Gary Beard (Music Director) has performed as organ, piano and tenor soloist, conductor and accompanist at some of the world's renowned music centers, including New York's Carnegie and Town Halls, Notre Dame Cathedral, Paris, The Spoleto Festival USA, and with numerous opera companies, orchestras and festivals under such conductors as Robert Shaw, Charles Detroit, James Conlon and Thomas Schippers. He was the longtime Artist-in-Residence at Lindenwood Church in Memphis, continues as Music Consultant at Theatre Memphis, and is the recipient of numerous local theatre awards. He performs frequently as accompanist for operatic soprano Kallen Esperian, and traveled the world for many years with trumpet virtuoso Ryan Anthony as "Anthony and Beard". His 'other musical life' includes appearances as Liberace, in his biographical cabaret, LIFE Is A BENCH, he was longtime District Director of The Metropolitan Opera Auditions, and was honored with the Germantown, TN, Arts Alliance Arts and Humanities Award.

Whitney Branan (Choreographer, Angelique, Cagelle) Born in Memphis, Whitney lived in New York for thirteen years where she was the resident tap-coach for the Broadway show, BILLY ELLIOT, and two of its national tours. She was the world-premiere Choreographer of CHANGING MINDS for Theatrical Rights Worldwide in NYC. Whitney choreographed THE IRISH AND HOW THEY GOT THAT WAY at New York City's Snug Harbor Theatre and Off-Off Broadway at Queens Theatre in the Park. A favorite Director/Choreographer credit is crafting four new musical productions aboard the post-Katrina restoration of the American Queen, the largest luxury paddle boat in the world. Whitney also directed and choreographed the live concert "Steve Kinworthy's Lovin' Every Minute", filmed in Branson, MO. Music video director credits include "Still Beating," "Play Me Again," and "Side of Everything" for songwriter Amy Barkley. Whitney is thrilled to be directing/ choreographing THE MUSIC MAN next summer at the Texas Shakespeare Festival where she will also serve as Festival Choreographer for the 2022 summer season. She is the founder/owner of Dramatic Movement, a company that provides drop-in dance classes for professional and preprofessional dancers in Memphis. Memphis/Mississippi Regional Director/Choreographer credits include Camelot (Allie Award for Best Direction); DISNEY'S NEWSIES (Ostrander Award for Best Choreography [Associate], Allie Award for Best Choreography, and Broadway World Regional Award for Best Choreography); OKLAHOMA! (Allie Award for Best Choreography); MADAGASCAR: A MUSICAL ADVENTURE; HEAD OVER HEELS; MAMMA MIA!; BYE BYE BIRDIE; JUNIE B. JONES: THE Musical; Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat; The Taming; Beauty and the BEAST; HELLO, DOLLY!; SCHOOLHOUSE ROCK LIVE!; HAIRSPRAY; SHOCKHEADED PETER; BROADWAY ON BEALE; ALADDIN JR; and DISNEY'S THE LION KING JR. Whitney has performed across the country (dancer at Bally's Casino in Las Vegas), and across the ocean (three award-winning tours to the International Fringe Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland). Her favorite NYC credits include Janet Van De Graaf in THE DROWSY CHAPERONE (The Gallery Players), Sheila in HAIR (Dillon's Mainstage West 54th), Catherine in PIPPIN (Snug Harbor), and Kelly in THE IRISH AND HOW THEY GOT THAT WAY (Snug Harbor/Queens Theatre in the Park). A Little Bit about the Show

LA CAGE AUX FOLLES, the musical, is based on the 1973 French play of the same name by Jean Poiret. It tells the story of a gay couple, Georges, the manager of a Saint-Tropez nightclub featuring drag entertainment, and Albin, his romantic partner and the club's star attraction, and the farcical adventures that ensue when Georges's son, Jean-Michel, brings home his fiancée's ultra-conservative parents to meet them. LA CAGE AUX FOLLES literally means "the cage of crazy women".

Opening on Broadway in 1983 LA CAGE broke barriers for gay representation by becoming the first hit Broadway musical centered on a homosexual relationship. The show's Act One finale, "I Am What I Am", received praise as a "gay anthem" and has been widely recorded. The original production ran for more than four years (1,761 performances), and won six Tony Awards, including Best Musical, Best Score and Best Book.

The success of the musical spawned a West End production and several international runs. The 2004 Broadway revival won the Tony Award for Best Revival, and the 2008 London revival garnered the Laurence Olivier Award for Best Musical Revival. The 2010 Broadway revival was nominated for eleven Tony Awards, winning the Tony Award for Best Revival of a Musical. LA CAGE AUX FOLLES is the first musical which has won the Tony Award for Best Revival of a Musical twice and it has won a Best Musical Tony Award (Best Musical or Best Revival of a Musical) for each of its Broadway productions. The show has garnered five nominations for Tony Award for Best Actor in a Musical from its three Broadway productions, twice for portrayers of Georges and three times for portrayers of Albin, winning the award twice (both for actors playing Albin).

George Hearn, who studied philosophy at Southwestern at Memphis (now Rhodes College), played Albin in the original Broadway production.



Phyllis has served as the Artist Link representative to Theatre Memphis for the past several years, helping to curate and display the work of area artists in our lobby. For that we are very grateful.



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
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THEATRE MEMPHIS ARTISTIC STAFF
