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INTRODUCTION.

Columbia county, in the State of New York, lies on the east bank of the Hudson river, between Dutchess county on the south and Rensselaer county on the north, and extends to the boundary line of the State of Massachusetts. It is about thirty-six miles in length and about twenty miles in breadth, with an area of 688 square miles, and a population of 47,928. Its capital city is Hudson, and its minor divisions or townships are Ancram, Austerlitz, Canaan, Chatham, Claverack,* Clermont, Copake, Gallatin, Germantown, Ghent, Greenport, Hillsdale, Kinderhook,† Livingston, New Lebanon, Stockport, Stuyvesant‡ and Taghkanick.§

The earliest mention of this tract of country is found in a monograph by Henry Hudson, the discoverer, when on the evening of September 17, 1609, he anchored opposite the spot now occupied by the county seat which bears his name. In ancient days it was sparsely inhabited by Indian tribes residing on the bank of the Hudson and in the Taghkanick hills.

The first European settlers of the county seem to arrange themselves in four groups: the Dutch settlers from Albany, the tenants of the Livingston Manor, the settlement of German palatinates, and the gradual immigration of New England families.

Under the Dutch government, and the directors of its West India Company, a large number of Holland families settled in what are now known as the townships of Kinderhook, Ghent, Stuyvesant, Stockport and Claverack, the latter being the seat of the Van Rensselaers, as patroons of the great manor, which comprised not less than 170,000 acres of land. The

earliest records are those of the Dutch Reformed Church, which establish the fact that very many well-known county names were among its earliest settlers, and are still represented by numerous descendants. The Van Rensselaers, for example, in two direct lines from the founder of that historic family in America.

The Livingston Manor originally contained upwards of 160,000 acres, and included a large portion of the present townships of Livingston, Clermont, Copake, Ancram, Gallatin, Germantown and Taghkanick, being granted by a patent issued by Governor Dongan to Robert Livingston in 1685, and confirmed by royal charter in 1715. Descendants of this distinguished family still reside within the limits of the county, although the old manor house at Clermont, and nearly all the estate, have passed from possession of the descendants of the first Lord of the Manor. Robert Livingston, although a Scotchman by birth, does not seem to have introduced to America many of his own countrymen. A refugee in Holland, he appears to have come to this country with strong Dutch proclivities, and his intimate connections with the Van Rensselaers gave a distinctively Dutch character to the Livingston colony.

In the year 1710, Queen Anne, through Governor Robert Hunter, purchased from Robert Livingston 6,000 acres of land on the Livingston Manor for the settlement of German palatinates who had served in the British army, and formed the original settlement of what is now known as Germantown. Some of the first settlers removed to the Mohawk and Schoharie valleys, but the descendants of not a few are still residing in the township.

The township of Canaan, which was afterward divided into New Lebanon and parts of Chatham and Austerlitz, was first occupied by emigrants from New England, Samuel A. Curtis being the first white child born in the place; but the great influx of American settlers took place after the declaration of Independence in 1776; and the unsettled condition of affairs previous to that epoch is evident from the fact that a very large number of the lineages in this volume can only be traced to the revolutionary period, family records having been lost when the members thereof were engaged in a great national struggle, and the whole country was in a state of turmoil and transition.

The object of the present undertaking is to preserve in the deluge of time the pedigrees and salient historic incidents in a family, and to present them in the popular form of a direct pedigree. For many years there has

been a growing interest in genealogical research, as the very large collections of such works in our leading libraries testify; but they are very often diffuse in their character, and not of great importance to the general public, whereas the pedigrees of those whose living personality is part of our social and national life are of more interest.

The preservation of pedigrees is not the mere pastime of the idle and curious, it is the honorable employment of the student and historian, for it has always formed the basis of true history. In the ancient records of Assyria, Egypt and Arabia, the pedigree of an individual is usually the thread upon which is strung the stirring events of centuries, and so important a place did the preservation of a pedigree occupy among the Israelites that it was established as a positive obligation upon every Levite in the Temple. Josephus regarded genealogical study as of the utmost importance, and in giving an account of his personal history, boasts "I have traced my pedigree as I found it recorded on the public tablets." Nor is the genealogical form of history peculiar to semetic races. The earliest Greek records were also those of pedigrees. The histories of Acusilaus of Argos, and of Hectæus of Miletus were entitled genealogies (*γενεαλογίαι*), and the fragmentary histories of Xanthus, Charon of Lampsacus and Hellanicus are strongly marked with the genealogical element, whilst in the Greek Testament the whole structure of Christianity is based upon the established pedigree of its founder.

It is true that in the volume before us there are many lineages which contain nothing save the simple records of uneventful generations, but they preserve facts which would otherwise be lost in the history of the American nation. Examples illustrative of this are seen in a comparison of two lineages of historic value as regards Columbia county history — that of Martin Van Buren, eighth president of the United States, who was born at Kinderhook in 1782, and that of Samuel J. Tilden, governor of New York State and candidate for the presidency in the great political struggle of 1876, and who was born in New Lebanon. The records of the Van Buren family have not been preserved, and we have, therefore, no information regarding the pedigree of Martin Van Buren beyond that of his father, although he was undoubtedly descended from an old Dutch ancestry — whereas in the case of Samuel J. Tilden we are able to trace the lineage of one who is an important figure in American history to the original English stock. Some affect to be indifferent to such matters, on the principle that we judge of a man as we find him, and not on the merits of his ancestors,

but such feelings are not in harmony with those of the student of history and of hereditary genius.

The publication of such details as are given in the present volume have also another aspect of importance, inasmuch as they may enable families to trace their ancestry to a remote period. Such works as Savage's *Genealogical Dictionary of New England*,* Austin's *Dictionary of Rhode Island*,† Munsell's *First Settlers of Albany*, and the long list of works given in Durrie's *Alphabetical Index to American Genealogies and Pedigrees*,‡ trace as far as possible the three first generations of early American immigrants, and all that is needed is a careful investigation regarding the two generations which usually connect the present with the past as recorded in those genealogical publications.

Such a work as the present must also be of some interest and importance to many persons in Europe, as enabling them to locate branches of their families who have obtained a "local habitation and a name" in the new world.

—————**ROBERT LIVINGSTON**, first "Lord of the Manor" of Livingston in the State of New York (ancestor of 753, 754,

755, 756), was one of seven children of the **Rev. John Livingston**, a lineal descendant of the fifth **Lord Livingston**, ancestor of the earls of Linlithgow and Callendar (see Burke's *Extinct Peerages, in loco*), an energetic preacher of the Reformed church in Scotland, who was banished for his non-conformity, and took refuge in Rotterdam, where he died, 1672. Of his seven children, **Robert Livingston** (born in 1654) came to New York about 1675, and in 1686 received from Gov. Dongan a large tract of land, which was in 1715 confirmed by royal charter of King George I, creating the manor and lordship of Livingston. This tract embraced large portions of what are now Dutchess and Columbia counties in the State of New York. A portion of it is still held by the Livingston family, and is known as Livingston Manor. Robert Livingston married Alida, widow of Domine Nicolas Van Rensselaer, daughter of Colonel Philip Pieterse Schuyler of Albany, and had three sons, Philip, Robert and Gilbert, who are the ancestors of the Livingstons of America. ———— **MAJOR DIRK WESSELE TEN BROECK** (ancestor of 1310, 1311), born in Holland, 1642, was in the employ of Pieter Van Alen in Beverwyck as early as 1662. Soon after he began to trade for himself, and for many years was largely engaged in Indian and other public affairs at Albany; some years he exported as many as 5,000 beaver skins. In 1686, he became the first recorder under the charter of the city; 1696-8, he served as mayor; married Christina Cornelise Van Buren; he died Sept. 13, 1717, and in his will mentions the following sons: Wesselse, Samuel, Johannes, Tobias; bought of the heirs of the famous Anneke Janse, soon after her death in 1663, the lot on the east corner of State and James streets, which he retained till his death. From **Kiliaan** and **Hendrick** are descended the numerous members of the family in America; **Jeremias**, who died Oct. 12, 1674, was the son of **Kiliaan Van Rensselaer**, a merchant of Amsterdam, Holland, director of the Dutch West India Company of the Amsterdam chamber established in 1621, and who was sixth in descent from Henry Walters Van Rensselaer of Hemegseet, Holland, who does not appear to have ever visited America, but he is the progenitor of all the Van Rensselaers in the United States; he married 1st, Hillegonda Van Bylant, the mother of Johannes, who died without issue, 2nd, Anna Van Wely, by whom he had the following sons, *Jeremias*, above mentioned, *Jan Baptist*, the first of the family to visit the colonie, *Nicolaas*, the first Episcopal clergyman in Albany, and who preached in the Dutch church, 1675-1677, and was for a time director of Rensselaerswyck. Jan Baptist and Nicolaas died without male issue, Jeremias had two sons, Kiliaan and Hendrick. The crest of this historic family is an iron basket of flames, and the coat of arms the cross with the Dutch motto *niemand zonder*, "no one without it," but some of the Albany family seem to have adopted the motto *omnibus effulgemus*, "we shine for all."
