Ageing:

Adult (1+) Juvenile Forehead, crown, dark brown with brownish-grey uniform dark brown;

nape & hindneck: or pale grey mottling and light

Sides of neck & light grey-brown with indistinct not scalloped;

malar area: fine black-brown scalloping;

Mantle, back, scap- dark brown with distinct pale warm brown lacking mottling;

ulars & rump: grey mottling:

No information available on moult timing, or extent of plumage changes;

Based on data available for the other two species of bristlebird, the juvenile probably moults to an adult-like plumage within a few months of fledging;

In view of lack of data, birds which are not obviously juveniles should be aged (1+);

Sexing:

No sexual dimorphism in size or plumage; Nothing known about incubation.
