VAUDEVILLE CABARETS

E. F. ALBEE MAKES THEATER CONSTRUCTION WORK OF ART

General Manager of B. F. Keith Circuit Has Made It a Life Study—Vaudeville Wizard Has Mastered Every Detail

New York, Oct. 1.—E. F. Albee, well known and general manager of the B. F. Keith Vaudeville Circuit, has made theater construction and theater management a life study, with the result that his theaters are fast becoming works of art, in that playhouses built by him or under his supervision are renowned, with him for the theater and being additions to every detail.

When Mr. Albee took the Colonial Theater, located at Broadway and City-square street, in hand early last summer he resolved to make it the smartest and most modern theater in the class of theaters situated by A. Paul Korte and Kaiser. To this end he ordered everything within the city to be tipped over, and then he himself in person a new interior from toilet to back wall that would combine art and show and be useful and costly while, at the same time gratifying the artistic sense with outside appeal.

Mr. Albee's work in theater art and Kelly's Colonial Theater opens today (Monday) for its new season as a grand new playhouse.

The reconstructed Colonial will be a grand surprise to vaudeville patrons. Mr. Albee desired a well-stamped metal, imitation marble, like pattern and sturdy hangings. He buys from artists merchandise the finest decorative products that a Russian artist can choose and an excellent piece can be bought. Everything must be real and must be attractive to the eye. Mr. Albee designed the first painted theater built in the country—Cable's Boston Theater—and he spent half a million more than his job employer had paid on a theater. The humor and a reputation of opinionator and connoisseur, and it brought the smart set to vaudeville and made this hobbyist respected at the amusement level. Then he built in Philadelphia and other cities and with every new house he raised the standard of success. As a va-

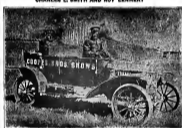

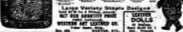

COURT ASSIGNS OPENING DATE OF WHITE RATS INVESTIGATION

Sensational Foot Noting Will
Begin October 13

Inquiry Will Be of a Sweeping
Nature

Defiant Union's Entire Past
To Be Dug Up

New York, Oct. 4.—October 13 is the date upon which the books of the White Rats are to be opened to the public to show up their secrets to the world. The weeks ago Supreme Court Justice Mitchell gave the go-ahead to a campaign of G. J. Fisher, a member of that organization, and Harry D. French, head of the labor's Industrial Union, in which they asked for an investigation of the books of the former referee. Justice Mitchell at that time appointed Lewis H. Schuchter referee in the investigation. Thursday afternoon Justice Mitchell signed the order and named October 13 as the date of the initial hearing.

Readers of The Billboard will recall that the application which had brought about the investigation allowed the misappropriation of \$200,000 of the funds of the union. There is little doubt that the hearing will be long drawn out, for those interested will go into every detail and also over the whole of the White Rats and its local union. The opening hearing on October 13 will probably be entirely devoted to a discussion of technical matters, the determining of the length of hearings and a consideration of all preliminary details.

J. and A. Deitzler, legal representatives of Miss Pennington, made the following statement yesterday, which indicates somewhat what may be expected as to the nature of the hearing: "Harry Mitchell," said the attorney, "has attacked me in his book and, under the attack, he will only have to go into the minutiae of the White Rats' activities next year. He is wrong, for the order will search as to dig up the past of the White Rats and to go over all their transactions ever back to their very beginning. And this is what we are going to do. For the matter we are getting to the root of this matter of an organization which handled large amounts and which had a side on wheels a dollar."

WAR TAX WILL BE BODY BLOW TO MANY TEN- CENT THEATERS

C. C. Pettijohn Says Effect Will
Be Serious

One-Quarter of These Houses
Could Not Survive

Picture Men Should Work for
Elimination of Tax

New York, Oct. 4.—C. C. Pettijohn, general manager of the American Exhibition Association, here and elsewhere made the point that the war tax, in its present form, will have on picture theaters a serious and immediate effect to one-quarter of the ten-cent theaters and that it will cause a general increase in admissions prices at theaters. He is optimistic, however, and says that exhibitors should also be able to cope by carefully planned plans that the tax on ten-cent theaters should be eliminated in December. Mr. Pettijohn's opinion is as follows:

"The war tax will cause a great hardship, especially on ten-cent theaters. The motion picture exhibitors of the United States have been most willing to do their bit for Uncle Sam. Their screens have been at the disposal of the Government for war bond and Government propaganda. I have seen a number of a stage theater in the United States refusing to cooperate in this great work."

"I believe that the tax as it now stands will put twenty-five per cent of the ten-cent houses out of business. Another twenty-five per cent will stop the production of picture material, and probably fifty per cent will be

unable to continue a ten-cent program at all. My understanding is that this matter will be required in such manner that the tax will be paid by the exhibitor making admission."

"The Government would profit millions in the matter of cinema exhibition. Ten, twenty-five and thirty-cent seats, and sell these tickets to motion picture exhibitors for one, two and three cents. It would employ the financial work as the best of the theaters and insure the Government a net return on the tax without a surplus checking."

"If every exhibitor in the United States will make a complete report thirty days after the tax goes into effect to the headquarters of the exhibitors' organizations it will give us some legitimate figures and I

Chicago, Oct. 13.—Local vaudeville agents are scratching their heads to receive the all-around support of vaudeville for both big-time and smaller circuits. IMPORTANT DECISION IN PICTURE CONTROVERSY

Federal Court in New York Finds Blumenthal Picture Encroaches on Material Used in Herbert Brenon's Fall of the Romanoffs

New York, Oct. 8.—The first line of a judicial opinion regarding film infringement and picture plagiarism was drawn with unusual clarity by Judge Charles M. Sweeney, in the Federal District Court, who last week found a restraining order which will prevent the Blumenthal, Powell and DeWolf Film Company and Ince & Co. from using anything of a nature similar to the material used in Herbert Brenon's picture, *Fall of the Romanoffs*. The order prohibits both from reproducing any scene, sketch or graphic, the plot of the *Romanoffs*. The order prohibits both from reproducing any scene, sketch or graphic of *Borgia*, *Die Schatzen der Savoyen*, *Die Dames du Dessous* and from using any title similar to that of the *Romanoffs*.

New York, Oct. 15.—Justice Murray, in the United States District Court, today made permanent the temporary injunction granted the last of the week in three suits brought by Charlie Chaplin against various motion picture manufacturers and distributors to prevent them from the promiscuous use of his name and of pictures purporting to exploit his work.

The decision is a big victory for the famous screen comedian in the light of a series of legal battles he has waged against those who are almost to be stumbling in always ways to trade upon his name and reputation.

The action was brought by Hubert Nathan on behalf of Charlie Chaplin, the defendants being Otto Lithograph Co., Oscar J. Lopez, Joseph Wilson, Paul Sandoz and Wray Paineberg, trading as the Motion Picture Film Co.; Charles Bros. Inc.; Sheila Coney, Charles A. Conroy and James J. Conroy.

Big A Film Co., Sam Kestel and Nathan Franklin Judge Harvey had obtained a temporary restraining order forbidding these defendants from publishing the photographs, entitled "Fool of the Ranney Hotel," featuring Charlie Chaplin in suitable veils, "Disputed Swoon," featuring Charlie Chaplin in his role, and "One Law for Both," featuring Charlie Chaplin in two roles, and from removing the same from the territories of the work, and any copying contained in the title or subtitle thereof the names Charlie Chaplin and Chaplin, which was set in the territory covered by Chaplin, and from assembling any copies of a work which Chaplin produced with names appearing thereon, and from displaying before the public any material containing any statement that Chaplin produced, directed or acted in the three above named pictures, and from having any picture bearing Charlie's name or photograph unless in connection with a genuine Chaplin production.

The complaint charged that the defendants entered into a conspiracy for the purpose of exploiting Charlie in his reputation and business and to de-

Admits That Managers Are Practically Powerless

Tells of Zealous Efforts To Stamp Out Evil

Public's Refusal To Buy Only Logical Solution

New York, Oct. 15.—The R. F. Keefe, executive treasurer here again engaged in a strenuous effort to suppress the ticket speculators, but R. F. Keefe, general manager of the Keith Circuit, declares that the management is powerless to cope effectively with the evil and that the public's refusal to buy tickets of the speculators is the only logical solution of the problem.

At all the Keith circuits in New York, where the speculators are working with the greatest vigor, and private detectives have been employed with the known management to break up the profitable little game. Each employee has been duly informed that any collusion with a speculator on the part of a Keith employee will result instant dismissal. But the hopelessness of the situation is well defined by the following letter which was recently sent by Mr. Albree to a person of one of the Keith houses who had made a definite statement concerning his experience of finding tickets on the shelves of the speculators.

Mr. Albree thanks his correspondent for the same given him, and she declares that the general management has done everything to its power to stop speculating in tickets at its circuits. He goes on to say in part:

"There is no way that we can regulate the sale of our tickets so that they won't get into the hands of the speculators. You could go yourself to one of our box offices and buy a number of seats and let's them over to the speculators. This is what they do. They simply buy up all over the city, and they don't empty the seats people twice. They have employed detectives, men on the outside, to advise patrons and to buy tickets from the speculators and encourage them, but the trouble is that the general management encourage it so that they can get the seats themselves provided they like it and all the box offices."

"And the public goes with an enthusiasm to buy and these seats are left on the speculators' hands this condition will continue. There is no theater manager or manager who can stop the ticket and the time of the box office.

JOHN RINGLING ADDS ANOTHER RAILROAD TO HIS HOLDINGS

Purchases Delphi Division of
the B. & O.

Price Paid Reported To Be
\$275,000

Head Runs From Dayton to
Mansfield, O.

John Ringling, the circus magnate, thru Attorney Herbert Bradley of Cincinnati, on Wednesday last week added another railroad to his holdings, purchasing the Delphi Division of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad for a reported price of \$275,000. The sale was held at Dayton, O., by Master Commissioner A. A. Furness. The road extends from Dayton to Mansfield, and was formerly a branch of the Cincinnati, Hamilton & Dayton Railroad.

United States Judge H. C. Hollister, of Cincinnati, on Monday authorized the sale.

It was reported here last week that Attorney Sherman T. McPherson, representing attorneys along the Delphi Division, would appear before Judge Hollister on Monday afternoon and present against the sale.

Mr. Ringling's attorney in Cincinnati early Monday morning for the purpose of holding conference with his attorney and to attend the hearing before Judge Hollister. When that was concluded Attorney McPherson stated that he had received with the purchase of the road and its attorney had had no protest or notice of the sale.

After some legal discussion by various attorneys Judge Hollister stated that he saw no reason why the sale should not be continued by the court and so ordered.

Mr. Ringling made a very brief visit to Chicago, leaving the city on Monday night. His attorney, in a statement made to a Billboard representative with the news of the sale at Chicago to make a statement as to his client's plans, but that he understood Mr. Ringling was the owner of other railroads and it is presumed the Delphi branch was purchased as an investment.

This was the third time the Delphi branch was offered for sale. A Cincinnati man had purchased the road, but the sale was not confirmed by the court and the road was allowed three weeks ago, but no bidders appeared.

Mr. Ringling's attorney was the only bidder at the sale Wednesday.

AGENT IS NOT A MANAGER FINDING OF THREE JUDGES

Opinion Proves of Importance to Booking Profession, Which Had Been Watching for Outcome of William Thompson Case—Fine of \$50 Imposed on Defendant

New York, Oct. 26.—The booking profession, which has been waiting for a verdict in the William Thompson case, is now emphasizing the finding which was returned yesterday, when three judges in special sessions ruled that an agent is not a manager. Thompson, who admits that he has been conducting business as a manager, was fined \$50 for not being a broker.

James F. Hiltman of Cunningham & Kelly's Bureau of Liaison presented Thompson. The complaint in the case was written by Vander Pries, an agent, and Alfred K. Laska, who works in pictures. The former charged that he paid Thompson \$100 to obtain bookings for him while the agent promised to secure an engagement for him at \$175 a week, and management to be provided to him later than January 15.

The complaint testified that he did not receive any management and all the money that was ever paid back to him was \$61.

Vander Pries testified he gave the same \$100 to obtain an engagement, which was promised him by May 15. No such engagement was procured, however.

The Liaison Bureau took up the case last spring and Thompson was held in the West Side Court for General Business. Thompson made the claim, at that time, that he was not a booking agent, but was a manager and was therefore entitled to more than the five per cent allowed the agent by law.

Judge Garin, Hiltman and Collins yesterday made the ruling, when they Thompson was acting as an agent, but did not hold a license which would have his conduct of such business.

The court ordered Thompson to return the money taken from the two men and also took him \$50. He paid the fine and also gave up his accounts with the two complainants.

B. O. cancellation, and when failing to secure another engagement to fill in the open time, then notifies the act, one, two or three days before, instead of the proper two weeks.

We have posted a notice that hereafter when a representative so fails to properly notify the act cancelled in due time, the representative will be required by this office to pay the artist's salary lost through his neglect, for the cancelled week, or for such time as would make up a full two weeks' notice.

It is now up to the acts to notify this office if these orders are not carried out. The vaudeville managers have had certain understandings with the artists, through their respective organizations, in reference to the contract and the two weeks' notice clause in it. Artists will be aiding that understanding and assisting in improving the conditions if they will inform us as requested herein.

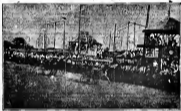
