JANE AUSTEN (1775–1817) (Novel), one of England's foremost novelists, was never publicly acknowledged as a writer during her lifetime. Austen was born on December 16, 1775, at Steventon Rectory in Hampshire, the seventh child of a country clergyman and his wife, George and Cassandra Austen. Her closest friend was her only sister, Cassandra, almost three years her senior. Austen wrote six novels that continue to captivate readers almost 200 years after her death: Sense and Sensibility, Pride and Prejudice, Mansfield Park, Emma, Northanger Abbey, and Persuasion. These novels, as well as her juvenilia and unfinished works, are available in numerous modern print and ebook editions. Her collected letters, which are also a source of entertainment and biographical information, are available in print in Jane Austen's Letters, edited by Deirdre Le Faye (Oxford University Press, 2011). –JASNA


