Zone: 5-6 Color: Blue, violet Bloom Time: May through July Plant Type: Perennial herb

Mature Spread: 1' wide

Mature Height: 2-3' tall

Water Use: Medium

Soil Type: Variable, well-drained

Range and Native Habitat: The Dusty Penstemon is found in the Four Corners area of New Mexico, Colorado, Arizona and Utah and in Nevada. Known habitats are pinyon juniper woodlands, mountain brush, ponderosa pine forests, Douglas fir and aspen forest communities.

Suggested Maintenance: Cut back faded foliage in the fall by a third. After the last frost in the spring, cut the remaining foliage back hard.

Other: "Comarrhenus" is from the Greek word meaning "hairy." The anthers of this plant are covered with kinky white hairs.
