat or wavy, never curly. Texture neither wiry nor silky. Dogs with long or profuse feathering or furnishings shall be so severely penalized as to effectively eliminate them from competition.
- TEMPERAMENT: Dogs, who show extreme aggression toward other dogs or people, or extreme shyness, should be severely penalized. This is a breed that gets along with other dogs and loves people, especially children.
- First, last and always a dual dog. We have more Dual Champions than any other breed and we would like to keep it that way.

ACTION ITEM

Judges' Education Committee – Robert J. Wire, Western Director
Recent input from the membership has indicated that there should be changes in the qualifications for the Judges' Education Committee.

1. Currently there are no restrictions for inclusion on the committee. It is recommended:

The Judges' Education Committee will not include any members who are professional show handlers. According to AKC, "A professional handler is a person who shows dogs for a fee."

The reason for this inclusion of this is that professional handlers may have an undue influence on judges or prospective judges they would come in contact with as a result of being on the Judges' Education Committee.

2. Membership on the judges' Education Committee should have term limits on their inclusion on the committee.

A. The Judges' Education Committee shall be a rotating, standing committee consisting of one (1) person appointed from each region of the ABC who is active, life member or in the Hall of Fame and in good standing of the ABC and who resides in the region from which they are selected.

B. The President, 1st Vice President and 3rd Vice President shall be members' ex-officio of this committee.

C. The appointed members of the committee shall be appointed by the President and approved by the Board of Directors.

D. Each appointment of a committee member shall be for a term of five (5) years except in the case of a vacancy in which case the appointment shall be for the period of the unexpired term. The five (5) year term of one (1) member shall expire each year. Nothing shall prevent a person from serving consecutive terms or from holding any other office while serving on this committee.

E. Each appointed member and the President shall have one vote in each committee matter requiring a vote. The 1st Vice President and 3rd Vice President shall have no vote.

F. Each year the President shall designate a chairman from among the appointed members of the committee.

G. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to investigate all nominees to be a Judges' Mentor and evaluate all information with current of former ABC members of experience and repute in regions of the nominee's origin, ownership and major exhibition.

H. The Board of Directors, by two-thirds (2/3) vote, may remove, with or without cause, any appointed member of the committee.

ACTION ITEM

Judges' Education – Robert J. Wire, Western Director

ABC Membership input indicates that there should be changes in the criteria for ABC Mentors put forth by the ABC Judge's Education Committee. The following is the current criteria:

AMERICAN BRITANNY CLUB JUDGES' EDUCATION

Criteria for ABC Mentors

The ABC Breeder Mentor requirements are meant to be a guide in selecting mentors. The Judge's Education Committee will be responsible for selecting individuals in their areas of the country that meet these criteria; individuals they feel would be good representatives of the American Brittany Club. The names of those people will be sent to the Judge's Education Chairman. The Chair will review those chosen and then invite those individuals to join the ABC Ringside Mentors. According to AKC anyone having twelve years experience may mentor and sign mentor's slips, so if someone is not chosen to be an ABC mentor, it does not eliminate them from mentoring. AKC does check credentials on individuals mentoring to be sure they have twelve years experience.

REQUIREMENTS

1. A full member in good standing of the American Brittany Club for the past 12 years.
2. A full member of a regional Brittany Club for the past 12 years.
3. Having bred, whelped, and raised Brittany litters in accordance with the ABC Code of Ethics would be considered helpful.
4. Having attended at least 5 ABC National Events that include both conformation and performance (field trials). (5 Total)
5. The applicant, to be effective, should:
 - Be well versed in the history of the Brittany,
 - Be knowledgeable about the Brittany Conformation Standard,
 - Understand the Brittany Performance Standard,
 - Have experience with the process of judging in conformation and performance,
 - Be willing to have prospective judges come to their home or kennel to observe and discuss Brittanys,
 - Attend any classes or meeting for mentors when possible,
 - Realize that their conduct reflects on the ABC at all times,
 - Should be unbiased,
 - Adhere to Brittany standard and its quest to keep the breed "forever dual" in keeping with the ABC Mission Statement.

We thank judges for taking the time to attend Brittany events, judge's education and turning to the American Brittany club for ringside mentoring. AKC's requirements for becoming a judge are lengthy and costly, so we appreciate your efforts on our behalf.

I would like the Board to consider changing to the following criteria:

REQUIREMENTS

- An applicant must be and have been a full member in good standing of the American Brittany Club for the past 8 years
- An applicant must be and have been a full member of a Regional Brittany Club for the past 8 years
- An applicant will find it helpful for their consideration to have bred, whelped and raised at least 3 Brittany litters within the last 8 years and in accordance with the ABC Code of Ethics
- An applicant will find it helpful for their consideration to have attended at least 3 National Events that include both conformation and performance events

FURTHERMORE

- They should know and understand the history of the Brittany
- They should know and understand the AKC Conformation Standard
- They should know and understand the AKC/American Field Performance Standards
- They should know and understand judging procedures for Conformation and Performance Events

AND

- Be willing to host prospective judges at their home and/or kennel for observations and discussions regarding the Brittany breed
- Be willing, whenever possible, to attend Mentor classes or meetings
- Be unbiased
- Be aware that their conduct reflects on the ABC
- Be aware that they must adhere to the ABC Mission and its quest to maintain the "duality" potential of the breed

2010 LEGISLATIVE LIAISON AGENDA REPORT, Mary Jo Trimble
September, 2010

Many states fought battles with animal rights activists again this year. We met with some successes and some losses. Since they have now increased their bills against agricultural interests, we have gained some new and powerful allies. The egg industry has been

hard hit in California and now in the central part of the US. Humane Watch has taken an aggressive roll in combating the HSUS and their status as a Not For Profit due to their preponderance of legislative (lobbying) activities and lack of support for shelters for which their ads solicit funds. Missouri is facing a ballot initiative regarding breeders that HSUS is hoping will pass so as to affect breeder legislation they sponsor in other states, particularly the neighboring state of Illinois.

States are beginning to re-activate or create new Federations of Dog Clubs under the AKC umbrella. The major problem facing these groups is funding. To be effective, these groups need paid lobbyists who can react at a minute's notice. Lobbyists are not cheap and may require pay in the thousands of dollars for one session of a legislature. Regional Clubs and individual members are urged to join and support these groups if we are to protect the sport and ability to breed dogs.

On a Federal Level, a new "PUPS" bill, [SB 3424 sponsored by Richard Durbin (D-IL) and David Vitter (R-LA)] has been introduced in Congress. I would like to thank Ann Short of the CME Brittany Club for the following summary:

"This battle is nothing new for breeders. It began in 2001 with the goal to define a breeder who sells pups directly to the public as retail breeders, and subject them to extremely strict regulations. It failed. Also in 2001 the Doris Day Animal League (now merged with HSUS) sued the USDA to require regulation of in-home (retail) breeders. 3 years worth of battling, it failed. The most familiar step in this journey is 2005 PAWS which pushed for regulation and in-home inspection of small and hobby breeders. In 2008 PUPS 1 (Baby's Bill) introduced numerical limits for the first time on number of animals owned, a bill regulating retail breeders with backing by HSUS and television personalities. It was also the first time internet sellers were mentioned. (I have yet to see a definition for internet sellers but breeders who are proud of their websites promoting or showcasing their animals would probably be included.) And here we are with PUPS 2 surfacing in May of 2010. It is the most recent reincarnation of these series of bills and repeats earlier efforts to regulate numbers, internet sales, and including for the first time, telephone sales."

The following synopsis of SB 3424 is from the Illinois Federation of Dog Clubs and Owners website. You can find a complete analysis by following the link to their website and click on pending legislation. There is also a link to contact your legislators.

- "Co-ownership" questions would be raised by this bill and would prove problematic to quality purebred dog breeders of various registries
- Would force licensing for many hobby breeders under current federal Animal Welfare Act (AWA) regulations, which most home breeders would be unable to meet
- Would not improve conditions for dogs residing in substandard kennels of known current AWA violators. The need for the stated exercise requirements, intended for all AWA breeder licensees, are not scientifically proven
- Would decrease the number of quality purposefully-bred puppies available for purchase by the American public

I urge everyone to read the links that follow and contact your Congressmen. Over 100 legislators have already signed on as co-sponsors of the bill.

 The same issues I outlined in 2009 are still considerations for Regional Clubs as they were in 2009. During the last few years the American Brittany Club has been trying to increase the number of regional trials that advertise their events in the American Field in order to make sure that dogs running in the ABC National Championships and Classics are qualified to receive the title of Champion or Runner-Up Champion if they would win one of our national stakes. A derby placement in an American Field sponsored event qualifies a dog for life as does an adult placement. Regional Clubs that are members of the AFTCA will have win certificates issued to their Amateur handled winners which qualifies them to receive AFTCA Championship titles.

The ABC Secretary has asked clubs to indicate if their regional trials are also American Field sponsored on the ABC Field Trial application blank. The ABC trial reporting form has a place to check if results are also being sent to the AFTCA as well as the AF and AKC. Not as many clubs are members of AFTCA as are now running their trials under the American Field.

A larger proportion of the events NOT run under the AF are Walking trials which does hurt people trying to get win certificates or placements that would make the dog eligible to receive an AF/AFTCA Gun Dog National Champion Title. They still get the AKC National title but not the American Field or AFTCA ones.

Bird Dog Foundation, Bird Dog Museum- Jim Chase

We have made tremendous progress toward obtaining our own space in the Bird Dog Museum in Grand Junction, Tennessee. We have Brittany contributions as of August 5 totaling \$90,104 in the fund. This is for the new addition being to be built to house The Continental Wing. The Shorthairs are at \$75,378 second behind Brittanys. The entire fund contains \$197,145 and represents all the other breeds originating on the European continent. Our space will be separate and as other breeds will be determined by the amount of money contributed by each. The total space to be added is 5,000 square feet and in addition to display space will include rest rooms and a modest amount of storage space. The total cost of the addition is \$316,910 and construction will start when \$250,000 is raised. The Bird Dog Foundation is adding an endowment cost equal to the construction cost to maintain and run the museum. But, this can be raised over a longer period of time and may include will bequests.

It is hoped that this will be the final addition to the museum and be sufficient for a long time.

Rick Smith became the chairman of the Brittany Hall of Fame committee two years ago, taking over from the Cartmells and has made real progress in adding vigor and vitality to the program. He has started a pledge program to contribute \$1000 to the building fund over a five year time frame, \$200 per year, and has completed his commitment early. This is a wonderful way to make a substantial contribution over a period of time. Several individuals and dog clubs have made pledges. Dave Lincoln has revitalized the idea of clubs making a one dollar per dog entered in field trials contribution. We have had several clubs go this route. You can contact me about the pledge program and Dave about the dollar per dog program.

Those of you who have not visited the museum need to see what is displayed now. It is thrilling to see pictures of most of the great dogs, owners, handlers, and other field trial greats in the pointer, setter, and Brittany world. It is amazing that the Bird Dog Foundation took care of us for so many years without much support from the breed. We can thank the Webbs, Cartmells, and Delmar Smith who started our participation and founded our Hall of Fame. The other bird dog breeds are just now starting or thinking about starting. The Brittanys have been participating in the Hall of Fame for over 10 years and the shorthairs have been active for the last two years.

One of the problems is commutation with members of the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame and with the entire membership of the American Brittany Club. To fix this problem, I would like to make a motion to allow use of a separate section of the Brittany Club Web site for the Bird Dog Foundation Communication with the membership of the American Brittany Club and the Brittany Hall of Fame Communications, both voting and nominations.

Book of the American Brittany, 1990-2010 - Jessica Carlson

Mary Kabiner and I have been working together this summer to get all the statistics compiled and completed that will be needed for reports in the book. This is a major undertaking, requiring various references to every title attained, every field trial placement earned, and every major show win achieved. As we get this in the finishing stages after the reporting of events through the end of 2010, I will also be working on the various chapters of the book, and plan to bring in some additional help for that as well. My goal is to have the book as finished as possible by the end of 2011 for publication in 2012. Naturally the sooner the better, but we also want to make sure we have as much complete and correct information as possible before publication!

Futurity Overview - Lisa Pollock and Judy Graves

The number of litters eligible for the 2010 ABC futurity running increased 12% from the previous year. However, we experienced a 25% drop in 2009, so our numbers are still below the 2006/2008 banner year of 144 litters. In 2008, 121 litters produced 754 pups eligible to participate. Of that total, September forfeits were paid for 131 dogs, representing 257 entries (139 in the field and 118 in the show). The combination of litter nomination fees and forfeits paid (less ABC expenses for the program), produced a total purse of \$10,391. The actual number of forfeited dogs declined slightly (131 vs. 135), with the relationship of forfeits paid to actual entries staying relatively constant at 62%.

The Eastern section led the number of entries in both the field and show with 62, followed by the Western with 56, then Central at 41. Total entries were down by only two (159 in 2010 vs. 161 in 2009). We had total entry of 89 field and 70 show comprised of 106 actual dogs.

Because of the economy and section locations, there were only a handful of dogs competing in more than one section. Judy & John Marinelli led the breeders with four dogs from RU-NFC/FC Ajax Diamond Dynamite x FC Rebel Jac's A Hammerin Dandy winning placements in the Eastern & Western sections. There were 14 breeders with multiple dogs earning placements. Of the 48 dogs placing, 45 different owners were in the winners circle. Congratulations to Jessica Carlson, Marvin & Karen Stout, and Mark Ambre who had multiple wins.

Once again, we want to thank each section manager and secretary who put in long hours to ensure a successful futurity. Jessica Carlson and Sara Taylor ran the Western Section, David & Teressa Downing headed the Central Section, and Ed Koska and Darlene Dow were responsible for the Eastern Section. Our special thanks to Purina for their financial support and Tri-tronics as participating sponsors of the American Brittany Club.

Host sites for the 2011 Futurities: are Camp H, California City, CA for the West, Thayer and Creston Iowa for the Central, and Polk and Harrisville, PA for the East. September forfeit forms were sent to all breeders and those owners who requested to be on the mailing list in July. They are also available on the ABC web site.

Steve Ralph has brought up the question of Futurity patches. They are ordered every 4 years, and he would need to order them now for 2012 and beyond. The sale of Futurity patches in all sections has been very minimal. It seems that no one is interested in them. Due to the lack of interest, the Futurity committee recommends that we discontinue the patches for the Futurity.

Reason: Changing the second forfeit deadline to a date 2 weeks later would allow the Futurity secretary more time to process the information. The September 15th deadline date falls at a time when members of the committee travel to attend the fall game bird classics.

- 1. **Page 96 TRIAL AND SHOW 2nd paragraph**
 On or before September 15th of the year following a pup's birth year those owners expecting to start dogs must describe their entries on blanks furnished by the ABC and pay on each a forfeit for each trial and for each show in which it is planned to participate. (2008)

Change to Read:

On or before **October 1st** of the year following a pup's birth year those owners expecting to start dogs must describe their entries on blanks furnished by the ABC and pay on each a forfeit for each trial and for each show in which it is planned to participate. **This payment shall be referred to as the final forfeit.**

2. **TRIAL AND SHOW 4th paragraph**

For those not meeting the September 15th deadline, a late fee of \$50.00 for each field and \$50.00 for each show entry (plus the regular forfeit fees) may be paid before December 31. (2000) Any subsequent deadline changes must be approved by the ABC Board of Directors. (2008)

Change to Read:

For those not meeting the final forfeit deadline, a late fee of \$50.00 for each field and \$50.00 for each show entry (plus the regular forfeit fees) may be paid before December 31. (2000) Any subsequent deadline changes must be approved by the ABC Board of Directors. (2008)

3. **PURSE (page 97)**

The litter forfeits, less all expenses incurred up to the closing of entries on Sept 15th, will be divided equally between the sections holding futurities. The forfeits due on September 15 shall be allocated to the designated section and event for which paid and added to the base amount above. This, after the deduction of 10% for the ABC will

constitute the purse for that section. All expenses for the preparation and running of the events will be covered by the starting fees. (2000-2001)

2010 Report of the Magazine Committee – Hank Harnek SEPTEMBER 15, 2010

The American Brittany Magazine is the lifeblood of the ABC. Producing this monthly magazine is the single most important function that connects and unites all the regional clubs and ABC membership. I believe it is critical that the ABC continue to produce a monthly magazine to provide information, news, event reports and interesting articles for all member of the ABC. There have been suggestions about going to a computerized magazine. I do not believe that we are at that point but as the development of the computer age continues and we are beginning to see the decline of printed material, we may want to consider modifying what we have been doing and refer some of the repetitious monthly pages to the ABC website.

The main problem area with the Magazine this year has been its lateness. Also of concern are the decline in the number of articles and advertising. These have been on going situations for some time. We have had some problems with key people having family health related issues as well as personnel and equipment problems at the publishers. Also, there have been changes in personnel at the publisher. These factors have had a great impact on delaying the publication schedule of the American Brittany.

During a Magazine Committee conference call it was determined that processing results from field trials, shows and hunt tests is a major problem. Some clubs fail to use the standard reporting form and hand writing is often illegible. Both of these make the job of accurate type setting very difficult. Further, some reports are incomplete, which requires more time. These things compound the amount of effort required to produce quality and timely publication copy.

Helping to improve the timeliness and accuracy of the results in the Magazine is the creation of a database system which will allow the Magazine publisher & typists to put in just the dog's registration number to get accurate dog and owner information. This will eliminate many errors and result in much less time required proofreading the results. Gil Hopper has stepped forward and is working with us to create this database. Until this is completed, Ken Window and Kristi Anglen have volunteered to take on the proofreading duties for the Managing Editor to free up her time for the actual layout of the magazine in a format to send to the publisher.

Earlier this year I brought Bob Fleury onto the Magazine Committee to help get us back on track along with resolving several other issues such as lack of content and a decrease in advertising. Bob was Magazine Committee chairman for 12 years. He brings to the committee a wealth of experience as well as a business-like approach to the Magazine. Getting back on schedule will result in smaller issues with fewer articles and less advertising over the short term. As soon as we are back on schedule, all this should improve rapidly.

The Magazine Committee, Managing Editor and the Publishing Editor have spent a great amount of time this year attempting to get the Magazine back on schedule. The publisher's staff is making a serious effort to improve both the quality of the magazine and the timeliness of publication and more attention to details will improve operations. The membership should expect a more aggressive approach from Editors with regard to compliance on submission deadlines, accuracy and completeness. The membership should expect to provide assistance in these areas to the Managing Editor, the Publishing Editor and the Executive Secretary. Collectively, we hope to have the magazine back on schedule by December and have identified and implemented sufficient improvements to keep it there in the future.

During the next year, the magazine committee should again review the magazine portion of the policy book and submit any revisions for Board of Directors approval.

Collectively, we hope to continue to improve the content and timeliness of the magazine.

ACTION ITEM

NEW AGENDA ITEM - Jim Chase, Central Director

I have heard complaints that the magazine is always late and contains information that is no longer relevant. Truth is I have to agree with this especially now that there exists another medium for dissemination of information. Everything in the magazine can be put on the web site. The beauty of this is that we can have a number of editors because the website can be divided into categories. We could have an editor for each category of field, show, hunt tests, obedience, agility, and hunting. We could have an overall editor to assign space and insure backups are made periodically. There could be an individual assigned to take and solicit advertisements. Ads could be on time and relevant. In fact everything could be on time and relevant.

Today most everyone has access to a computer or can get access once a month at a nearby library and it isn't true that old dogs cannot be taught new tricks. Old people can be taught to use a computer.

The magazine last year cost the Brittany Club \$38,000 including editor's salary, printing, and mailing less ads and other revenue. It is not a cheap item. We might have to spend a marginal amount more on the web site but not near \$38,000. Who knows, the dues might even go down.

I move that a committee be formed headed by Steve Ralph, our present web master, to handle and smooth the transition from our magazine to our web site and that we stop publishing the Brittany Magazine December 31, 2011.

I would agree to some form of quarterly news letter published electronically in the transition.

The German Shorthair web site is a good example of where we could go, www.gspca.org. Specifically look up their journal portion. They have obviously put some effort into it.

Magazine Managing Editor – Dee Hempfield

I have kept the wheels turning through a tough and stressful year. I would like to thank Ken Window for stepping up to the plate to help out with the proofing of the field trial, hunt test and championship results; Wendy Archinal for collecting the obedience, rally and agility

results; and Kristi Anglen for collecting, proofing and editing the Action at AKC, specialty shows, futurity and national events, without their volunteering to help we would not have the quality magazine we currently have.

Plans are moving forward for a results program that will help with the inconsistencies and misspellings in the field trial, hunt test and specialty show results and this will also help greatly with the lag time of the actual event and publishing date. We need to thank Robert at the Marshfield Office for all the work he and his staff put in on typing and deciphering the field trial and hunt test secretary reports that have been submitted to Mary Jo. At the beginning of 2010 Mary Jo started up loading those reports to our ftp site for each of those needing the reports to download at their convenience, this saved her from having to email them to a multitude of people. Myself and the Marshfield Office have been using this successfully.

The overall content of the magazine is in the membership's hands, I have a select few that continue to submit articles for print and that is greatly appreciated. I personally do not have the time to track down leads for articles for reprint permission or to write them, that is where I am asking for the memberships help in doing so. Articles of interest, reports of special events, health related issues, poems and short informational pieces are needed. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

2010 National Championship Grounds Liaison (Booneville), Tom Milan

This year's improvements include hay/ grass removal, brush hogging along the trails and \$6,000 in improvements to roads and trails. One of the problems, beaver dams, causing flooding in some areas has been drastically reduced with the trapping of 110 beaver.

This year there has been a fairly good carry-over of quail. Larry said they planned to release 2,000 birds about September 1st with another 1,000 birds just before our Nationals. Costs for birds will be going up due to increased costs. This year 11 week old birds will be \$2.95 with transportation costs of \$600. The BMCA authorized up to \$5,000 to cover feed expenses for the year. Also new netting for the pens needs to be installed. This should be done before the Irish Setter trial in October.

Food plots in the drier areas are ready for planting. Plots in the wetter areas won't be ready for about two weeks. Due to higher transportation costs, costs for seed will be going up somewhat this year. Larry reported there is continued encroachment of trees into the open areas along the courses and in the areas of the food plots.

BMCA has increased the entry fee for each dog from \$6.00 to \$7.00 for 2010. It is intended to increase this fee \$1.00 each year until it reached \$10.00 per dog. The increase in these fees is needed to support continued maintenance of the grounds and infrastructure.

Assessment of grass awn disease in dogs & CRP plantings of grasses with barbed awns

Background and Objective

There is a growing perception among sporting dog owners that the incidence of grass awn migration disease has substantially increased over the past two decades. This disease has been well documented in the scientific and sporting dog literature, but no systematic assessments have been conducted to quantify its prevalence. The objective of this proposed research project is to conduct a systematic assessment of cases of grass awn disease in dogs over the past 20 years and to investigate seed mixes recommended for conservation reserve lands and assess the frequency of grasses with barbed awns as constituents of those mixes.

Grass awn migration disease results when a grass awn enters the soft tissue of an animal and because of its barbs moves continuously forward through the tissue leaving a tract of infection behind it (Gnudi et al. 2005, Dennis et al. 2005). Hundreds if not thousands of such cases have been documented in the canine veterinary literature (Brennan and Ihrke 1983, Frenidin 1997, Walker et al. 2000, Wagner et al. 2006, Burkitt et al. 2007, Bigham and Nourani 2009). There have been several published papers that summarized a large number of cases. For instance, Brennan and Ihrke (1983) reviewed 182 cases of grass awn migration disease (176 dogs and 8 cats). The most common site of grass awn entry was the external ear canal followed by inter-digital webs, eye, nose, and lumbar area. Walker et al. (2000) reviewed 98 cases (51 dogs and 47 cats) and found that several of the bacteria isolated were exclusively from grass awns. The literature also contains detailed case studies of individual dogs such as the Yorkshire Terrier that suffered from septic pericarditis (fluid around the heart) as a result of penetration by a grass awn. This condition is also reported in large breeds and is primarily caused by fatal awn migration (Wagner et al. 2006).

Sporting publications also provide detailed information on serious injuries to dogs caused by the barbed awns. Illustrative are the materials compiled by the Springer Spaniel Parent Club's Committee (formed in 2007 to address the barbed awn problems). This compilation is available to the public at the Committee's dedicated website (www.meanseeds.com). Also illustrative are some case studies of several affected dogs (i.e., two Springers – "Roz" and "Tai" – and an English Setter – "Maggie"), excerpted from materials on the Committee's website and included as examples in Appendix I.

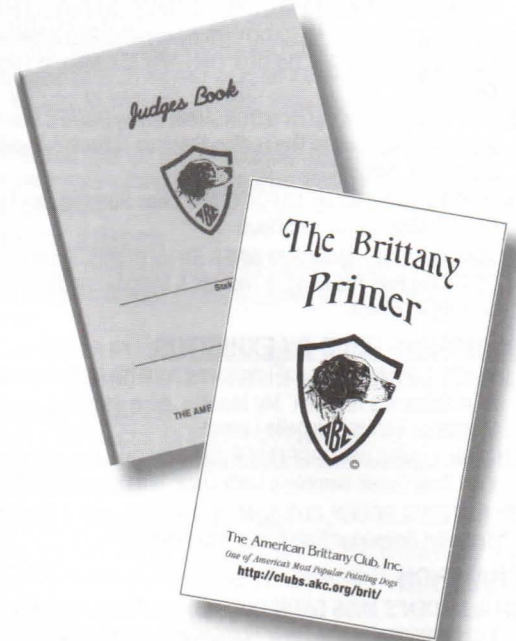
Many sporting dog owners suspect that the increase in the incidence of grass awn migration is directly related to the important role Conservation Reserve Program lands have come to play as locations for hunting and field trials over the past 20 years and the prevalence of grasses with sharp, barbed awns in the seed mixes planted on these lands.

When Loyd was inducted into the Field Trial Hall of Fame he ask if I would speak on his behalf and introduce him. I said I would be honored.

Loyd is a member of the ABC Brittany Hall of Fame and The Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame.

I first met Loyd Budd in September 1969 at a trial in Colorado, I remember this trial because it was my first trial to run dogs in competition on my own. I was braced with Loyd when my dog went on point and I started to flush the birds when this voice (a deep, demanding voice) yelled at me, to wait because he wanted to get a back. His first words spoken to me were "Little Delmar"..... I did as I was told, but our friendship did not start there.

At the 1976 National Open Brittany Championship that I won, would not have been possible with out Loyd Budd's help. Three out of the last four National Open Brittany Championships Loyd had won, and he was willing to help me win. That is trustworthy. His training and handling ability, by the facts, are outstanding. Loyd handled maybe the greatest Brittany of all time Ban Dee owned by Wayne Oliver. I personally was watching when Ban Dee won the National Open Brittany Championship two times, United States Open Brittany Championship once and the Southern Kansas Open All Age Stake in Sedan, KS with 77 entries. I am a poor loser also, but it doesn't hurt to lose to a better performance. Loyd was one of the few individuals years ago that saw the importance of the hour stakes and how valuable would be to the development of the Brittany breed.

I will tell you what Loyd Budd was. He served his nation with honor the Korean War receiving the Korean Service Medal, United Nations Service National Defense Service Medal. He was a loyal friend, trustworthy, would give you needed if he had it, hard worker, fierce competitor/poor loser that would help you two trainers in the history of the Brittany National Open Championship have won more Nationals than Loyd. My memories of Loyd are many, the ones I like best were when Loyd, Jim Holman and I were on horse back at the back of the field trial gallery involved in heavy and light conversation. I think Loyd was at home mounted on a horse in the country with bird dogs as the topic. He was at home in the Sand Hills of Nebraska where he wanted his ashes spread.

When you hear people talking about the streets of gold in heaven where they plan to live, I think Loyd would be content living on a gravel road. He may not be at the right hand of God, but if God needs an opinion on anything he can summon the Bird Dog Trainer Loyd Budd and Loyd would give a heart felt opinion.

A memorial service took place October 9, 2010.

He was preceded in death by his parents Gerald and Willamine Budd, brother Gary Budd and his daughter Julie Jo Young.

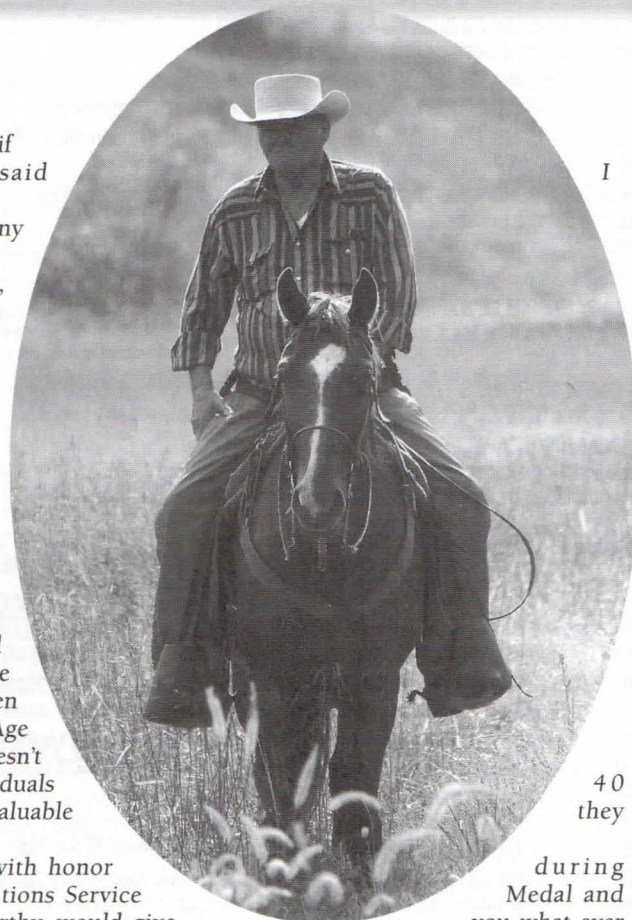

2010 American Brittany Club Futurity Overview

The number of litters eligible for the 2010 ABC futurity running increased 12% from the previous year. However, we experienced a 25% drop in 2009, so our numbers are still below the 2006/2008 banner year of 144 litters. In 2008, 121 litters produced 754 pups eligible to participate. Of that total, September forfeits were paid for 131 dogs, representing 257 entries (139 in the field and 118 in the show). The combination of litter nomination fees and forfeits paid (less ABC expenses for the program), produced a total purse of \$10,391. The actual number of forfeited dogs declined slightly (131 vs. 135), with the relationship of forfeits paid to actual entries staying relatively constant at 62%.

The Eastern section led the number of entries in both the field and show with 62, followed by the Western with 56, then Central at 41. Total entries were down by only two (159 in 2010 vs. 161 in 2009). We had total entry of 89 field and 70 show comprised of 106 actual dogs.

Because of the economy and section locations, there were only a handful of dogs competing in more than one section. Judy & John Marinelli led

the breeders with four dogs from RU-NFC/FC Ajax Diamond Dynamite x FC Rebel Jac's A Hammerin Dandy winning placements in the Eastern & Western sections. There were 14 breeders with multiple dogs earning placements. Of the 48 dogs placing, 45 different owners were in the winners circle. Congratulations to Jessica Carlson, Marvin & Karen Stout, and Mark Ambre who had multiple wins.

Once again, we want to thank each section manager and secretary who put in long hours to ensure a successful futurity. Jessica Carlson and Sara Taylor ran the Western Section, David & Teresa Downing headed the Central Section, and Ed Kostka and Darlene Dow were responsible for the Eastern Section. Our special thanks to Purina for their financial support and Tri-tronics as participating sponsors of the American Brittany Club.

Make your plans now to participate in the 2011 Futurities. Host sites are Camp H, California City, CA for the West, Thayer and Creston Iowa for the Central, and Polk and Harrisville, PA for the East. September forfeit forms will be sent to all breeders and those owners who requested to be on the mailing list in July. They will also be available on the ABC web site.

All Age Futurity

Brace 1 Blazin Tactical Weapon "Tazer" (Linda Holcomb) and Triumphants Beau Smith "Beau" (Linda McCartney) This brace broke away at 8:30 am, conditions were bright, clear and cool. Both dogs broke down the chute, hunting hard. When we reached the lower fields, each worked an edge and ended up with a divided find at the island before the creek crossing. Beau had a second find minutes later at the rock wall before the crossing. After the creek crossing, Beau had finds at 14 and 17, along the rock wall on the left edge and just further up the hill. Beau took some time to be gathered after this second find, but eventually worked his way to the front to join Tazer. Both dogs finished hunting hard.

Brace 2 Sigbrit's Simply Unforgettable "Nat" (Yvonne McKeag) and Dyna's Crown Joule "Joules" (Robert Kiefluk) Broke away at 9:10 am. Joules took off to a big start on the right edge, and showed on the right side half way down the chute. Nat had some trouble getting started, but started to put things together as we reached the lower open fields, where he continued to hunt forward. Meanwhile, Joules worked all the edges on the lower fields and went looking for more. After the creek crossing, Joules went missing for a few minutes, but was returned to her handler before we reached the fields on top. She disappeared to the front from the right side, never to be returned to judgment. Nat had a very stylish find on top at 19, but never seemed to fire up enough to please the judges.

Brace 3 Ajax's Dyna's Hammerin Mandy "Mandy" (John Marinelli) and Diamond Hill Bob "Bob" (Hans Borgmann) Broke away at 9:50 am. Both dogs broke quickly down the chute. Mandy showed herself well on the edges of the lower fields. Bob did the same, but stopped at the island, with a very nice find at 10. After being released, Bob pressed forward to the fields south of the rock wall as we headed up the hill. Mandy was a bit shorter, but hit every edge. Bob had a couple of brief absences, but always showed to the front. Bob finished with a big cast on the left, showing in the next field going away. Mandy finish the brace with a good forward race, but no birds.

Brace 4 Dakota Gun Runner's Buckshot "Buck" (Tom Tracy) and Sigbrits Grin & Bear It "Bear" (Bobbie Sigmund) Both dogs had some trouble getting started, then straightened out in the lower fields.

Bear had a find at 10 along the rock wall headed up the hill. As we approached the top, Bear took the top edge and Buck hunted all the objectives along the center and right edges. Buck had a find at 13 along the center strips, while Bear worked the outside left edge. Both were worked forward down the hill. After the creek crossing, Bear seemed to get hung up on the left side, but finished strong on the edges of the last field, while Buck searched for game quartering the last field.

Brace 5 Diamond Hill Ace's Kid "Tucker" (Paul Pollock) and Lane's End Dyna's Marquise "Markie" (Tom Robin) Brace broke at 10:55 am. Markie set out down the chute like she was on a mission. Tucker took some time to work things out, but both dogs worked the edges on lower fields well. After the creek crossing, Tucker went wide left and was found standing on the back side of the rock wall. Markie worked the right side, and then raced to the top of the hill. At the top, Tucker took the left edge, while Markie worked the right. At 15, Markie had a find in the center strip, while Tucker was too wide left to notice. Both dogs were gathered and sent down the hill. After the creek crossing, Tucker shortened and lost some steam, while Markie finished the brace with the same enthusiasm that she started.

Brace 6 Sigbrit's The Diamonds in Me "Diamond" (Ed Kerr) Georgia's Texas Two Step "Georgia" (Tom Tracy) Broke away at 11:30 am, as skies started to cloud up. Both dogs broke well, and showed nicely in the lower fields. After the creek crossing, Diamond ran a little wider to the left. At the top of the hill, both dogs came together after the first stonewall and were found standing on a large pile of feathers. Upon release, Georgia had another quick find further up the edge, while Diamond broke to the outside left. Diamond crossed to the right at the stonewall and joined Georgia's release. At 20, the 2 met up again for a divided find at the island on the lower right side. Both dogs finished strong to the front.

Brace 7 Marjos Shazam "Sammie" (Joe Luisi) and Augustus of Tiger "Gus" (Tom Tracy) This brace broke at 12:40, after lunch as the clouds broke and temperatures started to heat up. These two got off to a rough start and took some time to get their heads back in the game. Gus had a non-productive on a pile of feathers on the right edge before the creek crossing. Sammie went on to the next field where he

also had a non-productive, backed by Gus. Both dogs hunted to the top of the hill, Gus had a find along the top strips. Both dogs finished forward at a shorter range.

Brace 8 Diamond Hill Micro Brew "Alvin" (Lisa Pollock) and Jagoub's Buzz'n Bayou "Skeeter" (Tom Jagielski) Skeeter led the way down the chute, but Alvin caught up as they approached the lower fields. Neither dog was seen until they were over the hill, found standing at the island. Both dogs pressed forward, a little wide and sometimes erratic. Both finished the brace along the hedgerow heading back toward the breakaway.

Brace 9 Rebel Jac's A Jammerin Jill "Jill" (Dan Rein) and Rainbow's Chik'n McNugget "Nugget" (Ben Lorensen) The temperature really heated up as this last brace broke away. Both dogs broke away with plenty of drive. Jill took the right edge in the lower fields, while Nugget worked the left. Both dogs shortened up a bit as they worked the hill to the top. Neither had bird contact as they hunted their way to the finish.

2010 Gun Dog Futurity

This course was run in an up and back fashion which is our normal amateur gun dog course. The breakaway for odd braces is in a large field then bearing to the right up a long slow incline. After a few more fields you navigate around a pond and move into the woods. Coming out of the woods into a large field is the end. The even braces break into that same field and work in the opposite direction.

Brace 1 Diamond Hill Just Like Mike (Mick) o/Paul & Lisa Pollock, h/Lisa and Brookwoods Just too Hot (Adian) o/Sue Drazek, h/Jeff Currier Breakaway at 7:30 in sunny, clear conditions. Both dogs broke forward nicely. Mick crossed in front of Lisa and went on point along the stone wall at the end of the breakaway field. He worked up the wall and re-pointed, but no bird was seen. Adian was handling and hunting well for Jeff. Heading up the deceptively tiring incline Adian worked to the left of the hedgerow and Mick to the right. Mick went on point in the gap heading to the next field and Adian came in the other side and pointed as well. Both handlers fired. Adian had his second find as did Mick in the gap leading into the fields before the pond. Proving his pedigree Mick was not one to let an opportunity to swim pass him up. Breaking into the woods Mick had a very

stylish find to the left. Both dogs hunted the woods to the end of the course with Mick being the wider of the two.

Brace 2 Hill's Jump N Jac Flash (Flash) o/h Larry Gates and Swift River's The Great Escape (Caper) o/ Fran & Dave Phillips, h/Dave. After a horse incident the reporter was walking for this brace so my apologies for anything that was missed. Caper is a nice running liver dog. Both dogs handled very kindly albeit a little close. They worked all the obvious objectives. Flash was rewarded with a find in the woods holding point very nicely. After circling the pond and crossing into the final fields both dogs had a find in the island to the left. They continued to hunt kindly the rest of the brace.

Brace 3 Rosie the Terror (Rosie) o/h Mario Maile and Little TNT Kaboom (Kaboom) o/h Shan Wessels Both dogs broke away nicely crossing the breakaway field into the next one. They both worked the left edge with Rosie going on point in the gap where birds were found in the first brace. Kaboom went on a littler farther and had his own bird in the left hand hedgerow. Both dogs hunted hard and forward with Rosie being the bigger of the two. She was rewarded with her second find further down the field. This ultimate winner was a pleasure to watch.

Brace 4 Hill's Catch'n the Wind (Bailey) o/Dawn & Paul Hill, h/Paul and Bantam's Firecracker (Popper) o/h Diane Hedstrom. At the breakaway both dogs broke nicely up the hill. After entering the woods Bailey had a solid find with Popper coming in for the back. Both dogs were snappy quartering and working the woods in front of them. Paul has much longer legs so Diane had her work cut out for her to keep up, but she did well. Both dogs were pointed at what turned out to be a very recent hawk kill. For the remainder of the brace they both worked the edges of the field well with Bailey reaching just a tad farther. Popper was given an honorable mention by the judges.

Brace 5 J & A's High Caliber Harris Special (Bullet) o/h Julie Harris—Bye Bullet was on his own yet even without competition he had nice snappy style. You could tell his immaturity and lack of experience, yet

he showed lot of potential and desire. He worked more in the middle of the fields, but when reaching for the edge of the island he was rewarded with his only very stylish find.

Brace 6 Sigbrit's Chocolate Kiss (Mickey) o/h Bobbie Sigmund and Mr. B's Jessie (Jessie) o/h Hans Borgmann This brace was enjoyable to watch even though neither were to garner a placement. They ran a little bigger than some of the more recent braces and also required a bit more handling. Both dogs had a find as we entered into the woods. Mickey had a find down below the pond. Jessie stood on her hind legs to see where the bird had went to the amusement of the onlookers. She then was a little hard to get out of there to move forward. Both carded another find in the island. They finished the brace strongly hunting the puppy course.

Brace 7 Simply Play Misty for Me (Misty) o/h Yvonne McKeag and J & A' Heartfelt Legend of Acton (Pippin) o/John & Ann Short, h/Dawn Hill Both dogs hunted at moderate range searching objectives. Pippin was rewarded with a point and retrieve by the pond. I was afraid Misty was the only dog to go birdless, when she pulled a hail mary point in the gap as we headed out of the woods into the last field. She stylishly held in front of the judges for a lengthy time.

Brace 8 Sigbrit's Catchers in the Rye (Ryley) o/h Bobby Sigmund and Little Liberty Delight (Libby) o/h Aaron Crown Both dogs worked the woods hard, but were not rewarded until a divided find by the pond.. Ryley worked the edge of the island, went on point and gave it up. He worked farther up the edge and then pointed again at the end of the island with very nice style. Bobbie went in to flush and the bird kamakazed across the field. Ryley followed and Bobbie had a hard time getting him to come out of the woods. When he eventually did come forward, Bobbie was WAY behind and she gets my personal award for running like heck to catch the front and she did! In the mean time, Libby had another find on the right edge leading into the last field.

Brace 9 Swift River's Sweet Deceit (Zeva) o/h Sharon Buehler Zeva had come in season and had to run last, as a bye. Although Sharon has been a long time

Brittany owner Zeva and her are newcomers to the field trial game. Neither should be embarrassed by their efforts. Zeva was a pleasure to watch, snappy with desire. She had a nice find at the island. She worked hard the whole time and with a little more experience will be a serious contender for the ribbons.

After their return, both Spice and Tripp disappeared over a hill to the front. Upon our approach Spice was found standing, then Tripp a few yards ahead of her. A bird was flushed in front of Tripp, with Paul taking a back for Spice. Sent on, Spice charged to the front and up over a hill, with Tripp making fast work of the hillsides and valley below, checking in occasionally. He again went out of sight over a hillside, and next we saw both dogs, Spice was found standing with intensity, as was Tripp, just a few feet from her. Both dogs held steady until Jessica got in front of Tripp, and he decided to flush the bird for them both. After a short chase Tripp went forward, working up the next hill and then down into the flat at the turn while Spice went up into the canyon and had a broke find on her own. It took Paul a while to flush this one, so Tripp took the

front and was soon spotted standing by judge Pescod. Impressing the judges with maturity belying his 16 months was Midas Smoke's A Blazin, handled by Paul Doiron. Larry boited off the breakaway out of sight to the front, pointed out once by Paul as he headed over a far hill halfway to the turn. He was finally regathered from the rolling hills to the south to be watered at 12. Larry continued impressive casts into the steeper hills as we watched from the ridge. He swept down a hill on a bold move and upon his return to the front, pointed staunchly on the crest of a hill 100 yards away. His manners impeccable, Larry stood solid through the flush and shot and he was sent forward. He hunted down the hill to the lower part of the course and upon catching the front, he pointed again with style under a mesquite bush. Another stylish and mannerly find, and Larry was sent forward to continue working into the hillsides with his handler as his time expired.

Runner-Up, Mason Ridge's Ajax Rebel was handled by owner Guy Shelander, the only amateur handler in this stake. This being Guy's first All Age potential pup, he smartly chose to simply ride, sing, and let the dog do what came naturally. Jack headed off the breakaway and immediately took to the hills and ridgeline on the right side of the course. He was seen intermittently, always going to the front, then returned to Guy at the pond, watered, and headed on up the hills to the turn. Scout spotted him under a bird a hill over from his handler, and after chasing the single down Jack kindly retrieved it to hand. He continued working the course diligently and with speed to the front, seen turning down a ridge two hills over as we descended back to the lower valley. A brief absence brought Jack in from behind with 6 minutes to go, but he worked willingly forward with Guy in the valley until time.

Third place was claimed by Pike's Racer Rex, also handled by Paul Doiron. Rex made a big move into the hills off the breakaway, quickly carding his first find. He maintained excellent ground speed throughout and finished forward, having two more classy finds along the way.

Claiming fourth to earn the Dual Award for this futurity was Shadow's Tequila Tryst, a tri-color female handled by Ed Tillson. Slower to start partly thanks to a big burr patch early on, Tristyn began building her ground race as we reached the pond. She set her sights on the hillsides beyond and began stretching out bold casts across the ridges. A magnificently styled limb find that she held until the flush sealed the deal, and Tristyn finished forward as time expired.

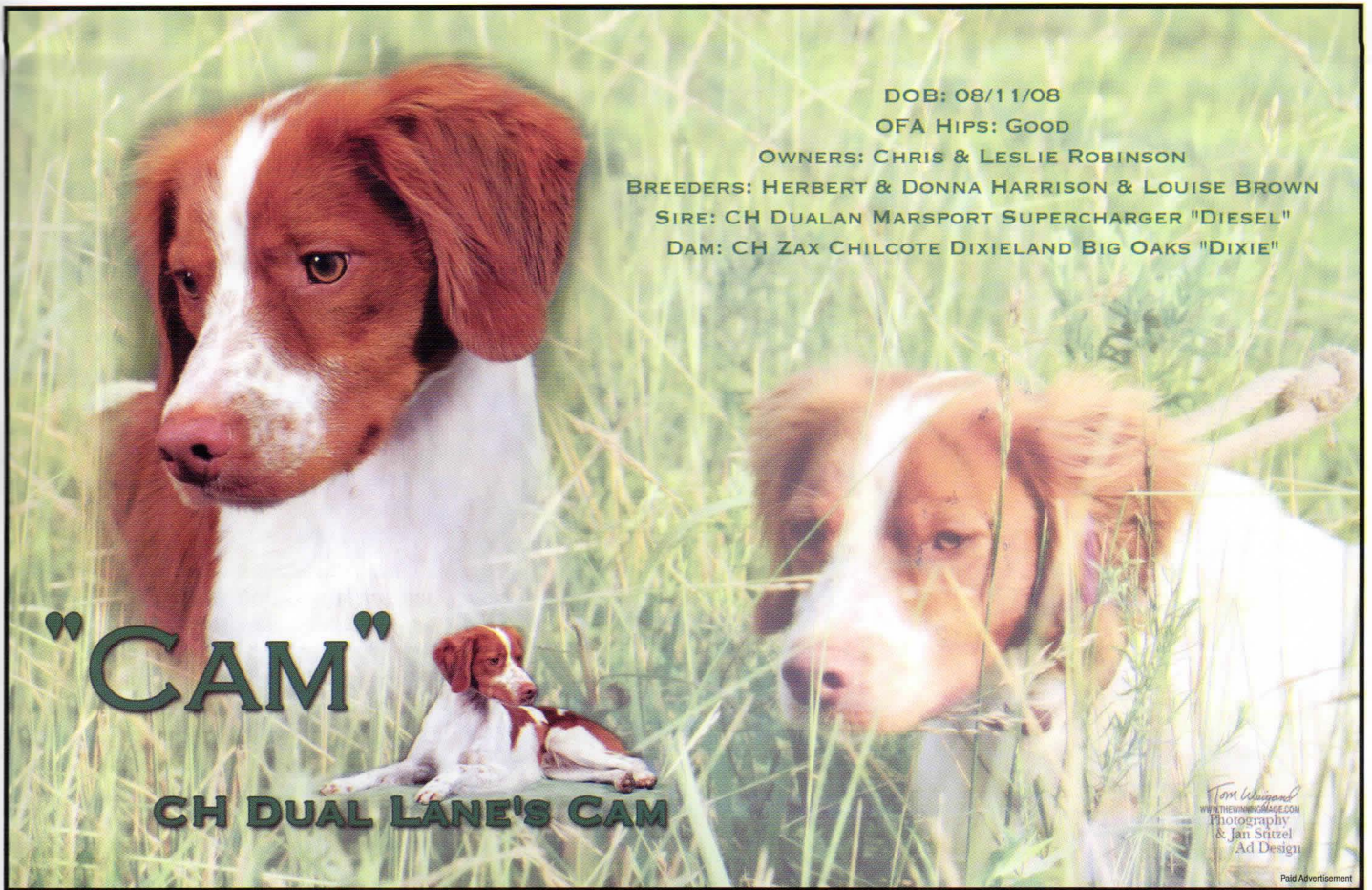

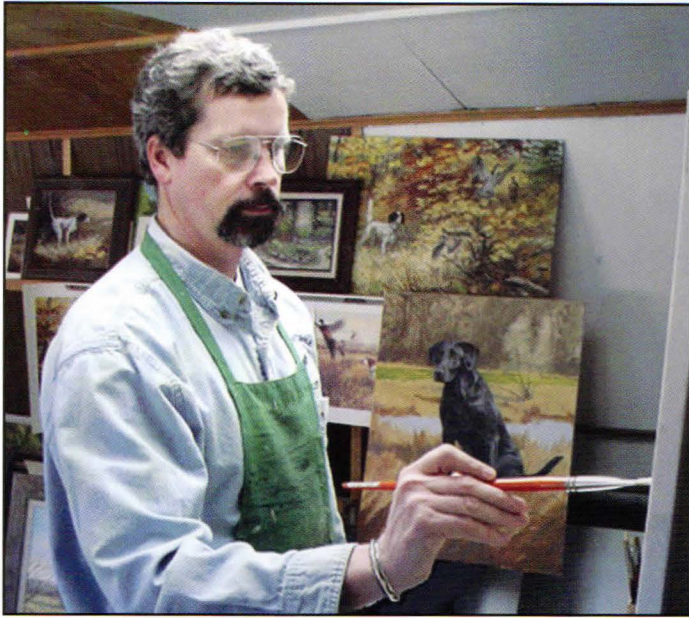

ROSS B. YOUNG

ARTIST

By Neil L. Mace



Ross B. Young is an acclaimed sporting artist by profession, but that only describes what he does, not who he is. He also hunts quail and most other upland game, pursues waterfowl, and trains his own hunting dogs. He has field trialed extensively, handled his own dogs, served as a superb scout and has judged most pointing breeds. He is also a devoted husband, father, and son. But most importantly to the field trial community, he is one of the most knowledgeable naturalist to pick up a paint brush. Or perhaps, better said, that as an artist, he is one of the most schooled in the physical sciences. Young's art reflects not only his love of nature, but his understanding of living things and how each interacts with the other. The combination of love and knowledge are needed in equal measure to breathe life into what would otherwise be a static object of only two dimensions.

Young has inculcated himself in outdoor lore, not just in the classroom, but in the Ozark fields, the Maine woodcock parlors, the West Texas and Oklahoma plains, the prairies of the Dakotas and Canada, and most of the game holding terrain in between. Oh, he has academic credentials, earning his Bachelor of Fine Art in 1978 and his Master of Art in 1980 from the University of Tulsa, but it has been in the field and woods that he has learned to give his art meaning to hunters and field trialers.

Any competent artist can paint a dog on point with rough background added, but to make it believable to us, the dogs have to have been viewed by the artist thousands of times in hundreds of varying habitat. There are those that paint bird dogs from photographs and do a passable job, but that is what it is for them a job, having workman like results. They paint dog portraits. Young paints our magnificent dogs in the field trial courses we have ridden, his paintings force us to relive the frosty mornings on rank horses that had us panting with anticipation, with our breath leaving as steam to match the horse's. We recall the excitement, as a hum ran through the gallery, realizing a dog was getting it done. Subliminally perhaps, we recognize the multi-flora rose hedge, surrounded by a honeysuckle edge, as the dog races through the sedge field to gain the front nearly out of sight to the naked eye, only to appear, when we gain a higher advantage, as a stature on point. In his art, the dog

may be at the center, but the landscape is what makes it real to us.

Subliminally, because we may not be fully aware that an artist must know the chemical components of sedge, trees, and shrubs to properly convey that colors and structure change depending on the time of the year and the location. Unconsciously, we are aware when it is false, but we may not know why. As a naturalist he knows flora, he knows that mesquite does not grow in Missouri, but some cactus does. That honeysuckle grows differently in the edge of a piney woods, than along a cotton field. That Southern pine creates a different shadow from those of the Mid-South. And he paints it the way it is and at the time of the year his subject is captured. It speaks in a way most of us don't, can't, understand on an intellectual level, but we feel it.

It is considered trite when one says, "I don't know much about art, but I do know what I like". But what is most probable being said is, "I don't know why I feel the emotions I do when I look at this piece of art, but there is something that provokes intense feelings". In Young's paintings, it may well be that we are there again, where we so enjoyed the performance of the dog. We could take years of art appreciation and visit hundreds of art museums, and still might not be able to articulate this single truth, sporting dog art must be genuine in every detail to hold meaning. It must be more than a pretty picture of a dog on point, not only must the background be dead on, but the dog's image must show that seconds before he was in fluid motion. A photograph cannot and does not give that impression, it is still, having only two dimensions, but Young's art somehow does convey this energy. It is his ability to create a painted image using his knowledge of the subject rather than copying a photograph that his art apart.

Young has studied the physiology of dogs, he knows what muscle connects by which tendon to every bone, he knows how and why they bunch at a certain point, and what they look like when tensed as they are when a dog points. His still life conveys the intensity of the dog, the very quivering of those muscles, it captures the look in their eyes, when as Freddy Epp says, "they break with everything but their feet". It is not believed that you can gain that intimacy by just watching a dog, and for sure you cannot from a photograph, you have had to have been the one that went forward for the flush to do it justice.

Young is a self-taught, amateur taxidermist, mounting a number of mammals and game birds, to go with his extensive collections of skulls and other bones. It is from their study that he has added to his understanding of how animals move and behave. It would seem you need to know what goes on under the skin to fully grasp what the outside must look like to be truly representative.

A real test of Young's skill is that not only do the actual owner and handler gain enjoyment from his paintings of a past champion, but the owners and handlers of its competitors can recognize the greatness of the dog. How some oil paint brushed onto a stretched piece of canvas can instill an appreciation for the accomplishments of a great animal, is what makes it art. I have witnessed a crusty handler view a painting of dog that beat him, a dog they may have respected, but they sure did not enjoy the outcome of that particular two weeks at the Ames Plantations, say, "You know, I can see what the judges saw in him. He looks like he would have held that point until the cows came home. He was a good one".

Hemingway and Ruark could not have written of hunting and fishing in the moving way they did had they not only lived it, but



loved living it. That the outdoors was their reason for being, as it seems to be with Ross Young. There is no way to accurately count the thousands of hours he has watched bird dogs perform, the number of miles he has spent in a saddle or on foot, the number of successful finds he has witnessed, the number of birds he has seen flown, many of them grassed to his guns. He paints for us because he is one of us.

But then he is different than us in that he sees better, I don't mean just visual acuity, which, by the number of birds he has slipped into my game bag as he neared his limit, is quite good. He sees and remembers things the rest of us do not. He sees vivid colors, he sees shapes that add definition to space, he sees standing objects that are somehow in motion. I recall, as Billy Joel sings, "when I wore a younger man's clothes", Ross and I were hunting an old Ozark abandoned homestead when I noticed he was no longer by my side, which was not remarkable, as he often stopped to study some plant, rock, or track that if I saw, I ignored. This time he was gazing at an old ramshackle barn as though in a hypnotic trance. This was in the early 70s, he was not yet 16, so I was the leader by virtue of having a driver's license, and Southwest Missouri still held quail in good numbers. So as only one in authority can, I unkindly said, "If you will wake up and get off your butt, we can go flush Kirby's and Charlie's birds and you might even be able to hit one". Startled by my words, he walked past me and dropped two birds with two shots. But it was I that was startled the next day when he shyly showed me a faithful pen and ink reproduction of that very barn. Every detail was there, it was as though I was back on the same hillside, where I soon did return. Film could not have shown it the way he saw it, the way he drew it, it was better than the actual building, because he gave it life. I still have the drawing, but I can't remember if I even hit a single bird that day.

As with great dogs, breeding tells. Young gained his artistic leanings from his talented mother, and his fondness for the outdoors from his father, who, in addition to being a sportsman, was the owner of a number of winning dogs, including one inducted into the Brittany Hall of Fame, The Magic Moment.

He and his wife, Judy, upon graduation from college, prior to starting a family, decided to hike the 2,000 mile Appalachian Trail, from Georgia to Maine. This experience left an everlasting

impression on them both, as they continue to be avid hikers. Treks in remote areas of the Eastern and Western United States have given Ross a first hand understanding and knowledge of nature in its wildest form, which is always present in his art.

But it is in the painting of our champions that he has made a lasting contribution to our beloved sport that is unmatched by any practicing artist. Many of his paintings are featured in the Bird Dog Museum and the Field Trial Hall of Fame, so that we and future generations can enjoy the true vision of our greatest dogs.

He took over the painting of the National Champion in 1997; this portrait highlights and memorializes the greatest achievement in field trials. Beginning in 1985, he has painted every National Shoot to Retrieve Association's Champion of Champions Portraits, honoring that distinguished dog each year. Followed by the Iams, Brittany Dog of the Year in 1986 (now the Purina Brittany of the Year Award), continuing to today. Then In 1999 he undertook the Nestle Purina Outstanding Field Trial Dog Awards,



with ten superior dogs recognized annually, each with their own portrait. Other paintings of note that he has been annually commissioned to paint are the American Field Quail Futurity and the American Field Pheasant Futurity winners. National Open Shooting Dog Championship, the Continental Championship and most recently the United States Open Shooting Dog Invitational Championship.

He still enjoys doing commissions of someone's special dog, working with his clients to produce a work of quality fine art that not only pays tribute to the dog, but will also be a lasting reminder of the memorable days spent afield. Only a man that has known the unconditional love of a hunting dog can recreate it in such living detail.

Young continues to grow as an artist, most everything he does could be considered research, spending 3 to 4 weeks a year fly fishing in the west, every Fall casing everything from sharp-tail and pheasant to woodcock and quail when he is not duck hunting in a Missouri river or Arkansas green timber. He attends the Brittany National Championships, and the Bird Dog National Championship at the Ames Plantation, and several local trials each year. All of these activities add validity to his portrayal of the outdoors and our dogs. Yet he maintains the drive and stamina to spend hours creating fresh paintings in his Springfield, MO studio or in the field. Perhaps it is his hectic schedule that revitalizes him, that drives him to see what it is that will become of an empty canvas.

Ross B. Young has earned the gratitude of every person that has ever been thrilled by a class bird dog, many of the accomplishments of our greatest dogs would be lost, were it not for his art. Each portrait of a past champion reminds us of their contributions and, also, of the great dogs to come. When you view the magnificent portrait of Cedaroak Kate, Whippoorwill Wild Card, or any of those enshrined at Grand Junction you know that the future of field trialing is assured. He is preserving our very heritage through his art.

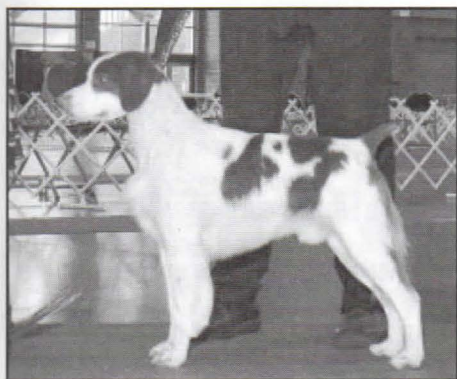

The history of field trials spanning over a century reveals some very interesting facts. Such as, why did they begin? Simply put hunters wanted better bird dogs. What does a hunter basically want in a bird dog? A dog that finds birds. No surprise here, correct? So men of means and land with birds that loved to hunt with pointing dogs wanted a competition to see who had the best dogs. Their thinking was simple. Let's have a competition to find the best and thus we will have the best to breed. This would then give hunters the optimum hunting dogs.

The criteria were fairly simple. Select from the competitors those that could find the most birds in a given time. What did this take? A dog that is "subservient to the gun." One that would find game birds in the most efficient manner. Keep in mind the early field trials were run on native game. Bobwhite were the kings of the game birds. Tradition has kept Mr. Bob as the National Championship quarry. Dogs were as now run in braces of two. A dog that could find the quail the fastest was what a hunter would desire. A dog finding the birds fast, more often was efficient. Therefore the term "race" came into vogue. It was not a man or a horse starting at point "A" and getting to point "B" the quickest but a dog getting to the birds quicker than its brace mate. Since hunters were in the field for long periods of time the better dogs had to have stamina and physical and physiological traits that would allow them to do that.

As time progressed aesthetical considerations began to become important. Consequently, if we were to look at paintings and old photographs of some the first champions we see horizontal tails during the era. Today the tail is at ten to twelve o'clock. With the Brittany the tail albeit docked is important in terms of length and set.

I digress. Back to "race" which we hear more commonly referred as "run." "How did your dog do?" "Well he really ran nice, but no birds." The truth is that race is important. But what should it mean?

Allow me to use an illustration. We have a brace of dogs and one dog runs like a greyhound after the rabbit. The other dog applies himself in a steady running manner. The greyhound has his handler and/or scout sweating their horses out pretty good. The second dog, to be known as the "Applier" has his horse at a steady, smooth second gear walk staying on course. The course has hedgerows running primarily perpendicular to the course. Applier is well ahead of the handler but runs down the hedgerows on the correct windward side. Greyhound is further ahead of Applier but crosses through the hedgerows. When Applier's handler does not see him for several minutes he asks the judge for permission to go look for his dog. Permission granted. The handler knowing his dog rides to the crest of the hill that has long brush line. Midway down the line the handler finds his dog, Applier, on point. The handler rides to where he can see the judges and signals point. The judge rides to the point. All is in order. This happens four more times. Applier is running hard but to right places. Greyhound is running bigger but passing up a lot of likely productive locations. Greyhound has a one limb find. Final score: Applier 5 finds and Greyhound 1 find. In terms of faster and further, Greyhound won. In terms of application and going to the objectives, Applier won. Later that evening, placements were read. Applier won. Why? I think I overheard the judge explaining to the disgruntled handler of Greyhound that he, the judge, was looking for a sensible bird dog that demonstrated application and a race that lead him to the birds. (This is a factual observation.)

Run or race is very important whether it be applied to a gun dog or all-age dog. If a dog is not where it should be then velocity means nothing. If one dog is going to as many likely objectives to the front for the handler as possible then that is meeting the criteria. Running into the next county means nothing while the other dog is racing or running to likely bird locations. Run is important if it is smart, has a purpose, and gets results.

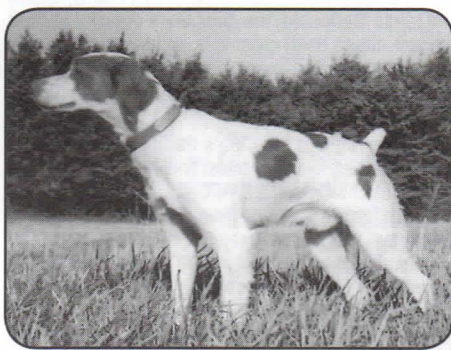

We were treated to the site of a herd of elk running through one of the large pastures. Dan Doiron grabbed

This was the ninth renewal of the championship named after J. W. "Dub" Emde. Dub loved these grounds. He was the "go to" guy for years. It didn't make any difference if it was mowing, filling feeders, repairing kennels or barn, as long as he was able Dub either did it or got it done. To say he is missed is an understatement.

Purina has sponsored the championship since its inception. They supply their fine product for the winners and financial assistance for the underlying costs. The assistance is greatly appreciated by the Brittany field trial fraternity.

Any championship is only as good as the quality of the judges and the many people who pitch in to make it a success. Charlie Collier and Tip Davis were the judges. While they knew each other, they had never judged together. Both are very experienced having trained and handled many dogs through the years. The supporting cast of Bob & Vicki Rankin, Ben & Carolyn Kuykendall, Jack & LaDenna Murphy, Francis Tucker, Alicia Brown, Ed Tillson, Vic Carrington, Rick Conner (Dog Wagon Guru), Retha Mason, my lady Linda Milam, and each and every handler made this an enjoyable, competitive championship.

This championship was commenced the day after the U.S. Open Brittany Championship concluded. Those dogs that were in the callback of the U.S. Open; Wimberly Jim Dandy, Prime Time Outlaw Johnny, Wintuck Rocket's Red Glare, Maxwell's Blew By You, Jo-Lockapex Dark Roux Gumbo and TJ's Prairie Blizzard, were not drawn to run until the second day. Kinwashkly Dakota Molester was also in the callback but Kenny Seivert had to be back in Iowa Monday morning to return to work. Molester was randomly drawn the first day as were the rest of the dogs. I make this disclosure on the drawing simply to be above board. The course had been modified in order to utilize as much of the grounds as possible. Breakaway was from camp to the south over Gundog Hill to Rocky Crossing, southeast through the middle meadow to the east side of pond 4, across the dam into the West Country to the north end of the big ridge and through the west meadow back to the dam. We went down the crossing east of pond 4 into the east meadow and through the first crossing to Manck Crossing, then up to the original first course across Lem Robert's road.

TLM Comanche Chief (Chief) Milam / Gunrunner's Ima Hunk (Hunk) Hancock: Both dogs broke hard to the top of Gundog Hill and went right and returned to the handlers before Rocky Crossing disappearing to the front. Chief is pointed on the right at the edge of a sumac mott. A small covey is flushed with all in order. As we approached Pond 4, the judges point out Chief in the west meadow. Chief tallies his second find buried in Johnson grass to the right of the crossing into the West Country. A single is produced with Chief remaining rock steady. As we enter the west meadow returning to Pond 4, Chief is wide left and was not returned to judgment. Hunk toured the country hunting the country diligently but his fine effort was not rewarded.

Kinwashkly Dakota Molester (Lester) Seivert / Lost Creek Timber Ridge (Rowdy) McCann: Breakaway was

on Camp 2 point. Lester had a find on the left at 3 and went with the flushed covey. Rowdy lasted until 16 when he ran over a bird and didn't get stopped soon enough.

Dakota Luke (Luke) Mantler / Tsunami (Sue) Clasen: Breakaway was from Lem Robert's Road headed into Briar Point. It was a clean break with both knocking on the front door. Sue points at the feeder at the mouth of Briar Point. Luke backs. No birds are produced. She suffers another non-productive outside of Cedar Point. To be fair it must be noted that birds had been produced in both of these places several times the previous week during the U.S. Open. Sue rallies and cards three finds in the last thirty-five minutes along with a competitive race. Luke has a second back but fails to score.

Me and You Alone Maverick (Maya) Nakamura / Starlight's Blazing Sirius (Sy) Thomas: Breakaway from Lem Robert's headed to Manck Crossing. Both dogs have their running shoes on and navigate the crossing with no problems. Maya is not pleasing her handler and is collared near Roscoe's Pond. Sy continues making forward fast casts to objectives. He establishes point at the Sumac mott where Chief had his first find. Birds are flushed, shot fired and then the wheels fell off.

Wayside's Blueridge Runner (Blue) Longfellow / Megabuck's Hell On Wheels (Buck) Cross: Breakaway from camp after lunch. Blue brings in a live bird and is up early. Buck evidently cut a pad and develops a bad limp and is up at 20.

Spanky's Little Pill Bandit (Bandit) Hancock / TLM Frequent Flyer (Jack) Gerardy: If there is a piece of the ground that these two didn't run over, I don't know where it is. It may not have been pretty but it was a lot of fun. The horses Terry and I were riding certainly earned their feed during this brace. Jack had a nonproductive on Camp 2 point and a nice limb find on the Bedsprings covey at time. I don't think Bandit had bird contact.

T&W Diamond Jim (Jim) Peace / KD's Slip And Slide (Splash) McCann: Breakaway was at the south end of the Double Motts. Splash starts slow but Jim breaks hard. Scout Mitsue has her work cut out. Through Manck Crossing and north toward Roscoe's Pond Splash begins to build steam. He scores on the right near the pond. High on both ends and steady as a single well located is flushed. Jim is gone at the time on one of his far-reaching casts. Splash is broke away and hunts the country with showy casts. He has two more finds with perfect manners and great style. The best hour the writer had seen. Jim had previously come forward with

the wind to his rear and bumped some birds he never smelled.

Wimberly Jim Dandy (Dandy) Clasen / TJ's Thunder (Thunder) Rankin: Breakaway Sunday morning from camp. Over Gundog Hill through Rocky Crossing, the pair are well to the front showing their heels. Thunder is standing on the outside of the Sumac mott that has been a honey hole. Dandy is thoroughly scouring the mott. Both are taken on. Dandy has the bit in his teeth and eventually is lost. Thunder is found standing by scout Murphy in the first meadow in the West Country. A pair of partridge are flushed fifteen feet in front. This is a good find and was well handled. Thunder continues to run the front, has three more clean finds and a good finish. This was a very solid hour.

Prime Time Outlaw Johnny (Cash) Rea / Havapal's Renegade Billy Boy (Billy) Thomas: I have a theory about naming dogs. If one has a wild and woolly name, that will accurately describe him at times. Well, Cash was an "Outlaw" and Billy was a "Renegade" today. Neither made the hour.

Tequila With a Twist (Taryn) Carlson / Gone With the Wind (Tara) Kuykendall: Taryn, last year's champion, was a scratch due to an injury. Breakaway from the south end of the Double Motts. Tara was to the front and made some competitive casts. She had a nice limb find displaying her steadiness. With more bird work, she would have been in the consideration.

Wintuck Rocket's Red Glare (Rocket) Milam / Tub O Tee (Tee) Lincoln: Breakaway in the meadow west of pond 4. Big opening casts were made to the pond dam. Milam gathered Rocket first and sent him down the crossing. He pointed in the brush before the next meadow. Tee came forward and failed to back. Three quail were flushed with perfect manners. We had not seen birds here before. Milam kept his charge handy across Manck Crossing and up to Lem Robert's where he again asked him to run. A second find was tallied at the mott across from the oil well. Rocket disappeared across Tent Pad Point and was not seen until we neared Pond 2. He finished the hour to the front near Bird Valley.

Dakota Sunrise (Sonny) Kuykendall / Maxwell's Blew By You (Chuck) Maxwell: Breakaway from camp after lunch. Chuck and Sonny went to the top of Gundog Hill with Sonny continuing on course and Chuck breaking left. As we topped the hill and Chuck not in sight, Maxwell left in a hurry to the south. As we entered the meadow to Pond 4, Maxwell returned Chuck to the front after an absence of fourteen minutes. Chuck made some big forward moves and had a find near the lake in the West Country. He will knock your eyes out on point. He suffered a non-productive in the meadow east of Manck Crossing at time. Sonny hunted hard and turned in a workman like hour. He had a find on the same birds as Rocket on his second find.

Cheyenne Wind Dancer (Dancer) Cross / Boudreaux's Poki JJ Johnson (JJ) Clasen: Breakaway was from the hill above Pond 1. Dancer put on a bird finding clinic with four finds but didn't have the race to dislodge the winners. JJ had a find on a good relocation but also failed to threaten the leaders.

Jo-Lockapex Dark Roux Gumbo (Roux) Lincoln / TJ's Prairie Blizzard (Bliz) Carlson: Roux laid down a fantastic forward searching race but went birdless. Bliz was also competitive but was also birdless.

The winners were Champion KD's Slip and Slide out of the last brace on Saturday. Tsunami out of the third brace on Saturday was named the Runner Up. They were pressed by TJ's Thunder out of the first brace on Sunday.

It was a good championship with plenty of bird work, running dogs, fellowship and good sportsmanship. We hope you can come back.

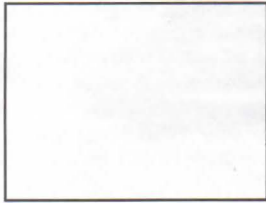

- Bitch must be owned or leased by an American Brittany club member.
- All dams nominated and all sires bred to must be registered or eligible for registration.
- Nominations of dams must be made within 30 days after the bitches have whelped.** A sum of \$30.00 must be paid at this time. This payment will entitle each puppy of this particular litter to be entered in the ABC Futurities (Field and/or Bench) after the dog has been properly registered in a recognized stud book.

- Late litter nominations will be accepted with the following current fee schedule:** Late fees are: \$30.00 for 31-60 days, \$60.00 for 61-90 days, and \$100.00 for any nomination received more than 90 days after whelping. No nominations will be accepted past 180 days of whelping. Additional late fees may be imposed from time to time by the ABC Board of Directors. The postmark will determine the fee for late nominations.
