## **Hot air balloons in Ozark on** display for charity fundraiser

The 16th Annual GLOW presented by Ozark Chevrolet to benefit Children's Smile Center is slated for Friday, June 17, 2022, beginning at approximately 8:45 p.m. at the Finley River Park in downtown Ozark. The Balloon Glow is held inside the grounds of the Sertoma Duck Race Festival and is free to the public.

Several hot air balloons will inflate just after dark, providing an amazing light display against the night sky. Balloons are tethered to the ground and do not take flight, so attendees can enjoy a 60 to 90 minute light show, pending weather and wind speeds. All attendees have the opportunity to see the very large and exquisite balloons close up, visit with the pilots and get in the basket to help keep the balloons inflated.

The event is part of the two-day Sertoma Duck Race Festival June 17-18, with several activities taking place besides the GLOW on Friday evening, including live music in an entertainment area, food and drink booths, small business vendor booths and a kids' zone with various carnival-type attractions for families to enjoy. For more information about these activities, please visit 4csertoma.org. There are costs associated with many of these activities, including a \$10 parking fee.

"The GLOW is a fun event for all ages," said



executive director, Jackie Barger. "Rarely do people have the opportunity to see the balloons close up, but here you can visit with the pilots and then watch an amazing light show." Barger continued, "We want everyone to know that the event is extremely sensitive to weather and wind conditions. The unpredictability of Ozarks weather means there is always a chance the event could be cancelled. Please keep informed through our Face-

book page." The Balloon Glow is the largest single fundraising event of the year for Children's Smile Center, and provides family enjoyment for thousands and thousands of families and individuals from not only local communities, but the four-state region, as well. Tentative responses from the Facebook event page show a very wide range of attendees from a 200-mile radius.

Barger commented. "We are grateful to local corporate sponsors for underwriting this event and providing funds to help provide our dental clinics to people from low-income families served by Medicaid. Because of this support, we are privileged to put smiles on many faces, just like our GLOW."

Proceeds from this event benefit Children's Smile Center to provide dental care to children ages 1 to 19 and pregnant women covered by Missouri Medicaid who reside in Christian, Stone, Taney, Dade, Barry or Lawrence Counties through its three dental clinics located in Ozark, Branson West and Aurora.

#### Large crowds affect traffic, parking

Barger stated that people attending the Balloon Glow need to plan to arrive well before the hot

air balloons begin to inflate, which should be in the vicinity of 8:30 to 9:00 p.m. "4C Sertoma works well with the Ozark Police Department, as well as volunteer groups handling the parking areas, to provide an orderly as possible way to the park," Barger stated. "But make no mistake about it, the traffic and parking are opportunities for patience and planning," he added. Gates to the festival grounds for the GLOW

open at 5:00 p.m. Law enforcement has estimated the crowd in recent years at the 12,000 level. "Getting that many people and vehicles all coming to one location at the same time is a challenge; once you arrive in the park, take the chance to appreciate the setting of the park, the trees, the river, the bridge and the Ozark Mill at Finley Farms."

The shooting took place on May 28 at approximately 12:49 p.m.

at 100 block West Church Street in front of Iguana Roja. Responding officers found Newburn with multiple gunshot

wounds. Newburn was transported to Cox South Hospital and pronounced dead on ar-

rival. Sources say Newburn and Dedmon knew each other. However, police have yet to release a

motive for the murder.

es worked closely with hunger relief agencies to ensure food stayed local.


The nation's letter cartion of Letter Carriers riers see how hunger affects the communities that they live and work in every day.

## New Liberty Electric rates to take effect

Tariffs reflecting decisions in an electric rate case filed by The Empire District Electric Company d/b/a Liberty are scheduled to take effect on June 1, 2022. These tariffs reflect a March 9, 2022 order by the Public Service Commission which approved four unanimous agreements filed by parties in the Liberty electric rate case. Under those agreements, Liberty will increase annual electric revenues by approximately

It is estimated that a residential customer using approximately 1,000 kWh (1,000 kilowatt-hours) of electricity a month will see the current average monthly electric bill increase by about \$10.00 a month. Under the agreements approved by the Commission, there will be no increase in the residential monthly customer charge (currently \$13.00 a month).


The agreements transition most customers to rates that give customers a discount on energy consumed during "off-peak" hours of

10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. each day through the creation of default time-of-use rates. When Liberty transitions to default time-based rates in October, the way customers are billed will change; providing customers with information to help them make choices about when to use energy that will incur lower system costs versus using energy that incurs increased system costs.

The agreements also create time-of-use rate schedules as options for residential and small commercial customers. The optional time-of-use rate structures are designed to give customers more control over their monthly electric bill. Both default and optional time-based rates will become available on October 15, 2022. Liberty will conduct a robust education program for its customers regarding the default and optional time-of-use rates.

Also under the agreements approved, Liberty's low-income pilot program will continue with the discount increasing to two times the customer charge during the peak heating months of December through February and peak cooling months of June through August. Liberty will also establish a critical needs program and funding for the low-income weatherization program will more than double from \$250,000 to \$550,000 annually.

Liberty serves approximately 155,400 electric customers in the Missouri counties of Barry, Barton, Cedar, Christian, Dade, Dallas, Greene, Hickory, Jasper, Lawrence, McDonald, Newton, Polk, St. Clair, Stone and Taney.



#### Weather and wind are key

Barger wants to remind attendees to keep informed about the event through the Facebook page. 16th Annual Hot Air Balloon Glow. Weather and wind conditions are monitored right up to the time of the balloons inflating, and pilots are very careful in making the decision to inflate their balloon based on local and area weather patterns, wind speeds and other fronts that move through the area from time to time.

Barger recalls a GLOW years ago when several pilots did not inflate their balloons because of an earlier rain that left the grass wet, severely impacting the pilots ability to keep their balloons dry and mildew-free upon completing a glow. "What was difficult was explaining to attendees that many of the balloons could not glow even though there were blue skies and almost no wind at 8:30 p.m. So many factors are taken into account before a balloon can even be inflated," Barger said.





## Take care of our streams

erhaps the most important thing to remember about a stream is that, here in the southwest Missouri, we all live near one. That means we all play a part in either making it better or worse for all the

creatures that live in and around a stream including us humans. The more each of us do to maintain the health of local streams, the more all of us will benefit.

Caring for a stream and maintaining its good water quality is a constant challenge nowadays. That's somewhat ironic because there probably never has been a time when Missourians were more conscious of the benefits of good water quality than the present. We've all heard about the harmful effects of water pollution and, chances are, most of us have probably fished an aluminum can or a plastic bait con-

fects on our waterways.

For instance, one stream pollution problem we hear about is too much nitrogen in the water. This usually is the product of run-off from lawns, by-products of animal treatment operations with inadequate waste-removal facilities or poorly functioning septic systems. In addition to being bad for aquatic creatures, excessive nitrate levels in a stream can pose health problems for humans who utilize the water in some fashion.

The same can be said for phosphorus, which becomes phosphate when it enters the water. This encourages excessive plant growth which, in turn, often depletes dissolved oxygen levels in streams. Depleted dissolved oxygen levels can lead to fish die-offs and problems for other stream organisms, too.

These are just two of a number of modern hazards — in addition to the age-old problem of littering — that pose constant threats to Ozarks waterways. Granted, there are still many, many miles of great streams to fish, float and enjoy in Missouri. However, it seems like no matter what stream you visit, there's a potential problem looming close by.

The Missouri Stream Team program is one method the state uses to keep these problems under control. The Stream Team program, a joint effort of the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the Conservation Federation of Missouri, is a chance for citizens of all ages to get involved in caring for the state's streams. A Stream Team can be a family of three or a church group of 30. It can be a group of senior citizens or a troop of young scouts. In other words, Stream Teams are for

Trash pick-ups are the Stream Team efforts that usually get the most publicity, but Stream Teams do more than fill bags with litter. They do water quality testing. They collect samples of aquatic animals. This data, which is passed on to government and environmental agencies, helps these larger groups develop management plans for watershed areas.

If you've never done water quality monitoring, there's no need to be intimidated by the process. Technical assistance is provided if requested to show groups what to look for, how to collect data and how to record their findings.

Missouri has more than 110,000 miles of streams, so there are plenty of streams that need care. If you're interested in joining a Stream Team or forming one, contact your nearest Missouri Department of Conservation office. Information on Stream Teams can also be found at www.mostreamteam.org or at mdc.

## Polaris the North Star

<u>Viewpoints</u>

olaris is one of the best-known stars. Its name means 'pole star' because of its northern location in the nighttime sky. It has been used as a navigational aid throughout history.

Polaris is in the constellation Ursa Minor, which is better known as the 'Little Dipper.' Polaris marks the tail of the bear, or the end star of the dipper. To locate Polaris, use the front two stars of the constellation Ursa Major, then trace an imaginary line about five times the distance between the two 'pointer'

There are several misconceptions about Polaris. It is the brightest star in Ursa Minor when compared to the other stars, but it ranks 48th in brightness overall. The distance to Polaris is over 400 light years. It is not a single star, but a binary star that can be seen with a telescope. The orbital period of the companion star is about 30

Polaris is not directly at 'true' North, but about one degree away. If an image were taken of Polaris over a night, Polaris would make a small circle in the

image. Polaris has not always been the pole star. Around 2750 BC, the star Thuban in the constellation Draco was the pole star.

Hipparchus first observed that stars were shifted slightly to the west when compared to star maps made by previous astronomers. This shifting of star positions over a period of years was caused by the wobble of the Earth on its axis. This wobble, called the 'precession of the equinoxes,' is caused by the gravitational pull of the sun and moon. This was explained by Isaac Newton. The wobble causes an arc that will make the star Vega, the bright blue star in Lyra, the pole star in about 12,000 years.

Polaris will once again be the pole star in 27,500 years.

Summer solstice officially occurs on June 21.

The morning of the 25th will be the best time to see all five planets at one time this month. Mercury will be closest to the eastern horizon, with Venus next. Mars, Jupiter and then Saturn will be higher in the morn-

On the morning of the 18th, the moon will be below Saturn. Jupiter will be close to the

moon on the 21st; it will be above

and to the left of the moon. To see the moon and Mars close together, look on the 22nd. The moon will be below and to

the right of Mars. Venus and the moon will be close on the morning of the 26th. Venus will be to the right of a

very thin crescent moon. Finally, Mercury will be to the right of an even thinner moon on the 27th.





"Once he got comfortable and started pumping his fast ball outside, he got the umpire's zone," Heimer said. "It was over when that happened."

Other than Heimer's single, about the only hard-hit ball for Billings came off the bat of Jason Sekscinski, who lined out to center field.

Meanwhile, St. Elizabeth scored four runs in the first inning, four in the second, one in the third and five in the fourth off of Billings starting pitcher Chase Verch and reliever Brayden Garbee.

Lucas also received plenty of respect from Craig. He was intentionally walked twice in between going 2-for-2 with a double.


Jace Kesel led the Hornets with three hits, including a double, and three RBIs. Isaac Green was 2-for-4 with a double and two RBIs, Gavin Williams had two hits and two RBIs, Noah Chipman had two hits and a walk and Caleb Oligschlaeger doubled and walked.

"The lead-off kid (Oligschlaeger) and Lucas are solid," Craig said. "Their whole lineup did what they had to do — they put the ball in play. You can get a lot of stuff going just by putting the ball in play."

St. Elizabeth (16-6), which is commonly mistaken for a private school, is a public school about 30 miles east of Eldon in
