The Board was advised by Mr. Lewis that in all of the items submitted and recommended to the Board where payment is to be made from the proceeds of the following bond issues:

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the significant section in point reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That no department, board, commission, agency, or institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provisions of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Lewis that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond Issue Funds were provided.

The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvements in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal grant.

Mr. Lewis also informed the Board of the provisions of Section 9 of

Chapter 289 of the Acts of 1974 as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That where Federal funds may be available to help accomplish any specific projects in this Act, the using department or agency shall be obligated to seek the allocation of such Federal funds to apply to the cost of the particular project. In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the suing department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administrative procedures to obtain such Federal funds, and the reason, if any, why the Federal funds were not obtained. Availability of Federal funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects of the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in this Act if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or development contemplated for the State park or recreation area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas as adopted by the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources."

#### RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, The State of Maryland is establishing a warm water fish hatchery at Cedarville Natural Resources Management Area, and
- WHEREAS, It is deemed appropriate that the facility be named to honor a citizen who has devoted his professional career to the improvement of Maryland fisheries, and
- WHEREAS, Joseph H. Manning was educated at the University of Maryland, receiving a B. S. degree in fisheries biology and a M.S. degree in zoology, and
- WHEREAS, From 1951 to 1961 Joseph H. Manning was employed by the Maryland Department of Research and Education at Solomons Island, where he was engaged in oyster and clam investigations, and
- WHEREAS, From 1961 to 1971 Joseph H. Manning was responsible for the management of Maryland tidewater resources as Director of the Department of Tidewater Fisheries, Department of Chesapeake Bay Affairs, and Department of Game and Inland Fish, and
- WHEREAS, Under Joseph H. Manning's direction during that period there were major advances in programs involving Bay resources, resulting in substantial benefits to the people of Maryland, and
- WHEREAS, From 1971 to the present Joseph H. Manning has served as Deputy Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources, having direct responsibilities regarding all of Maryland's treasured natural resources, and
- WHEREAS, During nearly thirty years of association with the natural resources of Maryland, Joseph H. Manning has acquired the respect and admiration of his professional colleagues as an excellent scientist and public administrator, and
- WHEREAS, He has also earned the respect and high regard of elected and appointed officials at all levels of government as a dedicated and conscientious statesman, and
- WHEREAS, Joseph H. Manning has richly earned the respect, affection, and esteem of the hundreds of State employees who have served under his direction, for his leadership, his good humor, and his decency, and
- WHEREAS, Joseph H. Manning above all has earned the gratitude of all of the citizens of the State of Maryland for his signal contributions to the protection, enhancement, and wise use of the natural resources of this State, and

- WHEREAS, Joseph H. Manning has decided to devote more time to the enjoyment of the bounteous natural resources he has so ably served, and will retire on June 30th of this year to a spot, it is rumored, somewhere west of the Chesapeake Bay;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Public Works of the State of Maryland in tangible recognition of these achievements that the name of the Natural Resources facility herebefore mentioned will be known as the Joseph H. Manning Fish Hatchery.

#### STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM: 15.

Submission of a request by the Interagency Committee for State Public School Construction that the present method of advancing state funds to the local educational agencies for the purpose of public school construction be allowed to continue.

In support of this request , a report is submitted (identified as Schedule A) which summarizes the cash on hand monthly in each county and Baltimore City, starting with December 1973 and ending April 1974, which shows the progress made in regard to controlling cash distributions to the 23 counties and Baltimore The total cash on hand for all counties and Baltimore City declined from \$18,893,373 at the end of December 1973 to \$6,040,320 at the end of April 1974. This report was requested by the Board at its meeting of February 21, 1974.

Also submitted (Schedule B), is a summary of earnings and estimated earnings by the counties from investment of State funds by the counties as reported to the State Public School Construction Finance Office. Many counties invest State and local funds together to take advantage of the best rate of return. In those cases, the earnings were prorated. Eight counties reported no interest earned. which could be caused by a lack of sufficient excess funds to justify investment or a policy of not investing. Most counties have indicated verbally that the earnings have been expended toward the acquisition of items for schools which were not funded by the State or other usage attributable to school construction. The reduction of outstanding advanced cash will in the future prohibit investment.

Using the present funding method, the Committee believes the outstanding cash can be further reduced from the present balance of \$6,040,320 to an overall range of \$4,000,000. With the large amount of construction work being accomplished throughout the State, the Committee feels it is necessary that the counties have some emergency working capital. (Copy enclosed)

A State official or employee of the Executive Department, who receives an invitation offered to him because of his official position or the nature of his State responsibilities to travel out of state at the expense of a private individual or nongovernmental organization and who has some question as to the propriety of accepting such an invitation may present the facts surrounding the invitation in writing to the Board of Public Works or its designee for a determination as to whether the invitation should be accepted. The Board of Public Works or its designee, after evaluating the written submission, may recommend that the invitation be accepted or declined or, in the alternative, may advise the official or employee to accept the invitation with the understanding that all or part of the costs thereof be borne by the State of Maryland when the Board or its designee is of the view that such travel is in furtherance of a matter of State concern and interest.
