The Board was advised by Mr. Lewis that in all of the items submitted and recommended to the Board where payment is to be made from the proceeds of the following bond issues:

the significant section in point reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, that no department, board, commission, agency or institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provisions of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each such item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Slicher that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond Issue Funds were provided.

The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8, Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvement in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal grant."

Mr. Andrew Heubeck, Jr., Secretary to the Board of Public Works, presented Item la of his Agenda, dated June 14, 1971 as completely described in Exhibit page 4, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

All funds for these loans have been expended, and the cancellations of these encumbrance balances will close out these loans.

Mr. Andrew Heubeck, Jr., Secretary to the Board of Public Works, presented Item 1b of his Agenda, dated June 14, 1971, as completely described in Exhibit page 6, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

The Board of Public Works approved extending the lease, provided the Company would comply with the Wetland Permit procedures as provided for in Article 66C, Sections 718 to 731, of the Annotated Code of Maryland. The company must also comply with Chapter 792 of the Acts of 1971. This Act makes it unlawful to dredge for sand, gravel or other aggregates or minerals in any of the tidal waters or marshlands of Charles County. The agreement between the State and the Company provides for dredging in Charles County.

b. Reconsideration of a request by C. J. Langenfelder and Son, Inc., for approval of an extension of a lease agreement between the State of Maryland, acting by and through the Board of Public Works, and C. J. Langenfelder and Sons, Inc., dated April 1, 1968, providing for the leasing of approximately 125 acres of land in the Potomac River, under the same terms and conditions as in the original lease.

The Board considered this request at its meeting on April 7, 1971 and was concerned because the agreement expired on April 1, 1971. The Board, therefore, requested the Legal Counsel to the Board to review this request and give his legal advice as to whether or not this agreement could be extended for an additional three year period. The Legal Counsel has advised in a letter dated May 24, 1971 to the Secretary to the Board, that the Board of Public Works has the authority to award such a contract and said award is not subject to any competitive bidding. It is his opinion that the Board may extend this agreement for an additional three year period; however, the Wetlands permit procedure as provided for in Article 66C, Section 718 to 731, of the Annotated Code of Maryland, must be complied with by the Company.

12. STATE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT:

Submission of a request by the State Insurance Department for permission to write off the penalty of \$4,000.00 imposed on Allstate Insurance Company and the National Emblem Insurance Company for violating certain sections of the Insurance Code.

The Insurance Commissioner of Maryland, on July 11, 1969, issued an order, after a hearing, imposing a penalty of \$12,000.00 on Allstate Insurance Company and the National Emblem Insurance Company for violations to the Insurance Code. This decision was appealed to the Baltimore City Court, Appeal No. 9081367, and on June 26, 1970 was upheld by Judge Anselm Sodaro in the amount of \$8,000.00 penalty.
