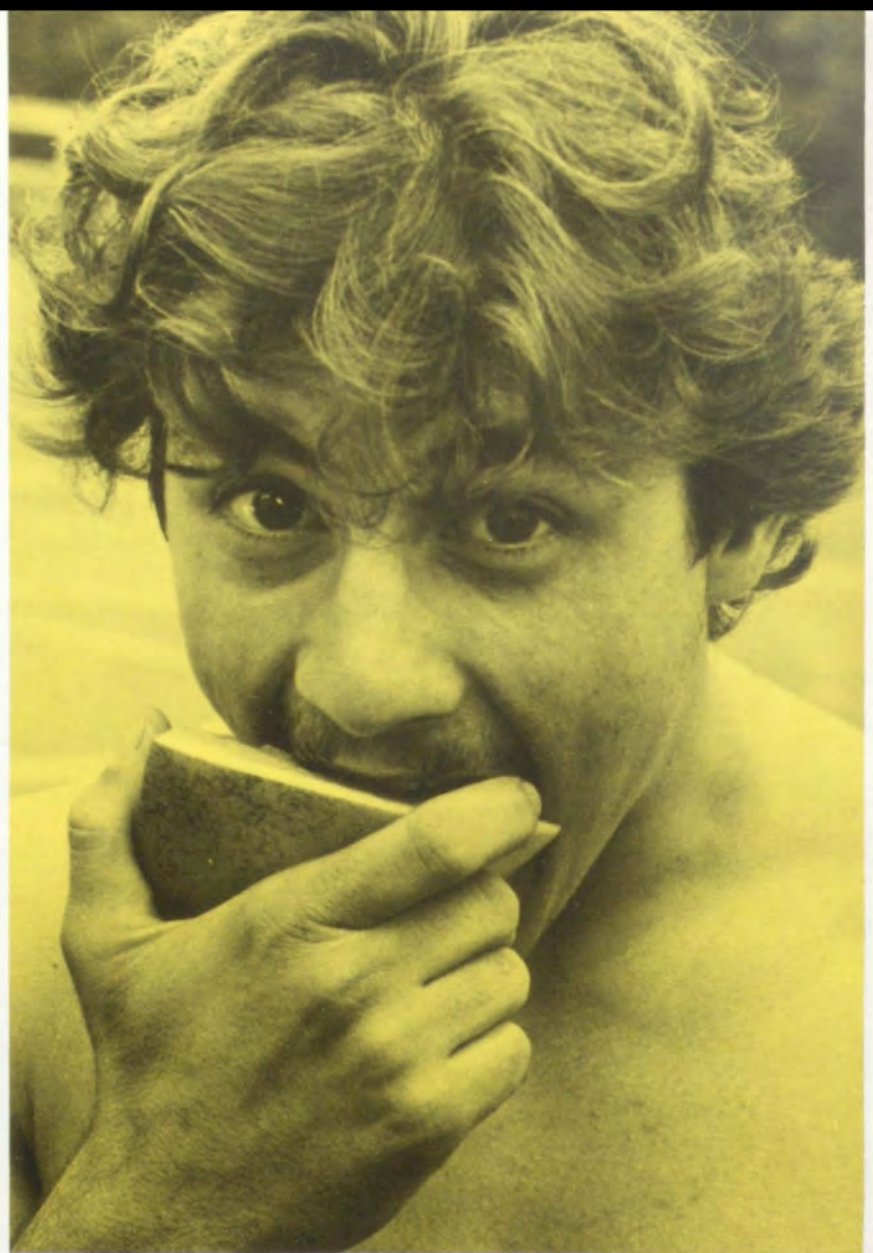

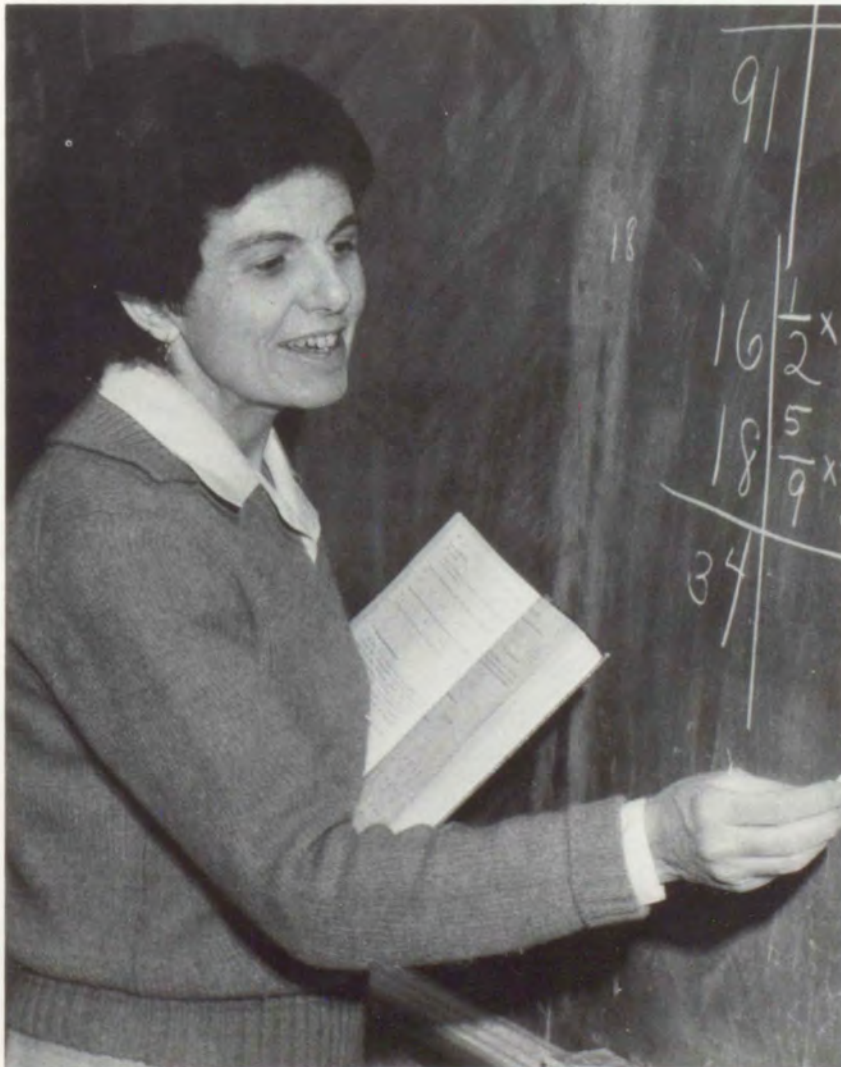

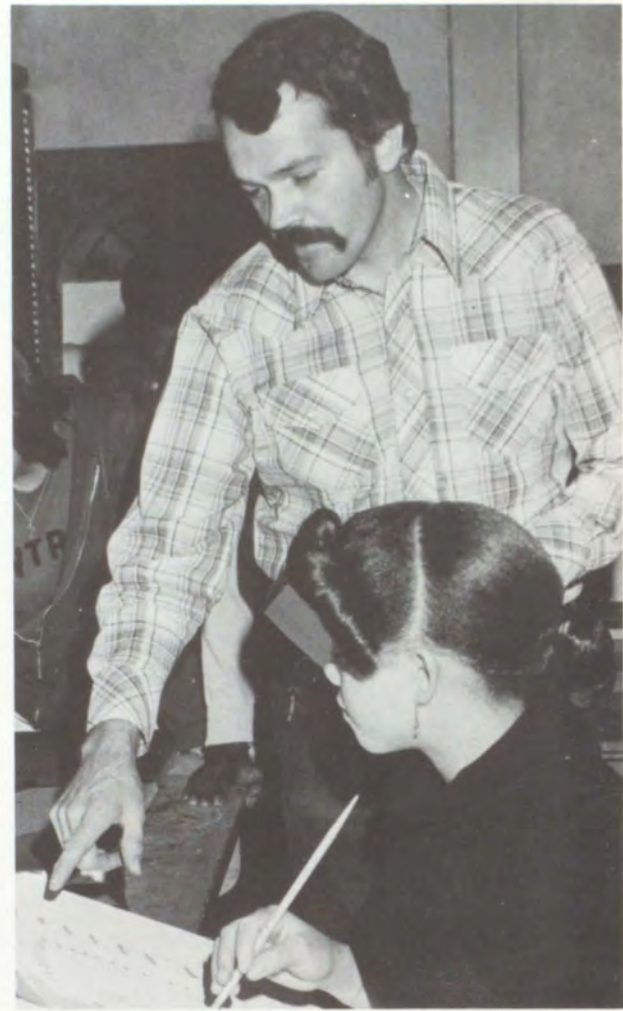

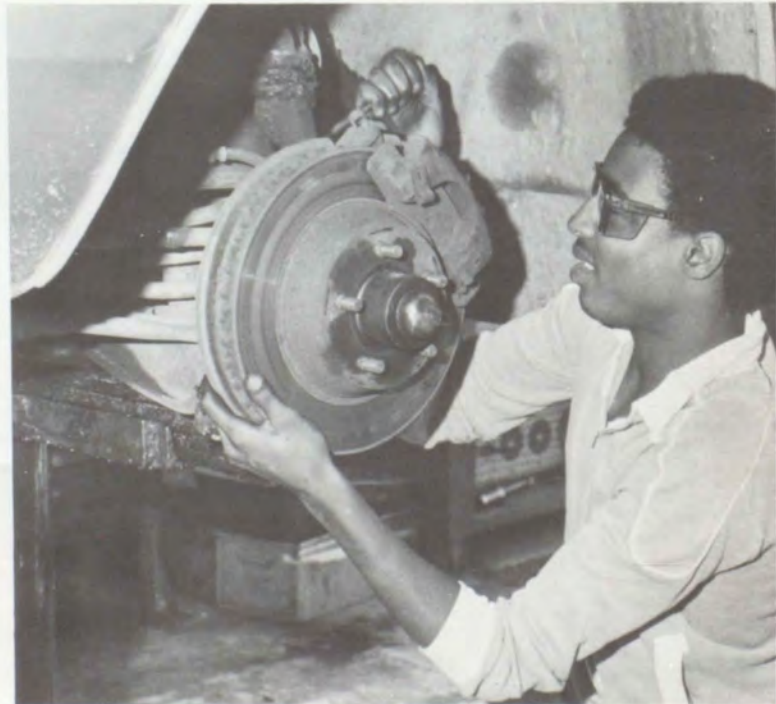

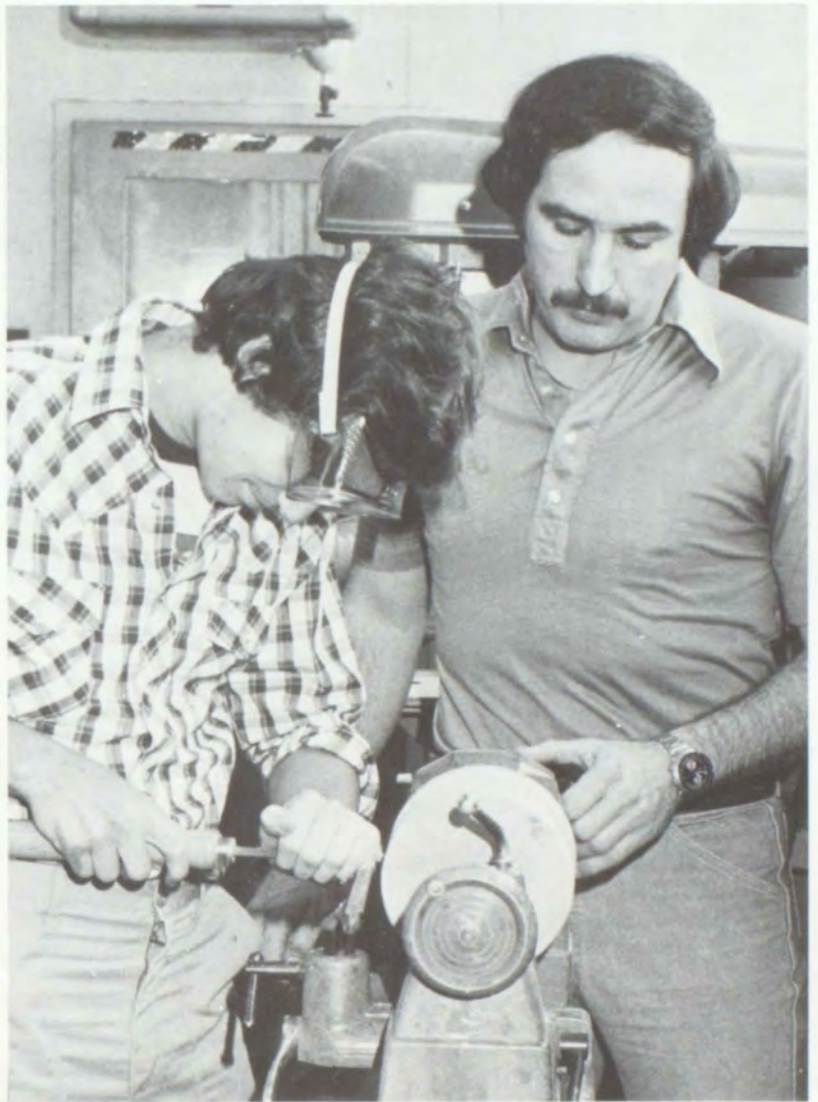

The spring of '79 began a rebuilding year for Central. After winning the state championship the year before, the Hilltoppers were only able to win eight out of twenty games.

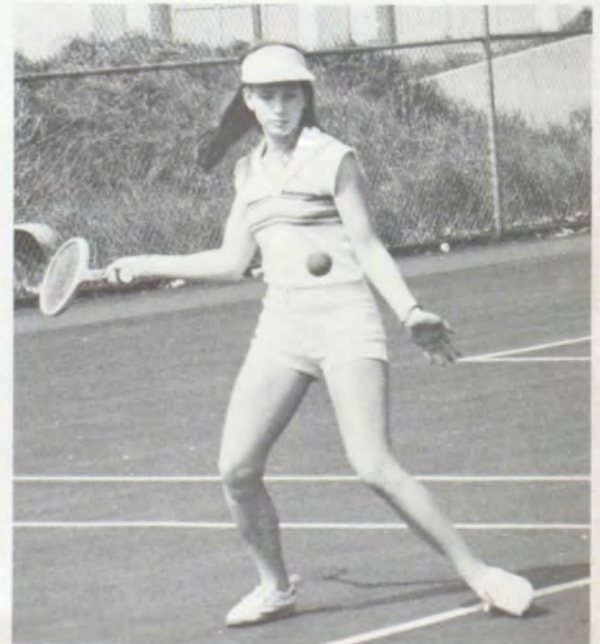

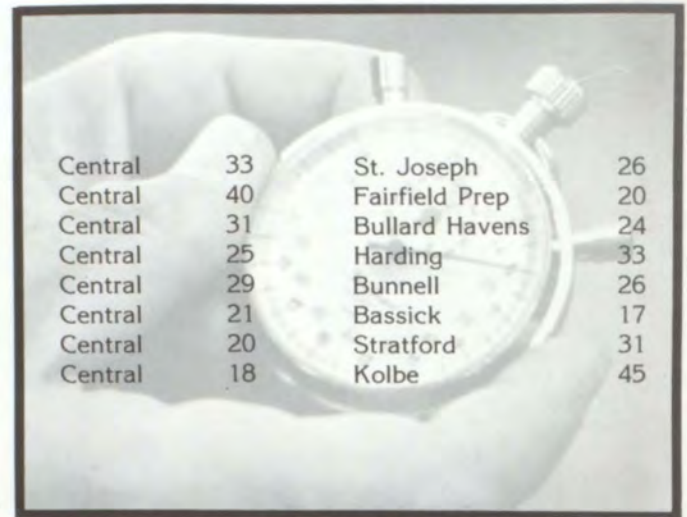

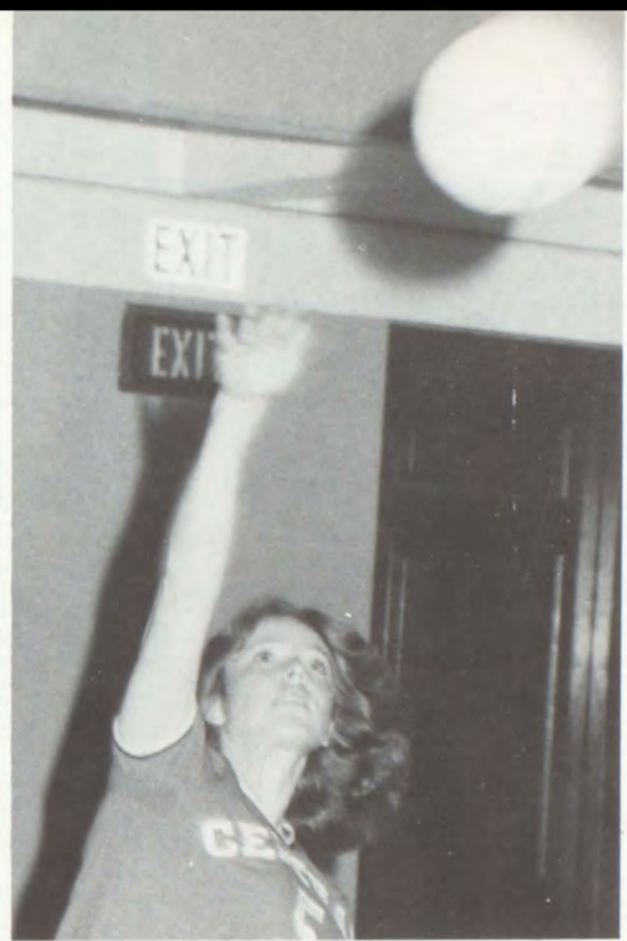

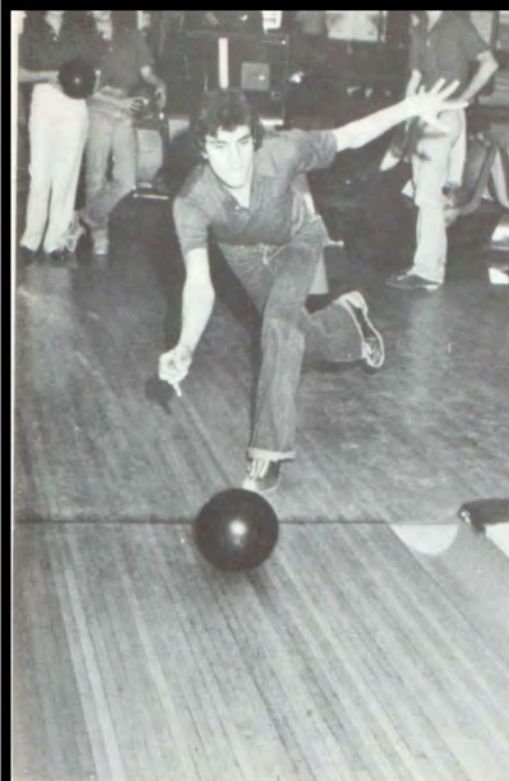

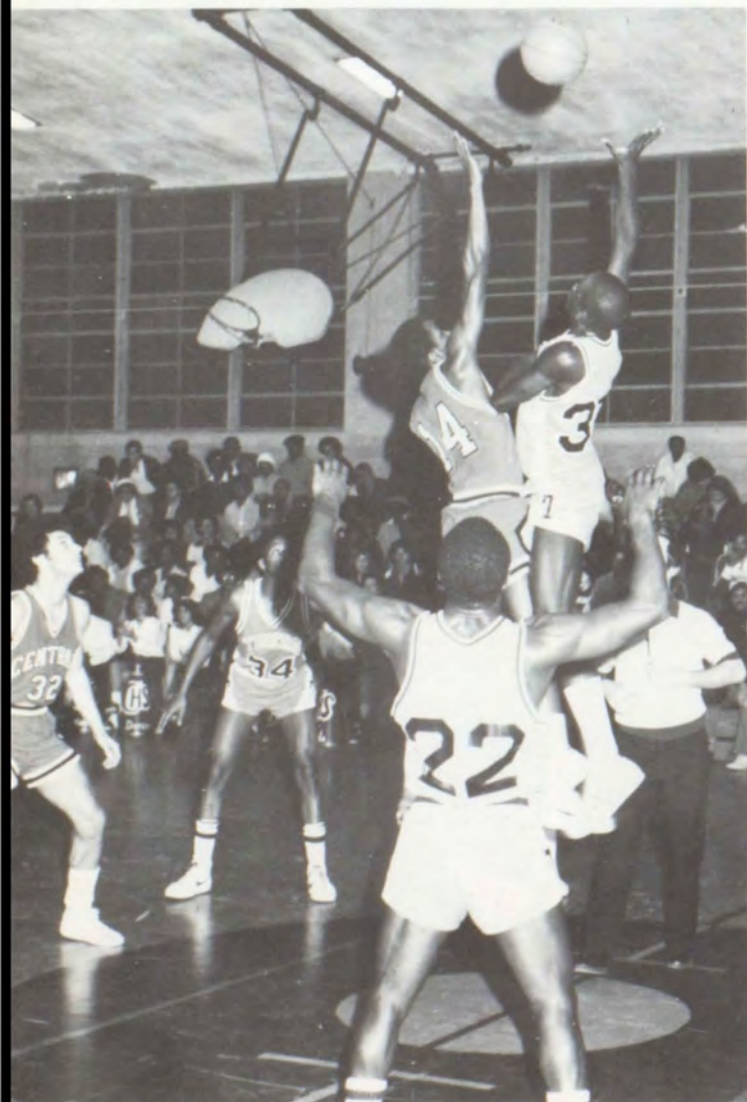

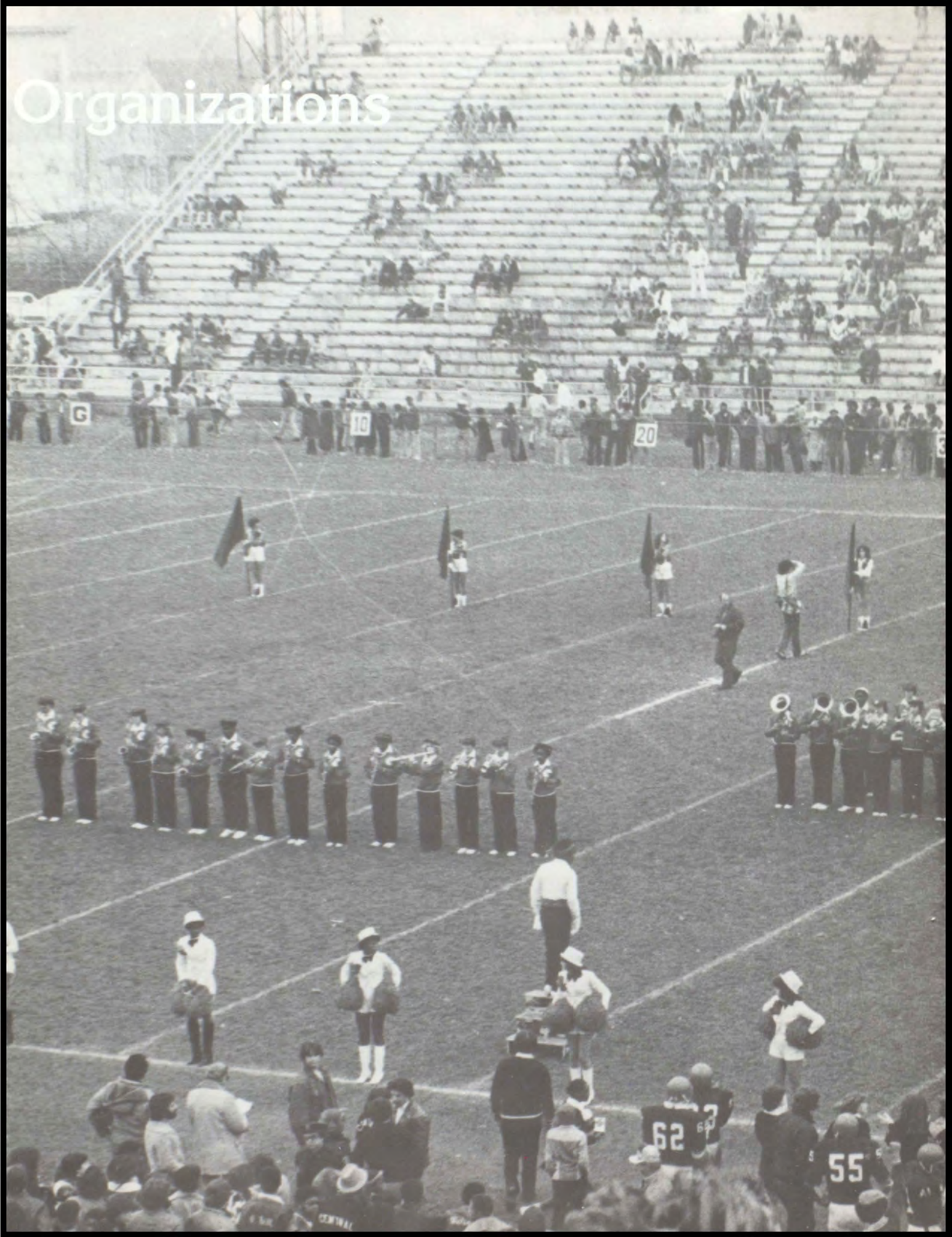

D.A.R. awards were won by Michelle Rivelli and Leticia Sierra.

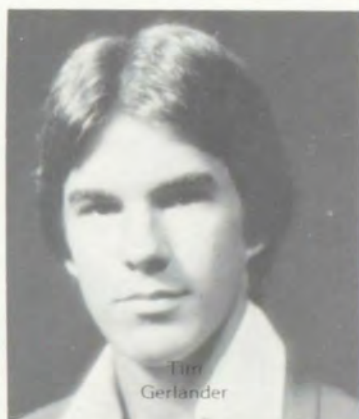
