AN ACT relating to oaths.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- → Section 1. KRS 6.072 is amended to read as follows:
- (1) Witnesses <u>testifying before</u>[attending] the General Assembly,[<u>either house</u>] or a[
 <u>legislative</u>] committee, <u>subcommittee</u>, <u>or task force thereof</u> are entitled to the same
 privileges and immunities, and the same compensation, as witnesses in other <u>civil</u>
 <u>and criminal proceedings</u>[cases]. When summoned by the Commonwealth, they
 shall be paid out of the State Treasury.
- (2) <u>Any member acting as chair</u>[Chairmen] of <u>a</u>[the] <u>committee</u>, <u>[committees]</u> subcommittee, or task force of the <u>General Assembly</u>[Senate and House of Representatives] <u>shall</u>[may] administer <u>an [all necessary oaths]oath</u> to any person who appears or is called to testify before <u>that[a]</u> committee, <u>subcommittee</u>, or task force. [of either house.]
- (3) The oath administered to each witness who testifies before a committee shall follow the oath administered to a witness in a court of law and read as follows:

 "Do you swear or affirm that you will tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?"
- (4) An oath sworn during a previous committee, subcommittee or task force meeting is not applicable to any future committee meeting.
- (5) Testimony given under oath is subject to the penalties as prescribed in KRS Chapter 523.
