The USC Schaeffer Center's distinguished faculty includes renowned health economists, a Nobel laureate in economics, and experts in global health policy, pharmacoeconomics, and health care management. It is jointly housed in the USC Price School of Public Policy and USC School of Pharmacy.

GLOBAL IMPLICATIONS

Health spending policies will influence national and global economies for decades to come. By convening the highestcaliber scholars in bold, innovative thinking, the USC Schaeffer Center reaches beyond academia to create new directions in policy discussions worldwide.
