

**Eczematous Rash**

Superficial dermatitis e.g. tinea



**Erythematous Rash**

Redness and inflammation of the skin. Blanches under pressure.



**Papular Rash**

Small raised and solid area of the skin, usually occurring in clusters. Do not contain pus.



**Papular Urticarial Rash**

Raised and itchy patches on the skin e.g. insect bites



**Petechial Rash**

Tiny flat purple or red spots ranging in size from pinpoint to less than 2mm. Does not blanch.

**\*\*\*NOTE: Potential meningococcal rash\*\*\***



**Purpuric Rash**

Purple or red blotches on the skin. Blotches greater 2 mm to 1 cm in diameter.

**\*\*\*NOTE: Potential meningococcal rash\*\*\***

**Pustular Rash**

Small raised and solid area of the skin filled with pus.



**Urticarial Rash**

Raised red blotches, welts or weals



**Vesicular Rash**

Raised areas of the skin filled with fluid e.g. blister, chicken pox.
