#### CONSTRUCTION:

The Board was advised by Mr. Lewis that in all of the items submitted and recommended to the Board where payment is to be made from the proceeds of the following bond issues:

that full regard was given to the provisions of the Acts of each of the following Laws and the amendments thereto pertaining to the above construction loans:

Chapter 885 of the Acts of 1961, and as amended in 1962 and 1965, Chapter 128 of the Acts of 1962, and as amended in 1963, 1964 and 1965, Chapter 903 of the Acts of 1963, and as amended in 1965, 1966 and 1967, Chapter 159 of the Acts of 1964, and as amended in 1965, 1966, 1967 and 1968, Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965, and as amended in 1966, 1967, 1968, 1969 and 1970, Chapter 504 of the Acts of 1966, and as amended in 1967, 1968, 1969 and 1970, Chapter 759 of the Acts of 1967, and as amended in 1968, 1969, 1970 and 1971, Chapter 435 of the Acts of 1968, and as amended in 1968, 1969, 1970 and 1971, Chapter 409 of the Acts of 1969, and as amended in 1970 and 1971, Chapter 101 of the Acts of 1970, Chapter 425 of the Acts of 1971, and as amended in 1972, Chapter 179 of the Acts of 1971, and as amended in 1972,

the significant section in point reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That no department, board, commission, agency or institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provisions of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Lewis that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond Issue Funds were provided. The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvements in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal grant."

Mr. Lewis also informed the Board of the provisions of Section 9 of Chapter 435 of the Acts of 1968 as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That where Federal funds may be available to help accomplish any specific projects in this Act, the using department or agency shall be obligated to seek the allocation of such Federal funds to apply to the cost of the particular project. In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the using department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administrative procedures to obtain such Federal funds, and the reason, if any, why the Federal funds were not obtained. Availability of Federal funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects of theDepartment of Forests and Parks. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in this Act if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or development contemplated for the State park or recreation area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas as adopted by the Department of Forests and Parks."

### I. ITEMS SUBMITTED ON THE AGENDA OF THE SECRETARY, BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS:

#### COMMISSION ON SUBMERGED LANDS:

<u>1-</u> The Board formally denied the issuance of the Wetlands License in connection with a request by M's Mildred F. Abel, Box 265, Hickory Point Road, Pasadena, Maryland, Case No. 73-81, for an application for a permit to fill two acres of marshland at Hickory Point, on the Magothy River, Anne Arundel County.

This license was denied upon the recommendation of the Wetlands Hearing Officer who was in agreement with the Department of Natural Resources that ecologically valuable state marshland will be irretrievably destroyed, and filling ecologically valuable state wetlands for the disposal of spoil material and debris is deemed an unreasonable use and destruction of such areas. This recommendation was made pursuant to the evidence presented at Wetlands Hearing of October 3, 1972.

<u>2-</u> The Board confirmed its prior approval in connection with the following applications for U. S. Army Corps of Engineers permits for projects involving dredging and filling in the navigable waters of Maryland under Chapter 241 of the Acts of 1970:

The Board approved a request by the Data Processing Division of the State Comptroller's Office for permission to write-off the following accounts receivable as uncollectible:

The Board was advised by the Data Processing Division that these outstanding accounts receivable are made up of an accumulation of charges to various agencies for services rendered by the Data Processing Division, consists of interagency transactions only, and were not paid because of insufficient funding. This request was a follow-up to a recommendation made by the Legislative Auditor in an audit of the Data Processing Division, Comptroller's Office.

### DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES:

The Board approved the Monthly Progress Report of the Construction Division of the Department of General Services, covering the month ending February 28, 1973.

### DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE:

The Board approved the request of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for permission to charge-off as uncollectible the following list of accounts:

Voucher Nos. 6324,6325, 6326, 6327, 6328, 6329, 6330, 6331, 6332, in the aggregate amount of \$54,799.51, for the month of January, 1973.

# DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL: (Continued)

The Secretary of Porconnel felt that in order to insure the return of the identification cards upon separation of the employee from State service and to safeguard against loss, penalties for the failure to return or loss of the card should be assessed. He, therefore, recommended that a penalty of \$5.00 attached to any failure to return or loss, and intend to set out the penalty in the instructions to the agencies involved.

After some discussion, the Board directed that a penalty of \$5.00 be imposed on the employee for the loss of an identification card, but for the failure to return the card to his employer upon separation from the State, the employee's last pay check shall be withheld until he returns his identification card. This provision shall be a part of the instructions to the agencies involved in the Positive Identification Program for State employees.

# EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ADMINISTRATION:

<u>1-</u> The Board approved a request by the Employment Security Administration for permission to write-off \$725,689.59 in employer accounts receivable for the period January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1969, which are uncollectible and have been recommended to be written off the records of the Administration by the State Law Department.

At the January, 1972 meeting, the Board recommended that these debts be turned over to a collection unit that had been working with the State Department of Education and the Department of Budget and Fiscal Procurement; subsequently this assignment was determined by the collection unit to be too large for them to handle properly.

<u>2-</u> The Board approved a request by the Employment Security Administration for permission to write-off a schedule of accounts receivable totaling \$56,217.87 for the quarter ending December 31, 1972, from overpaid unemployment insurance claimants that meet approved standards to be considered uncollectible.

The Board understands that no collection has been made in five years in spite of all efforts to collect, and that no wages in Maryland employment have been reported for the individuals involved for at least three years. The Board further understands that the wage records continue to be flagged and if ever a claim should be filed, the case will be reactivated and claim credits used to effect collection at that time.

# FRIENDSHIP INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT LOAN OF 1967:

The Board approved four requests for reimbursement by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City in the total amount of \$180,119.08. These amounts represent reimbrusement due Baltimore City under the terms and conditions of Chapter 679, Acts of 1967, and are within the realignment of funds approved by the Secretary of State Planning.

## DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES:

<u>1-</u> The Board considered a request by the Department of Natural Resources for permission to grant the Potomac Edison Company a right-of-way for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, operating and maintaining an overhead or underground electric system including all necessary poles, anchors, wires, trenches, conduits, cables and other facilities under, over and upon the property owned by the Department of Natural Resources in Gross #21 District of Allegany County, State of Maryland

The Board noted that no consideration is involved in this Right-of-Way Agreement, as the lines would serve the bath house and comfort stations at Rocky Gap State Park, Cumberland, Maryland.

After some discussion, the Board agreed to approve this item with the stipulation that this Right-of-Way Agreement, for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, operating and maintaining an overhead or underground electric system, serve only the bath house and comfort stations at Rocky Gap State Park.

2- The Board approved a request by the Department of Natural Resources for the approval of a Deed between the Board of Public Works, for and on behalf of the Department of Natural Resources, and the Board of County Commissioners of Garrett County transferring the following parcels of land to Garrett County to improve New Germany Road:

Parcel One -- A strip of land lying on either side of center line relocation as per the construction plans by the Garrett County Roads Department containing 9.2 acres of land plus slope easements for the New Germany Road, the easement to terminate automatically upon completion of the construction of the road.

Parcel Two -- A strip of land lying on either side of centerline relocation of the Big Run Road as per the construction plans by Garrett County Roads Department containing 0.80 acres plus easement for cut and fill slopes, the easement to terminate automatically upon completion of the construction of the road.

The Board was advised by the Department of Natural Resources that there will be no monetary consideration for the transfer of this property as the road is being taken to upgrade the New Germany Road.

<u>3-</u> The Board approved a request by the Department of Natural Resources for approval of a Deed transferring 2.538 acres of land in Allegany County from the Department of Natural Resources to the State Highway Administration for the sum of \$132.00. This property is for the relocation of U. S. Route 40 - Polish Mountain, Easterly to 15 Mile Creek, Contract A-464-5-620, Item No. 48410, known as the U. S. 40 Project, east slope of Polish Mountain. The appraised price of this land was \$40.00 per acre.

## DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL:

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The Board considered a request by the Secretary of Personnel for permission to provide for a penalty in connection with the process of establishing a Positive Identification Program for State employees by the Department of Personnel.

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## MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION:

The Beard approved a request by the Department of Transportation for the approval and execution of a Deed to Bankers Trust Company, New York, Trustee, and the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, Baltimore, Maryland, covering the conveyance of two (2) parcels of land totaling 6.869 acres which are a portion of the property of the Maryland Port Administration's Hawkins Point Facility. The sale of the two parcels to the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company was based on a price of \$19,794.98 per acre, or a total consideration of \$135,971.72.

The two parcels of land are part of a 137.06 acre tract purchased in 1958 by the Maryland Port Authority from the General Services Administration of the United States at a price of approximately \$11,017.00 per acre and are located adjacent to the north side of a 15.6 acre tract to be made available to the State Roads Commission for the use as a right-of-way for construction of the west approaches to the Baltimore Harbor Outer Crossing (between Hawkins Point and Sollers Point).

The two parcels are to be used by the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company as a right-of-way for construction of an electric transmission line connecting to the Calvert Cliffs generating plant. Arrangements have been made by the Gas and Electric Company for the construction of a submarine cable across the Patapsco River between Hawkins Point and Sollers Point and negotiations have just been concluded for acquisition of the required right-of-way for construction of the transmission main across Sollers Point into the Dundalk area of Baltimore County.

Because a portion of the property proposed for sale to the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, plus a portion of the right-of-way to be acquired by the State Highway Administration for the west approach to the Outer Harbor Crossing had, by earlier agreement, been leased by the Port Authority to the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, who had then subleased to Eastalco Aluminum Company, who, in turn, had subleased all but 19.91 acres, which they retained, to the Maryland Port Authority, it was necessary concurrently with this sale to modify the previous leases in order to satisfy the leasehold interests. The required modifications have been accomplished and are approved as follows:

a. "Modification of Lease and Agreement" between the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad and the Maryland Transportation Authority consented to by Eastalco Aluminum Company, which reduces the area in the original lease by the acreage to be transferred to the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company.

b. "Amendment to Sub-sublease and Agreement" between Eastalco and Maryland Transportation Authority, consented to by Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, which reduces from the area which they retained in the original sub-sublease that acreage to be transferred to the State Highway Administration and to the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company and substitutes therefore a new area of equal size.

## MASS TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION:

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The Board approved a recommendation by the Department of Transportation for the approval of the following two (2) easements granting the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company the right to construct, operate and maintain electric power poles and lines across property of the Mass Transit Administration of the Department of Transportation in connection with the installation of outdoor lighting requested by the Administration.

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### MASS TRANSIT ADMUNSTRATION:

(a) Easement covering the installation of outdoor lighting at the Mass Transit Administration's bus garage, located at Kirk and Bonaparte Avenues, Baltimore City.

(b) Easement covering the installation of outdoor lighting at the Oldham-Ponca Street and Eastern Avenue bus garage, Baltimore City.

The Board was advised by the Department of Transportation that the light pole locations are generally along the perimeter of the bus garages and adjacent to the buildings. The installation of outdoor lighting is being accomplished to aid security officers in providing better night time surveillance, to afford safer conditions for the night time switching of fare boxes, to improve conditions for the cleaning, and fueling of vehicles during the hours of darkness and to serve as a general deterrent to crime in the vicinity. Since the easements required by the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, in order to provide a service requested by the Mass Transit Administration, there is no consideration involved.

## OUTDOOR RECREATION LAND LOAN OF 1968:

<u>1-</u> The Board approved a request submitted by the Department of Natural Resources to cancel an encumbrance to Montgomery County in the amount of <u>\$42.88</u> from the Outdoor Recreation Land of 1968. This amount represents an underrun on Program assistance committed by the Board on May 23, 1969 for the following project:

68-16-1 Little Seneca Stream Valley Park Acquisition #1 Montgomery County

The requested cancellation of encumbrance is to be issued on the following item:

139-2 C.F.C. Corporation - \$42.88

The Department of Natural Resources has advised the Board that reimbursement has been made on this property and as the purchase price was less than anticipated, the above amount may now be returned to the unobligated balance of the Outdoor Recreation Land Loan of 1968.

2- The Board approved a request submitted by the Department of Natural Resources to cancel an encumbrance to Montgomery County in the amount of <u>\$271.14</u> from the Outdoor Recreation Land Loan of 1968. This amount represents Program assistance committed by the Board on May 23, 1969 for the following project:

68-16-4 Great Seneca Extension Park Acquisition #1 Montgomery County

The requested cancellation of encumbrance is to be issued on the following item:

142-2 Rosa Snowden - \$271.14

The Department of Natural Resources has advised the Board that reimbursement has been made on this property and as the purchase price was less than anticipated, the above amount may now be returned to the unobligated balance of the Outdoor Recreation Land Loan of 1968.

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<u>1-</u> The Board approved a request submitted by the Department of Natural Resources for the authorization by the department to average supporting appraisals on Program Open Space projects submitted for commitment of funds or reimbursement of funds when the total cost of the land is greater than the average of the supporting appraisals.

The Department of Natural Resources believes that the averaging of appraisals prior to each Board meeting would reduce the frequent modification of the printed Program Open Space Agenda.

<u>2-</u> The Board approved a request submitted by the Department of Natural Resources for the adoption of a Resolution required by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development authorizing the Execution of Contract for grant for the <u>Anna B</u>. Smith property to be known as Rosaryville State Park.

The Department of Natural Resources advised the Board that an Open Space application was submitted by the State of Maryland, Department of Natural' besources on March 30, 1971, and approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Washington Area office on April 11, 1972 for \$1,055,500.00.

This resolution gives Mr. James B. Coulter, Secretary, Department of Natural Resources the authority to execute the contract for grant to acquire the Rosaryville State Park property consisting of 498 <u>+</u> acres and be partially reimbursed by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development for acquisition expenses.

<u>3-</u> The Board approved a request submitted by the Department of Natural Resources for permission to cancel a commitment to Hagerstown, Maryland of <u>\$93,927.50</u> from the Outdoor Recreation Land Loan of 1969. This amount represents an over commitment created through a typographical error on the March 7, 1973 Program Open Space Agenda - Supplement A, Page 22, Item 22.

POS 445-21-8 Hagerstown Municipal Swimming Pool Development #2 Washington County

The Department of Natural Resources has advised the Board that this project is receiving a 50% Federal Grant and is therefore only eligible for 25% Program Open Space Assistance and not the 50% Program Open Space Assistance which was approved at the March 7, 1973, Board of Public Works meeting.

The amount of commitment to be canceled is \$93,927.50.

Based upon the recommendation submitted by Mr. Louis N. Phipps, Jr., Assistant Secretary of Capital Programs for the Department of Natural Resources, the Board declined to approve this item at the present time pending a feasibility study to be made by the Department of Natural Resources as directed by House Joint Resolution No. #120.

### SHORE EROSION CONTROL CONSTRUCTION LOAN FUND:

The Board approved a request by the Department of Natural Resources for the approval of a Shore Erosion Control Project Agreement between the State of Maryland and Luther W. Gregory which has been recorded in Queen Anne's County under Liber No. C.W.C. 70, Folio 214. The total amount of this loan is \$22,538.00 with annual repayments to be made in twenty-five equal installments of \$901.52.

The Board of Public Works, at its meeting of February 7, 1973, considered a request by the State Board for Community Colleges for the approval of an allocation of State funds to Montgomery College in the amount of \$1,044,400.50 from the General Public Junior or Community College Construction Loan of 1971 (Item M-2 - General Services Agenda).

After some discussion, the Governor moved that the Board approve the allocation with the understanding that it would not be advanced by the State for a period of one month in order that Montgomery County might have an opportunity to review the plans for the College again and decide whether or not to change their position. After further discussion, it was decided to give the Montgomery County government until March 10, 1973 to consider the matter and if the position of the County with respect to the plans for Montgomery College was not changed by that time, the money would be advanced.

The Board was advised that Montgomery County after having been given the opportunity to review the plans for the Takoma Park Campus of Montgomery Community College, decided not to change its position. Whereupon the Comptroller moved for the approval of this allocation, provided the money be used for the present campus and on property already acquired and that no additional condemnation be authorized in Block 69. The motion made by the Comptroller was accepted by the Board.

State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Ccde of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and Rummel, Klepper and Kahl, for engineering services consisting of subsurface borings, surveys, design, and preparation of right of way plans, contract plans and specifications for construction within Baltimore City of Interstate Route 395, from vicinity of Hamburg Street, northerly to connection with the southerly terminus of the proposed Boulevard System, and that portion of the Boulevard System extending from Saratoga Street on the north to vicinity of Battery Avenue on the south. All work is to be completed by March 1, 1974. Each of these highway sections are a part of the "3-A" Expressway System in Baltimore City.

Compensation for all services in connection with I-395 are not to exceed \$484,203 including a fixed fee of \$30,078 and for services in connection with the Boulevard System, compensation is not to exceed \$1,737,967 including a fixed fee of \$128,330. The amount of compensation was developed from a comparison by the State Highway Administration of costs experienced for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultant's records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services, and compares to a multiplier of 2.20 times direct salary costs. There are no State funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds for services in connection with I-95 and 50% Federal and 50% Baltimore City for services in connection with the Boulevard System.

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The agreement has been reviewed and concurred in by the Federal Highway Administration and the Board of Estimates, Baltimore City. (25)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and the Joint Venture of the Wilcon T. Ballard Company, Owings Mills, Maryland and Diver Brothers, Baltimore, Maryland

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and the Joint Venture of the Wilson T. Ballard Company, Owings Mills, Maryland and Diver Brothers, Baltimore, Maryland, for engineering services consisting of subsurface borings, surveys, design and preparation of right of way plans, contract plans and specifications for construction within Baltimore City of: (1) Interstate Route 170 from the east side of North Pulaski Street to North Fremont Avenue, a distance of approximately 1.0 mile including ramp connections to designated intersection streets; (2) Interstate Route 170 mainline ramps from North Fremont Avenue to Pearl Street, a distance of approximately 0.36 mile; and (3) a Storm Drain Outfall System extending from Interstate Route 170 to Middle Branch of the Patapsco River. All work is to be completed by March 1, 1974. Each of these highway improvements are part of the "3-A" Expressway System in Baltimore City.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on a lump sum basis in the amount of \$1,823,524. The estimated construction cost of the project is \$40,000,000. The compensation amounts to approximately 4.6% of the estimated construction cost. There are no State Funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds. The Federal Highway Administration and the Baltimore City Board of Estimates have concurred in the agreement.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (26)

### Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and the Joint Venture of Ewell, Bomhardt & Associates, Inc. and Sanders and Thomas, Inc., Baltimore, Maryland.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on the basis of cost plus fixed fee with reimbursement for direct costs. Compensation for all services in connection with Interstate Route 95 are not to exceed \$3,733,695, including a fixed fee of \$269,424, and for all services in connection with Interstate Route 395 compensation is not to exceed \$1,613,055 including a fixed fee of \$117,134. The amount of compensation was developed from a comparison by the State Highway Administration of costs experienced for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultant's records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services and compares to an average multiplier for the two firms of approximately 2.0 times direct salary costs. There are no State funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds.

The agreement has also been reviewed and concurred in by the Federal Highway Administration and the Board of Estimates of Baltimore City.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (27)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and the feint Venture of Zollaran Accociates. Inc., Baltimore, Maryland, and Per-Hall Associates, Limited, Montreal, Canada.

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted permission to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and the Joint Venture of Zollman Associates, Inc., Baltimore, Maryland and Per Hall Associates, Limited, Montreal, Canada for engineering services consisting of location studies and preparation of report detailing the tunnel alternatives to presently proposed elevated highway (I-83) through the Fells Point area of Baltimore City, generally from the vicinity of Caroline Street in the west to the vicinity of Anchorage "A" in the east, together with cost estimates, recommendations and an evaluation of the environmental consequences. All work is to be completed within 75 days of notice to proceed. The section of Interstate Route 83 through Fells Point is a part of the "3-A" Expressway System in Baltimore City.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on the basis of cost plus fixed fee with reimbursement for direct costs. Compensation for all services to be furnished is not to exceed \$113,834 including a fixed fee of \$8,450. The amount of compensation was developed from an evaluation by the State Highway Administration of costs for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultants' records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services, and compares to an average multiplier for the two firms of approximately 2.10 times direct salary costs. There are no State funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds.

The agreement has also been reviewed and concurred in by the Federal Highway Administration and the Board of Estimates of Baltimore City.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (28)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administrative and the Joint Ventury of Zollingh Associates, Inc., Beltimore, Maryland and Per-Hall Associates, Limited, Montreal, Canada.

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and the Joint Venture of Zollman Associates, Inc., Baltimore, Maryland and Per Hall Associates, Limited, Montreal Canada, for Phase I engineering services in connection with the proposed construction of a section of Interstate Route 95 in a tunnel across Baltimore Harbor at Fort McHenry with a total length including immediate approaches of approximately 8,500 feet. The Phase I services are those required to develop contract plans to approximately 30% completion for presentation at a Public Design Hearing. In addition to sursurface borings, soil tests, preliminary surveys, estimates and design, services to be provided under Phase I include an evluation of alternate ventilating tower structures to develop a design compatible with requirements of the Historic Preservation Act, the development of an environmental impact study detailing the levels of existing sound, air and water pollution and evaluating the nature of changes to be anticipated as a result of the proposed construction, explore possible sites for disposal of dredged material and develop construction procedures so as to minimize or eliminate navigation conflicts. All work is to be completed by September 30, 1974. A subsequent agreement will be required to complete the plans and specifications. This, however, cannot be developed until work under this agreement, scheduled for September 30, 1974, is complete and the required Public Design Hearing is held. This section of Interstate Route 95 is a part of the "3-A" Expressway System in Baltimore City.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on the basis of cost plus fixed fee with reimbursement for direct costs. The total compensation for all services is not to exceed \$2,363,100 including a fixed fee of \$150,546. The amount of compensation was developed from an evaluation by the State Highway Administration of costs for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultants' records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services, and compares to an average multiplier for the two firms of approximately 2.10 times direct salary costs. Based on an estimated construction cost of \$232,000,000, the compensation represents approximately 1%. There are no State funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds. The agreement has been reviewed and concurred in by the Federal Highway Administration and the Board of Estimates of Baltimore City.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (29)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and Maryland Surveying and Engineering Company, Incorporated, Baltimore, Maryland.

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and Maryland Surveying and Engineering Company, Inc., which provides for engineering services consisting of surveys, right of way plans, design and preparation of contract plans and specifications, for an access road, approximately 1 mile long, extending from Ingleside Avenue, along the south side of the Social Security Administration Complex to Woodlawn Drive in Baltimore County, Maryland.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on a lump sum basis in the amount of \$40,725. The amount of compensation was established from pre-audit information, a review of man-hours and salary costs and a comparison with work effort and costs for similar projects recently under taken elsewhere in the State Highway System. The estimated construction cost of the project is \$800,000. Compensation to the Consultant thus represents 5.1% of the estimated construction cost which is deemed reasonable. A portion of the work to be performed will be for the benefit of the Social Security Administration. By agreement, funding will be approximately 42% State from budget funds of the State Highway Administration, and approximately 58% Federal from budgeted funds of the Social Security Administration.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (30)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and Ewell, Bomhardt & Associates, Incorporated, Baltimore, Maryland

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportatic State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and Ewell, Bomhardt & Associates, Inc., Baltimore, Maryland, which provides for engineering services consisting of design and specificications in connection with the modification of existing interchange ramp connections from I-495 to Maryland Route 210, development of interchange connection between Maryland Route 210 and Ocon Hill Road, and the improvement to a 62 foot street section of Oxon Hill Road for a distance of approximately 1,000 feet in Prince George's County.

Compensation for services to be furnished under the agreement is to be on a cost plus fixed fee basis with reimbursement for direct costs. The total compensation for all services to be furnished is not to exceed \$83,435 including a fixed fee of \$7,365. The amount of compensation was developed from a comparison by the State Highway Administration of costs experienced for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultant's records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services and compares to a multiplier of 2.05 times direct salary costs. Funding will be 100% State from funds budgeted as part of the Five Year Highway Construction and Reconstruction Program of the State Highway Administration.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and by the Secretary of Transportation. (31)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and George William Stephens, Jr. and Associates, Inc., Towson, Maryland

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207 (f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and George William Stephens, Jr., and Associates, Incorporated, Towson, Maryland, for engineering services consisting of surveys, design and preparation of contract plans and specifications for 495 and Md. Route 414 in Prince George's County, Maryland, based on prelimination configuration studies accomplished under prior Agreement dated November 1968.

Compensation for services to be provided under the supplemental agreement is to be on a lump sum basis in the amount of \$70,966 for design and a maximum of \$24,300 for surveys or a total of \$95,266. Compensation for design services have been reduced from the lump sum of \$88,000 authorized under the agreement of November 1968 due to changes in the interchange configuration, resulting in a lessor design effort. The amount of compensation was established from prework effort and costs for similar projects recently undertaken elsewhere in the State Highway System. The estimated construction cost of work under the supplemental agreement is \$1,501,900. The lump sum design fee thus represents budgeted as part of the Five Year Construction and Reconstruction Program of the State Highway Administration.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (32)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and Matz, Childs & Associates, Inc., Towson, Maryland

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportati-State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration, to enter into an agreement between the State Highway Administration and Matz, Childs & Associates, Inc., Towson, Maryland, for engineering services consisting of design, preparation of right of way plans, contract plans and specifications, and the checking of shop drawing for improvement of Md. Route 586 as a dual lane highway from Md. Route 355 to an existing dual section east of Md. Route 28, Rockville, Montgomery County, Maryland.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on a lump sum basis in the amount of \$119,110. The amount of compensation was established from pre-audit information, a review of man-hours and salary costs and a comparison with work effort and costs for similar projects recently undertaken elsewhere in the State Highway System. The estimated construction cost for the project is \$2,309,000. The lump sum compensation thus represents 5.1% of the estimated construction cost which is considered reasonable.

Funding will be 100% State from funds budgeted as part of the Five Year Construction and Reconstruction Program of the State Highway Administration.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (33)

Agreement between the Department of Transportation, Maryland Port Administration and the Wilson T. Ballard Company, Owings Mills, Md.

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted permission to the Department of Transportation, Maryland Port Administration, to enter into an agreement between the Maryland Port Administration and the Wilson T. Ballard Company, Owings Mills, Maryland, for engineering services for a new entrance facility at Dundalk Marine Terminal, Baltimore Harbor, Maryland. Under the agreement of October 5, 1972, the Consultant's compensation for design of the entrance facilities was based on a sliding fee schedule related to an estimated construction cost of \$910,000. Based on a report entitled, "Survey on Computerized Billing and Security Operation - Their effect on a New Terminal Gateway Plaza" prepared as a joint effort of the staffs of the Department of Transportation and the Maryland Port Administration, it has been determined that the facility initially proposed will have to be significantly enlarged to handle the indicated larger traffic volumes. The new construction cost has been estimated at \$1,410,000. It was also determined that the engineering services in connection with a proposed data process office building would not be required. The proposes amendment would eliminate the previously proposed services in connection with the data process office building and would provide a fee of 4% on all construction costs for the new entrance facilities above \$990,000. The new fee schedule would

> 6.35% on first \$330,000 5.86% on second \$330,000 5.55% on third \$330,000 -4.00% on amounts over \$990,000\* (\*added by supplemental agreement)

The fee schedule is well within the standard fee schedule of the Department of General Services. The net effect of the proposed amendment will be to increase the total amount payable to the consultant by approximately \$17,600.

Funding will be 100% State and is available from State monies budgeted for the Maryland Port Administration for this purpose.

It is recommended that this contract be executed for the State by the Maryland Port Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (34)

### Agreement between the Department of Transportation, Mass Transit Administration and the Architect - Engineer firm of Fenton and Lichtig, Baltimore, Maryland

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportatic. State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f), of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted permission to the Department of Transportation, Mass Transit Administration, to enter into an agreement between the Mass Transit Administration, for architectural-engineering and construction inspection services in connection with the construction of a bus cleaning, fueling and servicing facility to be located at the Bush Street Division of the Mass Transit Administration. Compensation for services to be furnished is to be on the basis c. 6% of the final construction cost of the building, site work and utilities, and 3% of the final cost of the bus service equipment required for the project. Total compensation for all services to be furnished is not to exceed \$81,300 which incluareimbursement for the actual cost of surveys, subsurface borings, and laboratory tests of soil samples and materials.

The compensation is within the Department of General Services standard schedule of fees for similar services. Funding will be 2/3 Federal Funds and 1/3 State Funds, from monies budgeted for the Mass Transit Administration. The Federal share of both the Architect - Engineer services and of the construction cos of this project are part of a capital grant budget previously approved by the Federal Urban Mass Transit Administration.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the Mass Transit Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (35)

# Agreement between the Department of Transportation, Office of the Secretary and Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Company, Washington, D.C.

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 47, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted permission to the Department of Transportation, Office of the Secretary, to enter into an agreement between the Office of the Secretary and Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Company, Washington, D. for supporting services to the Staff of the Maryland Department of Transportation in the development of a detailed study design for an integrated long range transportation plan for the Annapolis area, plus a short range plan for public transportation improvements, which can be implemented within the next five years. The study design activities will involve evaluating alternative processes for determining future travel patterns for the Annapolis area, and establishing a criteria for assignment of traffic volumes to the separate modes of transportation. The activities related to development of a short range plan for public transportation facilities will include an evaluation of present facilities and the development of recommendations for modifications, extensions and/or changes to more effectively serve the needs of the area. Following completion of the work under this agreement and approval by the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Urban Mass Transit Administration, another agreement would be required providic for the actual development of the long range transportation plan for the Annapolis area. There are no Maryland based firms qualified to provide these services. The firm of Peat, Marwick and Mitchell, which has performed similar studies in Prince George's and Montgomery Counties, is currently engaged in developing a land use plan for the City of Annapolis and does employ a number of Maryland residents. Because of their current work with the City of Annapolis, their assignment to this work will insure full coordination and integration of the two activities.

Compensation for services to be furnished is to be on the basis of cost plus fixed fee with reimbursement for direct costs. Total compensation for all services to be furnished is not to exceed \$30,200 including a fixed fee of \$1,817.27. The amount of compensation was established from a pre-audit of the Consultant's records and a review of man-hour rates and effort to be expended in providing the required services and compares to a multiplier of 2.29 times direct salary costs. Funding will be \$8,890 from Federal Highway Administration, \$1,250 from the City of Annapolis and \$7,520 State from funds budgeted in the Office of the Secretary.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the Secretary of Transportation. (36)

# Agreement between the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and Gibbs & Hill, Incorporated, New York, New York,

Upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, State of Maryland, and in accordance with Article 41, Section 207(f) of the 1957 Annotated Code of Maryland, the Board granted approval to the Department of Transportation, State Highway Administration and Gibbs & Hill, Incorporated, New York, New York, for engineering services consisting of the design and preparation of contract plans and specifications for both temporary and permanent modifications to the Penn Central Railroad electrification system in connection with the proposed construction of Interstate Route 70 northerly to North Pulaski Street, a distance of 1.6 miles in Baltimore City. The firm of Gibbs & Hill, Inc. prepared the original plans for electrification of the Penn Central Railroad and has been the only engineering acceptable to the Railroad for designing modifications to the system. All work is to be completed within eight months of notice to proceed. These improvements are part of the "S-A" Expressway System in Baltimore City.

Compensation for services to be provided under the agreement is to be on the basis of cost plus fixed fee with reimbursement for direct costs. The total compensation for all services to be furnished is not to exceed \$339,900 including a fixed fee of \$29,535. The amount of compensation was developed from an evaluation by the State Highway Administration of costs for similar work and from a pre-audit of the Consultant's records and a review of man-hour rates and effort in providing the required services and compares to an average multiplier of approximately 2.0 times direct salary costs. There are no State funds involved. Funding will be 90% Federal funds and 10% Baltimore City funds. The agreement has been reviewed and concurred in by the Federal Highway Administration and the Board of Estimates of Baltimore City.

It is recommended that the contract be executed for the State by the State Highway Administrator and the Secretary of Transportation. (42-A)
