

### Media Information

Press Row: Wisconsin working facilities for press-radio-television are located on the west side of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

Working Tickets: All requests for Press Row tickets must be placed with the Sports Information Office. Tickets are either mailed or held for pickup at the Press Will Call window at Gate 2.

Photographers: Photographers may work from either the north or south ends and west side of the court.

Player Interviews: Media representatives may interview Badger palyers fifteen minutes after each game. Arrangements should be made with Tamara J. Flarup. Players are also available for interviews or pictures on Monday. Requests should be made through the Sports Information Office. Suggested time for appointments is 4:30 p.m.

Coaches Interviews: Edwina Qualls will meet with media representatives 15 minutes after each game. Meeting room will be the Reinke Room located at the north end of the Fieldhouse. The best time to interview Coach Qualls on a daily basis is at 1:30 p.m. in her office at the stadium (in person or by telephone), and before practice each day at 4:30 p.m. in the Fieldhouse.


### Madison and the Wisconsin Campus

Nestled between a chain of four sparkling lakes, the most dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief business is education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-America City given by the National Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is a 129-acre park-like peninsula called Picnic Point which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.



Dr. Kit Saunders begins her eighth year as Wisconsin's Director of Women's Athletics. She has had a long association with women's athletics at Wisconsin, however, having served as the sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education, and women's tennis coach for eight years prior to her present appointment in 1974.

Under Kit's leadership the athletic program has experienced great increases each year in funding and participation. Wisconsin teams have enjoyed the benefits of excellent coaching, fine facilities and adequate budgets while the Wisconsin women's sports program has emerged as a model for other Division I athletic programs.

Kit's demonstrated leadership at home has also had an impact within the state, region and even nationally. She has served in numerous state offices including that of President. She has been a Commissioner for the six-state Midwest Region V, and is presently national Vice President of the AIAW for Division I schools.

Assisting Dr. Saunders in directing the Wisconsin women's athletics program is Paula Bonner. Beginning her fourth year as Assistant Athletic Director, the South Carolina native brings the enthusiasm and knowledge to her position which makes her so indispensable to the staff and student-athletes alike. Her varied responsibilities include working closely with the coaches and athletes in matters concerning recruitment, financial aid, eligibility and special events arrangements. Paula is currently serving as chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees.





#### Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 12-sport women's athletic program lies with Tamara J. Flarup, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Under Tam's direction the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures, writes weekly sports releases and features on women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (W.I.S.) in their promotion and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, and is a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee.



Janet Tappon begins her fourth year as the head Women's Athletic Trainer at Wisconsin. Utilizing the modern training facilities in Camp Randall Stadium, Jan provides for the care, prevention and treatment of injuries for all Wisconsin women athletes.

Together with her staff of student trainers, Jan is responsible for covering all practices and competitions of the 12 women's sports. Besides the Camp Randall training center, Jan also has access to training facilities in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse and Natatorium. All are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus.

Jan is a N.A.T.A. certified athletic trainer whose experience and knowledge helped her in being selected to be one of 60 athletic trainers who worked with the athletes at the 1980 Winter Olympic Games in Lake Placid, NY.



#### Academic Counseling

Academic excellence is a phrase which is stressed at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the student-athlete.

Assistant to the Director of Athletics Diane Johnson and Counselor Alan Zussman are responsible for the Wisconsin athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Al have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane and Allan offer counseling sessions on a one-on-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. Johnson and Zussman take a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.





#### **EDWINA QUALLS**

Head basketball Coach Edwina Qualls begins her sixth year of coaching women's basketball at Wisconsin. A native of Connecticut, Edwina coached basketball and taught physical education at R. C. Lee High School in New Haven where whe compiled an 82-15 high school coaching record over a seven year period. Her teams consistently appeared in the Connecticut State basketball tournament claiming the Class L state title in 1975, and runners-up titles two other years.

Edwina's university coaching experience began at Southern Connecticut State College where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physical education. She later teamed with basketball great Louise O'Neal as her assistant basketball coach at Yale University prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Coach Qualls was honored by being named "Coach of the Year" in 1975 by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. She served as the Midwest basketball coach at the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs in 1979, and was a member of the AIAW Division I Basketball Committee in 1980.

#### KATHY RICHEY WALTON



Now in her third year at Wisconsin, Assistant coach Kathy Richey Walton came to the Badger basketball program with a broad background both as a player and coach.

A native of Bellefontaine, Ohio, Kathy played in three AIAW National Basketball Championships while an undergraduate student at Ashland College in Ohio. Her teams placed third, fourth and eighth in those three years.

In addition to her extensive playing experience, Kathy gained a solid coaching background at the high school and college levels in Ohio and Iowa. This included a one year stint as assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa, where she concurrently works on her M.A. Degree in Athletic Administration.

### Assistant Coach

#### **DENNIS SIMPSON**



The 1981-82 season marks the sixth year that Dennis has been associated with the UW women's basketball program. The first three were spent as assistant to the varsity squad, where he helped develop many of the program's prominent players. The last three years were spent as head coach of the varsity reserve squad, where he compiled a 26-15 record. Dennis returns as an assistant to the varsity this season.

A 1972 graduate of Western Kentucky University, Dennis earned his B.A. degree in sociology with a minor in recreation. Before coming to the UW, Dennis taught at two high schools in Louisville, Kentucky, where he also served as assistant men's basketball coach. Since his arrival in Madison, Dennis has participated in several youth oriented programs, in addition to his responsibilities with the UW women's basketball program. He is currently working on a Master's Degree in Counseling and Guidance at the UW.

### 1981-82 Badger Women's Basketball

If one word could epitomize the attitude of the 1981-82 University of Wisconsin women's basketball team it would be **hungry**. After two consecutive losing seasons, this year's cage team seems determined to turn its fortunes around. With a mixture of youth and experience, the squad appears to have the capability to do just that. Eight letter winners return and three promising freshman are coming in, magnifying prospects for success at the UW this year.

However, if one word could dash the hopes of the 1981-82 Badgers, it would be **injuries**. Four players prominent in the plans of Head Coach Edwina Qualls are coming off nagging injuries which could affect their performances and those of the Badgers this year. Michelle Lowman, a 6-3 center from New Haven, CT who started in the pivot for Wisconsin last year, scoring 194 points and grabbing 187 rebounds in 31 games, is coming off an ankle injury suffered in early September of this year.

Two other possible starters, Carol Jones, a cat-quick junior guard from Chicago, IL, and Vivian Rorer, a versatile senior forward from Peoria, IL, come into the 1981-82 season after breaking ankles a year ago. Jones averaged 9.4 points in 18 games last year before going out of action. Rorer, who looks to be completely recovered from her ankle problems, averaged 7.7 points and 6.2 rebounds in 18 games in her initial season as a Badger.

The final injury occurred to Theresa Theder, one of the top freshman recruits signed by Coach Qualls in 1981, who suffered from knee problems and eventually succumbed to surgery. After an illustrious high school career, the multi-talented 6-3 center from Watertown, WI holds the potential of adding scoring punch and defense to the Badger middle when healthy. If healthy, the talent and experience of all these players could solidify the Wisconsin output and depth both offensively and defensively and make the 1981-82 picture even brighter.


While the performance of these four players are important to this year's Badger team, they are only one dimension of a squad which possesses several other fine players. The top performer of this group is 5-11 junior forward Theresa Huff of Milwaukee, WI. Theresa is a dominating presence on both ends of the court for Wisconsin, and her statistics bear that out. In her two years at Wisconsin, she has averaged 14.1 and 16.6 points per game respectively, while shooting at an impressive .498 clip from the floor. She has complemented that by averaging 8.8 rebounds per contest. Her defense has stayed on par with the offensive output, as evidenced by her 54 career blocked shots. With just two years of playing time under her belt, Theresa is on the verge of becoming the dominant figure in the Badger record book. She is among the top five in nine school offensive and defensive career categories. The Badgers hope the 1981-82 season will bring even better things from this talented athlete.

Another top-notch performer for Wisconsin in 1981-82 season figures to be 5-5 sophomore guard Faith Johnson of Minneapolis, MN. In her initial year as a Badger player, Faith scored at an 8.0 point per game clip. However, she showed her real potential later in the year when more playing time and a greater adjustment to college life saw her come on to average 14.1 points per game in the team's last 13 contests. Included in that string was a 26 point output vs. Indiana on January 30 in Madison. With such potential, Coach Qualls figures to start Faith at the point guard position for Wisconsin this season.

Janet Huff, a sophomore guard from Milwaukee, WI, should also inject strong offense into the Badger attack. She tallied 5.5 points per game as a freshman reserve and showed flashes of offensive and defensive potential which should aid Wisconsin this season. Her 77 assists were the second most ever by a Badger freshman.

Other members of the Badger team figuring to get extensive playing time this year are Kristine Hallisy, a 5-11 junior forward-center from Antigo, WI, Debbie Ambruso, a 5-8 junior guard from Kenosha, WI, Linda Sielaff, a 5-8 junior guard from Milwaukee, WI, and Lizbeth Minchem, a 5-10 sophomore forward from Kalamazoo, MI. In addition, two other freshmen, Chris Pruitt (Chicago, IL) and Andrea Adams (Milwaukee, WI), could be prominent figures in 1981-82 season plans. Pruitt is an explosive guard who averaged 24 points a game in her career at Chicago Simeon Vocational High School. Adams led her Milwaukee Pius High School to the WISAA Wisconsin State Basketball Championships, averaging 14 points and 10 rebounds.

Despite the talent the Badgers have put together, they will need it all, for the 1981-82 schedule provides some of the stiffest competition they have ever faced. As a build-up to organized Big Ten Conference play in 1982-83, the Badgers have slated a large number of Big Ten opponents for play in 1981-82. Minnesota, Northwestern, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan State and Iowa dot the Wisconsin schedule. Tough non-conference foes such as Illinois State, Maryland, Georgetown, Loyola of Chicago and DePaul also await the Badgers. Badger fans will be able to see eleven such contests at the UW-Fieldhouse this year.

Theresa led Watertown High School to the runner-up spot in the 1981 Wisconsin Class A basketball tournament. She was named as a member of the All-Tournament Team and was later selected to the Wisconsin All-State team and was named the state's co-Player of the Year. 


