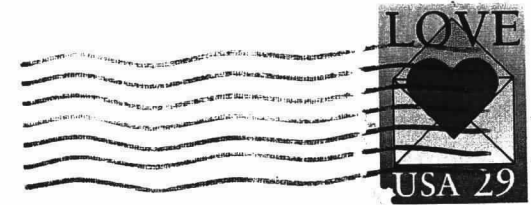

Dear Rex,

Thank you for your letter of 25 September. Sorry for the delay in response but have had a lot of correspondence to answer, and also had to give two talks at an all-day workshop at the Silver Spring LDS Library center - about 400 attended, and the speakers were mostly from the genealogical societies of Prince George's County and Montgomery Co.

Barbara McEwing was certainly very helpful at the Reunion. Her address is 2415 Brookshire Dr., Wilmington, DE 19803-2707.

I have very little to add on the parentage of those persons that you listed in your letter. We have no evidence that William and Deborah had any children; nothing new on Phillip's wife Mary, tho Elizabeth Babb will keep us posted if she finds anything new. I'm sorry that she found that the Philip we were counting on died young and was recorded!

George Hussey is apparently the least known of the line of Husseys. Mrs. Jo Buck Jones did a lot of research on the Hussey background right in the Dallas library through all the peerage books on England that she could find, and all that she could prove was that George did fit in between Thomas Hussey and John Hussey and was born ca 1551. No info on wife and family at all.

John Hussey and Mary (Wood) had Christopher, and a son John bpt 1594, who remained in England, and a Joseph who emigrated to New England. Mary was a Wood or a Woodin, but there is disagreement. In 1648 she sold some land in Hampton to a John Woodin to be held jointly by them during her lifetime and then to go entirely to him and his heirs. However, John Hussey of Dorking in the county of Surrey, England, married Dec. 5, 1593 Mary Wood. Of course you could search the Dorking records for baptisms.


On Stephen Batchelder, I suggest that you dig into the Batchelder Genealogy by Frederick Clifton Pierce which goes into much detail on his life. There was a Batchelor Family News-Journal that I used to take back in the 1970's, and one of the headlines was "The Stephen Bachiler Story: Mixture of Fact & Mystery." That issue stated that while much is known, few bare facts exist. Neither his date or place of birth, nor his parents' names are known. No record of Stephen has been found which pre-dates his entrance to St. John's College of Oxford in 1581." One problem in trying to pin him down is that Bachilers used various spellings around England. His first wife was "perhaps a Bate" and was perhaps Deborah. No record has been found. He married second in 1624 Christian Weare a widow, but all the children were by the first wife. The surviving church records of Wherewell do not begin until 1643.

There may be some info on the Foulks in one of the histories of Delaware or Chester County, but I don't have any more. On Cope I suspect there is a book on the family, as Robert Babb II, of Portland, OR sent a chart showing Elizabeth Cope as dau of Oliver Cope who emigrated from Aveburg, Wiltshire, Eng to Pa ca 1682. He was married to a Rebecca. He was son of a John Cope d. 1649 in Wilshire, Eng., who was son of a John Cope d. 1656, son of an Edward Cope, Esq, living in 1613, son of Sir Anthony Cope of Bedhampton "co. Hants" England, living in 1573.

Well, that about covers it. There may be some histories that touch on some of the others, but I am not aware of them.

I have just published a book of my Mother's writings about life on a mountain in New Hampshire around 1900, and it came out to celebrate her 100th birthday which was 15 September. She died 17 years ago, but would have been very proud of the book "The Chanticleer Weathervane." I will inclose a bit about it.

Thank you for your letter of 8 November and the additional pedigree charts. We have your line in very good shape now.


I was surprised that Rex Babb hadn't written to you about the Babb Family Association. He has known about it since we organized it in September 1989 and did attend the big reunion at Wilmington, DE a year ago last summer. He had a wonderful time as the Babbs who came down from New England were very active in that area, and there were many things to see and lots of reproduction to copy and new people to meet. We got to know each other much better than during the first reunion at Portsmouth, NH. That was partly because we all stayed at the same hotel - not scattered around - so had more time with each other.

Rex will of course enjoy your charts as he is always looking for more information - is an avid researcher.

I have enclosed a chart on the HUSSEY line which goes back into England to the 1400's. Mrs. Jo Buck Jones who prepared it is now deceased. Also enclosed is a chart from Henry Perkins showing how the Batchelder line connects to the Hussey line and then connects to the Perkins line and then to the Babb line through Bathsheba Hussey who mar. THOMAS BABB and lived in the Wilmington, DE area -- Brandywine Hundred. Also there is a write up on the PERKINS ancestry from George Little's book on Maine families. The "Genealogical Dictionary of Maine and New Hampshire" had material on the Batchelder, Hussey, and Perkins lines. (By the way, I come down from Rev. Stephen Batchelder six times through connections with settlers in Hampton, NH) The pages from "The Town of Hampton" have further clarification on the HUSSEY line that first arrived in Hampton.

These should prove interesting to you. I like to get back to good secondary sources when primary sources are not available, and these have proved to be valuable and reliable.


Delighted to receive your letter of 7 October.

I am enclosing the first three issues of Vol. 2 of the Babb Family Association News and Notes, which I send out in Sep and March each year. I think that you will enjoy reading about the various Babbs - I try to put things of interest from various lines in each issue.

The Issue #3 inclosed which has a front page article on Doddiscombsleigh, Devon in England will be of great interest. Our contact in England - Cherida Babb Coleman, a very charming lady who came to our Wilmington, DE, reunion last year - comes from a Babb line that can be traced to there. One of our members, David Babb of Belvidere, IL, just recently returned from a 5 or 6-week trip to England, Ireland, and Scotland with his wife, Jean and visited with Cherida and in Doddiscombsleigh. Altho, we have never found proof of where our Phillip of the Isles of Shoals off the coast of NH and ME came from in England, we think it was Devonshire but farther south than Dod. Also, we believe that he was connected with a number of BABB sea captains who sailed out of Stepney in the outskirts of London. Babbs of Devon were seafarers.

You might like to obtain the six issues of Vol.1 of N&N which has quite a bit of info on the sea captains and also on early ancestors of your line.

Your pedigree charts are fine, and of course fit in with those submitted earlier by Rex Babb. Also if you are interested in some repro material on your ancestral lines going back into the HUSSEY, BATCHELDER, and PERKINS families - via Bathsheba Hussey who married Thomas² Babb who migrated down from New England to Delaware back before 1700 - let me know. I don't want to overwhelm you all at once with new ancestors, tho.

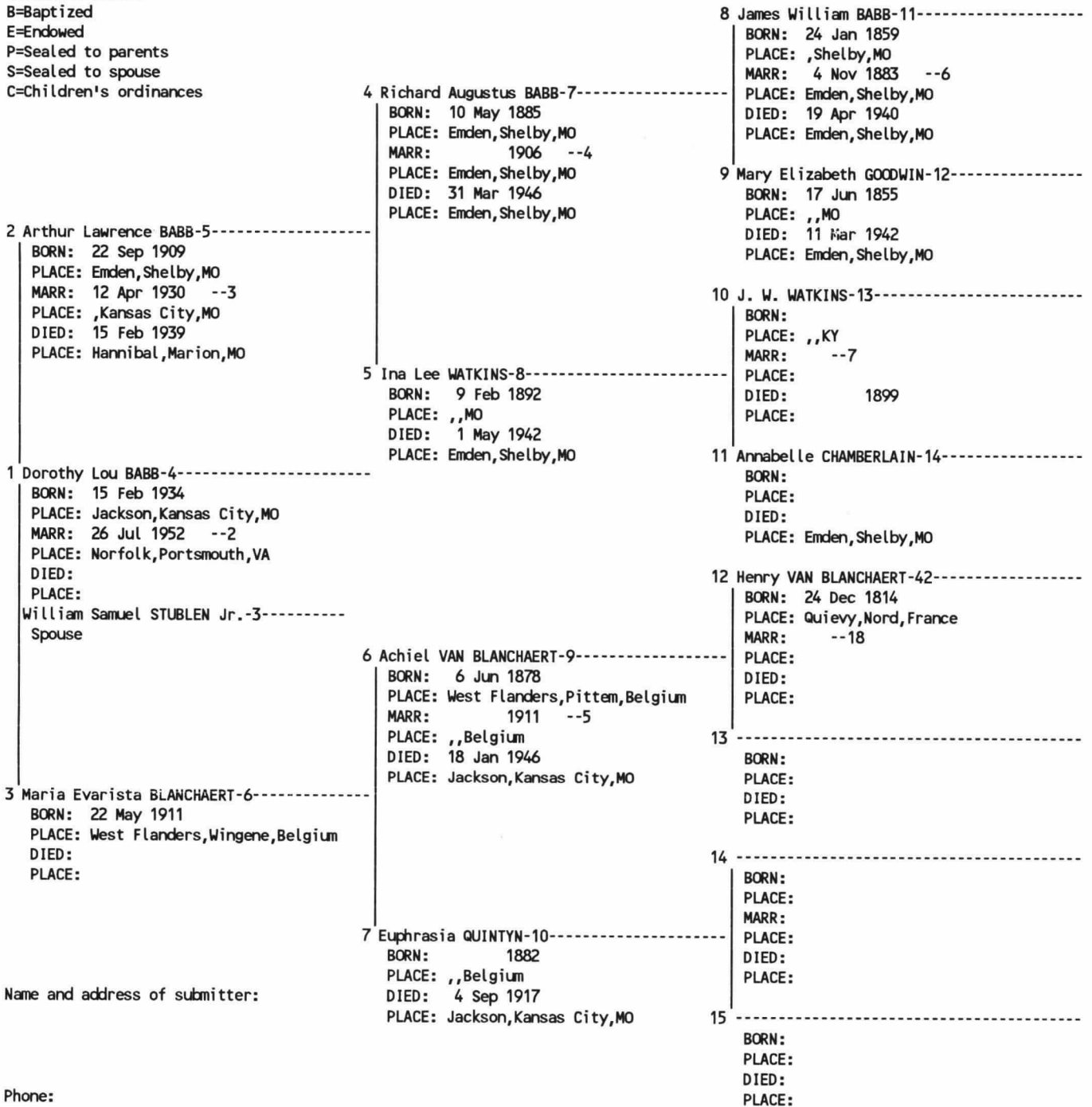

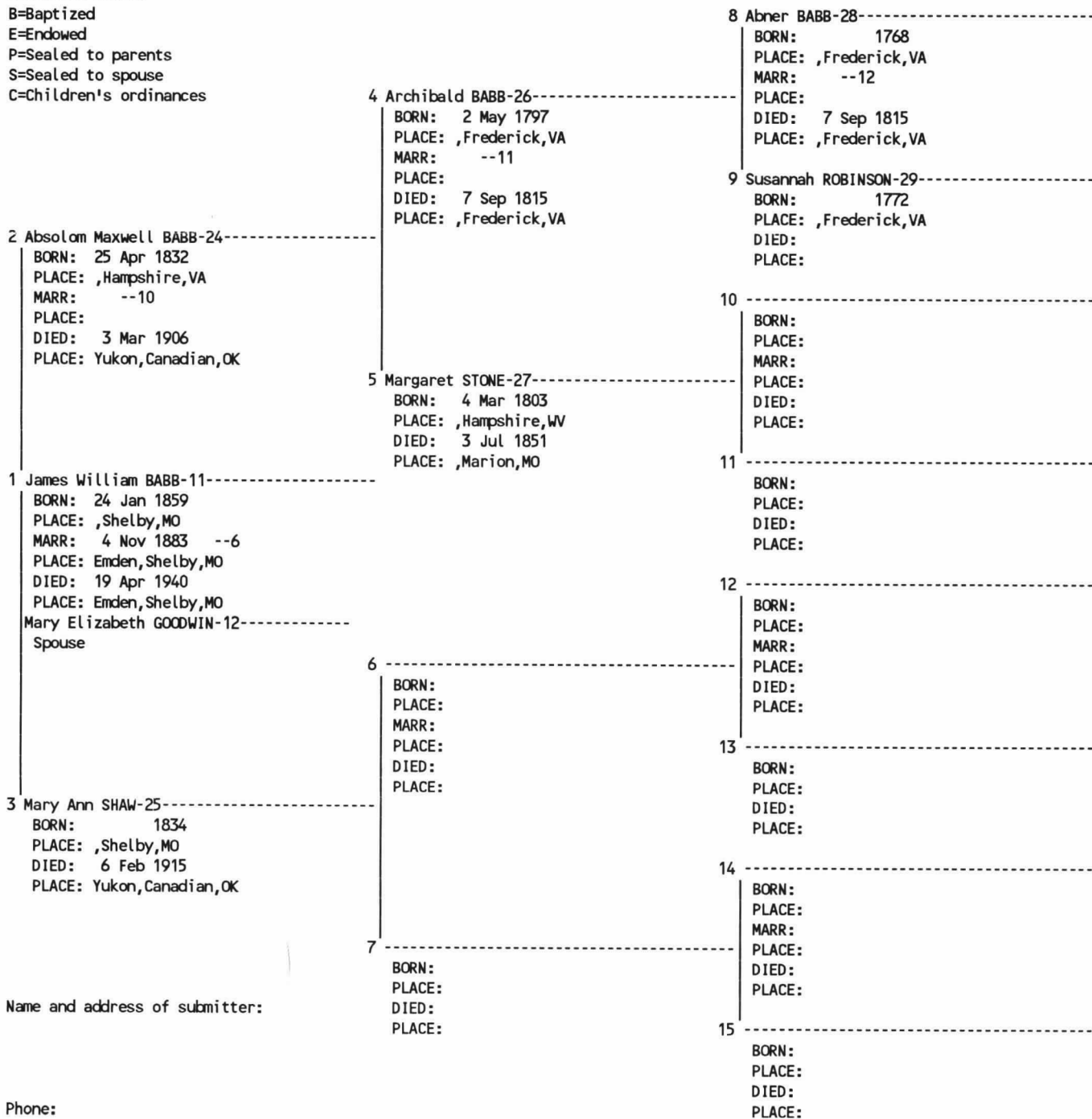


PEDIGREE CHART

Dear Ms Shindle,

Larry Mansur has sent your letter of 26 August on to me for response, as his former wife and my co-author is now deceased. We had a great time doing the book together mostly by correspondence, but she died in 1988 a year after we published the book.

Our book is "sold out" and I have had numerous requests for it since then, so I am working on an expanded book, which will have most of the original plus new sections and corrections to errors that we have found. It will take me probably six months more to complete it for publication, because I can't work on it full time. You will like it, I feel sure when it is completed. Meanwhile, we have organized a Babb Family Association and I put out a News and Notes twice a year, and we have had two big reunions. If you would be interested in joining, it is \$8.00 for the current 3-year period, and \$5.00 for the six News and Notes of the previous 3-year period. I put a lot of genealogy in the News and Notes and cover many lines.

First of all, though I need some dates on your Mother's father and grandfather to try to see where they fit. Numerous Babb's decided to go to Missouri in the 1800's. It seemed to be the thing to do on the way West!

I have an Absolom Maxwell Babb in Shelby, MO by 1858. He mar Mary Ann Shaw and they had 14 children in Shelby Co. Perhaps one of them was father of Richard Augustus. Have you looked for him on the 1880 or 1900 census? If we can get you back to Absolom Maxwell, we can take you way back to the immigrant of 1652. Any clues that you can give me as to birth and death dates and names of siblings will help. **Oh my gosh, I think that I have found RICHARD AUGUSTUS!!**

I checked another lady's group sheets and lo and behold she has Richard A. Babb mar. Zinia b. 1892 and they had Edna and Arthur (no dates). She shows cemetery records for Emden Cemetery, North River Township for Richard May 10, 1885 - Mar. 31, 1946; Mrs. Richard 9 Feb 1892 - May 1 1945; Arthur 21 Sep 1909 - Feb 13 1939.

In the same cemetery there is an Alex Babb Aug 31, 1867 - May 11, 1950. Also Mrs. Alex - Margaret Mayes (Meg) Dec 13, 1862 - May 2, 1939 (dau of Wm. T. Mayes.) This could be Richard's parents.


Then back to the group sheet on Absolom Maxwell and wife Mary Ann Shaw - they had 14 children, including Alexander Gosney b. 31 Aug 1867.

Absolom Maxwell Babb was son of Archibald and Margaret (Stone) who had 11 Children.

Let me know how this sounds as to your family line, and of course I can make copies of group sheets for you.

Without the group sheets of these two persons, we would have had to try to solve your line via the Census of 1900 and 1880, and any possible probate material. Luckily these two blended together nicely.

Dear Rex,

Thanks for the \$8.00 renewal check for the Babb Family Association and N&N Vol. 3. Penny Chaboudy and Frank and I are working on plans for the Winchester reunion. Penny is doing the "heavy" work - traveling to Winchester and checking into arrangements. However, she suffered a "sprain" in her leg which the doctor discovered 5 weeks later was a break down near the ankle. She drove over to see me the other day and still has a light weight cast.

On Francis Babb whose wife in BFA is a little different from BFNE, the name Nancy Ann Pierce was given to us by a gr-gr nephew, who didn't know all the facts, but still was a big help on the family. The more detailed info of the BFA was given to us after the first book was published, by Ardina Boynton, who noticed the error right away. Her husband's grandmother was Minnie Ethel Babb, shown as dau of John Stuart Babb on page 320 of BFA. She married Herman Wayne Boynton, but Minnie and Herman got divorced in 1926, and Minnie married (2) Arthur Seigars.

Ardina had detailed records of the Boyntons and Babbs and Seigars, but gave no clue as to the name of her husband. Regarding the wife of Francis, she wrote that Nancy Ann was shown as a Pierce on a Census (which apparently caused the confusion) but that her maiden name was Barrett according to her death certificate. (It is not shown on the stone). She wrote also that there is a record of a Francis Babb and a Nancy Barrett both of Bangor who were married March 18, 1847, but I don't have it in my listing of ME marriages. ME records are not as complete and organized as those of NH. Before we had received the nice letter from Ardina, of course we had gone by the erring census.

Regarding your question #7 of your 2 Feb letter, on page 386 of BFNE Martha is listed as "one of the children of David" but I had no dates so they were unnumbered. Martha ended up as #5 (unproved) in later corres, but we do have it that she married George Garves. However, the poor dear got lopped off in the typing at the bottom of the page.

On the Abner and Samuel who show as sons of Philip on page 28 BFNE, and also as sons of Philip, Jr. on page 29 (this info from the late Robert) They were actually sons of the JR only. People are easily confused by Philip and Philip, Jr., because the latter became SR when his father died. A and S are on page 64 of BFA, safe and sound.

Have been having a busy correspondence time lately in connection with the Bible records of LEVI BABB that were offered by Douglas K. Newton of 695 E. Saginaw Ave., Dinuba, CA 93618, in the Nov-Dec Genealogical Helper. Eighteen people responded including me, and Mr. Newton was kind enough to send the info for cost of repro and postage and to send a listing. I have written to each and have gotten interesting letters back. None are from LEVI, and none of us can solve how Mr. Newton is connected and why his grandparents had the Bible records and kept them for years. He sent his line but with no BABB connection, and I suspect that one of the gr-grandparents had a second wife named BABB and the record of it did not pass down. One of us may still solve it. I have helped most of the others with their lines.

Referring to the numerous questions in your letter of 2 February, I will answer some of them.

Mrs. Marna L. Clemons-Tomkins, 11045 Evening Creek Drive E., San Diego, CA 92128-4011 is my source on JOSHUA E., as he was one of her ancestors. She had written me that JOSHUA E. had at least two children. In her ascendancy chart she shows MARY JANE BABB (1842-1919) mar Benjamin Seaton
ALFRED C. BABB (1844) mar Sarah Basinger

It seems to me that checking the 1860 census of Osage Co., MO would be the next best place to look. Another friend of mine Elaine Munroe sent some 1850 Census material of MO and included JOSHUA E. with just the two children born 1842 and 1844. Of course they could have had a later one.

Ina Babb Mansur did not have any children or any siblings. Larry died last year.

SAMPLE BABB apparently is just a "Sample"! We don't have any record of sex.

Apparently you haven't realized that the info on page 24 of BFNE - taken from info furnished by the late Robert E. Babb of Charleston, SC, was greatly in error. He had two Peter Babbs confused - based on research of everyone up to that time. I made pen and ink changes in the later copies of the BFNE books. I did research on probate and land records and finally straightened out the two Peters. The Peter of page 30 of BFA and p 24 of BFNE had only one wife Mary Beeson. The other PETER is on page 87 with JANE BELL and with second wife ELIZABETH NORRIS and all their 13 children. There are lots of descendants of both PETERS. It is a great relief to have them straightened out.

On EDGAR REDFAREN BABB, the source of information that I have is the work of Dorothy Ringold, the late aunt of Frank Babb, our President. She was from the Benjamin Bentley line, and Edgar was one of his sons, so I presumed that she was right. She wrote that he was buried in Arabia, Colo. The map indicates that it must have been Arriba, but out there they may pronounce it much the same, and its history may be that it was taken from the name Arabia, and may be a desert like terrain vs the mountains around it.

In the same cemetery there is an Alex Babb Aug 31, 1867 - May 11, 1950. Also Mrs. Alex - Margaret Mayes (Meg) Dec 13, 1862 - May 2, 1939 (dau of Wm. T. Mayes.) This could be Richard's parents.



Dear Penny,

Thank you for your concern and whoever called the next day, it was really appreciated and we needed it. Also thanks for calling earlier to make sure we hadn't forgotten to make reservations at Holiday Inn. The weekend of the reunion, I followed the program thinking what we would have been doing. I'm not real sure why we weren't meant to come, but----

John said there had been no death, but that wasn't entirely true. The Saturday before we had been shocked to see the death notice of the husband, Ron age 59, of one of my best friends. He had called me about a month earlier and we had visited two hours and set up he was taking us boat riding. It knocked us for a loop.

The last few years have been lusus, and with each I think the next can't be worse, and hopefully none will top last year. In January 1994 Ron's wife Carol, age 56 died of cancer. We had been friends since gradeschool. And it wasn't just her death, but a lot of circumstances around it that ripped me to pieces. The kicker being her wicked sister (and that is literal) came to see Carol while she was in hospital, posted the room family members only, then left town. I stood outside her room crying, while she died all alone. I had to learn of her death from the newspaper.

At that same time, my beloved mother-in-law had an event of some sort, and while we were in KC for Carol's funeral (lived here, buried there), we had to immediately place mom in a nursing home. The particular home John's brother and wife wanted her in, didn't have a place then, Maybe, so had to find a possible tentative place and wait, again literally, until hospital was putting her out the door to find out which we were going to. My heart was thumping like a jungle drum.

And still at the very same time, there was a crisis with my mother's home, which we had self-financed and were not getting the payments etc. KC also. That week beat us to death.

May 12th, my older sister's husband was diagnosed with terminal cancer, and I was their support. I was there more than at home.

May 25th our older son and his German fiancee moved here, and to our house. We had to sign our life away to get her legally into the country, so I have strong opinions on illegals. We knocked ourselves out for them.

You think it can't get worse---in June John's sister-in-law called and left a message on machine for us to call. I got scared and had John call. In this beautiful nursing home that I had nearly had heart failure trying to get her in, mom had been raped by one of the male temp. workers!! Shoot I'm crying again. A white clean-cut looking 37 yr. old, that I could easily hurt or kill if I ever got near him. The only reason we knew was that another worker walked in on him. Mom is cognizant of what is going on, but cannot talk or do things for herself. I had thought it awful when my mom did not have a mind, but I see now it was a snap to the hell my mother-in-law lives every day. And do you know what happened to the guy---Nothing, he walked. Even though the worker that walked in signed a report. She walked in a moment too soon, there was no physical evidence and her word wasn't enough. There was rumors that he had done this before to others, but without proof. What kind o nice things did the nursing home do for us and her ---nothing, not even an apology.

I had esophagitis twice in August, and while a bit puny, we took off right after Labor Day in our "new" to us trailer. It had been filthy and I'd spent August cleaning it and there had been a bruhaha in the purchase of it. This trailer turned out to be the trailer from hell. Very pretty, but our brakes on it went out three times; a spring busted on it; furnace didn't work properly when we encountered cold weather; the converter didn't function right so fridge wouldn't start, etc; we encountered one drunk driver, which is another story. There were wrecks in front of us, there were people's wheels dropping off, an old lady driving at us down a divided highway (WV), stayed in a strange campground being run by a very depressed religious fanatic. In this same county, the Greenbrier Co. Clerks office gypped us out of a lot of money. I wrote later, and they never responded with apology or money. And during this same period, my husband's driving scared me to tears, and it looked more and more like he was in early stages of Alzheimer's. On my birthday, Sept 23rd, only a few miles from Fort Wayne Library I had such a terrible cold and fever, we couldn't go, and I thought I was going to die. Fortunately that week was spent in a nice campground a mile or two out of Bluffton, but I had 'cousins' there to get together with, but didn't dare.

The day before we were to start home, we got food-poisoning. John got punky real quick and got over it fast. I was not so lucky- I had eaten lots of the horseradish sauce, which for some reason I had had a flash not to eat, but did anyway.

My brother-in-law seemed to hang in there, while we were gone. We came home on Monday. Nov 1, Tuesday they came out, Wednesday he had convulsions and went into a coma. Unfortunately, he didn't die until Dec. 21. My sister decided I was her life. The last of March she had hip replacement and I offered for her to come here, but she didn't want to, it'd be too inconvenient for her. We ended up moving to her house for over 4 weeks.

I waited until nearly the last minute to send in the reunion money. All seemed fine. I worked hard to get trailer cleaned and stocked. We had had everything corrected on it last December. I am tall and have difficulty finding clothes, so was thrilled 4th of July to discover Penny's had clothes to fit, and I bought some much needed clothes, and some not so needed. I gathered my Babb info, copied pictures and info to share. I had everything in the trailer except clothes for the two days before leaving and all food except fridge food. We were to leave on Friday, so we could piddle there, and if John's driving still scared me, we'd not have lots of hours on the road each day. I picked a route that was all big roads.

We had been very close, I thought, to our son, Eric, and daughter-in-law, Melanie. She had a terrible job, but did not quit and look for another. They lived about three miles away. We planned our trip so we'd be back before their first anniversary Aug. 23rd. I was also counting on them, for support if it did turn out to be Alzheimer's, if my test I'm to go in for turns out to be cancer; and for support when our younger son, Craig, finds his birth family. Both are adopted, but Eric has no interest, at this point, in finding his. I have been researching for Craig, and have wanted to be the one to find them, from what few clues we have. I'd be curious, too.

Then came Black Tuesday. We were already a bit down over Ron's death, but looking forward to trip. That morning as John hooked up the trailer and towed it up beside house to doublecheck all brakes, I said what I've never said before. "I've got so much done, we can leave a day earlier, if you want" Then mid-afternoon two things happened simultaneously, John said the trailer brake control in truck was not functioning completely, called RV Repair and they said it'd be two weeks before we could get in; and then the phone rang.

The guy on the phone said this is Atlas Moving Co, may I speak to Melanie (my German daughter-in-law) that she had given them our number -- my heart stopped. What could have happened since Sunday night when they were to come over to play Bocce Ball, but we had had a storm? She goes into orbit easily (21 yrs old). I gave him their home phone number. A couple minutes later he called back and said their phone is disconnected. The shock was unbelievable. I grabbed a lightweight lawnchair as I went through the garage to go out to tell John. I knew I wouldn't be able to stand.

I said I'd go to pharmacy and pick up prescription for my nerves that I'd ask my dr. for to help for our three week trip. Her office had called earlier that afternoon to say it was there. Then I'd go by their house and see what was going on. I got to Walmart and got another shock, the scrip was only four pills. I took a piece of one and headed for the kids' house. Another shock, there was a For Rent sign in the yard, and our son's car was there instead of hers, so that meant they were riding together. So with all the signs whatever was going on, it was going on together. I rush home to tell John and then to call my sister.

The shocks continue--as I tell her, she says--oh yeah I'm not surprised, when I went to talked Melanie something to eat a couple months ago, her boss said, "isn't too bad that she's going back to Germany?". Melanie worked at a stable that raised thoroughbred race horses and it was within sight of my sister's house. I hung up on her after saying why didn't you tell us? She bugs me with a call every day and would have come out everyday if I had let her, and not a word from her. She knew about our trip plans from the start, and let us buy \$40.00 worth of CCR tickets from her. We bought this and we bought that.

The pain was unbelievable. I cried and cried and we still had no real idea of what was going on. Finally about 8:30 pm I decided to get out and walk. As I started my second lap around neighborhood, I asked John to drive over and see what was going on. As I got to the foot of the hill, they drove into neighborhood. I told them I was finishing my lap.

The reason she was getting so thin, she had been saving every cent she could for months to move back. We had loaned her the money to buy her car and hadn't seen a payment since first of

the year, but there was money to buy a Thoroughbred horse on time and the many expenses to keep it. If we had gotten to come, you'd probably seen the word Sucker written across our foreheads. We still have no explanation why everyone else knew but us.

This was Tues. night. Friday the movers came for their stuff. Saturday, they moved out of their place and in with us for a very long week and a half. We had a garage sale to try to help them get rid of some of their things. They couldn't take any of their new appliances because of diff. elect. current. And they ended up taking a beating on their cars, because he didn't listen to us and get into newspaper that first Sunday. Eric's car sold the evening before they left.

She was a mess (an understatement) while here, because of money tension and we did not offer a penny. They had their tickets and the dog's (Jeremy) bought, but did not have enough for the horse. Yes that's right the horse. Their tickets were abt 500 ea, the dog's 115, their belongings 1500. and what is the horse's---\$3,300.00 plus what the paperwork cost and the expense of hauling it to Chicago to where he stands in quarantine for 30 days!! We took them to KC the 8th and by the nursing home to see his grandma, and to airport next morning. They had too many suitcases and it cost her another \$200.00.

I'd been having chest pains some time before this, and they didn't decrease through this. I had a echogram, and hadn't heard results before we left. They called me long distance to tell me that I have 2 valves leaking and 3 prophy something??? whatever that is. I haven't yet checked to see how serious, but guess may not be too bad, since whoever called didn't speak of what to do next. But just in case, I'm getting things lined around. I had worked on lists for our attorney before the "trip we didn't take" to list what we had and it's location, who to notify and their phone and addresses. Of course, I had to redo the page with boys addresses & phone.

I said we don't need to watch soap operas, our life is one. The stuff I haven't told would curl your hair and break a mom's heart.

Sorry to be so windy, but thought you all deserved an explanation of what happened. I hope all went well. I now you all worked very hard. Is there a list of who came and where they fit in the line-up? I have yet to find anyone down from Thomas, son of Archibald. Where's the next one? How about Marion County Mo? Maybe, just maybe, we'd get to come.

Dear Claudette,

The reunion went off just great and everyone seemed very pleased and wanted to know when we would have another one. We are planning to keep to the three-year cycle, and it may be in Winchester, VA next time, that is, if we find that there is a satisfactory hotel there. Our Sheraton in Wilmington was just great, with excellent food, all new furnishings, a hospitality room for us the whole time, out from the busy downtown and close to the areas that we wanted to visit, and very pleasant staff. In fact we met the new owner one evening and he offered our table a share of his son's birthday cake with strawberries. (This was the day before the big crowd came.)

It was a little tiring for me as everyone wanted to ask me questions or show me papers. We had lots of materials around on tables in our hospitality room which could be reproduced and had a repro machine which was used morning, noon and night. So, I stood up a lot answering questions.

On Saturday morning I went to the Brandywine Valley Museum where the Wyeth paintings are located. There was a show specifically on the Brandywine Valley and numerous other artists of the 19th century type of realism had paintings on display, but the whole top floor was Wyeth. Then I picked up the bus tour for the box lunch at the Longwood Gardens, and after lunch I followed the two buses around in my car, as they were taking a different route from what I had planned to get to the Holy Trinity (Old Swedes) Church way down town.

Regarding the libraries and societies, most of them plead poverty and want genealogists to donate copies of their works -- except the Mormons and a few others, who do pay. On periodicals they like the quarterlies but normally consider the News and Notes types to be throw aways as they usually do not contain genealogical material. However, some libraries have written me for additional copies of issues that they have either had stolen or lost or thrown away, and I always send them. They have found that I put quite a bit of genealogical material in them. I want the libraries to keep them because we get new members thru people spotting them in libraries. Russell Emery who used to do a Babb News and Notes in the sixties did the same thing and sent copies to 50 libraries. I found them at the DAR library and at the Maryland Historical Society and they helped me when I was starting the book. But the real reason we raised the rate was that postage is going up, and the dues payment also covers considerable correspondence about the reunion. Some on the committee wanted to raise it to \$10.00, I said \$7.50, and agreed to a compromise of \$8.00!!!! The Reunion Committee had numerous other expenses for which we wouldn't think of charging. It is all part of the fun of doing genealogy.


David and Kris and their three children have moved into their very nice new Orem home and like it very much - this saves much travel time. They were in Sandy, Utah.

I will pass this bit of sage advice on to those who would like to be in on this little secret. If you have a computer and it is working mighty fine - don't try to fix it so that it may work better. It won't. I know!

I had purchased the product "THE NORTON UTILITIES - Advanced Edition." I thought that I should do some of the things that it advised doing for the hard disk. I had great success on Disk C but when it came time for disc D and E - I misread a command and KILLED - RUINED - DESTROYED ALL THE DATA on my D and E discs. 


With all the information at hand - one will need no less than a 40 megabyte disc to handle all the data.

Dear Mr. Babb,

How interesting that you and your wife had a two-month trip to Alaska. I am sure that you found it very stimulating. I stopped in Anchorage for a total of two hours on my way to Japan back in 1962! But you seem to be always coming or going from a big trip!

I gather that you have upgraded your computer system quite a bit since your first one and have now gone into the hard disc. I have started out modestly and will probably move up as time goes by. I have a Leading Edge with two 5¼" floppy discs and I like their word processing system very much, and at the moment am primarily using it to put into printing form some writings of my Mother. To get the best quality printing type I have a Citizen Premier 35 printer. May add a 24 pin dot matrix later if I feel the need. Of course the latter is more versatile, but the former is better for publishing. Being such a long time user of the typewriter, I still find it easier to type my letters, and any copies I can run quickly on my Canon copier, which has been a jewel.

I am glad that you still enjoy the book. Printing and distributing it has rooted out many people that I couldn't have reached through queries in genealogical columns and has led to much additional material which I wish that I had had before. I am still contacting probate and land offices to try to solve some of the mysterious "dead enders."

The Eli, Daniel, and William of Warren Co., OH, are still a mystery as explained in my 30 May letter. I suspect that they were brothers because of the connection of the name Eli. James was also common to Daniel and William, and I have recently discovered that there was a James Babb in Washington Co., PA in the 1790 census who could have been the father and the "J" on the 1820 census of Warren Co., OH. The Eli Sugars Babb was evidently the only son of Eli Babb and Elizabeth (Drake). Did Robert have anything on these Babbs which would give a clue to their ancestry. I have quite a bit on their descendants.

I am currently working on Peter Babb and wife Mary (Beeson) (1-2-1-4). I unfortunately followed Robert Babb's confusion of this Peter with Peter (1-2-2-2-6) who married Jane Bell and Elizabeth Norris, but have separated them now. Since I found this Peter in Allegheny Co., PA in 1790 with a family 2-2-6, he obviously had a number of sons, and I am trying to prove that they included John, Peter, Jasper, and James as I have indicated on the inclosed sheet.

There were a couple of Green B. Babbs, who show up in TN in the 1850 and 1860 census, and I wonder if Robert had anything that gives clues to their parentage. One Green B. Babb was age 37 in 1850, born KY, wife Catherine age 31 b. Robertson Co., TN and had 8 ch. In 1860 they had 9 children and oldest son James W. had married. The other Green B. Babb was age 53 in 1850 in Gibson Co. and had wife Nancy and son John. He was a Baptist deacon, and died in Gibson Co., TN in 1861 age 66. He made a profession of religion in Cheatham Co (Chatham) NC about 1815.

The NC Green B. probably came from the coastal Babbs of VA who went down into NC and then spread west into TN, but I can't pin him to parents yet though I have some wills on the NC Babbs. He was supposedly in War of 1812 as a youth.

The KY Green B. leaves me puzzled, because I have so little on Babbs in KY. Stephen Babb (1-2-2-1-6) son of Philip did go to Barren Co., KY, tho born in Frederick Co., VA, married in Greene Co., TN, but my correspondents have only sons William M., Philip, and David as his children. Son Wm. b. ca 1790 was married in Barren Co., KY. Did Robert have any clues to birth of Green B. in Kentucky?

Well, I have asked enough questions for now. Answer them at your leisure! It is a challenge to try to help people solve their lines, and I will keep plugging away at it.



Thank you very much for your letter - I was beginning to worry that my package did not make it to your place over this long distance. I am very glad that it did.

To answer a question or two for you. My computer is the Sanyo MBC 4000/4050, Creative Computer. It is a 16 bit unit with two disc drives. I have it built up to handle 512 K internal memory. My dot/matrix printer is the Smith-Corona D200. While it does not do the beautiful work that your Selectric does - what it does do is very fast - considerably faster than the daisy printwheel type printers. This will be your first battle with a computer - to go with the slower Daisy Printwheel printer that can give you innumerable print types or the faster Dot/Matrix unit that basically gives you one manner of letter - changeable if you understand the mechanics of programming your printer. The Daisy Printwheel Printer is also more expensive to start with.

What computer should you buy? There is a big market place out there. There are several great computers to choose from. When I was shopping for a computer - I visited all the stores in my community and secured their best prices for what they had. I soon found out that there were good bargains to be obtained by shopping and looking carefully.

One has to define his needs and possibilities for his future projects on the computer. Will it be used primarily for letter and book formation? Will there be special forms that you want to create and reproduce with new material on that same form? Will you want to do some calculating that you will want to use some "Spreadsheet" formats with? Will you want to be doing taxes, checkbook update, genealogy, etc., etc., on the unit?

Will the Computer you are looking at do all that you want it to do?

Be sure to insist that your unit is at least a "16 Bit" computer. The WANG is a "32 Bit" unit. It is faster than mine.

After looking around a lot, I asked one important question. Who will service the unit that I purchase? Several of the places suggested to me that there were service personnel all over the place and I would take the unit to them - after the sale the salesman and that company were done with me. Some suggested that they had a Service Policy that was available for a healthy price that would pay for the service calls and repair bills. In my experiences over the years - if the unit lasts during the period of the original warrenty - it will last a long time without assistance usually. I am not motivated by service policies.

I chose the Sanyo because it was being sold by a company who had sold typewriters, calculators, copiers and other related supplies for about forty years in the same location. They also service what they sell. It is in this type establishment that

you can go back and ask questions and receive civil answers to your needs. If anything goes wrong with my unit I can haul it back to them and they will fix it right there in their shop. I feel that this is a very important factor. Another facit to this is that they are there to represent good quality products - so I feel that I have a quality product. It has so proven.

Many computers will do the same projects. Some will have to have special care to make a program work in it. You will need help to assure that the program you purchase will work on your specific computer.

When I bought mine, they sold me the computer and gave me enough programs to equal the value of the computer. In other words, I was completely "set up" with the purchase price of the computer. I was given all the programs that I could use. I received: Wordstar - an excellant word processing package, CalcStar, DataStar, Formgen, and a couple other programs that I haven't used yet. My main activity has been with my word processing package. I have used Formgen and DataStar some also. It does take a lot of time to learn how to use these programs. But once you have it down - it does seem to stay with you and it then becomes such a pleasure to use them.

I also have an Adler (mechanical) typewriter. I will use it to address my envelopes - but give me the word processor to write my letters, documents, etc., with. You can do so much with it. Add, delete, move, insert, change position, move paragraphs, sentences, or words from here to there. You can add words, sentences, phrases, paragraphs or a whole book of material within a sentence, between words, in the body of the work anywhere. You can space, move, add, delete anything anytime in the preparation before you print it. After you have printed it - if you don't like it - you can call it back to the screen, re-arrange it and proof the material - then reprint it on a new sheet of paper and keep on until you are completely satisfied with it. If you want ten copies or one copy - it is simple. One of the fun things to do is to add material (as I have this) and then touch a couple buttons and completely re-form the paragraph.

One of the fun things we do, in writing to our family - we take the same letter - change the heading, perhaps alter a few sentences and print it on the new format and mail it. Easy! All children receive a letter - and if they don't compare the body - they will not know that it wasn't their totally private information.

If you are a journal keeper, which you should be, the computer is the place to do it. You can insert pages of information any place that you feel you need to. You forgot an incident - it needs to go just right here between these two important ideas - insert it - reprint it - there you have it.

If I were looking at a computer this day. I would study the WANG PC \$7000.00 unit - it is a wonder!, I would look at the IBM units in that price range and down, I would look at the Zenith, Sanyo, Commdore, Apple, Leading Edge, and several others that I cannot name at this time. I would be very interested in the programs they would throw in to get me going. I would want to know how much help they would give me to train me to use the unit and the programs. You won't save anything by buying a very

cheap one - you won't really gain by buying the most expensive one. Take plenty of time and evaluate each new search experience to let your imagination run free to allow your subconscious mind bring to your conscious mind those ideas that will allow you to "sprout your wings" in this new venture. Literally that is what will happen. As you search, and then sleep on the matter, new ideas will come to you that you will write down and this new thought will give you a new area for re-evaluation until finally you have "jelled" - then you enter the new experience that is totally fascinating, following your final decision to purchase.

Be sure that the unit you purchase has adequate "internal memory" to handle any program that you may place in your computer and that there is adequate storage capability on the "floppy disc" or the "hard disc" to store what you are or will be researching and/or writing.

I may have mentioned that I have a Genealogy program for this computer - that will work on any IBM Compatible and WANG PC computers - It is really great to have it - once put in, you can pull up any individual family group sheet, marriage information sheet, or it will make the pedigree chart automatically, for any person for which you have filled out a family group sheet. Of course you must have put the information into the computer for it to have that information to assemble and print.

In about four weeks we will plan to drive over to your place to become better acquainted. We will call you first so that we can get exact directions to your place. We have not as yet been to the Archives or D.A.R libraries here - this we plan to do also.

Thomas Babb lived and died in Newark twp, Brandywine Hundred, New Castle, Del.

His son, Thomas born there, moved to Chester Co, Pa. and apparently some of his children were born in Frederick, Co. Va.

Peter Babb, son of Thomas Babb, Jr. lived and died in Frederick County, Va. His children were born there.

Abner Babb, Peter's son stayed in Frederick County, Va.

Archibald Babb, Son of Abner, moved to Hampshire County, West Virginia, his children were born there, Archibald died in Marion County, Mo.

I have a lot to see in this vicinity and must search out the records for these people while I am here. If you have anything on these folks - I would really appreciate any help you might be able to give me with them. You have the family group sheets of all those that I have mentioned.

I did not expect this to be this involved - but now that it has been said - it does convey my interests. Pertaining to other source material of Mary Baylie (?), we know that Phillip married a MARY. At least one of our sources hinted strongly that Mary Baylie was the wife of Phillip. We tried for other sources but could not nail it down. This material I found in the Salt Lake City LDS Genealogy Library and also in the State of New Hampshire Genealogical Library in Concord, N.H. (they have a lot of good material there - we didn't get through all their material, more later.)

This area appears to be a gold-mine for delving into the Babb genealogies. It looks as though many of the children may have stayed in the area. I would like to get acquainted with each one of them.

You will wonder if I lost your nice letter of 5 November, since it has taken me so long to respond. I did receive it and all the fine charts of your Babb ancestry and have had it on the desk to answer ever since!! However, I have been on a Search Committee for a new rector for our church for the past year, and the past several months have included many meetings as well as trips to visit potential rectors. The decision has finally been made as of last weekend, so my duties on that Committee are over. It was most interesting while it lasted, and the 11 of us on the committee became fast friends, meeting around at each other's houses and going on trips together.

Now I can get back to the Babb book project - although I have been working on it actually all year while on the Committee. It seems that one can really spend what seems like a lifetime on one book! Makes a good hobby! Now I am trying to edit the sheets on the numerous families so that they make sense from my numerous notes. Haven't started the final typing. I am taking a word processing course to try to make up my mind as to whether to buy a computer or not. I have done two books with my trusty typewriters - Adler and IBM Selectric - so I know that I can do a book on them. However, learning the IBM "Display Writer" course is proving interesting and a good change from the committee work. What is your brand of computer and printer?

Although I have previously thought that Philip Babb probably came from Devonshire because a number of the fishermen of the Isles of Shoals came from there, I have changed my mind (1) because I can't find anything in the Devonshire records to back up Philip, and (2) there is information in the records of St. Dunstan, Stepney, London which is probably the christening of Philip on 6 Apr 1634, and may connect him with "uncles" who were Captain Thomas of the "Hopewell" and Captain John of the "Philip" both of London. I have inclosed my sheet of the names and dates of early Babbs in the St. Dunstan files - which I found in the Mormon records. I noted that you have Philip born 1634, so you undoubtedly have these records also.

This would mean that he came to the new world as a young man, perhaps not yet 21, and therefore presumably unmarried. I have no clues as to his marriage to Mary. I note that you call her Mary Baylie (?), but I have no record of her in the Bailey genealogy. I descend from John Bailey who came on the "Angel Gabriel" in 1635 from Bristol. His wife and most of his ch did not come over, but son John Bailey came, and he married Eleanor Emery. His children born in Salisbury and Newbury, MA 1641-1665 do not include a Mary. So, I would be most interested to know where you found your bit of info on Mary!!!

Perhaps we can get together on a Saturday soon - between snowstorms. Would be glad to have you come to my house, or I can drive to yours. My phone is 301-776-6138.

Have you been able to find anything more on Phillip Babb, his wife Mary and their birth places or parentage? Do you know the ship on which they came to America?


Any information that you have I would be deeply appreciative if you could share it.

Dear Dr. Babb:

Thank you for your letter of 13 June concerning the BABB surname. Yes, I am a descendent, though I lost the name through marriage back a ways. My gr-gr^{ty}grandmother was Rachel Babb who married George Wallace, Jr. of Deerfield, N.H., and I got interested in the family because she and he were such elusive ancestors to prove.

For several years I was corresponding with Robert E. Babb, Jr., of Charleston, S. C., helping him with New Hampshire Babb families. However, as you have probably heard, he died 19 July 1982 of a heart attack, and was never able to publish his proposed book. His materials were to go to Laurens, S. C., home of his immediate ancestors. There is a Malcolm J. Babb, Sr., of Daphne, AL, who was close to the family, and he is going to try to do some research in Robert's records.

Meanwhile, I have been working with a Mrs. Ina Babb Mansur of Bedford, MA, and Gardiner, ME, on what we hope will be a book titled "Babb Families of New England." We work off and on the project because we both have other responsibilities to take up some time. She is historian of her town, and has to make speeches and do write ups on that; and I am Records Chairman and Queries Editor of our County Genealogical Society and spent two years working on a book on the cemetery records of the County titled "Stones and Bones."

But our Babb materials are getting more and more fine tuned, and I hope to get into some final typing this fall. Right now I am working on indexing and doing some research at the Nathinnal Archives, and this helps to pull some stray families together.

My Rachel Babb came from Philip¹, Peter², Philip³, Philip⁴, Rachel. I understand that you line comes from Philip's son Thomas who m. first Bathsheba Hussey and second Elizabeth Conway Booth, and went south to Delaware because they were Quakers. I have the children and grandchildren of Thomas which Robert had sent me,, and have Robert's line from Thomas, Jr. right down to Robert. I presume that your line was from one of the sons who went to Chester Co., PA.

I had to laugh when I read your query as to whether my interest was for "commercial purposes" because research of this kind has to be just for the love of it, and the money is all out go for obtaining wills and deeds and administrations, and traveling to courthouses, and correspondence, and typewriter ribbons and paper! And when one publishes a book of this kind, one is lucky to get back the cost of the printing. But I feel that every genealogist should produce something permanent in the field for the use of others. I did the 675-page cemetery book for our County, and I did another book on Valentine Hill, an ancestor of mine.

Thank you for your order for a copy of our book "BABB FAMILIES OF NEW ENGLAND -- AND BEYOND." I sent you copy #139 on the 4th and hope you have it by now.

Your Absolom Maxwell is on page 33 as is his father Archibald. Perhaps you have corresponded with Re~~x~~ Babb of Provo, Ut, who is also from Archibald and Absolom. If not, I can give you his address. Archibald's father Abner is on page 31, and his father Capt. Peter is on page 29. I have a copy of his will if you would like one also. There is some disagreement as to whether Peter married a Mary Malin first and was disowned by Hopewell Monthly Meeting and then married Mary Bowen. Well, he definitely married Mary Bowen, dau of Henry, and I have inclosed an abstract of Henry's will from Frederick Co., VA records indicating Peter Babb as son-in-law.

Whether or not he married Mary Malin doesn't really matter since the children were of Mary Bowen, anyway. But the basis for the questionable 1st marriage is that in the Hopewell Monthly Meeting records, a Mary Malin Babb was disowned 3-11-1760 for marrying contrary to discipline, and Peter Babb was disowned 2-11-1761 for marrying contrary to discipline. So Mary Bowen is the only one that counts!

I have a copy of the will of Thomas 1-2-2, Peter's father, if you would like a copy. I am trying to help all the descendants in any way that I can, and am also appreciative of anything they care to share.

The ancestors of Bathsheba Hussey are fascinating, and I am inclosing copies of materials on the Hussey, Perkins, and Batchelder families from "Genealogical Dictionary of Maine and New Hampshire" by Noyes/Libby/Davis; as well as some on the Hussey family from the "History of the Town of Hampton, New Hampshire" by Dow; plus an ancestor chart prepared by the late Mrs. Jo Buck Jones which seems to be primarily from "Lincoln Pedigrees" (as you can see it is quite an illustrious pedigree!); and finally some pages from Little's "Genealogical and Family History of the State of Maine" on the ancestry of the Perkins family, also illustrious.

I hope that you will find these handouts of interest. I apologize for some mixup of Capt. Peter's son Peter and the Peter on page 24, and I made some pen and ink changes in your book. I was relying on someone else's research which was incorrect and gave Peter 1-2-1-4 too many wives and lots of children that didn't belong to him! I apologize also for a mixup on two Philips - father and son on pages 28 and 29. Philip⁵ was called "Senior" after his father died, and it took us a while after the book was published to discover that some children attributed to Philip⁴ really belonged to his son and that Philip⁴ had 3 other children found in Quaker records later. I think we have it straight in our minds now. I would be interested in any additional info that you have on Absolom Maxwell and Rease Bone Babb - to supplement my files.

Dear Mr. Babb,

How interesting that you and your wife had a two-month trip to Alaska. I am sure that you found it very stimulating. I stopped in Anchorage for a total of two hours on my way to Japan back in 1962! But you seem to be always coming or going from a big trip!

I gather that you have upgraded your computer system quite a bit since your first one and have now gone into the hard disc. I have started out modestly and will probably move up as time goes by. I have a Leading Edge with two 5¼" floppy discs and I like their word processing system very much, and at the moment am primarily using it to put into printing form some writings of my Mother. To get the best quality printing type I have a Citizen Premier 35 printer. May add a 24 pin dot matrix later if I feel the need. Of course the latter is more versatile, but the former is better for publishing. Being such a long time user of the typewriter, I still find it easier to type my letters, and any copies I can run quickly on my Canon copier, which has been a jewel.

I am glad that you still enjoy the book. Printing and distributing it has rooted out many people that I couldn't have reached through queries in genealogical columns and has led to much additional material which I wish that I had had before. I am still contacting probate and land offices to try to solve some of the mysterious "dead enders."

The Eli, Daniel, and William of Warren Co., OH, are still a mystery as explained in my 30 May letter. I suspect that they were brothers because of the connection of the name Eli. James was also common to Daniel and William, and I have recently discovered that there was a James Babb in Washington Co., PA in the 1790 census who could have been the father and the "J" on the 1820 census of Warren Co., OH. The Eli Sugars Babb was evidently the only son of Eli Babb and Elizabeth (Drake). Did Robert have anything on these Babbs which would give a clue to their ancestry. I have quite a bit on their descendants.

I am currently working on Peter Babb and wife Mary(Beeson) (1-2-1-4). I unfortunately followed Robert Babb's confusion of this Peter with Peter (1-2-2-2-6) who married Jane Bell and Elizabeth Norris, but have separated them now. Since I found this Peter in Allegheny Co., PA in 1790 with a family 2-2-6, he obviously had a number of sons, and I am trying to prove that they included John, Peter, Jasper, and James as I have indicated on the inclosed sheet.


There were a couple of Green B. Babbs who show up in TN in the 1850 and 1860 census, and I wonder if Robert had anything that gives clues to their parentage. One Green B. Babb was age 37 in 1850, born KY, wife Catherine age 31 b. Robertson Co., TN and had 8 ch. In 1860 they had 9 children and oldest son James W. had married. The other Green B. Babb was age 53 in 1850 in Gibson Co. and had wife Nancy and son John. He was a Baptist deacon, and died in Gibson Co., TN in 1861 age 66. He made a profession of religion in Cheatham Co (Chatham) NC about 1815.

The NC Green B. probably came from the coastal Babbs of VA who went down into NC and then spread west into TN, but I can't pin him to parents yet though I have some wills on the NC Babbs. He was supposedly in War of 1812 as a youth.

The KY Green B. leaves me puzzled, because I have so little on Babbs in KY. Stephen Babb (1-2-2-1-6) son of Philip^d did go to Barren Co., KY, tho born in Frederick Co., VA, married in Greene Co., TN, but my correspondents have only sons William M., Philip, and David as his children. Son Wm. b. ca 1790 was married in Barren Co., KY. Did Robert have any clues to birth of Green B. in Kentucky?

Well, I have asked enough questions for now. Answer them at your leisure! It is a challenge to try to help people solve their lines, and I will keep plugging away at it.

Dear Mr. Babb,

Thank you for your kind letter of 25 April concerning our book "BABB FAMILIES OF NEW ENGLAND -- AND BEYOND." Ina and I certainly found it an enjoyable challenge, but wondered often if we would ever finish it in published form. Robert Babb of Charleston, SC must have wondered that often of his work. But he kept accumulating so much that it became overwhelming and he expressed the thought that he would keep helping people but wouldn't get into publishing.

I was surprised that you copied over 4,000 pages of Babb materials at the Laurens Library recently. However, Robert did mention in one of his last letters to me that he had over 3,000 sheets on Babbs, and he did one on most everyone whether they had children or married. I guess you will enjoy browsing through them. A number of people who have written to me after buying the book have sent me copies of sheets that they had worked out with Robert.

I have some "unsolved" Babb families which I puzzle over now and then. As far as I know Robert had not solved them either. There was an Eli Sugars Babb who was probably son of Eli Babb and Elizabeth (Drake) of Warren Co., OH (Mar. 19 Dec 1819). Eli Sugars was born 26 Aug 1820 and was probably an only child as his mother remarried 25 Aug 1824 to a James Weeks. We can't find a clue as to the parents of Eli, although there were others named Eli that we have solved. There was a Daniel also in Warren Co., OH, who could have been a brother of Eli as he named a son Eli. Daniel mar. Rhoda Ulrey 10 Sep 1818 in Warren Co., OH. A William Babb mar. Elizabeth Dunn 20 Jan 1816 in same County and was apparently a brother of Daniel. The brothers were supposedly born in VA.

Another line "sprang" out of Maryland and called themselves "BABBS." This included an Eli of James, a Thomas, a John who enlisted in the Rev. at Annapolis, a William who mar. Hamutel, and a Charles who was in the War of 1812 and killed at New Orleans. Most of them migrated into Ohio and blended in, but don't seem to go back to Phillip.

There are others equally puzzling but solutions may appear eventually. Meanwhile, I do correspondence for my County Geneo. Society as I am Queries Editor, so have to do some digging into Maryland records. I have recently purchased an IBM Compatible computer and ordered the PAF 2.1 software so will probably be playing with that for a long time. There is a Users' Group that meets once a month at the Temple Genealogical Library but is not part of or under the direction of the LDS Church. I have attended only one meeting so far. They put out an interesting quarterly "ABT PAF".

The more I use your book the better I like it. I feel that you have done a superb job in arranging the material in a readable, searchable style that allows one to move along at an acceptable pace.

You wrote a letter to me which arrived just as we were leaving for a trip. We have only traveled a bit over 16,000 miles this year. The last trip was to Alaska. We took two months to make that journey. We are now settling back in and I am starting in to arrange and re-arrange my family history notes and materials.

I am very happy that you have chosen the Personal Ancestral File for your Family History recording. I am sure that you will love it. I hope that you have the 2.1 version - if you haven't the 2.1 - as soon as you can you want to update. The things that you can do with the PATIFUL portion of that program are wonderful in your searching, browsing, adding notes and editing your materials.

Tell me about your computer. What is its make? What type of disc do you have - floppy or hard disc. If you have the floppy disc - what is its size? If you have the hard disc - what is its size? What printer do you have?

My unit is an ALR 386 2 with a 70 megabyte hard disc. I also have a 5 1/4" floppy disc and a 3 1/2" floppy disc. The 5 1/4 will store 1.2 megabytes and the 3 1/2 will store 1.44 megabytes. It runs at 16 megahertz. The monitor is a Nec Multisync color with EGA color board in the controlling unit. The printer is a dot matrix Toshiba P321SL which is a 24 pin head - it gives good letter quality typing. I enjoy it very much.

In your letter that I received a day or two before our last two month trip to Alaska, that letter I cannot find since my trip, you asked me to research in the Robert E. Babb records for a specific individual - I do not remember that name - would you please send me the name or names again that you are interested in and I will get right on it.

Matter of fact if you can make a copy of that letter and send it to me and I will address the other questions that you had that I do not remember.

One very nice thing about the PAF 2.1 program - whenever they do update the unit - it can be obtained with minimal cost and it will simply replace the program that you now have and all the data that you have put into the computer is totally usable to the new program update.

You will be thrilled to know that about 70% of the use of the Family History Library and its branches of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints is by those who are not members of the Church. Everyone is more than welcome to use those facilities - no one that I am aware of is ever turned away - all are welcome to participate in this most important activity.


What is your next project? How can I help?

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
