





Knowledge and responsibility: advancing knowledge for a better society

The Invernizzi Foundation and Bocconi together for innovation and social progress

The bond between Bocconi University and the Romeo and Enrica Invernizzi Foundation goes back a long time. Established over twenty years ago and renewed every year through substantial philanthropic donations in support of generations of researchers, it has become even stronger by virtue of the Foundation's decision to fund two important new projects in 2015.

ICRIOS - The Invernizzi Center for Research on Innovation, Organization, Strategy and Entrepreneurship

The permanent naming of a research center is a tangible sign of alliance. Presided over by Franco Malerba and directed by Arnaldo Camuffo – Full Professors, respectively, of Industrial Economics and of Business Organization at the Department of Management and Technology – ICRIOS is now the largest European center for research in management, bringing together more than 50 academics, both Alumni and members of other leading national and international research institutions. With the support of the Invernizzi Foundation, the Center can fulfill its role as an engine of ideas with renewed vigor studying methods and experimentation in the governance and management of complex realities, understanding and improving the functioning of companies and institutions and contributing to solving everyday economic and social problems.

LEAP - Laboratory for Effective Anti-poverty Policies

The future of modern societies is born in universities, which are called on to face the big problems of contemporary reality: problems such as poverty, sustainable development, access to resources, and the equitable distribution of wealth. Aware of its responsibility as an institution and in the belief that research plays a key role in fostering economic and social development, in 2011 Bocconi established an endowed Chair in Development Economics. The Chair was created with the support of the Invernizzi Foundation and was awarded to Eliana La Ferrara. In 2015, with vet another significant gift, this shared commitment led to the creation of LEAP - Laboratory for Effective Anti-poverty Policies guided by La Ferrara herself and Lucia Corno as executive director. Through research and rigorous analysis of data, LEAP is committed to studying the origins of poverty, and identifying strategies and instruments that governments, international organizations, non-governmental organizations and companies can use to fight it.

The Laboratory's scientific agenda will put new knowledge in the service of many institutions and contribute to identifying effective public policies to ensure the betterment of society in many countries.

JPMorgan Chase Foundation promoting a more efficient labor market

JPMorgan Chase Foundation and Bocconi University have launched the three-year research program "Employment, Skills and Productivity in Italy", part of the Foundation's broader "New Skills at Work" program to provide evidence on how business and academia can work together to produce impact on everyday life. The initiative will analyze the dynamics and changes in the Italian labor market and offer concrete suggestions to bring labor policies closer to reality, companies closer to workers, demand closer to supply – all to increase employment. The project is coordinated by Fabiano Schivardi and Antonella Trigari of IGIER, and will provide a set of guidelines to support public and private efforts to confront the difficulties of the labor market, increase levels of skills, and identify opportunities for overall economic growth.





Citi Foundation rewards youth entrepreneurship

Through its partnership with Bocconi University to create Bocconi Start-up Day, Citi Foundation has contributed and will continue to contribute to identifying, developing and rewarding the most promising Italian startups. This in the understanding that new enterprises with a high rate of innovation can represent the cornerstone of development in the advanced economies and a driver for employment growth. The first edition of the initiative – in collaboration with Speed MI Up, SDA Bocconi, the Bocconi Alumni Association, Economia & Management and the media partnership of Corriere Innovazione – has involved more than 250 participants, providing 35 teams with the opportunity to participate in the marketplace and meet potential investors. The winners in the three different categories were awarded a cash prize and the chance to attend SDA executive courses.

LVMH gives value to creativity and excellence

The world's leading luxury goods group LVMH Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton and Bocconi University have signed a five-year agreement instituting the LVMH Associate Professorship in Fashion and Luxury Management, awarded to Emanuela Prandelli, Associate Professor of Management in the Department of Management and Technology. The inaugural lecture of the professorship opened the first edition of the LVMH Days, held alongside two other events reserved for Bocconi and SDA students: the presentation of the LVMH Challenge (with guest company Loro Piana) and the LVMH Recruiting Date. The partnership will ensure that Bocconi's contribution to studies in luxury management can grow, along with the training and placement opportunities for students, and marks LVMH's commitment and determination to enhance the values of creativity and excellence that constitute the strength of its brands.





A new investment culture with Antin Infrastructure Partners

The EU estimates that by 2020 there will be an infrastructure gap in Europe amounting to two trillion euros. It is imperative, therefore, to disseminate a richer culture of investment in infrastructures. To this end, Antin Infrastructure Partners, one of Europe's leading infrastructure investment funds, has decided to support Bocconi in educating young people on this matter and on the question of structured finance. In funding the course "Structured and Project Finance", taught in the 2015-2016 academic year by Stefano Gatti, Professor of Practice in the Department of Finance and director of the full-time MBA at SDA Bocconi School of Management, Antin has shown its commitment to education as the basis not only for the economic prospects of Bocconi students, but also for their cultural development.



Diego Dessi - 2015 Alumni Senior Scholarship Recipient




In memory of Matteo Rubino

Matteo Rubino, born in 1987, was a proud and dedicated Bocconi Alumnus who died suddenly in January 2015. To remember him, a group of friends and fellow Alumni decided to launch a fundraising effort to support the undergraduate Partial Scholarship program. Thanks to generous donations, also from relatives and non-Alumni, an important milestone was reached in just a few months. The funds contributed made it possible to name a partial scholarship after Matteo, aiding a Bocconi student for the entire three-year program. For him the contribution is indeed important: "A scholarship is a unique opportunity, a launching pad that enables young people who have encountered obstacles to follow their dreams."

Young people ask themselves about the Europe to come at the "Europeans" gatherings

Today it is crucial to question the future of Europe. In order to overcome the crisis of identity and shared values that Europe is experiencing and to build a stronger and more solid Union, contributions around issues related to culture, knowledge, education, communication are needed. With this in mind, in 2015, after the positive experience of the Bocconi-Boroli Lectures, the Achille and Giulia Boroli Foundation and Bocconi University launched "Europeans -Bocconi-Boroli Days on Europe in memory of Achille Boroli". The project aims to raise young people's awareness on the European Union, strengthen the academic debate and bring the substance of that debate to the attention of the general public. Consisting of a series of twice-yearly events over a three-year span, the Europeans project presents itself as an occasion for encounters to discuss, compare ideas and analyze issues and proposals for a Europe that will be closer to its citizens and instill a new confidence in the common political and cultural agenda.







Naming a room in the Bocconi 12 Residence Hall

Gianni Zoppas and Alberto Minali attended the University and stayed in the dorm at via Bocconi 12 a few years apart from each other, the former in the late 1970s, the latter in the mid-80s. It was their wonderful memories of those years that led them each to name a room in the dorm, a gesture to honor their university experience and at the same time show the strength of their ties with Bocconi to today's students.

"I really got a lot from living at the Bocconi residence. It was a place of multicultural aggregation ahead of its time, in an era when there was no international openness like today", says Gianni Zoppas, General Manager of Marcolin. "I think it's a duty to give back part of what one has had. I believe very much in the initiatives the University

is pursuing in the field of social mobility and think they will be very successful."

A similar story is that of Alberto Minali, General Manager and Group Chief Financial Officer of Assicurazioni Generali, who walked these halls between 1984 and 1989. "I come from a humble family; I was able to study at Bocconi precisely because of the housing waiver I received to live in the dorm", he says, pointing out another aspect that made life within those walls special: "The fact that it's a community able to stimulate exchange and wholesome competition, but with no shortage of mutual aid and team spirit". An experience that shaped him and that "I would like my children to be able to have one day, too."


The Donor Event

Tax advantages

According to Italian law, the University is sustained in part through the contributions of private individuals and corporations and the Italian tax system extends tax benefits to contributors who make donations to it.

Italian Taxpayers

Individuals:

Contributions and donations made to Bocconi University by individuals can be deducted in full from their gross income (Tax Form 730 or UNICO) according to art. 10 comma 1 letter I-quater of DPR 917/1986 (TUIR).

Corporations:

Contributions and donations are deductible for an amount not exceeding 2% of the company's declared taxable income according to art.100, comma 2, letter a) of DPR 917/1986 - RM of 17 October 2008, n. 386/E.

Contributions and donations from businesses to universities specifically in support of research are fully deductible from their taxable income according to art. 1, comma 353 of Legge Finanziaria 2006.

Residents of other European Countries

Bocconi's membership in the Transnational Giving Europe network may allow tax benefits for residents of 17 European countries.

UK Taxpayers

Charitable contributions of £250+ to the University from UK taxpayers may be made through the Charities Aid Foundation and may be eligible for UK tax advantages and Gift Aid.

US Taxpayers

Charitable contributions to the University may be made through the US non-profit corporation Friends of Bocconi University, Inc. and may be eligible for US tax advantages.
