
White-bellied Cuckoo-Shrike Coracina papuensis Species No.: 425 Band size: 05 (04) AY

Immature similar to adult female, but retain many juvenile light brown wing feathers; Moult from Immature to adult plumage commences at around one year of age, probably coinciding with adult post-breeding moult; Therefore age Immatures (2-) and Adults (2+).

Sexing:

Males, except first year birds, have a small spot of white feathers at the upper hind rim of the eye. This spot is clearly visible in all plumage types; Both sexes brood.
