Local blogger settles lawsuit against Fairhope council

Local blogger Paul Ripp's lawsuit against Fairhope City Council President Jack Burrell and the rest of the city council has been settled, according to a recent blog post by Ripp and documents filed with the federal court system obtained by The Courier.

The lawsuit stemmed from Burrell's denial of letting Ripp

speak during the public comments portion of the Aug. 28, 2017, city council meeting - a move which Ripp claimed violated his constitutional rights. Ripp filed suit against Burrell and the city in Dec. 2017.

In a Friday, Oct. 19 post on his blog entitled "Loser," Ripp said he settled the suit with the city's insurance company, writing:

"I decided to settle the case with the Insurance Company

for many reasons," Ripp wrote. "One being, I knew the Council and Burrell would never apologize and that going to court was going to be very expensive for the city."

Ripp went on to say he heard Burrell had been "bragging" about the outcome of the case.

"I have now settled the lawsuit and deposited the

Daphne council upholds mayoral veto of potential downtown rezoning request

There was thunderous applause and cheering last week in the Daphne City Council chambers when residents realized the Daphne City Council would not take action to overturn Mayor Dane Haywood's veto of a controversial rezoning request in Olde Towne Daphne.

The development in question, a collection of townhouses called Jacob's Well, has been met with heavy criticism for months from neighboring property members and

other residents from throughout the city who question how the potential development could add additional traffic to Daphne's Main Street area.

The developer had looked for a rezoning and PUD approval that would have allowed the construction of six new townhomes near Olde Towne Daphne and U.S. 98, though nearby residents feared the development would also link up with a connector road between this proposed development and a nearby established neighborhood.

Council chambers were standing room only for the

Oct. 1 meeting, with a majority of those in attendance against the proposed zoning changes for the development.

"We need to require developers to do exactly what is required under our current rules," one resident said. "We need development that fits into the context of what is already there."

Daniel Dyas, who represented developer Dyas LLC, advised against the council following what he called "mob rule."

"It's important that everyone's rights be respected," Dyas said. "And we're entitled

to build six units on the property on the west side."

Dyas said the company had made concessions to try to assuage neighbors' concerns, including forgoing vehicular access to the nearby neighborhood, but residents said they still wanted the council to deny the rezoning.

Councilman Ron Scott motioned for the vote that would approve the rezoning, but added in some restrictions that were asked for by nearby residents, including the denial of vehicular access and a 104-

settlement check in the bank,” Ripp wrote. “On the same day someone called me and said Mr. Burrell was bragging that I should have never settled for so little, that I should have held out for more money. Burrell said that the city had won because I settled for so little.”

In an interview on Oct. 22 on WABF Radio, Burrell denied that claim.

“I have no idea where that comes from,” Burrell said. “It’s just gibberish. How do you address anything that’s written on there?”

Burrell confirmed the lawsuit had been settled by the insurance company, which did not require the consent of the council to do so.

“The insurance company settled and the insurance company had that right to settle,” Burrell said. “Many of us would have been in favor of going to trial and not settling, but the insurance company doesn’t have to have a right to consent - they can settle without the consent of the council.”

Ripp wrote he would use the funds he got in the lawsuit to continue

the promotion of issues on his blog.

“Today The Ripp Report is going to pay all of their attorney fees, the company American Express Card, the accountant, advertising bills, the computer services and bank charges,” Ripp wrote. “This is the first time The Ripp Report has been in the black in years. The balance of money will be used to further the efforts of The Ripp Report, thanks to Council President Burrell.”

According the the joint stipulation of dismissal filed in federal court Oct. 20, both parties agreed to bear their own attorneys’ fees and costs.

History of the lawsuit

In late December 2017, blogger Paul Ripp filed a lawsuit in federal court against Fairhope Council President Jack Burrell for actions taken by Burrell at an Aug. 28, 2017, Fairhope City Council meeting where Ripp said Burrell denied him his “constitutional rights protected by the First and Fourteenth Amendments.”

Ripp, the author of the Ripp Report blog, posted a copy of the lawsuit he filed on a Dec. 29, 2017, post entitled “SEE YA IN COURT JACK.”

“The meeting in ques-

tion, along with Ripp’s nasty confrontation with Council President Burrell — who denied Ripp his right to speak in a public forum sanctioned by City of Fairhope ordinance — and threatened his removal and arrest for trying to address the council — was captured on the official video of the council meeting,” Ripp wrote.

Ripp wrote this was the first time he had filed suit against the City of Fairhope regarding the issue of allowing him to speak.

“This is the first time Ripp has sued the City of Fairhope over refusing to allow him to address the city council,” Ripp wrote. “The city had denied him in the past, several times, the ability to speak at public meetings, forcing the council to adopt a new set of rules regarding public participation. These are the rules City Councilman Jack Burrell ignored when he allegedly denied Mr. Ripp, a Marine Corps veteran who served in Viet Nam, his constitutional right to free speech.”

During the Aug. 28, 2017, meeting, as Ripp approached the podium to speak, Burrell told

him he would not be allowed to speak.

The following audio comes directly from The Courier’s recording checked against footage from the City of Fairhope’s video archives.

Burrell: No, sir. Mr. Ripp, I’m not going to allow you to speak.

Ripp: Really?

Burrell: No, sir, I’m not. You’ve relinquished your rights. It’s a privilege, and I’ve had more complaints about you getting up here and spreading innuendo, talking about citizens and employees and council members. Most people that I’ve talked to don’t want to give you the time of day. Chief, if you will show him back to his seat. Take a seat. I’m not allowing you to speak.

Ripp: Are you aware this has been done before five times?

Burrell: It doesn’t matter to me what’s been done before. It’s a right, not a privilege (pause) a privilege, not a right, so you can take your seat. I’ve heard enough from you.

Burrell: Is there anyone else who would like to speak? (To Ripp) You can go back and write all you want to. Don’t say a

word. You’re going to go to jail.

Ripp: I will.

Burrell: Good.

When asked for a comment shortly after that Aug. 2017 meeting, Burrell said he never threatened to remove Ripp from the meeting. “I didn’t kick him out, and I didn’t violate his free speech,” Burrell said. “There was never an instruction for him to be removed. That was not my instruction to Chief Petties at all. I think he chose to walk out so he could say he got kicked out, which is not at all what happened.”

Nowhere in the recording of the exchange does Burrell instruct Petties to escort Ripp from the room.

Ripp also called out the other council members, City Clerk Lisa Hanks and former City Attorney Tut Wynne and current City Attorney Marcus McDowell for their part in the event.

“City Attorneys, council council (sic) and city clerk, remained mute during Mr Burrell’s actions,” Ripp wrote. “Ripp’s lawsuit seeks damages for what he described as “humiliation” and “emotional pain.”

In the suit filed by at-

torney Gregory Morris, however, Ripp originally only sued Burrell, both as an individual and as a city official for his actions.

The lawsuit alleges Burrell violated the City Council’s rules of procedure in not allowing Ripp to speak during the meeting.

“The City Council President embarrassed and humiliated the Plaintiff, causing the Plaintiff to suffer grave emotional stress,” the lawsuit alleges. “Clearly, the City Council President was acting beyond his presumption of qualified immunity. The City Council President’s language and his tone and tenor were clearly an attack on the Plaintiff personally as well as an affront against civil liberty.”

On June 29, Ripp’s attorney filed an amended complaint to the court that sought to add Councilmen Robert Brown, Jay Robinson, Jimmy Conyers and Kevin Boone as additional defendants in the lawsuit, as well as City Attorney McDowell.

“The proposed added Defendants would clarify the Plaintiff’s constitutional claims as well as bring to light a due process claim against the City of Fairhope and the City Council Members, acting officially,” the motion stated. “These new claims would be based on similar grounds to those alleged in connection with the claims against the individual capacity defendant, Jack Burrell.”

Burrell’s attorney filed a response to that motion on July 6, asking the judge to deny the inclusion of McDowell in the lawsuit as he was not serving as city attorney at the time of the incident being litigated.

“Plaintiff’s cause of action arose on August 28, 2017 during the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Fairhope,” the response said. “Mr. McDowell was not the City Attorney of the City of Fairhope at that time. In fact, Mr. McDowell was not appointed as City Attorney until December 18, 2017.”

An amended complaint filed July 16 removed McDowell but did have Boone, Brown, Conyers and Robinson added as defendants.

The Kingdom of God

Preparing lectures recently for a biblical theology course provided me the opportunity to examine afresh the broad sweep of the Bible’s message. The most significant re-discovery for me was the centrality of the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God is the life-giving, chaos-destroying dominion of God breaking into and redeeming the cosmos through the life, death, and resurrection of Israel’s Messiah, the Son of God. This triumphant in-breaking comes in the power of the Spirit of God and is actualized through the re-created, restored, and redeemed people of God. An intimate theological connection exists, therefore, between the kingdom of God in the world and the image of God in us. The image of God is not only ontological (our sharing in God’s relational, communicative, creative, intellectual nature) but also functional (our representing and instantiating the rule of God on the earth). When ancient kings set up their image in a conquered land, they did so to remind the inhabitants who was in charge. Being made in God’s image means that God’s sovereign plan for people was that they live in a blessed relationship with Him and one another in order to extend God’s sovereign purposes throughout the created order (Gen 1.26-28). Sin is our rejection of God’s desire for relationship with us and His desire for us to rule with Him. Christ’s life of sacrifice, His substitutionary death on the cross, and His life-giving resurrection from the dead re-establishes our relationship with God. Christ’s earthly authority, his faithfulness in suffering, and his victory over sin and death restored the image of God on earth and opened the way for our conformity with that image

(Ro 8.29). The kingdom of God, therefore, provides the perfect conceptual and existential framework for the life of the Christian. In it, the dialectics of being and doing, relationality and action, mercy and justice, faith and works, triumph and sacrifice, surprise and expectation, grace and truth, freedom and responsibility are perfectly balanced and powerfully enabled. Life in the kingdom for every believer, therefore, should be characterized by authority, liberty, victory, significance, impact, authenticity, fellowship, and servanthood. Confusion ensues when one side of these kingdom realities is preferred above the other. Evangelical Christianity often limps between the Scylla of amorphous intimacy and the Charybdis of unspiritual activism. This turns the Christian life into a burdensome dilemma when the kingdom is supposed to be a new and living way. Let us cultivate a continual attitude of responsiveness to the theology of Jesus which he announced through the simplicity of his preaching: “Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand.”

Frank Johnson the Legend and the Free State of Winston

Those of us who are Baby Boomers remember the tumultuous times of the 1960's. We lived through the Civil Rights revolution. Those of us who grew up here in the Heart of Dixie witnessed the transpiring of racial integration first hand. Most of the crusades and struggles occurred here in Alabama, especially Montgomery.

A good many of the landmark Civil Rights court decisions were handed down in the Federal Court in Montgomery. The author and renderer of these epic rulings was one, Frank M. Johnson, Jr. Johnson served as Federal Judge in the Middle District of Alabama for 24 years from 1955 through 1979. Johnson's judicial decisions brought death threats to him and his family from whites opposed to integration.

He was vilified by most white Alabamians at that time and became George Wallace's favorite whipping boy. Wallace referred to him as a "lying, scalawagging, carpetbagging integrationist."

Frank Johnson, Jr. was born in Winston County in October, 1918. Winston County attempted to stay neutral during the Civil War. It was a Republican stronghold in an overwhelmingly Democratic Alabama.

In contrast to the Black Belt planters in South Alabama, the people who settled North Alabama were small farmers. The land they settled on was hilly and not as conducive to growing cotton. Rather than large plantations and slaves, the fiercely independent hill country farmers had 40 acres and a mule.

Therefore, when

the winds of division between North and South began to blow in the 1850's, an obvious political difference between North and South Alabamians arose. In 1860 there were only 14 slave owners in Winston County. With the election of Abraham Lincoln, the crucial decision of secession arose. Contrary to what most present-day Alabamians think, it was not an easy unified decision that we should leave the Union.

A secession convention was held in January, 1861, in Montgomery. The vote was extremely close. The delegates split 54-46 for secession. The Black Belters from South Alabama were for creating a confederacy of southern states to protect their slave ownership and way of life. The hill farmers from North Alabama preferred to not secede. These North Alabamians voted against secession from the Union at that time.

Shortly after the seces-

sion convention, citizens of Winston County met at a local establishment, Looney's Tavern. These yeoman farmers of the hills were obviously reluctant to leave the Union for the cause of the planter and his slaves.

Legend has it that on July 4, 1861, the good people of Winston County decided to secede from Alabama and remain in the Union. That is why they are known in Alabama political history and folklore as, "The Free State of Winston."

That same sort of independent streak was a hallmark of the Johnson family who were some of the earliest settlers of Winston County. Judge Johnson's father served as one of the few Republicans in the Alabama Legislature in the first half of the 20th century.

Frank Johnson, Jr studied law at the University of Alabama and graduated at the top of his law school class in

1943. He then distinguished himself as a U.S. Army officer in World War II. He was wounded at Normandy and received the Purple Heart. After the war, he settled in Winston County and began practicing law in Jasper.

Although the Democratic Party dominated southern politics, Johnson was a lifelong, Winston County Republican. Therefore, he led the 1952 Dwight Eisenhower campaign for President in the state. After Eisenhower became president, he rewarded Johnson with a federal judgeship.

In 1955-1956, shortly after taking his seat on the bench, Johnson became involved in a formative event of the Civil Rights movement. Rosa Parks was arrested for violating a Montgomery ordinance requiring racial segregation on the city buses. In response, the African American community organized a boycott of the bus system and nominated Reverend

Martin Luther King as its leader. Johnson ruled that the Montgomery ordinance violated the due process clause of the 14th Amendment.

The ruling was the first of many by Johnson which eliminated racial segregation in public accommodations such as parks, libraries, bus stations, and airports during the 1950's and 1960's.

Johnson's decisions were legendary and groundbreaking. He became the central defender of Civil Rights in America from his Federal Bench in Montgomery. The Federal Courthouse in Montgomery is now named in his honor. Judge Johnson died in 1999.

Time to shake up the status quo in Montgomery

When people who aren't from here picture South Alabama, they probably imagine the sandy white beaches of Gulf Shores or a quaint bayside downtown. I doubt they know that throughout much of the area our outdated water system backs up whenever it rains, turning our streams and creeks to sewage.

Unfortunately, that same mindset is typical of how elected officials up in Montgomery have treated our community for far too long. They're happy enough when the tax dollars from our tourism industry roll in, but when it comes time for bold solutions to tough problems, it seems we're out of sight, out of mind.

It's time for that to change.

Baldwin is Alabama's fastest growing county, and we're not even close to having the infrastructure we need to keep up. South Monroe county is no better. There is no good reason that the rain should regularly overwhelm our sewers. Or that families should have to check whether it's safe to swim in or eat the fish from our lakes

and streams. These are the conditions you would expect to find in a third world country, not the greatest nation in the world.

Here's the thing: We know how to fix it. But our elected leaders haven't summoned the political will to shake up the status quo.

That's why I'm asking you to let me represent you.

By all accounts, my opponent is a good person with years of public service behind him. But for more than a decade, we have sent him to Montgomery to represent us, and what has changed in that time?

Our streets are getting more and more crowded. Our water crisis is worse than ever. And it's not just infrastructure. By any measure Alabama ranks near the bottom of the list on education and healthcare.

Again, none of these failures stem from lack of talent or knowledge. We have the tools to succeed — we just haven't found the conviction.

Just look at our Pre-K system. It's the best in the nation. But after more than a decade, two-thirds of our children are still left out. That

means too many of our kids are behind from the day they start school. It only gets worse from there. We were told the Alabama Accountability Act would aid students districted to failing schools. It has cost Baldwin County public schools alone \$3 million since it was passed in 2013.

Baldwin County has no failing schools. Meanwhile, how many of us know teachers who dig into their own pockets just to outfit their classrooms with the bare necessities?

Or take healthcare. Alabama has incredible hospitals that have served our rural communities for decades, but 75 percent of them are operating in the red. Twelve rural hospitals have closed across the state in the last seven years. That's not sustainable, but we don't have to accept it. Just like we do on infrastructure and education, we have the answers. Expanding Medicaid would keep those hospitals open and keep our families healthy. It would also ensure affordable coverage for more than 200,000

Alabamians, create billions in revenue, and be the largest jobs bill our state has ever

passed. Yet our current leaders seem more interested in making a political point than making real change.

We can do better. We know how. Now we have to make the choice.

I'm an Alabamian by birth and by choice. I was born in Fairhope. I went to Georgia for school, but when it came time to start a family, I never considered anywhere but South Alabama. I wanted my kids to grow up here because it's home and because I know the remarkable potential we have here in South Alabama and across the state.

Running for elected office is about the last thing I saw myself doing when I moved back. But when I think about all that potential; when I think about the Alabama I want for my little girls; and when I think about all the work we have to do to get there, I can't just stand by and watch.

I don't claim to have the perfect solutions to all our problems, and I don't pretend we can fix them all overnight. But I do know this: if we keep doing things the same way, year after year, election after election, we'll keep getting the same results. Our kids and our communities deserve better.

Keeping their memory alive

Baldwin County Heritage Museum opens annual World War I and II exhibit

Coletta Bailey spends hours retracing each footstep Baldwin County veterans took as they marched from the comfort of the home front to the hell of the frontlines.

She has tracked down the official story: their enlistment papers, their awards and accolades, and their discharge paperwork.

But she has also uncovered the story of sons, fathers, husbands and brothers who chose to leave what they loved most in order to protect it. And when they returned, their dedication to their home and families only grew. They became local businessmen, store owners, teachers, coaches and doctors.

“I want to remind people what these people sacrificed,” Bailey said. “They put their lives on hold to do this. They could have stayed home.”

This is the sixth annual World War I and World War II Memories of Baldwin County exhibit. The center exhibit hall of the museum is now temporarily home to thousands of photos, uniforms pieces and equipment.

Bailey spends about eight hours researching information on each veteran and creating a board with photos, records and stories. She only researches veterans who lived in Baldwin County at the time of enlistment, shortening the list of veterans from several thousand to only a few thousand. She completes several new boards each year.

This year she added

several more women veterans to the mix.

“I like to find the women,” she said. “For many years they were overlooked for their contribution to the war effort.”

One notable addition this year is Grace Esther Edhegard Smith, of Silverhill. Smith graduated from Robertsdale High School in 1941 at age 16 and attended Birmingham Baptist Hospital Nursing School.

She served as a second lieutenant in the Army Nurse Corps and served overseas in Africa and later in West Germany.

After returning home she worked as a psychiatric nurse at Mobile Mental Health and Baldwin County Mental Health where a wing of the department is now named in her honor. Bailey said Smith was ahead of her time in addressing the mental strain that war caused on those who


served and focused on mental health needs after her war duties

ended. “They not only served their country but they

came home and served their county too,” Bailey said.

Retail Family: An interview with Ann Miller, Carol Eberlein and Barbara Levitt; mother and daughters running M&F Casuals

Strolling through the streets of idyllic downtown Fairhope, it’s hard not to notice the sunny yellow exterior of M&F Casuals. Once you step through the green canopied doors, the warmth of Southern hospitality invites you to stay a while, make new friends and truly enjoy the shopping experience.

It’s been 43 years since Ann and Marc Miller opened M&F Casuals in Fairhope — one of the first retail shops in the city’s downtown. At the time, the husband and wife team owned four other M&F stores in central and south Alabama.

“The Fairhope location was just a freak accident,” Ann says with a smile. “My husband was driving to Foley and Robertsdale and could not find a hotel room to stay in. He called me, and said, ‘I’ve come through this cute little town called Fairhope, and we’ve got to open a store here.’ ”

That was 1970. Three years later, in 1973, that store became a reality joining a pharmacy, a hardware store, a department store and a jeweler as the downtown retailers.

The Millers rented and later purchased an office building and renovated the front half to house the retail store and the back half became a two-bedroom apartment. Back then, Ann, Marc and their three young daughters Leslie, Carol and Barbara lived in Selma and would come to Fairhope on the weekends.

“It worked beautifully. We’d come down here on the weekends with the girls and walk down to the pier. We never dreamed of moving here, but of course we did, in 1990,” added Ann.

As the retail business evolved, the family gradually closed M&F’s other locations, except for the Fairhope store. Thanks to a facelift of the building in the early 1990s, the selling floor is now double its original size. Today, the store remains one of the busiest in the heart of Fairhope’s downtown, specializing in ladies apparel, accessories and shoes.

“There is a lot of talk that brick and mortar is dead, but we do not think

so,” said Ann. “We think that there will always be a place for this. Women don’t shop because they need things. They shop because they need to talk to people, to see people and to connect.”

Family Roots

The beginnings of M&F Casuals reach back more than 90 years. The story began in 1925, when Harry Maring, who owned a dry goods store in Selma, decided to go into a retail business with one of his top salesmen, Roswell Faulkenberry. The two used the first initials of their last names for M&F Department Stores, which they opened in 1927, carrying men’s, women’s and children’s apparel as well as home goods. Maring and his son-in-law Lester Yates expanded the business before Yates’ daughter Ann and her husband, Marc, moved back home to Selma from Atlanta and took over in 1966. When the two were planning the opening of the Fairhope store, they learned that another department store wouldn’t fit the feel of Fairhope. And so, the name M&F Casuals was chosen.

Nowadays, Ann still is actively involved in the shop, and her daughters Carol Eberlein and Barbara Levitt oversee the operations and merchandising/buying respectively.

“We are known as the store where we understand that our bodies aren’t perfect. But you can come in here and find an outfit that makes you feel confident and know that you look good,” said Barbara.

Barbara, who has worked in retail her whole career, started as an executive trainee at Bloomingdales after college, going on to work for the JCrew group and later an online business.

“When I left home,” Barbara said, “I wanted to work for a big company. But after all those years, one day I found myself thinking, I am tired of big corporations, I want to get back to family, and I have enjoyed it ever since.”

Carol jokes, “I was probably the least likely of the daughters to come into the business. But when my children were young, it was perfect timing. It’s been a rewarding opportunity for the whole family. My daughter,

worked here when she was in high school, and she was able to gain so much experience. That’s what working in a family business does.”

Ann added, “You never know in life what’s going to happen tomorrow. It’s been a wonderful journey. And to have had my daughters join me and take this to another level. So, we’re excited to see where it takes us from here.”

Community Impact

The team at M&F Casuals takes great pride in supporting and giving back to the community. The store regularly sponsors fundraising projects benefiting the arts, the schools and the business community.

Carol said, “That’s what’s special about small stores, we are able to help the causes that are important to our customers. We have always been told that small organizations have a hard time getting assistance

from big stores. But with local stores like us, because we are so small, the owners are right here on the spot. We can make quick decisions and immediately get involved.”

“It is wonderful that we can offer enough to keep the community vibrant and keep the customers shopping in town,” added Carol.

Barbara, who serves as an executive board member for the Downtown Fairhope Business Association (DFBA), said, “It’s our city. We are never going to sit here and hope people come here to shop. We see it as our mission to do our part to bring people into our downtown.” Marc was one of the founders of DFBA, which has grown to more than 100 business



members.

In addition to organizing community events, the association goes as far as to put together the city’s official visitor’s guide, so tourists get the most out of their stay in town.

‘Legacies’ grows the seeds of ‘The Vampire Diaries’ and ‘The Originals’

With “The Vampire Diaries” and “The Originals” both over, it’s only logical that The CW would want to keep the popular horror franchise going. It does that with the premiere of returning creator-producer Julie Plec’s “Legacies” Thursday, Oct. 25. The new show follows Hope Mikaelson (Danielle Rose Russell, continuing her “Originals” role) as she enters the Salvatore School for the Young and Gifted — which obviously takes its name from Stefan Salvatore of “The Vampire Diaries.” Hope joins other descendants of vampires, werewolves and witches as they become educated in controlling their supernatural ways. Plec explains that as the saga is reset just outside Mystic Falls, “the locals think it’s a school for rich kids, but inside is a wonderful cast of young, supernatural beings. They’ve either been cursed by genetics

or cursed by supernatural bloodlines. They have some element of them that, and were they to unleash it, it could be a dark thing ... and they all have it in them to be the villain of our story.” However, adds Plec, “Through love and acceptance and being embraced, and being around like-minded people with tolerance and all the things that come along with being supernatural, because it’s a boarding school, we are hoping that we can show the path to all of them individually being the hero.” Actress Russell allows of Hope, “I’ve only played her for a year, and I so fell in love with playing the character. Even in the way she does her makeup and the way she dresses, it’s a little edgier (now). It’s a little more adult. She’s definitely matured and grown up a bit since things that happened to her on ‘The Originals.’ And in her attitude and being in the school itself, it has helped me really navigate

how I’m going about playing her in a much different way. “She’s always been mature for her age,” Russell notes. “She’s been through things unimaginable, but she was definitely faced with a little more innocence, even little things. She had never had her first kiss before, and she was naive and making these bad decisions. And now that she’s kind of grown (and) has been through so much, I really focus on small things.” Matthew Davis also resumes his role as Alaric Saltzman, whose twin daughters Josie and Lizzie (played by Kaylee Bryant and Jenny Boyd) also are among the school’s students. “It’s been a fascinating journey,” Davis reflects. “I remember when I signed on to do just a four-episode arc, and it turned into (being) this regular on ‘The Vampire Diaries’ and (a guest on) ‘The Originals,’ and now this. It was clear to me that Alaric’s story was not finished.”

The Baldwin County High Tigers collected their third 6A Region 1 win of the season, evening their overall record to 4-4 with a road win against the Robertsdale Golden Bears (2-7, 2-5) at J.D. Sellars Stadium in Robertsdale.

“Any time you can get a road win in this league is huge,” said BCHS Head Coach Nathan McDaniel. “(Robertsdale Head Coach Chase Smith) has done a great job with this team and we knew coming in that they would be well-coached and ready to play.”

The Tigers scored first with just 16 ticks off the clock when senior La'trell Hollaway returned the opening kickoff 86 yards for the score.

The Bears came back

to take the lead driving 74 yards in eight plays, aided by a pair of Tiger penalties. Quarterback Tristian Stevens connected with Robert Barnett twice for 30 yards, including a 12-yard touchdown pass, then connected with Romaro Settles for the 2-point conversion to give the Bears an 8-7 lead with 7:41 to play.

It was a lead the Bears would hold onto until early in the second quarter when Stevens was picked off by Randy Jones, who returned the ball to the Robertsdale 7. Joshua Crook ran it in from there and a missed extra point left the score at 13-8 with 10:49 left in the half.

Baldwin County scored again before the half, going 63 yards in just four plays behind the running of James Stanley and quarterback A.J. Mix with Mix taking it in himself from two yards out.

Mix and Crook would

trade quarterbacking duties throughout the night with Crook passing to Jarvis Achison for the 2-point conversion to put the Tigers up 21-8 with 6:58 left in the half.

The Tigers held the Bears to two punts, but turned the ball over on downs near midfield to keep the score 21-8 at halftime.

“I thought our defense played well overall,” McDaniel said. “We had some issues with penalties that will need to be addressed, but overall, I think they did well. Offensively, we had some good moments, but were too sporadic. We’re going to have to play more consistently if we’re going to take this team to the next level.”

After holding the Bears to three-and-out, the Tigers ate up the clock on a 13-play, 65-yard drive, capped by a 30-yard fieldgoal from Josh Burton with 4:37 left in the third quarter

The Tigers added an-

other score with 9:06 to play in the game. Mix took the ball for a 22-yard gain, then connected with Jermaine Coleman on a 55-yard strike. Burton’s extra point gave BCHS a 31-8 lead.

From there the two teams traded punts before Robertsdale mounted a 62-yard drive behind the running of Barnett and Taven Curry, but time ran out on the Bears at the Tiger 3.

Mix led the Tiger offense with 79 yards on 16 carries, while completing 3-of-10 passes for 69 yards with a rushing and a passing touchdown. Stanley chipped in 45 yards on 10 carries. Crook added a rushing touchdown, a pass for a 2-point conversion and was 2-of-2 passing for 13 yards.

After having 64 yards of offense on its opening drive (with two Tiger penalties that accounted for 10 yards), the Bears managed just 96 yards

offensively for the rest of the game with only 72 yards of offense in the second half, not completing a pass in only two attempts.

Stevens was 5-of-10 passing for 56 yards and added 13 yards on seven carries (including three sacks for minus-11 yards), but sat out most of the second half with Barnett and sophomore Grant Driver taking most of the snaps in the final 24 minutes of play. Barnett gained 64 yards on 10 carries, while Curry had 27 yards on 15 carries for the Bears (including five negative rushing plays for minus-26 yards).

The Tigers (3-4 in 6A Region 1 play) finish up their 6A Region 1 schedule Friday night at home against winless B.C. Rain before traveling to 5A Region 2 Charles Henderson (4-4, 3-3) Nov. 2. The Bears will have a week off before taking on 6A Region 1 foe St. Paul’s (5-3, 4-2) on the road.

SPANISH FORT — With the 6A Region 1 coming down to the wire, there were three teams still in the hunt for the regional title in the Saraland Spartans, the Blount Leopards, and the Spanish Fort Toros. Last Friday night, one of those matchups was ultimately decided as the Spanish Fort Toros defeated the Blount Leopards with a 19-7 score at home on senior night. DAPHNE — Fred Riley is retired from high school coaching, but his passion for the sport and the opportunities to continue to teach it will keep him in the game at a new level. The former high-school and college coach is looking for athletes interested in continuing to play the game for fun as well as future advancement in the professional ranks. The first season of the American South Football Alliance is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2020, but the recruiting process starts in earnest in 2019. "We're looking forward

to playing in 2020. But it really begins this spring when we will begin with a mini camp, an OTA type workout with non-padded run throughs. We are still in the process of securing a practice facility as well as a playing facility right now, but by early 2019 we hope to be on the field somewhere getting ready to play ball." Riley, who retired from the state education system, said five assistant coaches and two front-office personnel have already been hired since he came on board as general manager and head coach. An organization-wide meeting is also set for Nov. 10 in Mobile to further establish the

franchise and business model for the league to be known officially as The America South Football Alliance. Teams will range geographically from Houston, Texas to Florida and northward to Tennessee and include Louisiana, Arkansas, Georgia and South Carolina. "We'll be looking for players out of Baldwin and Mobile county who are in that gap between having finished high school and of or near college ages. Maybe some who played in college or had dreams to play in the arena league. Or wanted to and didn't get the chance to. Also, guys who just enjoy the game of

football and want to give it one more shot and want to be a part of something bigger than themselves." The Vikings are a part of the new American South Football Alliance (ASFA) which will have 18 teams affiliated with Arena Football, other pro franchises and the NCAA. The league is scheduled to start play in the spring of 2020. Players interested can find more information about the Eastern Shore Vikings at: Americasouthfootballalliance.com. Riley, who also coached at Robertsdale and lived in the Belforest area for many years, leads the Davidson Warriors in all-time wins with a 110-50 record. The 110 victories also leave him fourth all-time among Mobile

County Public School coaches. His teams reached the playoffs 10 times in 14 years and made a pair of Class 6A semifinal appearances in 2008 and 2010. In addition to the Vikings, Mobile will be

foot buffer green space area that would shield the development from Olde Towne Daphne. Even with the restrictions, Scott said he


doubted residents would be pleased. “I’m not sure anything other than a total no would have made everyone happy here tonight, but I appreciate your input and appreciate your passion,” Scott said.

The council split 4-3 on the decision, with Scott, Doug Goodlin, Joel Coleman and Joe Davis voting yes and Council President Tommie Conaway, Pat Rudicell and Robin LeJeune voting against. On Oct. 2, Haygood

announced he would be exercising his veto power on the decision, citing several reasons for wanting to strike the project down in a letter to the council. “I am concerned about several of the aspects of this ordinance, including but not limited to, the passing of the ordinance to rezone is not consistent with the will of the community as evidenced by the concern expressed by neighboring property owners and a large contingent of the Olde Towne Daphne community; the fundamental tenant that the City may

not unilaterally alter the PUD documents submitted with the rezoning request, notwithstanding the applicant’s right to amend the documents or otherwise agree to Planning Commission or City Council requested changes in furtherance of the approval sought, and must vote on the rezoning based on the submission was not observed as the motion to adopt prescribed changes to the PUD without consent by the applicant; the ordinance as published is flawed as it did not include the definitive PUD documents for the project which are

necessary and proper to be included as part of the ordinance; and there was not an opportunity to hear from the public as to whether or not the proposed PUD modification which was included as part of the motion lessened the overwhelming objection of the community on this rezoning effort.” It would have required a supermajority of five council members to overturn Haywood’s veto, but no action was taken by the council, as the three nay votes originally against the rezoning — Conaway, Rudicell and LeJeune — had not changed their positions on the matter.

Summit provides updates on RESTORE progress in Alabama

Although the inaugural Governor’s Restoration Summit had held a firm spot on Governor Kay Ivey’s schedule for months, Hurricane Michael required a change of plans for Governor Ivey as the devastation left in its wake called for her immediate attention. Fortunately, Governor Ivey was able to leave the important business of the Summit under the leadership of Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Commissioner Chris Blankenship, a man very familiar with the Deepwater Horizon oil spill that initiated the 8-year path to the Summit.

The Summit, held recently at the Spanish Fort Community Center, provided updates on the progress of restoration efforts related to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill as well as the opportunity for public input on proposals for work that will continue for the foreseeable future.

“On the Alabama Coast we all know how it is to go through such a traumatic storm event. Our prayers and thoughts are with the people of Florida, South-east Alabama and Georgia and Governor Ivey as they deal with the aftermath of the massive storm,” Blankenship said as he opened the Summit.

“The most exciting thing to point out from the Summit is that 122 projects valued at more than \$711 million of restoration efforts have occurred or are underway so far in Alabama,” Blankenship said. “We’ve done good work in all these restoration projects, but there is still more work to do. It’s important to have events like this to hear from the public about what’s important to them and what type of projects we need to do moving forward to continue to restore Alabama.

“The settlement from BP will continue to be paid out over 15 years,

through 2032, so it’s a long process where we will be doing restoration work, and we want to continue to stay engaged with the public. We want to make sure we provide information about projects that are being done, how those projects are going and listen for what we can do better in the future.”

The Deepwater Horizon oil spill that occurred in 2010 forever changed the way of life along the Gulf Coast from the economic impact to the curtailment of recreational opportunities and property access. In 2016, a settlement was reached with BP to fund restoration efforts and recover economic damages for Alabama and the rest of the Gulf states.

“Each of us has a special interest in preserving our state’s natural resources,” Blankenship said. “I love our coast and what it means to our way of life and quality of life here. This is my home and, for most of you, your home. As Commissioner, I commit to you that we will strive to ensure that our state remains Alabama the beautiful.”

Blankenship said the interest citizens have shown in the state’s natural resources continues to demonstrate that the state’s most valuable resource is the people of Alabama.

“It warms my heart to see so many people who care deeply for Alabama and its natural resources,” he said. “Gov. Ivey also cares very much about the restoration work underway and what still needs to be done.”

Blankenship shared the successes in Alabama from the \$711 million allocated for 122 restoration projects to date.

“With these projects, we are improving water quality in Mobile Bay and protecting the Grand Bay Savanna,” he said. “We are protecting oyster habitats, turtle-nesting habitats, bird-nesting habitats and other wildlife. We are restoring the marsh and shoreline at Lightning

Point in Bayou La Batre.

“We are expanding public fishing opportunities by restoring the fishing pier at Fort Morgan. We also have the beautiful new Lodge at Gulf State Park that will open on November 2. We are promoting growth in south Alabama’s economy with important infrastructure projects.”

Other types of restoration projects include oyster management, artificial reef construction and research, ecosystem research and improving the stranding response network for marine mammals.

“In case you’ve never heard me say this before, Alabama has the largest artificial reef program in the country,” Blankenship said. “Through this funding, we have been able to build more artificial reefs and do research around those reefs that will continue to provide habitat and production for decades.

“And everybody loves oysters. A lot of work has been done and will be done to restore oysters.”

Regarding community resilience, Blankenship said the goal is for a community to use available resources to respond to, withstand and recover from adverse situations like natural disasters and environmental catastrophes.

“Coastal Alabama is all too familiar with being prepared when disaster strikes,” Blankenship said. “As we saw with the destruction caused by Hurricane Michael in the Florida

Panhandle and south-east Alabama, coastal resilience is vitally important. It is not a matter of if but when our coast will be impacted by a tropical storm or hurricane.”

For economic development and enhancement, the projects include an Africatown Museum and Welcome Center as well as various road and highway improvements, Port of Mobile enhancements and water system improvements in coastal Alabama.

With RESTORE funding, Alabama has been able to acquire more than 4,000 acres of environmentally sensitive coastal habitat. So far more than \$100 million has been designated for land acquisition and conservation.

“ADCNR, in close coordination with the Forever Wild Land Trust program, as well as state and federal partners, has invested and will continue to invest in land conservation and other restoration efforts across coastal Alabama,” Blankenship said.

The Commissioner said watershed management plans are a foundational piece of the restoration strategy with the goal of improving water quality.

“Clearly, we are making progress, but we’re not stopping there,” Blankenship said. “We need to do more. I’m grateful to our federal partners and local partners on each of these

projects.”

The Governor’s Office and ADCNR recently produced the 2018 Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Restoration Progress Report that highlights the progress through the middle of 2018. Go to www.alabamacoastal-restoration.org to review the complete report online.

The Restoration Progress Report is grouped by restoration project types:

- Replenishing and protecting living coastal and marine resources
- Supporting and enhancing community resilience
- Providing and enhancing economic development and infrastructure
- Restoring, conserving and enhancing habitat
- Providing and enhancing recreation and public access
- Restoring water quality
- Providing planning support
- Conducting science, research and monitoring

“The Governor’s Restoration Summit is the first opportunity we have had to put together a document that has all the projects showcased in one place, regardless of funding source,” Blankenship said. “When all the projects are grouped by restoration type it shows that, overall, restoration projects for Alabama cover all restoration types pretty fairly and

that when aggregated it is over 120 projects and \$711 million, which is pretty impressive.

“The important part is these projects come from you (the public). These projects started with a suggestion from somebody – a group, an organization, a municipality, a county or state agency. That is the primary reason for this summit – to hear from you on projects from ‘Bucket 2’ of the federal RESTORE Act. Restoration is definitely a team effort. The Governor’s Restoration Summit further proves the power of working together.”

Over the next 15 years about \$1.4 billion is allocated to Alabama for restoration projects related to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill from NRDA, NFWF and the Alabama RESTORE Council. About \$1.6 billion will be allocated by the federal RESTORE Council gulf-wide from Bucket 2. That money is not distributed or divided to each state by any formula. All five Gulf states and six federal agencies will work to put together a plan that meets project needs in each state. Paint the town pink

Just a few decades ago, little was known about breast cancer. It was a rarely talked about disease. Today, breast cancer is in the news, almost daily, reporting on new drug therapies and the latest treatment techniques. Thanks to the dedication of researchers, pharmacologists, oncologists and other health-care providers, we have made momentous progress in terms of what we know about breast cancer, its treatment and most importantly its prevention.

During the month of October, every town across our nation is painted pink. Professional football players wear pink sweat bands and pink cleats, local businesses display pink ribbons in their store-

fronts and millions of women gather together in their pink tutus to walk a 5K. This pink movement has been the single most effective cancer awareness campaign to date.

Why is this important? Because in recent years death rates from breast cancer have declined significantly. This movement has encouraged women to become more educated about the disease and more proactive in seeking their screenings. So I say, keep your paint brushes out and keep spreading the word.

Now, let's talk more about these screenings. A clinical breast exam is recommended every three years for women in their 20s and 30s, and every year for women 40 and older. Yearly mammograms should also start at age 40. Women with a family history, genetic tendency or past

breast cancer should speak with their health-care provider about starting mammography screenings earlier, having additional tests or having more frequent exams.

Self-exams are also an integral part of the screening process. It's imperative that women know how their breasts feel normally, making it easier to identify when something has changed. Self-breast exams should be performed routinely while lying down, while looking in a mirror and while standing in the shower (put a few soap suds on your hand to help). Move your fingers in circular patterns, up and down patterns and in diagonal lines on both breasts. Don't forget to check in your underarms too!

Besides lumps, breast cancer can also present as redness, dimpling, shape changes and



texture differences. Early detection is key to beating this disease, so please report worrisome changes to your health-care provider as soon as you can.

We are all in this fight together- no, it's not a cliché, it's the truth. Prevention and early detection combined with advancements in research means that we are finding better tools, better ways to equip ourselves against this disease and are inching

closer and closer to finding a cure.

At Southern Cancer Center, we are doing our part. We play an active and leading role in clinical research studies and can give patients access to new treatments that are otherwise not yet generally available. Through partnerships with The US Oncology Network, Alliance for Clinical Trials in Oncology, and various pharmaceutical companies, we continue to advance

what is known about breast cancer and aid in the development of some of the newest and most promising breast cancer therapies.

So I'll say it again- paint the town pink and spread the word. It's Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

"I have played soccer, baseball and basketball," Tiger announced during his first week of practice, "but I have never seen such teamwork. I didn't even know it existed."

"How was it?" I asked Matt as he exited the field after an early practice.

"Great! I wanted to tackle and be tackled. I got to do both."

"It feels really good to get tackled," adds my now 10-year-old, Cory, reading over my shoulder.

As a mother, I don't get that. But I have concluded that boys can learn a lot about life from football. Sometimes you tackle — hit hard but play fair. Sometimes you get tackled-roll with it and get back up. Stay focused, even when you're losing.

STATE OF ALABAMA
PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS the Alabama Legislature at its 2018 Regular Session enacted Act Nos. 2017-188 (HB98), 2018-132 (SB194), 2018-276 (SB15), and 2018-389 (SB181) proposing certain amendments to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901;

WHEREAS, in conformity with Section 284 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, the Legislature has ordered an election by the qualified electors of the state upon such proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS notice of this election, together with the proposed amendments, is required by law to be given by proclamation of the Governor, which shall be published once a week for at least four successive weeks immediately preceding the day appointed for the election;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, as Governor of the State of Alabama, do hereby give notice, direct, and proclaim that on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, an election will be held in the State of Alabama in the manner and form provided by law upon the following proposed amendments to the Constitution of 1901 of the State of Alabama:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY ACT NO. 2017-188 (HB98)

(a) This state acknowledges, declares, and affirms that it is the public policy of this state to recognize and support the sanctity of unborn life and the rights of unborn children, including the right to life.

(b) This state further acknowledges, declares, and affirms that it is the public policy of this state to ensure the protection of the rights of the unborn child in all manners and measures lawful and appropriate.

(c) Nothing in this constitution secures or protects a right to abortion or requires the funding of an abortion.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY ACT NO. 2018-132 (SB194)

“Section 264.

“The state university shall be under the management and control of a board of trustees, which shall consist of two members from each congressional district in the state as constituted on January 1, 2018, an additional member from the congressional district which includes the site of the first campus of the university, ~~the superintendent of education~~, and the governor, who shall be ex officio president of the board. The members of the board of trustees as now constituted shall hold office until their respective terms expire under existing law, and until their successors shall be elected and confirmed as hereinafter required. The additional trustees provided for by this amendment shall be elected by the existing members of the board, and confirmed by the senate in the manner provided below, for initial terms of not more than six years established by the board so that one term shall expire each three years in each congressional district. Successors to the terms of the existing and additional trustees shall hold office for a term of six years, and shall not serve more than three consecutive full six-year terms on the board; ~~provided however that a trustee shall retire from the board and vacate office at the annual meeting of the board following that trustee’s seventieth birthday.~~ Election of additional and successor trustees or of trustees to fill any vacancy created by the expiration of a term or by the death or resignation of any member or from any other cause shall be by the remaining members of the board by secret ballot; provided, that any trustee so elected shall hold office from the date of election until confirmation or rejection by the senate, and, if confirmed, until the expiration of the term for which elected, and until a successor is elected. At every meeting of the legislature the superintendent of education shall certify to the senate the names of all who shall have been so elected since the last session of the legislature, and the senate shall confirm or reject them, as it shall determine is for the best interest of the university. If it rejects the names of any members, it shall thereupon elect trustees in the stead of those rejected. No trustee shall receive any pay or emolument other than his actual expenses incurred in the discharge of his duties as such. Upon the vacation of office by a trustee, the board, if it desires, may bestow upon a trustee the honorary title of trustee emeritus, but such status shall confer no responsibilities, duties, rights, or privileges as such.”

AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY ACT NO. 2018-276 (SB15)

Part 1. Section 46 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, and Amendment 97 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, both now appearing as Section 46 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, are repealed.

Part 2. Section 46 is added to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to read as follows:

Section 46.

(a) Senators and representatives shall be elected by the qualified electors on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November unless the Legislature shall change the time of holding elections and in every fourth year thereafter. The terms of office of the senators and representatives shall commence on the day after the general election at which they are elected, and expire on the day after the general election held in the fourth year after their election, except as otherwise provided in this Constitution. At the general election in the year nineteen hundred and two all the representatives, together with the senators for the even numbered districts and for the thirty-fifth district, shall be elected. The terms of those senators who represent the odd numbered districts under the law in force prior to the ratification of this Constitution, are hereby extended until the day after the general election in the year nineteen hundred and six; and until the expiration of his or her term as hereinbefore extended, each such senator shall represent the district established by this Constitution, bearing the number corresponding with that for which he or she was elected. In the year nineteen hundred and six, and in every fourth year thereafter, all the senators and representatives shall be elected.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), when a vacancy occurs in either house of the Legislature, the Governor shall issue a writ of election to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term. However, if the Secretary of State determines that a legally qualified candidate for election to the vacancy is unopposed when the last date for filing certificates of nomination has passed, the election shall not be held. The Secretary of State shall issue a certificate of election to the candidate, the same as if an election had been held, and the certificate shall be accepted by the house in which the vacancy occurred as evidence of the unopposed candidate’s right to fill the position created by the vacancy. In the event an election is held, all the costs and expenses incurred thereby shall be paid out of any funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

(c) When a vacancy occurs in either house of the Legislature on or after October 1 of the third year of a quadrennium, the seat shall remain vacant until a successor is elected at the next succeeding general election.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY ACT NO. 2018-389 (SB181)

Every person shall be at liberty to worship God according to the dictates of his or her own conscience. No person shall be compelled to attend, or, against his or her consent, to contribute to the erection or support of any place of religious worship, or to pay tithes, taxes, or other rates for the support of any minister of the gospel. Property belonging to the state may be used to display the Ten Commandments, and the right of a public school and public body to display the Ten Commandments on property owned or administrated by a public school or public body in this state is not restrained or abridged. The civil and political rights, privileges, and capacities of no person shall be diminished or enlarged on account of his or her religious belief. No public funds may be expended in defense of the constitutionality of this amendment.

The Ten Commandments shall be displayed in a manner that complies with constitutional requirements, including, but not limited to, being intermingled with historical or educational items, or both, in a larger display within or on property owned or administrated by a public school or public body.

FURTHER, I proclaim and direct that notice of this election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, upon the above proposed amendments to the Constitution of 1901 of the State of Alabama, shall be given by publishing the same in a newspaper published within each county authorized to publish legal advertisements.
