

# ATTRACTIONS IN BREMANGER

## HORNELEN – EUROPE`S HIGHEST SEA CLIFF



The mighty Hornelen is the tallest sea cliff in Europe, and one of the most impressive in the world. Hornelen is made of conglomerate



sandstone from the Devonian period - in other words, old seabed! There is a large crack near the top where you can see "infinitely" down. Because of this and other cracks, seafarers were forbidden to use their ship's whistle when passing under Hornelen. If they did, the vibration could cause the rock to fall out and create a tidal wave.

Naturally, because of the impressive sight in the middle of the ship's bed, a number of legends have been created about Hornelen. In Heimskringla from the 13th century, the story is told of when Olav Trygvasson climbed up the mountain wall and attached his shield to the top of the mountain wall. When one of the herdsmen tried to climb up to retrieve the shield, he got stuck and could neither get up nor down. Olav then climbed up again, took the man under one arm and climbed down. Witches from all over Europe gather at Hornelen on Christmas Eve and Christmas Eve to dance and party with the Devil himself.

Hornelen lies between one of the largest known Stone Age settlements, Skatestraumen, and southern Norway's largest petroglyph field, Vingen, suggesting that the mountain may have played a central role in the forgotten mythology of the past.

The hike to the top of Hornelen takes 3-4 hours. From land, you can look out over the mighty sea cliff from Leirgulen/Rugsund and the resting place Gloføykje on Rugsundøya. This summer, it is possible to climb adapted climbing trails up Hornelen. Hornelen Via Ferrata offers three trails; Ørnelia, heksevæggen and Olavsruite. All climbing tours must be completed with a guide.

## VETVIKA

The windswept, weather-exposed and roadless Vetvika was completely abandoned in 1951. Although there was plenty of fishing and room for farming, it was too hard to live in a place where you were often isolated from the outside world for three months in winter due to storms at sea and snow in the mountains. Today, only the ruins of the old farmhouses remain, along with telephone poles and the protected cemetery with 9 graves.

For a long time, Vetvika was a secret only a few people in Bremanger knew about. Today, however, word is spreading fast about the secret cove being the "most beautiful place on earth". In Vetvika, the white sandy beach meets the azure blue sea where the waves roll in from the big ocean. Green slopes with special vegetation cover the dunes that stretch all the way up to the vertical black cliffs that surround the cove - a witness to the powerful forces at work when winter storms strike from the west.

In Vetvika, the sunset goes directly into the sea, and an evening here in a tent is a memory for life. You can get to Vetvika by walking over a nice mountain trail for 3 hours from Svarstad in Bremangerlandet. If you want a slightly longer hike, with good views, you can walk up marked trails from Iglandsvik. Alternatively, you can come by boat from the villages in Bremanger/Kalvåg or Måløy.

If you come by sea, you can visit the islet Veststeinen, located 2 km outside the bay. Seabirds such as puffins nest here in large numbers, and there is a large population of seals that live here. Veststeinen is protected, and it is not allowed to go ashore during the breeding season. If you have a surfboard, there are often good surfing conditions in Vetvika.



## DOSABU - STORM HUNTING CABIN WITH SPECTACULAR VIEWS

On the edge of the rocky terrain on Frøya, west of Kalvåg, lies a cabin with a panoramic view of the big sea. There are two routes to get to Dosabu. If you want a slightly shorter hike, but with equally impeccable views, you can walk from Nesje. This hike is about 3 kilometres. But to get to Nesje, you have to be prepared to stop and reverse, as the roads here are narrow. From Kalvåg, the hike is 6.5 kilometres long. The hut is open to everyone, but is not for overnight stays. Bring food and drink and enjoy the view, whether it's a fierce storm or a beautiful sunset.

## GROTLESANDEN

At the far end of Grotle in Bremangerlandet, you'll find a real gem of a sandy beach, Grotlesanden. Here there is a silky white sandy beach as far as the eye can see. Although there are many different small and large beaches on the "Riviera" from Hauge to Grotle, Grotlesanden is the largest and most beautiful.

There are open toilets from 10:00 - 22:00. Paid parking for cars, 50,- per day.

The nearest accommodation, guest harbor, café, restaurant and shop are at Iglandsvik, just over 2 km away. Here, at Iglandsvik Marina, you can also camp in nice areas that have been prepared. At Grotlesanden itself, it is not possible to set up a tent, as it is too close to nearby buildings.



## VETEN



From idyllic Grotlesanden, the ascent starts on the hiking trail to Vetten and Vettenplatået, the westernmost mountain plateau in Norway. The summit itself (527 m above sea level), at the edge of the plateau, is marked by a large cairn. This is actually Norway's westernmost peak at over 500 meters above sea level. Naturally, this provides a fantastic and unique view of the open ocean, where in good weather you can see "infinitely far" into the blue horizon where the North Sea blends into the blue sky. At Vetten, there is a beautiful new day trip cabin with a library for the enjoyment of hikers.

There are several trails on the Vetten plateau, where you can head north towards viewpoints over Vetvika, or east to climb a series of peaks that together form a 7-mountain hike with posts on the local mountain trail. In winter, skiing is great here, and there are also good opportunities for mountain biking.

## KALVÅG - THE FINEST ROWING COMMUNITY IN SOUTHERN NORWAY

The fishing village of Kalvåg, with its characteristic dense development of seaside houses, grew up in the 19th century, when people from the fjords in the region came to take part in the adventurous herring fishing off Bremanger. At its peak, 11,000 fishermen were accommodated, and there were over 50 saltworks. Variations in fishing meant that there were cycles of strong ups and downs in activity and population. In the 1960s and 1970s, Kalvåg stagnated, and many of the fine seaside houses fell into disrepair. A bridge connection to the neighboring island of Bremangerlandet in the 80s made new investment possible, and local players, led by Svein Inge Fosse, began restoring the seaside houses for rent, establishing restaurants and more.

Today, Kalvåg is in constant development, but with a focus on the genuine and authentic coastal culture. It is an eldorado for boating and fishing tourism, and a natural base for great experiences such as diving and hiking. Herring is also still important to Kalvåg, and in recent years large quay facilities have been built for the local fishing fleet, and the most modern facility for receiving and processing herring in the world has been built. Here they produce Matjes herring (Hollandse Nieuwe), which is a delicacy and national dish in the Netherlands.

Even in winter, there is a southern atmosphere in Kalvåg, with a great spa with an indoor sandy beach and 28C on the weather forecast, and a jacuzzi overlooking the wave. (p.26) At this time of year, more and more visitors come to experience the powerful storms and waves that hit the beaches and islets in the vicinity.

In Kalvåg you will find Knutholmen, one of the best seafood restaurants in Norway, (p. 44+47) its own fish shop, a museum that tells the rich history, and enterprising players who organize a variety of activities to the delight of both locals and visitors. There are many seaside cabins and campsites for rent, as well as a large guest harbor for boats and car camping.



## VINGEN – ROCK CARVINGS IN A UNIQUE ATURAL LANDSCAPE



In the deep  
Vingenpollen,  
surrounded by  
steep mountains  
and with  
Hornelen  
looming above,  
you find Vingen,  
one of the  
largest and most



distinctive rock carvings in Northern Europe. Here you will find almost 2300 figures, all of which are around 7000 years old. The deer is the most common motif, but there are also human figures and abstract symbols, as well as staffs with animal heads that are often interpreted as important parts of shamanistic ceremonies.

Vingen must be seen in the context of the Stone Age settlements found in the Skatestraumen area, where it is most likely that there has been continuous habitation for 8,000 years. 150 such settlements have been found, an unprecedentedly high number at a time when there was no agriculture. There is a lot of information about this at the Gloføykje rest area on Rugsundøya, at the mainland connection to outer Bremanger.

The University Museum in Bergen owns and operates the area, where they are actively engaged in research, constantly coming up with new discoveries and theories about the mystery of the Wing. Several of the researchers have stated that Vingen should definitely be on the World Heritage List. The area is totally protected, and only organized traffic is allowed.

The experience of walking around and seeing where they sat and made all the figures, why they made them, and trying to understand the purpose of the carvings is unique. In collaboration with well-

experienced guides, this is a tour you won't soon forget. Queen Sonja is one of those who has fallen in love with Vingen, and visited the field in both 2014 and 2017.

## TONGANE – ONE OF THE LARGEST GERMAN FORTS ALONG THE NORWEGIAN COAST

Although

Tongane Fort

was built for

war by the

German

occupying power during World

War II, it is today a peaceful,

idyllic gem with a very

interesting story to tell. Firstly,

this was one of the

fortifications that was actually

in combat, during the Måløy

raid in the Christmas of 1941. In addition, much of the facility, including some of the artillery, is intact and

accessible. To make Tongane more visitor-friendly, several boards have also been set up with maps,

pictures and other information about the fortress. The entire fortress area is untouched, no cabins or

houses have been built here.

It is easy to get to Tongane both by boat and on foot. Boaters can use the quay on the south side of the facility. On foot, you can walk from the harbor, just by the tunnel under Skatestraumen (be careful when parking and avoid private areas). There are marked paths to the fortress and the walk takes about half an hour.



## BOTNANE – BURIAL MOUNDS FROM THE BRONZE AGE



On the farms Sørbotten, Øvrebotten and Nordbotten in Botnane there are eight burial cairns, many of which are easily visible

from both the road and the shipping lane. This is part of a large

landscape of burial cairns, with 27 large burial cairns along the

Botnane - Årebrot stretch. The graves are from the older Bronze

Age - around 1800 - 1000 BC. These coastal cairns are among the foremost

cultural monuments from the Bronze Age preserved in Norway, in good

condition after more than three thousand years. The largest has a cross-section of 36 meters, the smallest is 14 meters. The fact that so much manpower could be used to build tombs for a select few suggests that

society was tightly hierarchical. The petty kings and chieftains here ruled over the coastal plain that

everyone had to pass along the coast, and probably taxed passers-by at what is probably Norway's oldest

"toll station". Leave highway 614 at the junction at Myklebust. Follow the county road to Botnane for about

30 km. "Nordre Røysa" is located down the road on the right-hand side. "Søre Røysa" is on the left side of the road a little closer to the farms in Nordbotten. There are new information signs about the burial cairns

that you can follow. The other cairns are located on Sørbotten on the south side of Pollen.

## THE POET`S PATH IN BOTNANE

The popular poet Jan Magnus Bruheim lived in Botnane from 1978 to 1985, and wrote several poems related to specific places in the village, such as the cemetery, the schoolhouse and Flôtholmen. In his memory, a

cultural trail has been created through these and other cultural monuments and beautiful nature, with information signs and selected

poems at special locations. A fire pit has also been made available, and large, beautiful sitting stones and climbing rocks have been set up for the enjoyment of both young and old.

Much of the funds for the cultural trail have been raised through volunteer work among the local community, who have also been

responsible for much of the work.





## AASE BOTNMARK - SCULPTURE COLLECTION IN BOTNANE

Aase Botnmakr (b.Øvrebøtn) came into the world on 25 May 1927, on the Håjen farm in Botnane. She wanted some of her art to "come home", and after her death in 2012, her family deposited a selection of sculptures with Bremanger municipality. 22 of them are on display in Botnane hamlet house, in the old schoolroom, from which Aase had many fond memories. Aase was concerned with justice and equality and mostly made sculptures of women. She emphasised women's important contributions to their families and local communities. The sculptor Per Ung was one of her teachers and he said that "your sculptures are alive, Aase".



The coastal women had a special place in her heart. In the community centre in Botnane hamlet house is the sculpture "Ho mor i ank". It is owned by the hamlet team after NOK 15,000 was raised in 2005 to have the coastal woman cast in bronze. The model was Aase's mother, Sanna at Håjen.

## POWER AND INDUSTRY IN

### SVELGEN

In Bremanger, the power resources provided the basis for the development of the industrial town of Svelgen. It took time before industry was established that could use the power, and it was from 1918 that power production began, with the Elkem Bremanger plant, which started in 1928, providing the dominant workplace. Bremanger became a separate municipality in 1866, and after the municipal regulation in 1965, when Davik was included, Svelgen became the center of the new Branger municipality. The center of Svelgen has been renovated in recent years.

### ÅLFOTEN

This small village is located in the heart of Bremanger municipality, by the Ålfotfjord, between fjord and mountain. Ålfoten has a school, kindergarten and shop. In the village you will find a ball pit, "jungle" and a sand volleyball court.

The village has many marked hiking trails to the forest, mountains and glacier. The highest mountain is Blånibba (Gjegnet) at 1670 meters above sea level. Sigdestadnakken, which lies between the two valleys, is one of the smaller ones, at 632 meters above sea level and with great views.

There are many fine fishing lakes in the Ålfotdalen and Førdsdalen valleys. Førdsdalen is a V-valley, majestic and spectacular.

## ÅLFOTEN –THE OLDEST WOODEN CHURCH IN NORDFJORD

The 400-year-old church is idyllically located in Ålfoten. The church, which seats 100, was built in the 17th century. The year 1678 was long thought to be the year of construction, but it was more likely built around 1610. Ålfoten church is the parish church for Ålfoten parish in Davik parish. Ålfoten church is a long church made of timber. It is most difficult to spot the small church if you happen to look for it from the main road on the upper side of the village. But if you take the road down into the village of Ålfot, and look for a small white painted church house without a tower, you will soon find the small wooden church, the oldest wooden church in Nordfjord. Ålfoten church has the feel of solid craftsmanship from the 17th century. The church is the only one remaining in Davik parish from the time when the poet-priest Claus Frimann (1746-1829) worked here. The altarpiece is as old as the church, but was painted over in 1767. There may have been painting where there are now stars, as there are on similar altarpieces.

The oldest wooden church in Nordfjord is also the oldest post-Reformation church in the county. There are no sources that tell us who built the church in Ålfoten, but it may well have been one or more of the professional traveling builders. Ålfoten church is still in regular use and was restored a few years ago in collaboration with the Directorate for Cultural Heritage.

## DEER FARM IN ÅLFOTEN

Hjortegarden in Ålfoten is as close to nature as possible, run by Sonja and Karl Vidar Førde.



This is a farm with all the positive associations of stewardship of nature, creativity, loving animal husbandry, food traditions and hunting. The deer is the majestic animal that owns the forests around the farm, where they rule all the way down from the fjord, up along the rivers, through forests, scrub and scree to the snowy mountains and the large Ålfot glacier. Ålfoten is enclosed between high mountains, flowing rivers, the Ålfot Glacier and the mighty Nordfjord. This is the real deal. These are world-class nature experiences. This is Hjortegarden. Welcome to the farm!



## ÅLFOT GLACIER- THE WESTERMNMOST GLACERS IN NORWAY

Ålfoten and the nearby Gjegnalund glacier are the westernmost glaciers in Norway. The area is the rainiest in Europe, with an estimated annual precipitation of at least 5500 mm. This extreme precipitation is the basis for the large-scale power generation in Bremanger and the industry in Svelgen. The climate here is arctic, and even on a hot summer day you need to dress well and be well prepared to walk in the area.

The area is one of the last areas to be explored and mapped in Norway, so this is wilderness at its finest. Its exploration has resulted in some "creative" town names, so you'll find X-Vatnet, Y-Vatnet, Hylle-1, Hylle-2 - and so on. The glaciers and nearby areas are protected landscape areas and are free from encroachment, while virtually all lakes and waterfalls around this area are regulated for power generation.

The area is characterized by the unique and special shelf landscape of Devonian sandstone, where one can begin to wonder if one has not strayed to a completely different planet than Earth. It's completely unique in the world. These are the ground-up remains of the Caledonian mountain range that 400 million years ago stretched as high as the Himalayas. When the mountain was eroded, the sand masses gathered in what is today called the Hornelen Basin - here they gradually slid westwards, forming shelves, which under enormous pressure in the earth's crust became solid bedrock, which has since been pressed up into new mountains. There are over 200 such shelves from the Svelgen area in the west to Hyen in the east. Sandstone is impossible to polish, which means it is extremely good for climbing. There are many cliffs and rocks in the area with varying degrees of difficulty, the most difficult of which is probably the Gallery Wall at Gjegnen,

which is over a kilometer straight up. Svelgen and Ålfoten are good bases for exploring the area.

## THE FOUNDATION JØRNTUNET IN DAVIK

Jørntunet is an old farmhouse, built in the mid-1800s, in Davik.


The property is located in a beautiful cultural landscape, where there are stone walls, ramparts, planted trees and apple orchards. The buildings on the property are: a stove house, two mill houses, a fire house and a barn with a barn. In addition, there are walls of a storehouse, storage room, outhouse and two forges. The Jørntunet Foundation was established in 1992 and aims to preserve and restore the yard and houses as far as possible back to their original condition.



## MEMORIES OF THE POET-PRIEST CLAUS FRIMANN AT DAVIK

The famous poet-priest Claus Frimann (1746-1829) built a stately two-storey mansion with a half-hipped roof on the hill above the sea, a beautiful garden with paths, and planted tree allees and fruit trees. Down by the fjord he built a jetty. He called the property "Frimannslund", and in the years that followed the estate became a gathering place for the upper classes in Nordfjord, with the party-loving poet-priest hosting large parties.

Claus Frimann also planted his own "poetry grove" of pine trees close to the church at Davik. In addition to his work as a priest, Claus Frimann was a skilled businessman who ran his own yachts, herring farm and salt works. Much of his legacy remains, and a monument has been erected in memory of Frimann in the poet's grove. An information plaque has been erected by the main road.



## GROTLE GAMLE KYRKJEGARD - MEDIEVAL CHURCHYARD

On the seafront at Grotle in Bremanger, you will find the old medieval churchyard; Grotle gamle kyrkjegard. It was first mentioned in the 14th century. For several hundred years, people came here, many by sea. The church that stood there was demolished in 1865, but the churchyard was in use until 1902. Since then it has remained more or less untouched. On top of the wall and inside the churchyard there is a rich and diverse flora. Today, almost 100 burials have been registered here. The graves vary in age, material, size, shape and colour. The site is currently (14.06.23) under restoration. New information signs and a new gate will be installed in due course. The work of replacing the memorials that have been stored at the town hall is now underway, and we hope that they will all be in place before the summer.

## RUGSUND HANDELSTAD



Surrounded by beautiful scenery, the old trading town of Rugsund is located on the eastern tip of Rugsundøya. Rugsundet is the "shortcut" to Nordfjord when traveling south from Frøysjøen. The infamous Rugsundstraumen is also a short distance from the old trading town. The warm and good harbor, centrally located on the inner ship channel along the coast, was sought after by seafarers. Today, the harbor is often visited by boat tourists who have discovered the idyllic and peaceful harbor. You can also stay overnight at Rugsund Handelsstad. You can rent a room, apartment, house or tent site. You can rent function rooms for private events, such as weddings, confirmations, company outings, conferences, etc.



The Rugsund area offers excellent diving conditions. Tourists from all parts of the world come here and comment on the beautiful diving experience to be found in Rugsund. At the trading town you can fill your diving tanks.

When you are on the Rugsund Bridge, turn off one meter from the tunnel opening. We recommend keeping your speed low and parking in the first parking lot, rather than driving all the way down the old, narrow road.

## RUGSUND CHURCH

There has been a church in Rugsund since the 14th century. The church stood on Rugsundøy until 1834, when it burned down. The current church was built in 1837 on the mainland, designed by architect Hans Ditlev Franciscus

von Linstow, who was also the architect behind the Royal Palace in Oslo. It was restored in 1911 and consecrated on August 6, 1912. The artist Kinsarvik was responsible for this work. He did the rose painting and carvings. It is said that the interior is the most beautiful in Nordfjord. The church has 28 stained glass windows, all gifts from the church community.

## **BERLE – THE TUNNELS AT GOTRANESET COASTAL FORT**

In the idyllic village of Berle, on the south side of Bremangerlandet, you'll find the second largest World War II German fort in Bremanger. The most distinctive features here are the large halls and tunnels that were blasted out of the mountain. They were used to store ammunition and to house soldiers. Today, the mountain halls have been cleared and are used for larger events such as concerts.

## **VIKING HISTORY IN BERLE**

Berle was a center in the Viking Age, with its strategic location overlooking the ship channel in Frøysjøen. Swords, spears and remains of Viking ships have been found here. Much of the action in what is considered to be the most important Icelandic saga, Egilssoga, takes place in Berle. The most famous chieftain here was Berle-Kåre, who is the ancestor of Egil Skallagrimsson, the most famous Viking Age bard. The Vikings in Berle were known to be "half jotnar, half human", as they were enormously large and strong. They could take animal skins in beserkargong, had prophetic abilities and were known throughout Norway for their skaldic skills.

## SMØRHAMN HANDELSTAD

Smørhamn Handelsstad has been a centre for trade and hospitality since the 17th century. This was a central town at a time when all traffic travelled from the sea. We know of three kings of Denmark/Norway who passed through on their journeys to and from Trondheim. This happened in 1685, 1703 and 1733. In 1637, Smørhamn Handelsstad was the county seat for Kinn and Bremanger. This was also the location of the first municipal council in Bremanger, and the county boats used the town as a stopover. It was not until the end of 1800 that trade in Smørhamn came to an end, and Kalvåg emerged as a municipal centre.



It is a privilege to be able to holiday in the historic buildings in old Smørhamn. Today it is Kari and Knut Arne who continue to run it, after 100 years in the Vadøyslekta family.

Smørhamn is part of the pilgrimage route from Kinn to Selje, Sunnivaleia. It is now part of the national coastal pilgrimage route.

Remains of the old church at Grotle were sold at auction to the innkeeper in Smørhamn in 1865, so you can find traces of it in the buildings.



Kari and Knut Arne are happy to tell stories from the old days if you get in touch (NOK 50 per person). If you're lucky, you might get to try rowing a wooden boat of the old kind, or rent a plastic boat with a motor. They also sell skins from organic outdoor sheep. In addition, they rent out 5 camp sites in one of the buildings and function rooms in the other (see page 59).

## SMØRHAMN LIGHTHOUSE ON FISKHOLMEN

Fiskholmen lies out towards Frøysjøen south of the old trading town of Smørhamn. A manned lighthouse was built here in 1871. In 1936, a new lighthouse lantern was erected and the staffing was discontinued. There are still many traces of the old lighthouse, such as the landing stage, stairs and roofs. The name of the islet is a hint to visitors who want to fish. There are always plenty of bites to be had just off the island.

## THE FISHERMEN`S COTTAGES AT LISET NEAR KALVÅG

If you take a trip to the west side of Liset farm in Bremanger, you will find a peaceful place. Only old foundations remain, testifying to the hectic activity of the past, when up to several hundred men "lay in Geitholmen". The seasonal use of the town has ancient roots, with a final high point during the spring herring fishing season in the mid-1800s.

## LIGHTHOUSES AROUND KALVÅG

Lighthouses and lighthouses are signposts for seafarers. Farvatna by Kalvåg and around the island of Frøya in outer Bremanger has 6 lighthouses: Smørhamn, Sparkeltaren, Kalvåg (Ola lighthouse), Minnet, Nesje and Oldesteinen.

Nesje lighthouse in particular is a popular destination for visitors at sunset or during storms.

## WAR GRAVE AT NOVELANDET IN OUTER BREMANGER

Nearly 120,000 Americans lost their lives in the First World War, most of them on the fronts in France. One of them was Lorents Bakke from Bremanger. He emigrated to America in 1911. He came home as a fallen American soldier in France, and was buried in the churchyard at Novelandet.

When you arrive at Novelandet, there is a gravel road on the right side that is marked with signs. It is a fairly narrow gravel road but it is possible to drive all the way up. There is a shelter near the end of the road that you have to get up, or there is nothing in the way to drive all the way up to visit the churchyard. If you decide to walk up the road, it will take around 15-20 minutes to walk up.

## CULTURAL HERITAGE TRAILS IN BREMANGER

In Kalvåg there is a cultural walking trail that runs from Butikken/Amstkaia and through the village to the old herring salteries on the other side of the wave. Along the trail there are several posts where you can read and hear about the local history of the village. The posts are marked with small blue signs that you can use to find your way around. You don't have to walk in the sequence that has been laid out or visit all the posts. You can click through the whole thing without walking if you want to. A similar trail has been set up in the swallow, which was new in 2022. There you can read about the transformation of the village from two farms to the industrial center in the municipality. The trail has 28 posts with QR codes that you can use to read about the different places around the town. It is

designed to be walked in a circle around the village, but you can go through in any order you like. The starting point (post no. 1) is at the oldest house in Svelgen, Øyratunet.

## SWIMMING

- There are many small and large beaches in Bremangerlandet. Grotlesanden and Vetvika are already mentioned as attractions in their own right.
- Hokssanden is popular among those who live nearby. It is located close to the Spar shop at Hauge in Bremanger. There are no toilets or showers on the beach. Parking is available at the store.
- In Kalvåg you will find the beach Bontelabo. This beach is quite small, but has a toilet and free parking. There are also opportunities to walk part of the North Sea trail. Here you can easily reach Lamberæva where you can have a relaxing lunch with a view of Hovden, Batalden and Botnane. There is room for 2-3 tents here.
- At Davik is Hauesanden, a pleasant little sandy beach. It is nicely situated down by the fjord and there are associated sanitary facilities.
- In Svelgen, it is nice to walk around Risevatnet. There are also opportunities to swim here, but there are no toilets connected to the bathing area. The road has recently been improved, and there is now room to park about two cars.
- For those who like to swim, everywhere you go, there are opportunities. There are countless mountain lakes, quays and rocks where you can sunbathe and enjoy yourself.



## CLIMBING/RAPPELLING

There are excellent conditions for climbing and abseiling in Svelgen and the surrounding area. Here are bolted routes for climbing and experienced people in the area. For the more extreme, the 1070 meter high cliff face of Bremanger's highest mountain, Blånibba, is a great destination. In addition, it is worth taking advantage of the newly started, adapted climbing trails; Via Ferrata Hornelen (see page 27).

## CYCLING

If you bring your bike to Bremanger, you can see a lot of beautiful things in the municipality. Here you can take trips alone or with others. If you want to cycle with others, you can get in touch with Kalvåg Sykkel or Svelgen Sykling. These are two groups of happy cyclists who have organized themselves. During the summer months, the clubs organize cycling tours around the municipality. Ytre Bremanger is known for its fine and pleasant cycling trails. If you want to rent a bike in Bremanger municipality, contact Knutholmen in Kalvåg or Havlys in Bremanger.

Mountain biking: The Bremanger plateau offers extremely good conditions for mountain biking. You can roll your bike up either the construction road up Steinfjellet or the gravel road that goes up near Iglandsvik to Igland and Grotlesela via what is locally called "Nøre bakken". Once you're up on the plateau, there are plenty of your own trails to explore. In the mountains above Davik, there are also good opportunities for mountain biking with great views of Nordfjord.

### «STOLPEJAKT»

«Stolpejakt» is a popular hiking activity that was carried out for the first time last year. There are 40 poles that can be found and registered in an app. 20 in Nøredalen in Botnane and 20 in Uradalen on Årebrot. ## DISC GOLF

In July, a disc golf course will be opened in Øvrebotten, starting at the hamlet house. Disk golf is a popular and growing activity. People of all ages can play here. There are 20 courses on 12 baskets. Disk golf is similar to golf, but instead of golf balls, you use frisbees/discs that are thrown against a basket that can be placed on different terrain, including in the countryside. The game is about getting the disk into the basket in the fewest possible throws. The course is located on both sides of the southern river in Øvrebotten in idyllic surroundings.

## BUABREMANGER

Bua Bremanger is a municipal rental service where you can borrow various equipment for leisure activities. You can find them at the entrance in the basement (sea front) at the municipal building in Svelgen and they are open 14:30-17:00 Tuesday to Thursday. ## HUNTING

Bremanger is one of the country's largest deer municipalities, and perhaps Myklebustdalen in particular is legendary among the active hunting community in Norway. Deer can be seen regularly if you drive through the municipality late in the evening or at night. Especially in the spring, large herds of grazing deer can be found in the fields. There is great interest in hunting in Bremanger. The increasing deer population has led some landowners to lease out parts of their hunting rights, or interested hunters have joined existing hunting teams as guest hunters. Deer hunting can thus be considered both an outdoor activity and an outdoor industry. If you would like more information about hunting rules, hunting tests in the municipality and the like, please contact Bremanger Municipality's service office..

At Karlskardstova in Myklebustdalen, between Svelgen and Ålfoten/Davik, next to Langesjø Hyttegrend, there are beautiful, groomed and long cross-country ski trails in winter. The facility is freely accessible and you can have lights on the trails until 11 pm in the evening. There is a shooting range in connection with the facility.

## OTHER ACTIVITIES

If you want information about, for example, basketball, longboarding, sewing, athletics, fitness, shooting, sea rafting, dance, drama, sewing and crafts, painting and art, instruments, etc. please contact the Tourist Information Center so that we can help you. ## MOUNTAIN HIKES IN BREMANGER



### KEIPEN TURLAG

Keipen Turlag is a municipality-wide organization. The team organizes tours in both the outer and inner parts of the municipality. The team has two cabins with accommodation facilities.

- Moldahytta at 382 meters above sea level, 8 beds, south of Langeneset, Svelgen. The cabin has an unlocked porch, for rental of the cabin itself, contact Karstein Løvset at Keipen Turlag.
- Knekkevasshytta at 469 meters above sea level, sleeps 12 in 4 rooms + extra mattresses. The cabin was upgraded in 2017. DNT lock. Located on the T-marked trail to Keipen, 1 hour walk from Sjørdalsdammen parking lot, which is on the road between Svelgen and Bremanger/Ålfoten.
- Hiking teams, sports clubs, landowners and others have been responsible for marking and clearing hiking trails. A book and maps have been published highlighting and showing all the walks, which can be purchased at information offices and a number of other outlets in the municipality. At [www.ut.no](http://www.ut.no) you can also find many tours from Bremanger. Among other things, Sogn og Fjordane Turlag, Keipen Turlag and Svenn Petter Kjerpeset, the driving force behind mountain activities in Bremanger, have posted many great hikes. In total, there are over 100 marked hikes in Bremanger!
- There is also Barnas Turlag, Keipen, which organizes great hikes for children and young people both during the school year and holidays. See [www.facebook.com/Barnas-turlag-Keipen](http://www.facebook.com/Barnas-turlag-Keipen) for information about hikes.

### DAGSTURHYTTER (DAY TRIP CABINS IN BREMANGER)

- Vetehytta - Day trip cabin by the cairn that marks the highest point west of Veteplatået - Norway's westernmost mountain plateau. There is a New Norwegian library, seating, magnificent views and toilets nearby.
- -Dosavarden - A new "storm cabin" in the far east of Frøya, as far west as you can get in Bremanger. Marked trail from Kalvåg and Nesje. Spectacular views of the sea and the waves crashing against the cliffs.
- Martinbu on Sandsegga - Popular hike from Svelgen, and with good reason - In addition to fantastic views of the industrial town of Svelgen, you can see the mighty snow-capped mountains that crown

Risevatnet. From Sandsegga there is a trail to Vingelvsætra. The day trip cabin has a view, 15 seats and plenty of reading material.

- Molda- Moldahytta is owned by STIF and operated by Keipen Turlag. Number of beds: 8 It is not possible to bring dogs to the cabin.
- Please contact Karstein Løvset to get the code for the key box. Tel. 91 66 68 86
- Knekkevasshytta- The 100-year-old Knekkevasshytta is owned by SFE and Keipen Turlag has an agreement to use it as an unattended DNT cabin. Number of beds: 12. DNT - lock. It is not possible to bring dogs to the cabin. Contact: Steinar Isene tel: 45 87 47 37
- Olavsbu - The stone cabin at Hornelen, which serves as a rest hut/emergency hut, was donated to the hiking team by Berle grendalag in November 2019. The hut was built in the summer of 1990 in connection with the Witch Festival held in Berle. Many people come here every year to sign the cabin book and to pick up the flag to show everyone that they have reached the top of the Hornelen sea cliff.
- Kvilehytta in Berledalen-Lita, a nice cabin by a beautiful lake. From Berle: follow the North Sea trail starting at the school and walk on the gravel road almost all the way to the cabin (2 km). From Bremanger: start at the parking lot in Førø. Follow Nordsjøløypa over Høgste and Bremangerskaret and follow the path down to Berledalen (approx. 4.5 km).

## INFORMATION BOUT SELECTED HIKES:

A very large hiking map of the municipality (249,-) can be purchased at many of the shops and outlets in Bremanger, as well as at the Tourist Information Center. There are also good resources at [www.ut.no](http://www.ut.no) and the Ut app. We also have self-made maps/directions for most of the tours mentioned here, which we distribute free of charge.

## HORNELEN

- From Hunskår: This route is shorter, but much steeper than the one from Berleneset. It's also often muddy at the beginning, but some of it has been worked on by pairs of scissors. They've made it about 400m up the stone staircase so far, but plan to make it much longer in the future. After walking a good distance, you come to a flat terrain where the scissors have also been working, so it's nice and flat with stones for 900 meters. When you're done with this terrain, you descend into a valley where you meet the trail coming from Berleneset. The trip takes about 7-9 hours.
- From Berleneset: This is a route to Hornelen that is longer and thus not as steep, but it is still necessary to do some mountain training before setting out on the hike. The route offers a great

experience of nature and great views. A small stone hut has been built at the top of Hornelen. At the top, it is important to be aware of pebbles and deep cracks.

The entire hike takes about 8 - 10 hours. This hike is marked as a rough trail and is suitable for experienced hikers, it requires good stamina and good hiking equipment.

## VETVIKA

You start from the road that goes to Steinfjellet, it is marked with signs from the road at Svarstad/Dalen, Bremanger. We follow the road for about 2 km to around 500 meters above sea level. After the bend where there is a private cabin nearby, turn off the road and follow the marked path. This should be followed northwards, gently ascending approx. 1 km. The trail splits in two here. Both paths go to Vetvika.

We recommend that anyone who does not walk with familiar people to take the path that goes mostly north, around parts of Fåvatnet. The second trail can be a frighteningly steep descent. After Fåvatnet, you reach a stone wall with a view down to Solheimsvatnet in Vetvika. Follow the path down, about 3 km, and walk on the right side of the lake.

On the way home, you can try the steeper hill up. This is shorter. It should be easy to follow the path, even if it occasionally moves over rocks. Enjoy the views at the top at 574 meters above sea level, and follow the trail back towards Steinfjellet.

If you want a slightly longer hike with good views, you can walk up marked trails from Iglandsvik. Follow the blue/red marked trail to the outfield and further along the mountainside up to the junction where the trails go in opposite directions. Now follow the marked trail in the eastern direction.

As the unspoilt gem that Vetvika is, there are no rubbish bins here. That's why it's extra important to bring back all the rubbish you brought with you. Something about the loo?

## VETEN (FROM GROTTLESANDEN)

Start from the turnaround at the end of Grotle. Turn right along the boathouse towards the mountain gate. Somewhat steep climb on a good path in the rocks until you reach 300 meters. In Grolsdalen, the trail flattens out for 700-800m before a new steeper climb of another 200 vertical meters. Then you are up on the plateau and have approx. 1.8 km to Veten. The Veten plateau is flat and rock-free. The last 700 m before Veten is a gentle uphill climb of 70 vertical meters. From the top you have a good view of the sea as well as north and south. The hike up takes about 2 hours and the entire hike is marked as a blue trail,

which means that it is suitable for beginners/intermediate hikers with basic skills. From Vetten, there is a wide range of hikes you can continue on the relatively flat plateau that covers much of Bremangerlandet.

## «FLØYNA» ON SMØRHAMNSØYA ISLAND

This lovely little trip is perfect for taking the little ones with you. Fløyna is located just behind/above Smørhamn Handelsstad. It is 100 metres up from sea level, but you can walk or cycle halfway up the cabin road marked FLØYNA. Furthermore, you can follow the road upwards wherever you like, but we recommend starting at the first bend, where it is signposted. From the top, you have an uninterrupted 360-degree view of Bremanger, Nesje, Kalvåg, Kvannahovden, Florø, Botnane, Guleefjorden and Vågane. Maybe you'll be lucky enough to see the sun set into the sea at Olderveggen, or rise again over Kjeipen on a fine morning. At the top you'll find a book in which you can write your name, and maybe you'll meet a "Einetroll" or more of the friendly kind.

## DOSABU

At Dosavarden 291 meters above sea level is the beautiful storm cabin Dosabu. The hike starts from Nesje and is 3 km long. You can also walk from Kalvåg, which is 6.5 km long. With sea views all the way, Dosabu is a lovely end point with impeccable views. The cabin is located on the edge of the rocky terrain on Frøya, west of Kalvåg with a panoramic view of the sea. (see more, page 13)

## STOREHOVDEN AT KALVÅG

The North Sea trail starts at Bontelabo beach. After an easy hike up to Flona, near the city center, you have a view of Frøyskjera - a nature conservation area with rich bird life. There is also an old cannon exhibition from the war. From there, the hike goes out to Storehovden, also often called "Torshovden", (from Norse; temple/sacrifice to the god Thor) which is a hammer-shaped rock hammer located out in the sea. Here there are opportunities for swimming and rod fishing. At the end of the North Sea trail there is a table where you can relax and enjoy the view.

## RISEVATNET

The tour starts at the toll road in Svingen on the R614 at Risevatnet. There is parking for 2-3 cars at the barrier, but you can park in the center and walk to the barrier. The construction road is a gravel road that is 5 km long. It runs in varied terrain along the edge of the river and up into the forest. The end of the road is at the tunnel entrance to the power plant. The road is widely used for walking, jogging and skiing. The trip can be done with sneakers. Water can be found along the way. We look out over Risevatn to the west and

Staven, Rikeloftet and Omnen to the south. Looking south from the tunnel junction, you can see the facial profile of the mountain massif called "Risevatnes voktar". The entire hike takes about 3 hours.

This hike is marked with a green trail, which means that it is suitable for beginners, requires no special skills and can be completed by everyone.

## SMALERABBEN

The trip to Smalerabben starts from the parking lot in Førde in Bremangerlandet. You'll find a parking space just inside the parking lot, from where you follow the signs for Nordsjøløypa on a prepared footpath until it flattens out on the hill. Then turn left and follow the trail marked in blue to the northwest until you reach Raudskarvatnet lake. There the path turns in a more eastern direction. Further east, follow the edge with a view towards Dalsbotnen. After 1 km along the edge, you reach the top. At its narrowest, Smalerabben is only 1 m wide with 500 steep vertical meters down to the north and a 250 m drop on the other side. You can descend on a marked trail to Lågeide and take the road back to the parking lot. It takes about 1 hour and 45 minutes to get up (Information is taken from Bremanger Turboka).

## KEIPEN

R614/Sørdalsdammen-Keipen 14h, 270 - 1362 m above sea level.

The hike starts at the stairs that go up from Sørdalsbrua about 6 km from Svelgen. You can park in a large parking lot by the boathouse, Sørdalsvatn. From Sørdalsdammen there is a T-marked trail to the tree line and on to Keipen. 200 m south of the cabin at Knekkevatn, the trail goes up the steep hillside to the southwest, follows the valley over Storskredene and over Hjelmemyrane towards Søre Hjelmevatn. The route to Keipen is marked with T-scars. The marking goes on the south side of Søre Hjelmevatnet and on to Keipen. Be sure to follow the markings carefully on the slightly steep grassy slopes on the shelf in Øvre Vasskaret. From Keipen it is possible to hike to Plogen and Maritinden, for example, by heading slightly north of the vasskiljet in an easterly direction.

The ski tour to Keipen is often planned so that after Keipen you continue eastwards towards Plogen, and into Hylle 7. In Hylle 7 we have a steady run northwards and down to Førdedalen. In Førdedalen we can walk on a good forest road all the way down to the hamlet of Førde in Ålfoten. Water can be found along the way. From about 1000 meters above sea level and up, it can be difficult to find water due to rocks. The distinctive rock formations make this area very special. Keipen has given its name to the hiking team in Bremanger. Keipen is the highest mountain massif in the Svelgen area. The view from the top is fantastic in all directions.

The hike takes about 14 hours.

This hike is marked with black markings and is suitable for experienced mountain people, the hike requires good stamina and good hiking equipment as well as knowledge of maps and compasses.

## ÅLFOTBREEN

10B The route goes to the waterfall at Litje Åsgårvatn. Continue along the shelf until you round into the glacier, or follow solid rock west of the glacier towards the highest glacier ball. You can ski on the glacier most of the summer. You follow the mountain ridge west of the glacier and end up at a large cairn with a box and visitor's book about 500 meters west of the glacier ball (NB. Rope protection on the glacier). When it comes to the Ålfotbre area, useful information can be found on DNT Bergen's mountain sports pages on the internet. It may be useful to look at the route descriptions and drawings there.

The entire hike takes approx. 10 hours. This hike has black markings and is suitable for experienced mountaineers, the hike requires good stamina and good hiking equipment as well as knowledge of maps and compasses.

## GJEGNEN/BLÅNIBBA

Starting point: Parking lot - Yksenelvane Power Station, Ålfoten. 12 h, 2-1670 m above sea level. For experts.

This is a long, spectacular hike that takes you into Arctic climate conditions, where the weather can change quickly. Therefore, prepare yourself well.

Follow the steep construction road (blocked by barriers) that winds upwards. To save time, you can use a bicycle as the construction road flattens out after the ascent. After about 6 km on the construction road, you reach a T-marked path in the terrain upwards. It is about 11 km from the construction road to the top. You can see Gjegnen most of the way. After a long climb, you meet the Gjegalundsreen glacier. You have to cross the glacier for over 1 km to reach the top. Although the glacier is flat and easy to walk on, you will need a rope. There are no markings across the glacier, but you will see a cairn on the other side that you can follow. The spectacular point on Gjegnen is not the summit itself, but the gallery just beyond, where you can see 1070 m straight down in free fall.

Gjegnen is the 5th highest mountain in Norway measured in primary factor. This means that this is hardly the only place elsewhere in Norway where you have a view of a larger area. Here you can see everything from Jotunheimen with Josterdalsbreen to the Sunnmøre Alps and out into Havgapet.

## TENTING

Coastal areas in Bremanger are mainly private grounds. In this context, the tourist information encourages tourists to visit our offices in Svelgen or Kalvåg for more thorough information about where to pitch a tent and about trips that are fine with overnight stays in tents. You are free to pitch a tent in the wilderness as long as you stay out of cultivated land and at least 150m from any houses. If you are closer, you must have permission from the owner.

Bremanger Camping and Davik Fjordparadis offer tent sites.

In Kalvåg, it is possible to camp at the Botnelabo beach. There is space for a maximum of 2-3 small tents.

Vetvika is perfect for camping directly on the sandy beach.
