

South Kilworth Pop-up Café

Our first pop-up café took place on 21 September in the Village Hall and was attended by over 50 villagers of all ages, (except those at school) between 10:30 am and 1 pm. The most delicious sweet and savoury treats were kindly donated by fellow villagers and included gluten-free and vegan varieties too. For residents that are housebound, some 'goodie-bags' were delivered after the event.

Following the positive feedback received, a second pop-up café was held on 19 October 2021 and about 30 villagers attended. Thank you to all that attended, baked, and helped in any way.

A successful grant application made to Leicestershire County Council on behalf of the Parish Council has meant that the pop-up café can be run free of charge for a 4-month trial period. The aim is that if villagers enjoy the pop-up café experience, it eventually becomes self-funding, via donations. Appropriate Covid precautions have been instituted.

News from the Avon Swift Group of Churches

October was a busy month in the Diocese with many people being welcomed into active ministry. Five ordination services were held in October, with 25 people being ordained as deacons or priests, each one serving in a local parish context. Locally, Rev Stephen March is serving in the Hexagon Benefice (Husband's Bosworth area) as well as continuing his pioneering ministry in the Avon Swift

Team.



On Saturday 9 October the annual 'Called Together' service took place at Leicester Cathedral. There were eight people newly licensed as Readers and two as Associate Ministers. There were also six Readers and one Pastoral Assistant who were licensed in January via Zoom and were present in the cathedral to be prayed for by the Bishop and receive their symbols of ministry. During the service, our Pioneer, Sharon March, was interviewed by Rev Liz Rawlings, Discipleship and Vocations Enabler, about her role in the training of lay ministers in the diocese.

Exciting news too about our new diocesan structure! The Diocese of Leicester Synod has voted in favour of a 'Minster Community' (MC for short) framework. A Minster Community will be a "group of parishes" who work together to collaborate in mission without losing their individual identity, and who work alongside their church schools, fresh expressions of Church, chaplaincies, etc.

For each local MC of between 12 and 16 churches, there will be a leadership team of at least four people, including lay and ordained roles. Each MC will be led by an Oversight Minister who is ordained. One of the team will be a 'Growing Faith' focussed minister, either lay or ordained, to

increase inclusion of children and young people within the ministry of our churches and fresh expressions. As well as the Oversight Minister, the leadership teams will comprise at least (but not limited, to depending on resources) three other stipendiary posts.

The framework was overwhelmingly supported (72%) by Synod and it is intended it will gradually be brought into place by 2026, depending on discussions between parishes, schools and fresh expressions working together to decide what their local leadership will be.

5.0 TO CONFIRM MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING OF COUNCIL, HELD ON 14th SEPT'21

These minutes were confirmed to be a true record of matters discussed, and decisions reached, by the Parish Council.

6.0 PLANNING MATTERS

6.1 New Applications: 21/01685/FUL, Yew Tree House, North Rd, SK, erection of extension to front of garage and conversion to habitable accommodation as an annexe, dated 16th Sept'21 – The PC resolved to comment on this application expressing concerns that the application could create a precedent for development in front of the established building line along North Road.

6.2 Planning decision/s rec'd: None

7.0 PARISHIONERS TIME

- 7.1 Re resident's complaint regarding the newly installed zip-wire in the children's play area, overlooking their back garden PA reported that he had met with the resident on site to discuss the issue. The PC agreed to obtain a quote to replace the playing field fence, and at the rear of the property, to a height which should prevent children from being able to see over in to the private garden.
- **7.2** Re Council owned overhanging trees on to parishioner's garden GB confirmed that these trees had now been cut back satisfactorily. Resolved.
- **7.3** A group of 3 attendees requested that the PC support residents in addressing the problems caused by vehicles speeding on the village roads. A copy of a typed report, prepared by one of the group, was handed to the PC, outlining the concerns, along with suggestions for going forward. There followed a detailed discussion around various options that could potentially be pursued.

PA hi-lighted that LCC is the decision making body on all traffic matters however the PC assured the group that they would fully support any proposed measures that might help to reduce the very real dangers that existed. PA also reminded everyone that LCC had carried out a speed monitoring exercise a few years ago and it was evident from the results that the majority of speeding culprits were actually South Kilworth residents, rather than passing through traffic.

It was acknowledged however that, since the previous data collection had been carried out, the road situation in SK was now very different, as traffic volume had significantly increased, not least due to the building of new houses in the areas.

Action – the resident group will prepare a letter, addressed to PA, outlining the problem and requesting that action be taken to address. The PC agreed to forward on to LCC, with their full support.

Two of the attendees left the meeting.

- **8.2** KB reported on the cash balances held by the Parish Council at 30/09/21, along with bank reconciliation PC approved.
- **8.3** PC approved the year to date statement of income and expenditure with comparison to budget for financial year 2021-2022, circulated to Cllrs prior to the meeting.

9.0 PARISH COUNCIL PROCEDURES

9.1 Community Emergency Plan update – Discussion to be carried forward to next meeting. Pending.

- **9.2** The PC approved the following amendments to the current Standing Orders:
 - 1. All reference to the allowance of PC meetings being held virtually, to be removed. The government legislation introduced during 2020, allowing virtual meetings to be held due to the coronavirus pandemic, was a temporary measure only, and has now been revoked, as of May 2021.
 - 2. To remove the requirement for the Clerk to keep a record of all planning applications received for comment as this information is available to all, on the HDC website.
 - 3. To remove the requirement for the Clerk to report individual quarterly income and expenditure through the year. To retain the requirement for year to date reporting, on a quarterly basis, along with budget comparison.
 - Year-end accounts, again taking out the mention of 'last quarter' to be reported, retaining year to date figures only.
 Resolved.

10.0 HIGHWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

- 10.1 Re 'LCC Highways Members Fund', £25K to be made available to the County KB reported that a decision from HDC regarding SK's request for financing to be made available for vehicle activated signage to be provided for the village, was expected to be received within the next couple of weeks. Pending.
- 10.2 GB reported that a 30 mph speed sign on Rugby Road was faulty. Action: KB to report to LCC.
- 10.3 An attendee reported that a junction sign on Welford Road was currently unlit. KB to report to LCC.

11.0 VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS

- 11.1 Proposed training session to be arranged re the use of the defibrillator equipment PC agreed that TW would forward a notice to SKN for publication in the November edition, detailing dates and times of 2 training sessions to be held in the village hall, Thursdays, 18th and 25th November'21, 7.30pm. Each session will be limited to 10 people, due to covid awareness. Anyone interested in attending should contact the clerk by email, on southkilworthpc@hotmail.co.uk. The notice will also be published on the PC website.
- 11.2 GB reported Elder Trees/Bushes overhanging the bus shelter on Walcote Road were likely to damage the shelter roof. The PC agreed to accept a quote for £400 to have these cut down. Action: GB to instruct the contractor to proceed.
- 11.3 GB reported that two memorial seats positioned at the rear of the village hall were in need of restoration. The PC agreed to accept a quote of £120 for the repairs to be carried out. Action: GB to instruct the contractor to proceed.

12.0 RECREATION

- 2.1 Zip Wire installation in children's play area PA/KB confirmed that the £6.2k had been received from the CIC, as part funding of the zip wire. The PC agreed to provide a plaque to be displayed on site, acknowledging the funding contribution to the project, as part of the offer conditions set by HDC. Action: PA to arrange the supply of the plaque. KB to prepare the project completion report to be forwarded to HDC.
- **12.2** TW will arrange for Wicksteed to service the zip wire equipment.

13.0 VILLAGE WEBSITE

13.1 The upgrading of the Village website – KC (not in attendance) informed the PC by email, that the new website is expected to go live over the next seven days, and that content management training would be arranged for the administers. Pending.

14.0 FUNDING FROM \$106 FUND

14.1 Re the formulation of a village consultation regarding future S106 funding – The PC agreed that, due to covid awareness, it would be advisable to wait until 2022 before arranging a full village presentation. The PC planned to discuss, at the next month's meeting, the possibility of carrying out a website survey meantime.

15.0 WAR MEMORIAL CLOCK

- 15.1 Re the marking of the 100th anniversary of the installation of the memorial and the invitation for people to visit and view the clock –The PC agreed for the event to be held on Sat 13th Nov'21, with the tower being open between the hours of 9 and 12 a.m. TW and two volunteers have offered to act as guides on the day. Note, this event is not suitable for children.
 - Action: KB to inform those that have already requested to take part in the tour, re confirmed date and times. Anyone who hasn't already been in contact and wishing to visit the tower, please email the parish clerk on southkilworthpc@hotmail.co.uk.
- **15.2** Re previously reported lighting failures in the church tower KC to contact the PCC re repairs.

16.0 FUNDING FROM THE CIC (EIGHT PARISHES)

16.1 Re update on refunding due from CIC of £909.92, re HCYC Spring'21 term – KB confirmed that £1999.04 had been received from the CIC covering both the spring and summer terms.

17.0 SOUTH KILWORTH NEWS

PA reported that discussions were ongoing with the editorial team regarding ensuring that this very valuable publication can become financially viable and is able to continue.

18.0 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

18.1 The PC acknowledged the email update received from the NP representative on 30th September. Resolved.

19.0 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- 19.1 Rural Community Council Rural Strategy work for Harborough District Council.
 The PC received an email dated 12th Oct, requesting feedback to help the RCC to build and support a community rural strategy, on behalf of HDC. This item to be deferred to next month's meeting for discussion.
- 19.2 GB raised the condition of the Welford Road after the reservoir, up the hill and down to the Hemploe crossroads acknowledging that this is outside the Parish and in Northamptonshire. Nonetheless the PC agreed we should raise this matter with NCC as the number and size of the potholes is a real danger. PA to find out who we need to write to and follow up with NCC
- 20.0 TO CONFIRM DATE OF NEXT MEETING TUESDAY, 9TH NOV '21, 7.15 P.M.



Meet James Meakin - Author



My name is James Meakin and I have been living in South Kilworth for around a year.

At the start of July, I self-published my debut novel on Amazon, entitled *Two Dead Dissidents*. It is a murder mystery and espionage thriller set in 2023 and 2024 in the United Kingdom, France, Belarus and Russia. Intelligence Corps Captain Daniel Holloway and DCI Len Tidworth of the Metropolitan Police must investigate the murder of two Russian dissidents in London. Their investigation draws them to death threats made against the Paris-based anti-Putin oligarch, Nikolai Travsky.

Two Dead Dissidents takes inspiration from contemporary global social and political issues such as the Skripal poisoning, the 2020 protests in Belarus and the medium-term fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic. The novel's originality is derived from its setting in our constantly in-flux times.

Fans of murder mysteries from the Golden Age of crime fiction will notice many references to this genre. A significant portion of the book is set on board a luxury train between Paris and Moscow – a nod to Agatha Christie's *Murder on the Orient Express*. Most of all, the crime novelists of the 1920s and 1930s were writing during times of great crisis and upheaval such as the aftermath of the First World War and the Great Depression. They provided escapism to a scarred population. Two Dead Dissidents hopes to fill a similar role for our current times.

Overall, *Two Dead Dissidents* is a tense yet entertaining story, packed to the brim with unexpected twists and turns. With unusual settings in a unique period of time, my novel is a fresh and enjoyable new take on a well-loved genre. If you enjoy reading my novel, you will be pleased to know there is a sequel already in the pipeline. Two Dead Dissidents is available on Amazon in paperback for £7.99 and on Kindle for £3.99.

ST. NICHOLAS' CHURCH

Readers may not be aware, but the Church has to be inspected by a Church-appointed Architect every five years to assess the state of the Church building.

The Quinquennial inspection took place this summer. Unfortunately, the Report came back with rather a lot of work to be undertaken particularly the Chancel roof which needs replacing.

The Church is a Grade II* listed building, and it has some striking Norman and Medieval features and a very unusual memorial clock. The PCC is working hard to maintain it for future generations. It is a place not only for worship and quiet reflection but also for major events in peoples' lives such as weddings, christenings and funerals. Everyone is most welcome to enjoy this historical and tranquil place, whether you have a faith or not. The Church is also an important asset in our village, and it would be a sad day if it were to close.

Update on Neighbourhood Plan Groups

Following an open meeting at the end of 2019, various people offered to help set up working groups

This is my last report, as I have handed the responsibility back to the Parish Council to oversee the groups.

Various groups have met to look at the planned action objectives, despite the challenges due to Covid-19, especially as it has delayed any action by local councils.

UPDATE ON ACTION

Improve parking at the school

This group held meetings with the school and local residents and a variety of proposals were explored, resulting in:

- The layby near the school has had extra tarmac put on it to provide further "drop off" parking at busy times
- This layby should be upgraded but at present, the council have no money to do this we will keep nagging
- We have got the footpath upgraded from the village hall, via the back of the church to the school.
 This includes new tarmac, removal of the gate near the church, clearing of vegetation along this pathway, and new dog poo bins. The village hall car park can now be used as a drop-off/and walk to school.
- A school campaign/ parent information is also underway

Improving the facilities at the allotments

- There are plans to get a water supply onto the allotment site
- There is Section 106 money available

Bird Watching

Stanford Reservoir

Since my last article, birding at the reservoir has been slow going although, as normal, there are always some goodies to be seen.

Over the summer and into the autumn I have managed to record several Marsh Harriers which are passing through the reservoir. The number of records has increased over the past 5 years perhaps indicating that this scarce bird of prey has been having a better time of it in recent years - the last 2 years we have averaged around 7 sightings per annum at the reservoir.

A visitor from Siberia

On the 12th October, I received a message from the ringing group to say that they had caught a Yellow-browed Warbler. Breakfast was abandoned and I headed down to see the bird before it was released. This was only the 16th record for Northamptonshire, with 7 of these being at Stanford Reservoir. These tiny warblers breed across Russia, extending east from the Urals as far as Kamchatka and south to Afghanistan, northern India and the Sea of Japan. Every autumn they appear well inside Europe in seemingly ever-increasing numbers.

The middle fortnight of October is the peak time for their arrival in Britain, but the first birds often turn up as early as mid-September and the last as late as November. Records in England are mostly along the east coast south to Norfolk and along the south coast with a few birds recorded inland. Through the excellent work of the ringing group Yellow-browed Warbler has been recorded in the last 4 years at the site:

2021 - 12th October

2020 – 22nd September (exceptionally early for an inland site)

2019 - 12th October

2018 - 10th October

Birds to look out for over the next few weeks

Winter thrushes are now arriving from Scandinavia in large numbers. Redwings are the first to arrive, followed by Fieldfare. There is also a movement of finches at this time of year and one of the more uncommon winter visitors is the Brambling. They are more colourful than the more regular Chaffinch and if you see them in flight, they have a white rump. I have recorded several of the last few winters and they do enjoy sunflower seeds in garden feeders. Another visitor to look out for is the Siskin. Much smaller and daintier than the Greenfinches you often see but similar in colour although the male has a distinctive black crown and bib.
