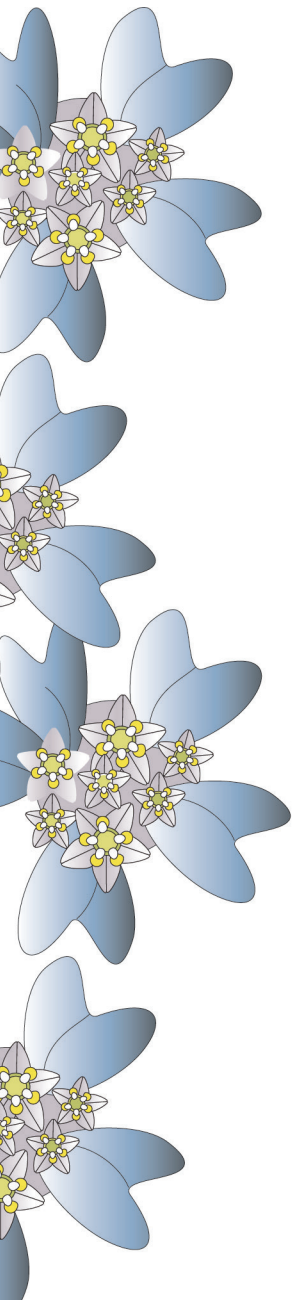




# *Spyridium furculentum* - Bookmark (Forked Spyridium)

This Victorian endemic shrub is only found on the southern fringe of the Little Desert National Park in western Victoria, in heathy mallee on slightly 'better' soils that have been selectively cleared for farming. Very few sites remain, and all are on roadsides or private land. Threats include road widening, weed invasion, rabbit grazing and changes in fire regimes.
