Welcome to the 20th anniversary of our holiday tradition *It's a Wonderful Life: Live in Chicago!* Frank Capra's story resonates with audiences as strongly today as its 1947 premiere. Likewise, our staged production draws passionate returning patrons and creates new fans annually. Over the years, we've delighted 60,000+ people and featured the work of 40+ Ensemble Members and Artistic Affiliates.

The story's themes are timeless and universal. We feel comforted by the annual reminders - to value kindness, to support our communities, to uplift others, to caution against greed, and to protect those struggling with despair. This story also reminds us of the fragility of life. Capra's brilliant sentiment – "Each man's life touches so many other lives. When he isn't around, he leaves an awful hole, doesn't he?" – hits our souls deeper this year.





She led American Blues through its reorganization in 2009, building the operational budget from zero to \$1 million. She secured the company's first-ever operating reserve and endowment. Whiteside served on numerous panels for the National Endowment for the Arts and sat on the Board of Directors for Network of Ensemble Theaters and League of Chicago Theatres. She's a graduate of Northwestern University (BS), The School of the Art Institute of Chicago (MFA), and a Kellogg Executive Scholar in Nonprofit management (Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University). As a producer, she's received 14 Joseph Jefferson nominations or

awards. As an actress, she's received 5 Joseph Jefferson Awards, Citations, and nominations; 2 After Dark Awards; and 1 Broadway World Chicago Award.

More than 60,000 patrons have enjoyed our holiday classic since 2002. As we celebrate 20 years of *It's a Wonderful Life*—and celebrate our return to live, inperson theatre—we remember our past and look toward the future.

The American Blues Theater Ensemble has staged "It's a Wonderful Life" as a radio play at various Chicago venues and events since 2002, including: 1909 Byron, Theater on the Lake, Logan Square (2002 - 2008); Victory Gardens Biograph Theater (2009 - 2012); Greenhouse Theater Center (2013 - 2016); Stage 773 (2017 - 2019); virtually via Zoom (2020); and now — we're returning to the Victory Gardens Biograph Theater for 2021!

ABOUT FRANK CAPRA AND "IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE"

Frank Capra (May 18, 1897 – September 3, 1991) was an Italian-born American film director, producer and writer who became the creative force behind some of the major award-winning films of the 1930s and 1940s. Among his leading films were "It Happened One Night" (1934), "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town" (1936), "You Can't Take It with You" (1938), and "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington" (1939). During World War II, Capra served in the U.S. Army Signal Corps and produced propaganda films.

After World War II, Capra's production company bought the film rights to Philip Van Doren Stern's self-published short story, "The Greatest Gift" (1943), which became the basis for "It's a Wonderful Life" (1946). Although the film initially received mixed reviews and was unsuccessful at the box office, it became a Christmas classic after it was put into the public domain, which allowed it to be broadcast without licensing or royalty fees.

Today "It's a Wonderful Life" is considered one of the greatest films of all time. It was nominated for five Academy Awards, including Best Picture, and has been recognized by the American Film Institute as one of the 100 best American films ever made. Frank Capra, Jimmy Stewart, and Donna Reed have all cited "It's a Wonderful Life" as their favorite movie.

American Blues Theater explores the American identity through the plays it produces and communities it serves. American Blues Theater follows these guiding values both on and off its stages—collaboration, courage, inclusive, equity, service, and integrity

We are Chicago's **second-oldest AEA Ensemble theater.** As of 2021, our theater and artists received 221 Joseph Jefferson Awards and nominations that celebrate excellence in Chicago theater and 40 Black Theatre Alliance Awards. Our artists are honored with Pulitzer Prize nominations, Academy Awards, Golden Globe Awards, Emmy Awards, and numerous other accolades. Our artists work throughout the nation - including Broadway and regional theaters - and loyally return to our stage.

American Blues Theater is committed to developing the classic plays and musicals of tomorrow. More than half of our mainstage productions are world and Chicago premieres. 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LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

American Blues Theater is located in Chicago, the traditional homelands of the Council of the Three Fires: the Odawa, Ojibwe, and Potawatomi Nations. City of Chicago was founded by the son of an enslaved African woman who was regarded as the first non-Indigenous settler. His name was Jean Baptiste Point du Sable.

Many other nations including the Myaamia, Wea, Ho-Chunk, Menominee, Thakiwaki, Meskwaki, Kiikaapoi, and Mascouten peoples also call this region home. This land has long been a center for Indigenous people to gather, trade, and maintain kinship ties. Today, Chicago is home to one of the largest urban American Indian communities in the United States, and the country's oldest urban-based Native membership community center, the American Indian Center Chicago (AIC).

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
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
