## Amendment to Rules Comm. Print 118–10 Offered by Mr. Kildee of Michigan

At the end of subtitle B of title XVIII, insert the following:

## 1 SEC. \_\_\_\_\_. REPORT ON UNITED STATES RESPONSE TO THE 2 CONFLICT IN SUDAN WITH RESPECT TO JUS 3 TICE, ACCOUNTABILITY, AND SANCTIONS.

4 (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days 5 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the President 6 shall submit a written report, which may include a classi-7 fied annex, to the appropriate congressional committees 8 on the actions of the United States with respect to justice, 9 accountability, and sanctions to address the ongoing con-10 flict in Sudan.

(b) ELEMENTS WITH RESPECT TO JUSTICE, ACCOUNTABILITY AND SANCTIONS.—The President, in consultation with the Secretary of State and Secretary of the
Treasury, shall also include in the report required by subsection (a) each of the following:

1 democratic spoilers, including a description of the 2 economic influence of such entities and how their involvement in Sudan's commerce and industry im-3 4 pedes a democratic transition; (2) A description of the primary sources of fi-5 6 nancing on which the Rapid Support Forces and Su-7 danese armed forces have relied since the conflict 8 began, and the extent to which either party is able 9 to benefit from gold revenue; 10 (3) A description of efforts to hold accountable 11 actors threatening peace, security, and stability in 12 Sudan or undermining Sudan's democratic transi-13 tion, and efforts to reconstitute a civilian-led transi-14 tional government with the goal of transitioning to 15 democracy in Sudan, including— 16 (A) the effectiveness of sanctions and visa 17 bans for advancing these goals; 18 (B) the diplomatic strategy of the United 19 States for leveraging such sanctions and visa 20 bans to advance these goals; 21 (C) the number of full-time employees of 22 the Department of State and Department of 23 Treasury dedicated to such efforts; and

2	sources and authorities devoted to such efforts
3	are sufficient to accomplish these goals.
4	(c) Appropriate Congressional Committees.—
5	In this section, the term "appropriate congressional com-
6	mittees" means—
7	(1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
8	Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Committee
9	on Appropriations of the Senate; and
10	(2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
11	Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Committee
12	on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.
