Brookings council 'reconsiders' decision on Howard *City attorney urges council to discuss matters behind closed doors*

Brookings city councilor Michelle Morosky made a surprise announcement at the start of the council meeting on Monday that she wanted to add an agenda item, to "reconsider" her position on two decisions made the previous week

regarding the employment status of City Manager Janell Howard.

Howard has been on paid administrative leave since early July after being charged with theft from Fred Meyer.

The motions up for reconsideration involved one that authorized the city attorney to initiate a conversation with City Manager

Janelle Howard about a separation agreement.

The other motion, which failed in a 3-2 vote last week, was made by Mayor Ron Hedenskog. His motion was to take the City Manager Janell Howard out of her current position and make her a new administrative/grants position at the highest pay level authorized by the city.

Morosky appeared to be the "swing" vote on Monday Oct. 17. She voted yes with councilors Brad Alcorn and John McKinney, forming a majority vote to initiate a separation agreement with Howard. But her call to "reconsider" Howard's "separation" was quickly supported by Mayor Ron Hedenskog.

He stepped in to explain he had found an ordinance that allowed a council member who voted with the majority to revisit the ordinance at the same or following meeting.

Mayor Hedenskog and Councilmembers Michelle Morosky and Ed Shreiber voted to place the motions back on the agenda, while

Governor candidate Betsy Johnson touts loyalty to Oregonians

Betsy Johnson travelled the state to meet with Oregonians where they live and work during her All of Oregon Tour, stopping in 10 cities in 48 hours along the way.

Johnson made a visit to Gold Beach on Tuesday, Oct. 25 during that tour for a meet and greet at First Chapter Coffee. Johnson said she has visited every county in Oregon during her campaign.

"We are doing this the hard way. We are running unaffiliated," Johnson told the crowd during her campaign stop on the South Coast.

While Johnson recognizes the challenges that come with running as an unaffiliated candidate, she said it is also her strength. Johnson touts herself as an independent leader loyal only to the people of Oregon. She believes only the people – not a broken political system – can rescue the state.

Johnson served in the Oregon House and Senate for more than 20 years, retiring as Chair of the Joint Ways and Means Committee last year to run for governor. Prior to that, Johnson graduated from law school, owned an aviation business that flew helicopters, and managed the Aeronautics Division of the State Department of Transportation.

"I loved being in the legislature and

taking care of constituents, but in December I decided if I was serious about running for Governor I couldn't take care of my district the way I always have and I needed to resign. So I have been running flat out since January," she said.

The unaffiliated governor candidate has a history with both sides of the political spectrum.

"I started out as an R and the Rs got a little too kooky on some stuff for me. So I left the Rs and went to the Ds and a Republican friend of mine in the Senate used to call me a 'BFD' and I gasped until he told me it stood for business-friendly democrat," Johnson said.

"That's how I represented my district. I was pro-choice, pro-cop, pro-business, pro-accountability and voted very consistently with the district to improve the economy," Johnson said.

The majority of Betsy Johnson's campaign stop on Oct. 25 consisted of a question and answer period by rural Oregonians. Johnson fielded questions ranging from how to get grants and funding, to education, gun rights and global nuclear threats.

"I'm very supportive of a lot of choice in education. I think our education system is letting our kids down badly. All you have to see is

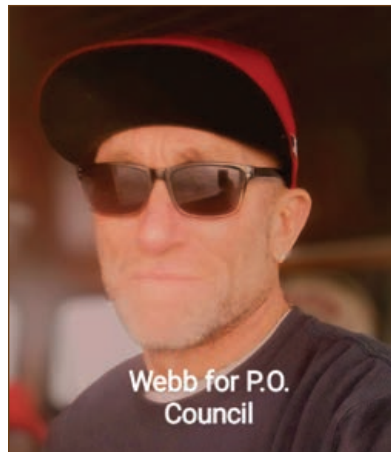
What made you interested in running for this position?

I feel like I stand out as a candidate because I am an open-minded, sensible, and approachable individual who is committed to representing the citizens' best interests and needs.

What skills and expertise would you bring to this position?

I want the best for the residents and city of Port Orford. I have a background in construction and renovation, which I have utilized to rehabilitate the former Shoreline Motel, now called the Shoreline Inn and Suites. A property which was run-down, and regarded very poorly in this community, but is now a respectable, functioning hotel, generating taxes from overnight lodging that is paid to our city. I am also an experienced businessman and entrepreneur who will look for creative, inclusive solutions to benefit this city.

If elected, what issues would you focus on?

If elected, I plan to focus on affordable public housing

and addressing the water issues a priority.

In my opinion, one of our most urgent needs for the city of Port Orford is to find ways to develop more public housing for its citizens. There is a shortage of housing in Port Orford (as there is currently in most of the United States). I plan to find options for more available housing, with ideas to obtain grants and/or offer property owners incentives to build new efficient homes and long-term rental units in the city. I am in support of accessory dwelling units that could help alleviate the housing shortage, and in addition, offer the city's residents an opportunity to make a supplementary income.

Another urgent need to address is the water issue that our city is faced with. There are numerous water leaks throughout the city, as well as issues with our reservoir. I have ideas to stop draining money from locals' pockets to make more clean water, by instead putting money toward identifying where our wasted water is going, stop it, and fix our city's water system. I plan to find ways to conserve water to prevent continuing exorbitant curtailment fees

and restricted usages implemented as a result of these water leaks.

What would you like to change or improve upon?

I am dedicated to improving what I can for the local residents of Port Orford. My goals for Port Orford are to uplift our community by supporting local small businesses, our commercial fishermen and the Port, and to nurture our city's Tourism to the benefit of Port Orford. Tourism is key to bringing in new revenue to make improvements, and give back to locals from tourists' spending their money in our city at local businesses. I enjoy living my American dream in this beautiful, small coastal town. I have traditional small town values. I value Port Orford's calming lifestyle, its beauty, feeling of safety and security, and sustainable atmosphere. I like knowing my neighbors and seeing children and adults alike walking and riding bikes around town. teaching career, joined several community-based organizations, and volunteer to support the Cape Blanco Heritage Society. I also deliver food to those in need (Meals for Neighbors). A friend recognized my dedication to the people in the area and encouraged me to join the city council when a position became available in 2020; then-Mayor Pogwizd appointed me to the council. The position is again open in this voting season – and I would love to continue my work.

During my time on the Council, I have worked on the Dark Skies ordinance, building height rules, the purchase of the watershed (expansion work is still underway), served as liaison to the Port Orford/Langlois School Board, finalization of the city employee contract,

and understanding and forming recommendations to address the upcoming 2023 homeless legislation as well as ODT's updates along our main street, 101.

If elected, what issues would you focus on? What would you like to change or improve upon?

A very important issue to me, and my main focus, is the availability of water in Port Orford and surrounding zones. Since the day I moved here, I heard stories about years of issues concerning water-shed and water infrastructure in the city. It's taken time to discover the history of past decisions, the truth about the current state, and work on recommendations and solutions for Port Orford's water woes. Without adequate water systems in place, our homes, safety and health are at risk and the future of Port Orford is questionable.

Preparing for council

meetings means time 'doing my homework' on the issues that are discussed and voted on in our meetings. This includes researching how other communities nation-wide have handled these situations and the outcomes of their efforts. Let's promote a community where everyone feels safe, comfortable, the nostalgic look of the community can be maintained, our children have excellent schools, and the city's atmosphere provides a location where our young people want to come home to live and work.

Attracting business to our community is critical to our future as well. Right now, affordable housing is under consideration and discussion - new businesses and their employees need available business locations and employee housing to be successful.

I am looking forward to continuing working for Port Orford and its citizens.

years and have been engaged in the community in many ways. I was a Ford Family Foundation Leadership Fellow, I participated in the "Looking Forward Port Orford" planning process, and I've served on the city budget committee for two years. My involvement with planning and conservation issues in our region has given me a solid understanding of how government works, and my background as an author of several books has given me knowledge along with research and communication skills that can help our city council team to better serve our community.

What skills and expertise would you bring to this position?

With a background in natural resources, I have

knowledge of planning and permitting. I know how to research, listen, think, collaborate, communicate, and problem-solve, and I always bring a positive outlook to everything I do.

If elected, what issues would you focus on?

The biggest issue for Port Orford right now is our troubled drinking water supply system. Our reservoir is silted in, and our antiquated delivery pipes leak. There have been times over the past couple of years, during house fires and drought, when our supply has been too low for comfort. We now have a moratorium on new building and have a curtailment policy in effect to conserve water.

Though our public works staff has done an amazing job keeping our old system operational, our city needs to tackle some underlying issues so that residents can

have a safe and reliable water supply. I will focus on making sure our city can make progress on this issue – pressing to get our dredging permit and new meters that will help us to better detect and repair leaks. With secure water, we can explore innovative ways to improve housing availability.

We also need good planning to assure quality of life for our residents and a sustainable future. Our local government needs to work better and to be transparent and fair for everyone.

What would you like to change or improve upon?

I love Port Orford, and I'd like to see our local government work better – to get things done, to be fair to everyone, and to have the chops to plan for the future – so we can keep Port Orford a special little town into the future, even as we grow.

plan, the chinks in the armor, results in a sweeter plan for everyone. From there, following the plan seems to be problematic for our cash strapped administrations as new issues arise.

What makes you stand out as a candidate? What skills and expertise would you bring to this position?

My skills are that of an experienced member of local government. I know the do's and don'ts. I am currently serving my fourth consecutive term as a commissioner

at the Port of Port Orford, having been elected as the chairman 4 or 5 times.

I also served a 4 year term on the Port Orford City Council from 2014 to 2018, where I was elected council president in 2006 through 2008. I have more local government time under my belt than my friends on the ballot combined, then doubled, and tripled, and more. I think this makes me uniquely qualified. I work on a resource management advisory board at ODFW and am a SOORC board member, keeping offshore wind at bay for a decade. I know how to do this stuff. It's slow, by design. Can you imagine the mess

If elected, what issues would you focus on? What would you like to change or improve upon?

We need our people to trust us – to trust the administration and the government body, because we need a bond if we want water. We need a bond, I will say again. It's the way forward for our water issues. We can do it... we can pass a bond if there is trust.

Kotek makes her case for governor

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Tina Kotek completed a swing down the coast on Sunday, visiting Astoria, Seaside, Lincoln City and Newport.

Addressing supporters in Newport, Kotek acknowledged the housing, homelessness, addiction and mental health crises facing the state but focused on her plans to address them.

“Oregonians know how to solve their problems,” Kotek said.

“What they need is a governor and a state government that’s going to be by their

side helping them solve their problems so we can move our state forward.”

Kotek pointed to her 2019 call to declare homelessness an emergency in the state and her support of legislation to protect access to housing during the pandemic as the types of action she would take as governor. Both of these calls failed to gain support from Governor Kate Brown, leading them to fizzle.

“We have the resources, we have the know-how, we just need to coordinate things better; that’s where a governor comes in,” Kotek said.

She pointed out that she was the only candidate

that has published plans to address these issues, saying her opponents are more concerned with partisan attacks, especially around law and order issues.

Kotek pushed back against opponents’ attacks on her record on crime, saying that she has always supported the Oregon State Police and other law enforcement.

She also said that as governor she would support expansion the state police, which she noted is particularly important in rural communities.

Other issues Kotek mentioned were gun control and the environment. Kotek said that she supported responsible gun ownership but was in favor of more measures to keep firearms out of the hands of dangerous individuals.

She said the environment was also a priority, mentioning her commitment to net-zero carbon emissions for Oregon by 2040.

Kotek acknowledged that the race is very tight and will come down to the last two weeks of campaigning.

While saying that she would support affordable housing development in smaller towns, she expressed a strong commitment to making sure it didn’t come at the expense of farmland. “We have to maintain our farms,” Kotek said.

She pointed to townhouses next to the campaign event as a good middle ground between single-family homes and apartment buildings for suburban and rural areas.

Kotek said that while her opponents claim she is unresponsive to rural concerns, that is not the case and she understands the different challenges facing rural areas in the state.

“I want to make sure that every part of the state can be successful,” Kotek said.

Kate Brown’s two years of locking kids out of school to see what it’s done. We are getting those academic scores back now from the kids who were locked down and their scores are awful. We have yet to measure their social, emotional and mental health deterioration but I am going to submit it was probably substantial. But we have been on a downward spiral for a long time,” Johnson said.

“I think parents and grandparents are sick of paying as much as they pay and getting a product that is not very good. Tina Kotek and Kate Brown – not on my vote, I voted no – passed a bill that just lowered our standards. I will ask for higher standards and accountability as to how our money is spent with measurable standards for how we are doing,” she said.

Johnson was asked how to talk to people about guns “without making them afraid they are going to lose something?”

“My thinking on the subject has evolved. But I will start by saying I am a responsible gun owner. I don’t want to take anyone’s second amendment rights away but I think we need to do something. I would restrict the age for buying certain weapons from 18 to 21 and I would strengthen background checks including allowing the schools to alert public safety folks if a kid is going seriously off the rails,” Johnson said. “I will also put a heavy dose of mental health experts in the schools.”

Johnson said she’s been endorsed by sheriffs and chiefs of police.

“Because I am a gun owner I believe I am the only one who can compromise. Tina wants to take all the guns, and Christine doesn’t want to do anything. I think we need to do something. I want to keep guns out of the hands of kids, crazy people and criminals.”

When it comes to the economy, Johnson said she is “pro-economic develop-

ment.” She described herself as a champion for rural areas, and said the governor should recognize there are different parts of the economic fabric.

“I don’t care whether you make wood chips, silicon chips, cow chips, potato chips – I don’t care. The governor needs to recognize different economic areas throughout our state and promote that economy.”

During her campaign tour stop, Johnson referred to ballot measure 110 as an “abomination.” She supports wrap-around mental health services and said homelessness needs to be treated as an emergency.

“It is inhumane to leave people in the squalor. We used to think it was a Portland problem. It’s not anymore. It’s everywhere. And the fastest growing homeless sector is women,” she said.

Johnson said while her opposing governor candidates

fly in “political celebrities” to promote their campaigns, she is thinking about how to bring people together.

“I don’t need political celebrities to come in and give me money. I need to be sitting in rooms like this talking to Oregonians where you live and work,” Johnson said.

“I’m worrying we are losing Oregonians voice in this campaign. We’ve lost the conversation about how do we govern? How do we bring people back together?” she said. “I think an independent governor because I don’t ride for a brand. I don’t own into some ideology. I’m exactly the right guy to call the question to work together, and we do the easy stuff first and work our way up to the harder.”

Christine Drazan is seeking to become the first Republican governor of Oregon since Vic Atiyeh.

A former minority leader of the Oregon House of Representatives, the 51-year-old Republican is a native of Klamath Falls now living in Canby. She is a graduate of George Fox University and served in the House from 2019 through most of 2022. Recent surveys have shown her widening her leads over Democrat Tina Kotek and independent Betsy Johnson.

Drazan said she thinks Oregon is moving in the wrong direction in several ways

"I want to fix our schools, keep our communities safe, and make Oregon more livable," she has said. "When I talk to Oregonians, the issues they want me to address are affordability, education, congestion, homelessness, crime."

Education

"As a mom of three, I saw first-hand the impacts of the shutdowns on my kids and their friends and neighbors. Those shutdowns hurt their academic progress."

Drazan has opposed lockdowns related to the COVID pandemic. Regarding any future public health crisis, she has said, "I'll lead with facts, not fear."

For students who are struggling, she calls for "interventions and supports that are necessary to bring them up to grade level."

Homelessness and housing

"We have a crisis in our streets that is driven by homelessness issues," Drazan said. "Handing this down to municipalities, I don't think is the best approach for full responsibility. Homeless populations, by the nature of being unhoused, move between jurisdictions. It will be for support for shelter space, it will be additional investments, and it will be support for workforce that will back up the mental and behavioral health needs that we have as a state. You will see in my first budget a prioritization of that with dollars that are otherwise being directed right now to programs that are not as essential and critical."

"When I talk about affordable housing, builders, people on the private sector side, they are saying, 'I can build houses, I can

build apartments, I need local governments to work with me, I need to be able to move through the regulatory process in two years.' I've committed to reviewing rules and regulations across the board and revising, repealing, or rolling back the ones that are an impediment or a barrier."

When asked about racial disparities in housing today due to past discriminatory policies, Drazan replied, "My administration will have a zero-tolerance policy for racism of any kind by continuing to support key affordability measures like the mortgage interest deduction and first-time home buyer program."

Describing the results of Oregon's greatly increased spending on housing "underwhelming," Drazan called for incentives to accomplish public policy goals and said, "I am supportive of private entities providing resources to accomplish housing goals."

Crime and safety

Drazan wants Measure 110, which decriminalized

possession of certain recreational drugs, repealed.

Regarding the lack of addiction treatment facilities, she said the state now has the ability to cooperate with non-profit partners to make sure they have the support to keep expanding their services to meet demand.

The environment

"Oregon is already among the greenest states in the country, due in large part to our ability to access renewable hydropower and other clean power sources," Drazan said. With respect to transportation, consumers should have the option to purchase an electric vehicle. It shouldn't be a requirement, and our current energy grid cannot support a prohibition on gas- or diesel-powered vehicles. I support widening our highways by building more lanes.

"I believe we can both reduce traffic times and reduce emissions from idling engines, but this is an incomplete solution unless we address jobs. We need to ensure that people can access

work within a reasonable distance from the home that they can afford. As long as we place housing and jobs at opposite ends of the metro area, we will face congestion challenges. We must take a more holistic approach and provide economic opportuni-

ty to all communities."

Turning to land use and congestion, Drazan called the state's land use system "one of a kind," and noted it has prevented urban sprawl by letting suburbs transition into farmland, but also "extraordinarily complex," and often

"very expensive to navigate."

"The Land Conservation and Development Commission," she said, "must be nimble, more accessible for everyday Oregonians, and should not hold future development hostage in bureaucratic purgatory."

Boice is requesting an independent "fact checking" process, similar to that he asked for; a Commissioner Paasch-Court Boice debate (twice earlier this year). Unfortunately, Mr. Paasch declined both requests.

This new invitation is to Treasurer David Barnes, by Boice who stated, "At this Townhall discussion, I also want to take the opportunity to provide information as to why I'm strongly supporting the more and highly qualified Curry Citizen Douglas Baker as a 'Write-In' candidate for County Treasurer."

Curry Commissioner Boice commented, "I'm no great debater, however, put me in a room with any of these

detractors, anyone in this county, including the Sheriff. The facts are easy to present. So many things have been said in the last four years in our county that are simply, if not blatantly false. It's important to note and the records will verify, I didn't initiate any of these unfortunate and unnecessary conflicts. I just dared, on occasion to disagree while always providing the facts". Conduct related fallout and the damage caused by certain County officials, their lawsuits and related ridiculous political attempts have had tremendous negative impacts on the citizens of our County. Further, it has sadly destroyed much needed confidence and compromised capacities to get the work done. To date, some Curry Officials have refused oversight, transparency, accountability, open and honest dialogue.

Basically, the people understand that no one employed by the County can run from or avoid public scrutiny of their commentary and behavior. It is the reason we have important Curry Personnel Rules. Boice stands behind his six-year Commissioner track record unequivocally and most Curry Citizens know he has worked six days per week during that entire time vigorously defending the County against these debilitating dysfunctions.

Boice's first challenge to Treasurer Barnes was on October 18th. As of this writing, Mr. Barnes has yet to respond to Commissioner Boice. To face up to this challenge, is especially important as he was an 'appointed' Curry Treasurer. All Public Officials and elected individuals have an important professional obligation to the citizens. Mr. Barnes and Mr. Paasch both should have demonstrated good faith and immediately accepted my invitations. Boice added, "I hope that Treasurer Barnes will take responsibility and respond to this request. It is time for him to be accountable for his decisions and conduct, 2019 to the present. Likewise, I am willing and continue to submit my record and conduct in and with full transparency"

As such, Court Boice is proposing the following: the Fact Checker process would be comprised of three volunteers, pre-agreed by both and participating parties. Then over a thirty-day period, they would do a thorough analysis of public records and other relevant research. They would assess and determine who is guilty, if any of false statements, legal questions, misinformation, or disinformation. Legitimate evaluations of debate statements might well lead to discussions regarding who is slandering and who has been slandered. Other important topics such as budget positions, governing philosophies, ethics, spending decisions, complaints, job description interpretations, public service accomplishments, all could and should be open and above-board subjects of debate. Each can communicate their detailed Public Policy Records through a respectful question and answer period including timed comments. Following an open discussion, the summary should assist the citizens determining for themselves who is honoring, guarding, and presenting truth.

Boice concluded, "I believe the objective should be straight forward. The people need to be informed. They desire and deserve the facts. Certainly, a fundamental path to brighter days for all of us and our Curry families. Such a discussion should, ultimately, help heal and effect long-term and positive working relationships in our County Government. Further, such an opportunity for citizens to determine where the facts lie could reset the foundation and process of restoring the public trust for the greater benefit of our people and our quality of life, now and in the future".

Our local post office does not answer the phone. When I called our county and the state election offices, I got the answer "I'll pass your question along." I attempted to get the local paper interested and I sent an email to the Oregonian.

Clarity is needed. Communication to the voters of Oregon is needed.

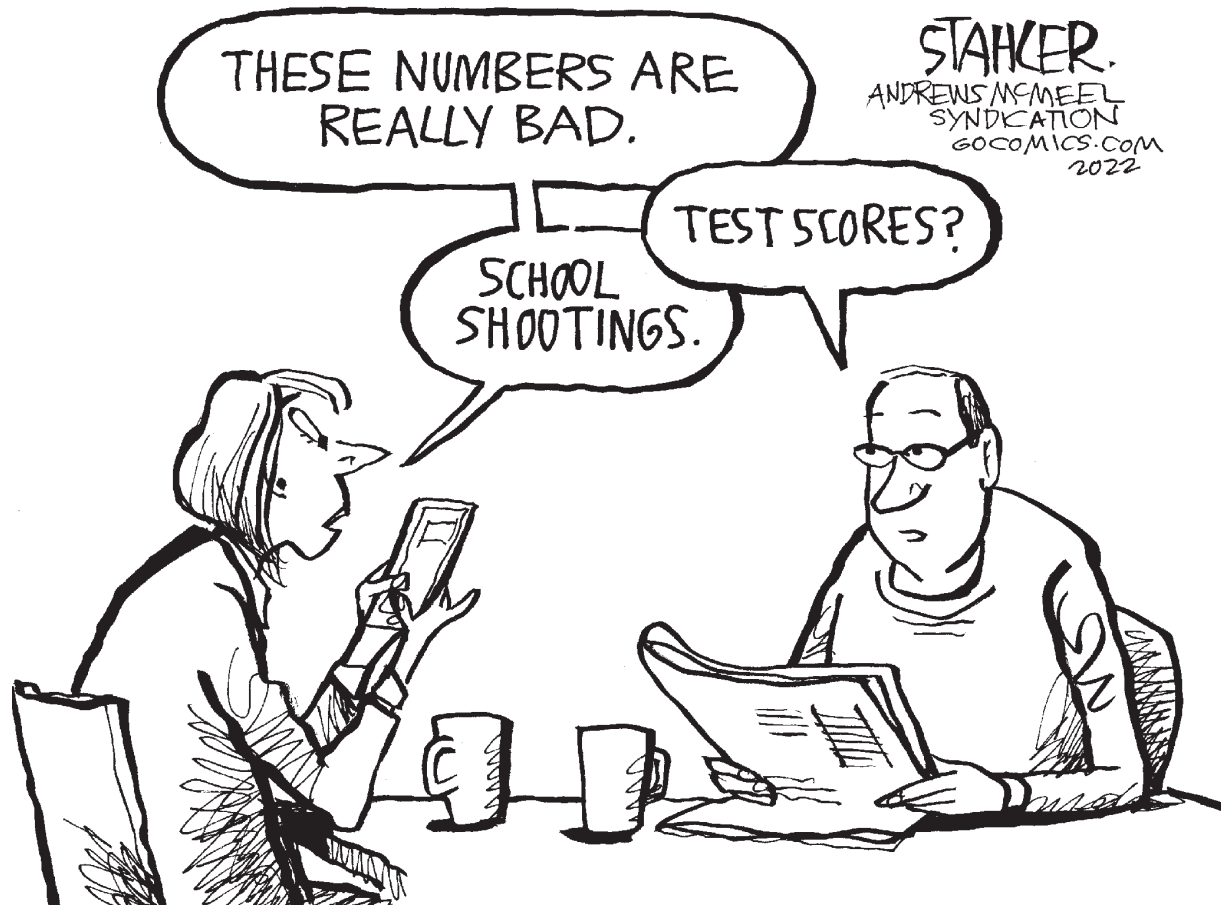

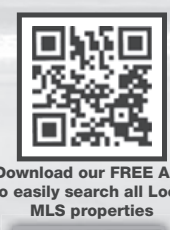

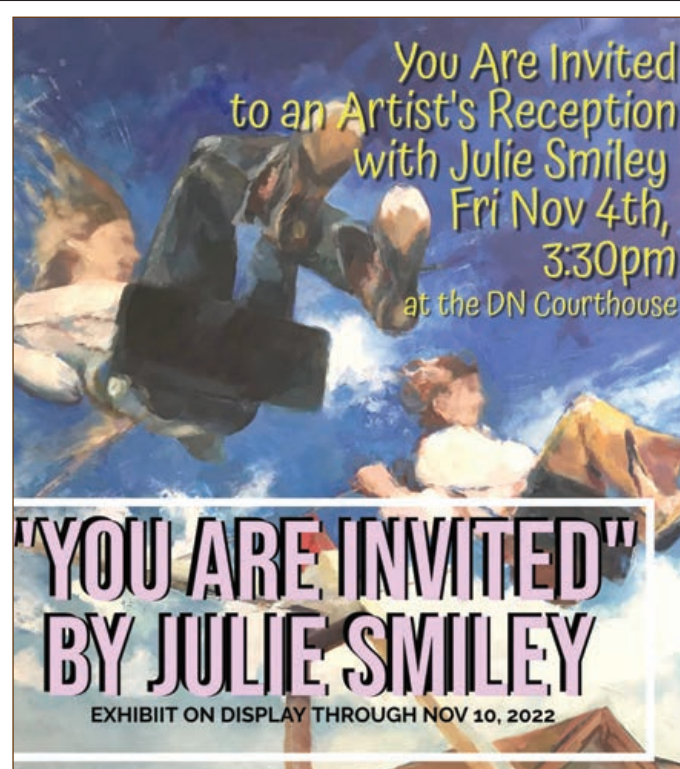

Tax statements have been mailed

Curry County Assessor and Tax Collector, Jim Kolen, reports that his office has prepared the 2022-23 tax roll and property tax statements will be mailed to property owners.

First trimester property tax payments are due no later than Tuesday, November 15. Tax payments may be made by mail or in person at the Assessor/Tax Collector's office in the Curry Office Annex Building in Gold Beach. Other payment options include payments by telephone or online payments. The tax office will be open for payments 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday - Friday.

"Most property owners will see a three percent overall increase in their Maximum Assessed Value (MAV)," explained Assessor Jim Kolen. "However, Oregon law dictates that property owners will pay property tax on their MAV or their Real Market Value (RMV) whichever is less," he added. Kolen reminds owners that the 3% limitation in the Oregon Constitution is on the Maximum Assessed Value of a property not the amount of

property taxes.

The RMV noted on the tax statement is the assessor's estimate of what property would have sold for on January 1, and is based upon sales that occurred primarily in 2021.

Real Market Values are increasing throughout most of the county. This year the Median RMV of single-family homes countywide is \$400,750 as compared to last year's median value of \$329,150. The 2022-23 median home values by city are \$281,620 in Port Orford, \$359,420 in Gold Beach and \$432,350 in Brookings. The total RMV of the entire county reached approximately 5.86 billion dollars this year as compared to \$4.76 billion in 2021-22.

Taxing districts in Curry County have levied almost \$30.94 million in property taxes for 2022-23. The county assesses, collects and distributes the property tax for the districts and receives approximately \$2.1 million or 6.9% of the total collected. Of the rest of the total levied property tax approximately 55% goes to Schools, 15%

to Cities, 5.6% Libraries, 5% Health District and the rest is for Rural Fire Protection, Ports, Cemeteries etc.

Property owners are encouraged to review their tax statements carefully and if they have questions or have not received their tax statement by November 1st, call Kolen's office at (541)247-3305 or (866)298-0307. Valuation questions should be directed to (541)247-3294 or 800-242-7601.

Kolen's office continues to contract with Jackson County to process mailed payments at a cost savings to Curry. This is why the return envelope mailed with the tax statement has a Medford, Oregon return address.

Property owners making payments by credit card will call the telephone tax payment service at 844-399-5263 and must include their property's account number which is shown on the upper right-hand corner of the tax statement. The account number begins with a letter (R, M, P, U) followed by five digits. Please enter only the five digits when following the pay by phone option.
