David missed me, I was actually at work near Kempsey.

It's actually the second house along the left, 1.7 km from turn off. The house is well back from the road and is not obvious at first, our landmark is a 30 m x 30 m Bloodwood gum tree near the house.

HOW THINGS CHANGE

Our last Newsletter was started after what I thought was an end to a drought, how wrong could I be. We don't talk much about the beaut weather we have here, most conversations are about the rain, or the lack of it, all sorts of theories of why its not raining and then the predictions that it will be some time yet before we have any worthwhile rain. During the five and a half months after the June rain, we have recorded 10 mm, we now depend on the Wilson River for water, I guess we are one of the few lucky ones, we have been able to keep our garden going and ourselves with river water. I loathe to mention our dam again, built by a local "EXPERT", was full after the June rain, something went wrong, it leaks, its empty.

PROSTANTHERA & WESTRINGIA SPECIES

Prostanthera cryptandroides Benth.

This species list is the latest available. The Study Group has had probably slightly less than 50% of Prostanthera and about 25% of the Westringia's in its collection over the past years.

Not listed are the many hybrids and variant forms, these could possibly total more than species in living collections. Of course, unfortunately, not all these have survived in our collections. Revision work (in particular Eastcoast species) is still under way by Barry Conn at the Royal Botanic Gardens Herbarium. Thank you Barry, for these lists and keeping up the good work.




DISTRIBUTION MAPS FOR PROSTANTHERA SPECIES A-C

CORRESPONDENCE

"Currently, I have established at home the following plants:

P.Lasianthos. calycina. rhombea (pink and mauve forms) rylestoni, densa. baxteri, melissifolla. saxicola var. montana. Boonoo Boonoo (lasianthos) discolor. linearis. incisa var pubescens. teretifolia. denticulata. cineolifera. incana. incisa. incana (white flowers), cuneata. phylicifolia. scutellarioides. nivea var. induta. rotundifolia. ovalifolia.

In addition, I have several unknown species — two from Burrendong Arboretum, one from Copeland near Gloucester and another from a nursery which may be a form of aspalathoides.

Of the named species above, teretifolia is from the Broken Back Range near Cessnock. linearis and incisa are from the Wattagans, incisa var. pubescens is from near Ourimbah and the rotundifolia is from Glen Davis. The rest are either nursery trade plants or from cuttings I have obtained over the years."

(I would be interested to see the P.teretifolia from Broken Back Range, it has not been previously recorded from this area) ED.

"In August of this year, the Blue Mountains Group of S.G.A.P., visited the Wildflower Garden at Picnic Point, where Robert Miller took us on a conducted tour of this lovely garden.

Whilst I was there, I took the opportunity of getting some cuttings from a very generous Robert. The cutting I put down were -

Prostanthera teretifolia - limited success
Prostanthera spinosa - very good
Prostanthera sieberi - from Macquarie Pass, excellent results.
Prostanthera dense - from Port Stephens, excellent
Prostanthera stricta - from Gundy Wallady Creek - rather reluctant success
Westringia blakeleyana - from Mignon Falls - very good.

My next worry is the potting mix for the next stage. I have had problems with commercial mixes - very reluctant growth. I have ordered some pulverised cow manure, and some coarse sand which I shall incorporate with this lot and hope for better results.

(I tried cuttings of P. spinosa (Robert collected this from the Grafton (NSW) area) but had no success at all. P. densa (Port Stephens) is a very worthwhile plant. I saw a couple of beaut specimens growing in Kel Hardingham's garden when I recently visited Armidale. P. stricta - this is also a beaut plant, when I saw this particular plant in the wild with Barry a few years ago, there were several color forms. I am not sure about the location you mention (spelling) but it is in the Widden Valley) ED.

"I am writing this note in the Brundah Hills. I am sitting on a rock waiting for the water from this plastic container to soak into the dry ground. I'd better start again.

Out here in the Central West of N.S.W. we are experiencing the dryest 9 months for many years. As I look around here I see 20 metre Stringy Banks, Red Gums and Cypress pine which have died. Large numbers of small shrubs have perished including Grevillea florabunda, Grevillea polybractea, Phebalium and Stypandra glauca. Also I'm afraid to say the mint bushes (Prostanthera ovalifolia) have also been affected by the drought. I'd say about one quarter are dead, another quarter just hanging on and the rest not much better. Every two or three weeks I've been bringing water up to one of the mints. As a result there is one varigated Mint Bush looking spot on. One about the same size next to it has died. Gee, if someone came up here and saw me they would say I've gone round the bend.

I've just taken a walk over the hill to where the other colour forms are. Unless we get rain within a couple of weeks they'll be gone.

June 10 - We have had about three inches of rain, good soaking rain, I have been back out to Brundah and you wouldn't know the place, everything so green again.

So all should look good when Spring arrives.
