New York, July 31.—(Special Staff.)—Willard Mack, manufacturer and author, who has many times day after day in his credit, and who is considered one of the world's best stage and screen actors, heads the new National Artists' Association, Inc. His election is the result, along with the election of other officers and directors, which takes place on Wednesday of last week. Mr. Mack, probably the most famous name in the theatrical profession, has been elected treasurer, and Henry Chamberlain, one of the original organizers of the new organization, is the first permanent secretary. FIGHT ON OVER USE OF NAME OF ROBINSON BY FRED BUCHANAN

WILLIAM ROCK, FILM PIONEER, DIES SUDDENLY AT OYSTER BAY

One of Most Prominent Figures in Film Industry

Was Joint Founder of Vitagraph Picture Company

Fortune Said To Total Several Million Dollars

New York, July 30.—(Special Staff.)—William Rock, pioneer motion picture manufacturer, one of the independent of Vitagraph Company, died suddenly at Oyster Bay, N. Y., at his home in Oyster Bay on Sunday. He was 62 years old and had been identified with the motion picture industry almost since its inception, nearly a quarter of a century ago.

Early last May, at the time of the reorganization of Vitagraph at a capitalization of \$1,000,000, at which time complete control was turned over to the American Vitaphone Company, Mr. Rock was active with them and his condition necessitated his leaving the premises. He continued to hold a large block of stock, however.

Mr. Rock came to this country from Wrexham, England, where a young man of 20 became one of the most successful ones in the motion picture industry. About twenty-two years ago he purchased the State rights for Louisiana for the Biograph Company. Shortly after he came to New York and with Commodore J. Henry Vanderbilt organized the Vitagraph Company of America.

Mr. Rock was formerly married to Ann A. Rock, an actress, from whom he was divorced in 1911. Some five years later the former wife attempted to have some divorce proceedings, but the application was denied. Mr. Rock married again and is survived by his widow and two children.

William C. Rock was the financial genius of the Vitagraph Company and was active in his management right up to last May when he was severely brought down by a stroke which had not proved in his death. In addition to his Vitagraph holdings Mr. Rock held considerable real estate and it is estimated his fortune will run into millions.

Commodore Vanderbilt, Mr. Rock's associate in Vitagraph, paid tribute to the memory of that actor and writer very suitably at Oyster Bay. He was (Continued on page 12)

NO HEARINGS ON TAX BILL BEFORE GOING TO THE SENATE

Sub-Committee Fails To Agree on Changes To Be Made

And Matter Is Now in Hands of Main Finance Committee

Fight To Be Made on Floor if Report Is Not Satisfactory

Washington, July 31.—The question of whether the tax on netting profits and other changes shall continue in the pending Kluckhohn revenue bill in the House will go to the main Finance Committee for settlement, or at least its recommendation. The chairman of Senator Johnson, of Maine, in Mr. Kluckhohn, held Senator Smith of Georgia and Kern of Indiana on the recommendation. These two Senators have failed to agree on changes to be made in the Kluckhohn bill, and will put it up to the main body.

Senator F. H. Stinson of North Carolina, chairman of the Finance Committee, has stated that an actual hearing of the Kluckhohn or other propositions involved in the pending revenue bill would be held before the bill goes to the floor. 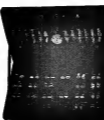

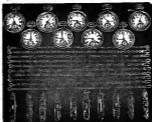

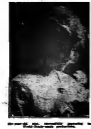

COURT DECIDES AGAINST YOUNG IN FIGHT OVER SINGER'S ESTATE

Bulk of Mrs. Nordin's Fortune Goes to Sisters

Judge Lawrence Ends Contest of Two-Year Period

Throws Out the First Will and Admits Later One

New York, August 7.—The dead state is legal action that has covered a period of two years, in which time George W. Young was named as executor. On the following day it was announced that Young would file the 1913 will. A few days later the original of Mrs. Nordin's will was filed, and in January of 1915 Attorney Charles Baldwin notified the 1914 will for probate. In the meantime Mr. Young had offered for probate in Westchester County the 1913 will, and Justice Justice Lawrence decided in January, 1915, that Mr. Young could proceed with the probate of the first will. This decision was taken as the application of Robert S. Baldwin to keep Mr. Young from taking further steps in probating the first will. Justice Lawrence ruling was the result from the New York courts, as he ruled that Mrs. Nordin was a resident of New Jersey at the time of her death. Mrs. Lillian Nordin's will was made on the territory of New Jersey.

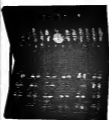

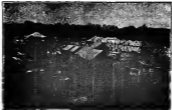

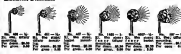

KITCHIN BILL REPORTED TO SENATE; FIGHT MAY BE MADE

Finance Committee Eliminates Tax on Gross Receipts

But Opposition May Send Back Bill for Revision

Chairman Claude Kitchin Declines To Talk on Subject

Washington, D. C., Aug. 21.—It looks as though there will not be a chance to hear any of the Kitchin bill that action demanding a Federal tax on theater gross receipts, in spite of the fact that Finance Committee of Senate reported the bill Thursday under the previous law was followed practically word for word in amending the House bill, with the result that the Kitchin plan of taxing all places of amusement one-half of one per cent was stricken out.

Chairman Claude Kitchin of the House Ways and Means Committee declined today Monday to talk. He was asked by a Missouri representative to discuss the provision of the House conference toward the Senate of the bill looking to do with the taxation of motion picture theaters and other amusement places, but he declined even to make a statement of his own personal views. He said that the attitude of the House conference had not yet been determined, but he would make no statement as to what it might be. As chairman of the Ways and Means Committee Mr. Kitchin will be one of the conferees.

There may be extended debate on the theoretical merits of the bill in the Senate, with a possibility that it may even be sent back to the Finance Committee again for revision before being brought over to the House for conference.

There will be one very important feature of the Kitchin bill affecting their interests has received a serious hit in many respects, however. The bill, as it left the Finance Committee was to all effects the present law. It reads:

"Theatres and concert halls, where a charge for admission is made, having a seating capacity of not more than 500, shall pay 100 cents a seating capacity of more than 500 and not exceeding 1,000, shall pay 200 cents a seating capacity of more than 1,000 and not exceeding 2,000, shall pay 300 cents a seating capacity of more than 2,000 shall pay 400 cents."
