Tour Summary

The Chocó, an eco-region and biodiversity hotspot ranging from the Pacific coast of Colombia south to Ecuador supports the largest number of range-restricted birds of any Endemic Bird Area in the Americas, with over 60 unique species. Our tour had been carefully designed to target as many Chocó endemics as possible, especially focusing on the tricky and remote lowland species. Sadly, the sites we visited were also the final accessible pristine lowland forests in the Esmeraldas province. In addition to seeing tonnes of fantastic birds and other wildlife, our tour directly supported the conservation of various private reserves in this critically threatened region. Highlights that we got to see included Berlepsch's Tinamou, Rufous-headed Chachalaca, Rufous-necked Wood Rail, Ecuadorian Rail, Pinnated Bittern, Blue-footed Booby, Rose-faced Parrot, Great Green Macaw, Sapayoa, Long-wattled Umbrellabird, Streak-chested, Chestnut-crowned, Rufous, Tawny, Ochre-breasted, Yellow-breasted and Giant Antpittas, Black-headed and Rufous-breasted Antthrushes, Choco Tapaculo, Choco Vireo, Orange-breasted Fruiteater, Rufous-brown Solitaire, Olive-backed Quail-Dove, Dark-backed and Rufous-fronted Wood Quail, Five-colored and Orange-fronted Barbet, Choco and Slaty-tailed Trogon, Purple-chested Hummingbird and Blue-headed Sapphire, Scarlet-breasted, Scarlet-thighed and Yellow-tufted Dacnis, Indigo Flowerpiercer, Scarlet-and-white, Glistening-green, Blue-whiskered, Rufous-throated, Dusky-faced, Lemon-spectacled, Moss-backed, Yellow-green and Golden-chested Tanagers, Black-tipped Cotinga, Green Manakin, Ochraceous Attila, Crimson-bellied and Lita Woodpeckers, Stub-tailed, Jet, Ocellated, Bicolored, Spotted and Zeledon's Antbirds, Rufescent Screech, Choco Screech, Cloud-forest Pygmy, Pacific Pygmy, Crested and Black-and-white Owls, Dagua Thrush, Ecuadorian Seedeater and Choco Poorwill.

Our Chocó Specialities tour kicked off in the capital Quito, where we picked up Streak-throated Bush Tyrant and Black-tailed Trainbearer right in front of our hotel – *a great start!* We then began our journey to the “wild” west, driving along the higher flanks of the Pichincha volcano at c. 3,600m elevation, where we visited the well-known Yanacocha reserve. En route to the reserve we had a productive stop which yielded targets like Red-crested Cotinga, White-crested Elaenia, Plain-colored Seedeater and Paramo Pipit. The bird feeders at the reserve's entrance were awesome, with Andean Guan, Masked and Glossy Flowerpiercers, Yellow-breasted Brushfinch and Black-chested Mountain Tanager – *all only a couple of feet away from us!* There were also many hummingbirds to enjoy, including Buff-winged Starfrontlet and Shining Sunbeam. The amazing Sword-billed Hummingbird with its extraordinarily long bill, also came in nicely. Along the foggy Inca trail a Tawny Antpitta foraging out in the open was the first bird we got our eyes on! A little further along the track we got nice views of other skulkers including White-browed Spinetail and Rufous Antpitta. A family group of Rufous Wren showed well, and Blue-backed Conebill and White-banded Tyrannulet were other flocking species we picked up. Barred Fruiteater and Andean Pygmy Owl were both heard calling but unfortunately, we could not get visuals. We did get views of the scarce Bar-bellied Woodpecker though! At the feeders at the end of the trail we enjoyed both Sapphire-

vented and Golden-breasted Puffleg, and also males and females of the impressive Great Sapphirewing. A stunning Scarlet-bellied Mountain Tanager came down to eye-level, which was a real treat. We then continued our journey down the western Andean slope along the winding Nono-Mindo road. It was rainy but we did pick up some goodies including Crimson-mantled Woodpecker and a pair of showy White-capped Dippers. Some of us got a brief view of a female Torrent Duck. In the lower Tandayapa valley, we watched an active nest of Andean Cock-of-the-rock containing two bizarre spiky-plumaged chicks. At the Bellavista reserve higher up we tried for the elusive Tanager Finch, a rare species which had been seen here a day earlier. Unfortunately, this target did not seem to be around but we did get nice views of a fantastic Chestnut-crowned Antpitta. Gorgeted Sunangel was another good catch for the late afternoon. The rare and secretive Flammulated Treehunter was vocal and only briefly seen in flight.

Our morning birding started with an unexpected roadside stop near the ancient settlement of Tulipe. On the road Dušan thought he heard the song of Ecuadorian Seedeater from the car window, and this was certainly worth further investigation. Indeed, once we got out of the car, the identification of this rare and erratic species got confirmed! There was a small patch of mixed secondary woodland with plenty of bamboo, and it was Lisa that first spotted the seedeater, an adult male. A few minutes later, the male came closer, showing nicely its glossy-blue plumage, and nearby we also discovered the female that was feeding a juvenile – *what a find!* At the same spot some flock activity produced other goodies including a pair of White-winged Tanager and quite a few Chivi Vireos. At the highest point of the Pacto-Pachijal road we stopped for a flock of Choco Toucans, which showed really nicely. Our next stop was the entrance track to the Amagusa reserve where a singing Indigo Flowerpiercer was among the first targets we got. The flowerpiercer was foraging in the canopy and rather tricky to get in the bins, in contrast to a Moss-backed Tanager that suddenly popped up in a nearby tree crown! Shortly after, we heard the song of the rare Choco Vireo, and believe it or not, this shy canopy dweller eventually came down to eye-level providing us with magnificent views! Our “Chocó endemics fiesta” and excitement continued with a male Orange-breasted Fruiteater posing in a mossy tree, and a Pacific Tuftedcheek that was also scoped nicely. A cherry on the cake was a Rufous-brown Solitaire, not a Chocó endemic but really rare, foraging on berries. At the reserve’s banana feeders, we enjoyed stunners like

Glistening-green and Flame-faced Tanager up close! Fun was also the pair of pet Crested Guans (not included in the checklist) that were particularly interested in perching atop the tour leader. The hummingbird feeders were mind-blowing with gems like Velvet-purple Coronet, Purple-bibbed Whitetip, Green Thorntail and Empress Brilliant, all literally buzzing around us. A family flock of Rose-faced Parrots perched for a prolonged time in a tree, allowing us close approach. In the afternoon, we descended down the Pacto-Pachijal road in search of mixed-species flocks. It rained for a while, but we did manage to get good views of Choco Warbler among others. A Barred Puffbird perched really nicely on a bare snag. Another highlight was a singing Yellow-green Tanager that we scoped for a prolonged time. This rare Chocó endemic has now been placed in the genus *Bangsia*, and is typically hard to get the grips with. During our drive back to Mindo, we had another unexpected roadside sighting. Dušan thought he possibly heard an owl at the gas station, and a few minutes later we were watching a marvellous Black-and-white Owl perched in a tree across the highway – *what a day!*

The following morning, pre-dawn, we targeted a Rufescent Screech Owl that we had “warmed up” the previous evening. This time, the bird flew in almost instantly, and we all managed to see it nicely in the spotlight. This species was previously known as Colombian Screech-owl, a Chocó endemic, but was lumped again into Rufescent by most authorities. We then continued to Refugio Paz de las Aves, also

known as “Paz de las Antpittas”. We started with the amazing Andean Cock-of-the-rocks at their lek site, and we got wonderful views of these noisy and flaming red creatures. Golden-headed Quetzal and Masked Trogon were nice bonuses that we got at the hide. Back on the road we got a Scaled Fruiteater, soon followed by scope views of Ashy-headed Tyrannulet. Next, we went to a stakeout for Dark-backed Wood Quail, and within less than a minute our local guide Angel Paz, “the antpitta whisperer”, had lured it in view with a banana. Another big catch was a Rufous-bellied Nighthawk on its day roost, perched in the canopy of a dense mossy tree. Without a doubt, the slam-dunk of the morning spectacle was “Maria”, a chunky and healthy-looking Giant Antpitta, that came out of the forest to feed on worms. This enigmatic species had been hard-to-get during

the previous few years, and we felt very lucky to connect with it intimately. Another roadside stop got us a singing Cloud-forest Pygmy Owl, but a rather distant and cryptic individual, which took a while to discern in the scope. Yellow-breasted Antpitta was also picked up at a roadside stakeout, two birds showing really nicely after Angel whistled them in – *yet another difficult Chocó endemic in the bag!* At Angel Paz’s restaurant we watched the flowers and feeders, with White-throated Daggerbill and Tawny-bellied Hermit among others, while we enjoyed a delicious “bolon de verde” and cheese empanadas. After this hearty meal, we continued down a trail where we met “Shakira”, a very obliging Ochre-breasted Antpitta. “Susan”, a Moustached Antpitta, remained rather elusive and was only seen briefly, while “Pepito”, a stunning Rufous-breasted Antthrush, wasn’t camera-shy at all! After a wonderful garden lunch at Septimo Paraiso, we continued our journey to Kapari Lodge located in the tropical foothills along the Rio Blanco. The lodge grounds got us some neat birds in the late afternoon, including Striped Cuckoo,

Band-backed Wren, Snowy-throated Kingbird, and Masked Water Tyrant. After dinner, the owling was hard work, going down a steep trail, and hearing both Crested and Choco Screech Owl. Back at the lodge deck, our efforts got rewarded with cracking views of the Crested Owl, a truly spectacular sight at night.

Back on the trail, we also got the Choco Screech Owl in view, much smaller in size than the previous species, but equally obliging – *a late but great night!*

An early morning departure got us to a small village located in the humid foothills south of the Rio Blanco. At the crack of dawn, we met our local guide Luis, and we continued together to a nearby forested valley. The magical Long-wattled Umbrellabird was our prime target for the morning, and we had to hike up a track to get to the key area. It was foggy and rainy, with challenging conditions on a slippery trail but luckily everybody made it up to the spot in time. We watched up to six umbrellabirds perched in the treetops, including a few “alpha males” with their “Elvis crests” and long, dangling wattles – *what a peculiar beast!* Unfortunately, the rain only intensified and we did not get much else apart from a skulking Bronze-olive Pygmy Tyrant. During our hike back down, the rain lessened and the clouds briefly lifted. Suddenly, an Ornate Hawk Eagle vocalized in the distance and Luis confirmed the presence of an active nest of this rare raptor. He knew in which trees to scan, and soon we got an adult in the scope – *distant but sweet!* Back at Kapari, we once again enjoyed the various bird feeders with

Pallid Dove, Red-headed Barbet, Pale-mandibled Aracari, Ecuadorian Thrush, Orange-billed Sparrow, Scrub Blackbird, and plenty of hummers including White-whiskered Hermit, White-necked Jacobin, Long-billed Starthroat, Purple-crowned Fairy and Violet-bellied Hummingbird. The afternoon was a long drive, mainly through depressive landscapes of oil palm monocultures and other sterile plantations with very little birdlife. Just before dusk we arrived at the remote forest of Rio Canandé, where we got greeted by the loud sounds of the Mantled Howler Monkeys!

On our first morning at the Rio Canandé reserve we started with canopy viewing from the top hill. It was pretty amazing and we bagged a number of high-quality birds within a short time frame. The first bird was a male Scarlet-browed Tanager in a fruiting *Cecropia* tree, soon followed by other goodies like Orange-fronted Barbet, Guira Tanager, Yellow-tufted Dacnis and Dusky Pigeon. A cracking male Scarlet-breasted Dacnis was the winner though, giving us prolonged scope views while perched atop the canopy. We then continued with the Tawny-faced Quail trail behind the lodge, which has always proved to be slow and tough forest birding. Indeed, we were getting the birds little by little, starting with a secretive Broad-billed Motmot. The tiny Golden-crowned Spadebill gave its insect-like call, and was another welcome find that we got to see well. Further in, we ran into some activity that produced good views of Spot-crowned Antvireo, Stripe-throated Wren and Western Woodhaunter. A male Red-capped Manakin showed itself nicely in the subcanopy. A female Red-capped Manakin was a little confusing at first, but too short-tailed for being the rare and sought-after Green Manakin. However, a little further along the trail we suddenly heard a Green Manakin vocalize. We waited for quite a while, and just before giving up on it, the bird came out in the open! Green Manakin of the subspecies *litae* is a rather drab bird but a likely future split,

Today we hiked the infamous trail to the mirador, also known as the Black-tipped Cotinga viewpoint. It is a tough and physically challenging trail, steadily climbing up the cordillera, but the forest up there hosts some rare birds including Golden-chested Tanager and Choco Tapaculo, so it was a must do. At breakfast, we enjoyed a male Black-crowned Antshrike that almost flew into the dining room, plus an impressive flock of at least thirteen Yellow-throated Toucans flying out of a fruiting tree. Along the lower stretch of the trail, we picked up some goodies including Checker-throated Stipplethroat, Western Woodhaunter, and White-whiskered Puffbird, all showing nicely. The morning “mega” was surely the adult Olive-backed Quail-Dove that we watched as it walked along a stream bank below us! The action continued with a stunning Black-headed Antthrush that walked out fully in the open on the trail. A pair of magnificent Ocellated Antbirds circling around us was another real treat – *surely the king of the antbirds!* Further up the trail we tactically lured in a Choco Tapaculo, a notorious skulker, that we actually got to see really well. A cracking male Scarlet-and-white Tanager was a prize bird that we got to pull out of a small mixed-species canopy flock. Other good stuff in the various flocks overhead included Slate-throated Gnatcatcher, Grey-and-gold Tanager, and Grey-mantled Wren. Unfortunately, at the top no sign of Golden-chested Tanager, nor Black-tipped Cotinga. However, our demanding hike all the way to the top of the cordillera did pay off. Without a

often referred to as “Choco Manakin”. Trogons were well-represented by voice, and we got views of both Choco and White-tailed Trogons. Rufous Piha remained elusive until one perched right above our heads, of which we got stunning views. We took the same trail in the afternoon, and although the weather was rainy and very few birds were active in the forest, we did get a very important target bird of the trip. For the family listers among us it was surely the prime goal, the enigmatic Sapayoa! Normally, this tricky species is first noticed by its vocalizations, typically moving along with a mixed-species flock. In our case, the bird was perched silently in the understory away from a flock, and we ran into it by sheer luck. After the discovery everybody quickly secured views of this monotypic family species, and soon the pressure for the tour leader was off the pan – *mission accomplished!* To our surprise, the Sapayoa perched for a prolonged time out in the open, together with a second bird, possibly indicating that we were at a nesting site. Primates were quite vocal in the forest today and we got great views of both Mantled Howler Monkey and Black-headed Spider Monkey, the latter species carrying a young.

doubt, the afternoon “mega” was a Berlepsch’s Tinamou. Dušan had heard the bird calling nearby and quickly prepared a camouflaged hide. After some trial and error, this highly elusive and rarely observed Chocó endemic came out on the trail twice – *we all got point-blank views!*

The following morning, we did the Manakin loop trail and had a fantastic start with a male Rufous-fronted Wood Quail. Like with the tinamou, we used the camouflaged sheet and we also got superb views of this shy forest-dweller. Rufous Mourner and Ruddy-tailed Flycatcher were new additions to the list but unfortunately it started to rain intensely, resulting in a steep drop of bird activity and birding opportunities. For a brief moment the rain stopped, and during this window we got a nice Great Jacamar in view. After lunch, we did canopy scanning and it was Jörg that found a nice male Black-tipped Cotinga! Another highlight was the “Christmas tree” full of tanagers and allies, including four species of dacnis in a single binocular view, namely Scarlet-thighed, Scarlet-breasted, Yellow-tufted and Blue Dacnis – *sweet!* Blue-whiskered Tanager and Pacific Antwren were other welcome additions that we

got. The porterweed flowers at the lodge attracted various hummers, and Joan had been carefully studying them while we had been hiking the challenging trails. Thanks to her, we learned that both Striped-throated and Bronzy Hermit were around, and Purple-chested and Rufous-tailed Hummingbird were the more regular garden guests. In the late afternoon, some of us did another hike into the forest, and just before the rain picked up again, we had another awesome encounter with Olive-backed Quail-Dove!

An active nest of Slaty Spinetail was a neat find during some early morning porch birding at Canandé, before departure. Today’s drive was pretty long, but we did make various birding stops. We had lunch in a small town where an obliging Ecuadorian Ground Dove was a new trip bird. House Sparrow, still a relatively scarce species in Ecuador, was also added to the list. Low tide at Playa San Vicente was fun, with high congregations of waterbirds, a very different way of birding compared to the deep jungle birding of the previous days! The number of White Ibises and Tricolored Herons was truly impressive, dozens of them, and we saw a

lot of new species, including various migrant waders like Semipalmated Plover and Western Sandpiper. Another brief stop at some dry forest produced Pacific Pygmy Owl and *Amazilia* Hummingbird, both species at the far northern limit of their range. At the river mouth of Rio Verde, we enjoyed some more coastal birding with American Golden Plover being our best find, a rare migrant for the area. A pair of Rufous-headed Chachalaca caused an emergency stop (one bird almost hit the wind shield), resulting in great views of this Tumbesian cracid. A cryptic Lesser Nighthawk roosting on the flotsam was another nice catch. In the late afternoon, we arrived just in time at the wetlands of Las Peñas to find a Pinnated Bittern – *bingo!*

The following morning, we started at a small patch of mangroves where we got fantastic views of three Rufous-necked Wood Rails that were foraging out in the open! Hook-billed Kites were present in good numbers along the road, but we also got an adult Crane Hawk. The forest remnants and woodlands produced various of our desired targets including Jet Antbird and Ochraceous Attila. A single Greater Ani was a welcome surprise. A female becard showed exceptionally well, and was most likely a Slaty Becard,

although she never vocalized. Olivaceous Piculet and Scarlet-backed Woodpecker also posed at close range. A scenic walk through the mangroves produced a large flock of the electrifying Red-legged Honeycreepers, and Panama Flycatcher, among others. A visit to the nearby shrimp ponds was rewarding with close up viewing of many different boreal waders, gulls, terns, and ducks. A Western Sandpiper with a crab stuck to its bill was a very unusual sighting that kept us entertained for a while. During a delicious seafood lunch, we had a flyby Blue-footed Booby, surprisingly close to shore! In the afternoon, we traveled to the Rio Santiago where we boarded our canoe to Playa de Oro. A handsome adult Fasciated Tiger Heron was picked up along the way.

At Playa de Oro, a male Spotted Antbird was the first bird we worked on just behind the lodge. We then continued on the Pueblo trail which was hard work with low bird activity, and a vocal Black-throated Trogon that kept eluding us. Far in, we finally run into a canopy mixed-species flock but it was frustrating at the same time, as viewing conditions were nearly impossible. The rare

decent views of this skulker. Owling at night produced prolonged and high-quality views of a male Choco Poorwill posing on a branch.

Today we went up to the scenic mirador, a full day hike with packed lunch. A Lemon-spectacled Tanager was our first highlight, and we watched it out in the open while it sang. A Pacific Flatbill also showed really well at the same spot. Sapayoa was encountered during multiple occasions on the way up, and we also got brief views of Ocellated Antbirds. A White-whiskered Puffbird posed nicely too. The forest up at the plateau was among the most beautiful and pristine, but at the same time challenging jungle birding. Dagua Thrush was only available for some, before it flew off. Luckily, a male Guayaquil Woodpecker was more cooperative. Lita Woodpecker was present in a large mixed-species flock but very hard to connect with. Double-banded Graytails were in the same flock but equally difficult to see. In the late morning, we heard a Lanceolated Monklet sing, a highly desired rarity. It took a while, but eventually we found it all the way up in the canopy! At the viewpoint we spotted a Black-tipped Cotinga male, Slate-colored Grosbeak and a Laughing Falcon, but not much else. Unfortunately, it rained for the rest of the afternoon but we did get a Great Tinamou and a Collared Peccary on the trail.

Double-banded Graytail was singing from the flock, but were unable to connect with the pair visually. On the way back, we ran into a pair of Sapayoa at a forest stream. The views we got were excellent, just like last time, and these birds were also possibly nesting. The superstar that we got before lunch was a male Five-colored Barbet that we watched while it sang – *a splendid Chocó endemic!* A small, quick moving flock in the garden produced Orange-fronted Barbet, Scarlet-breasted and Scarlet-thighed Dacnis, before we continued to Domingo's finca. The trail through some dense thickets was productive with awesome views of a male Stub-tailed Antbird. Streak-chested Antpitta was more elusive but many got

The rain continued the following morning, and consequently Band-rumped Swifts were flying low over the garden showing their pale rump patch nicely. A short loop trail behind the lodge produced a nice male Stub-tailed Antbird, and finally a good view of Black-throated Trogon. Otherwise, birding was rather slow in this semi-degraded forest patch. Some nice flock activity in the garden produced good views of birds including White-ringed Flycatcher, Snowy-throated Kingbird, One-colored Becard, Brown-capped Tyrannulet and Moustached Antwren, among others. A small antswarm not far from the lodge was attended by various species including Northern Barred Woodcreeper, Bicolored and Spotted Antbird, White-whiskered Puffbird, and Stripe-throated Wren, all showing nicely. Of course, we trawled for *Neomorphus* and *Pittasoma* but without any luck. In the late morning after continued effort, we finally connected with a nice male Lita Woodpecker perched up in a bare tree. In the afternoon, a pair of Great-green Macaws flew over at the river on our way to another remote forest trail. A Dagua Thrush was a nice catchup for many, and this time the bird hung around for longer views. The late afternoon jackpot was a Crimson-bellied Woodpecker, a rare forest-based *Campephilus*, not often encountered at Playa de Oro.

Our last day of the tour was a busy one, with lots of different habitats visited, which resulted in a good mix of exciting species! During our canoe trip back to Selva Alegre, we counted a total of four Fasciated Tiger Herons and a Little Blue Heron. At Yalare we picked up a pair of Pied Puffbirds and a lovely male Slaty-tailed Trogon. The forest edge was pretty birdy with species including Streaked Flycatcher, Yellow-margined Flatbill, Scarlet-breasted and Scarlet-thighed Dacnis, and Black-cheeked Woodpeckers. A Black-breasted Puffbird had been singing in the distance but seemingly never approached us.

After a lot of trawling and scanning, we had to give up on this desired target. The road to the Awa reserve was pretty frustrating to bird, knowing that the quality of the roadside forest had diminished over the years, and the ongoing deforestation that we witnessed in the area. The secondary woodland produced a few birds only, including a shy Rufous-tailed Jacamar but a showy Black-capped Pygmy Tyrant. Rufous Mourner was kind of a surprise here, and a male Long-wattled Umbrellabird that briefly perched in the canopy was even more of a surprise. Suddenly, vocalizing from a tall mossy tree, we were rewarded with one of the best Chocó endemics of the trip, a pair of stunning Golden-chested Tanagers! The couple perched long enough for full frame scope views for all, simply amazing and our third species of *Bangsia* for the trip! At a dry valley near Ibarra, we targeted Blue-headed Sapphire and got great views of a splendid male. Our last cracker for the tour we got at Lago San Pablo, a bold Ecuadorian Rail, totally out in the open, posing only a few meters away from us!
