

Potentilla simplex

Common Cinquefoil



Small yellow flowers and reddish stems. The five leaflets of the compound leaf are typical of cinquefoil. A great groundcover, by itself or try it with wild strawberry (Fragaria virginiana) and/or virginiana creeper (Partenocissus quinquefolia) to create a richly textured carpet.

Suggested companions: oaks (Quercus sp.), hickories (Carya sp.), witch-hazel (Hamamelis virginiana), little bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparium), wild bergamot (Monarda fistulosa), black-eyed Susan (Rudbeckia hirta)
