Editorial

The Threatened Plant Project (TPP) has prompted Kath and I to check as many Anacamptis morio (Green-winged Orchid) sites in Carmarthenshire as we can get to during the season, not just the three sites selected by the BSBI. We started at our most prolific site, Pembrey Burrows, where, in most years, thousands of plants are normally to be found from mid April until the end of May. We thought that the warm March would herald an early season but our first sortie on April Fools' Day only produced one plant in bud. We put it down to the dry weather, but then April came when it seemed never to stop raining! We ventured out again on 22nd April and counted about fifteen plants on the area of dunes visited previously and a similar number on the edges of the nearby football field, also originally dune grassland. Now in the latter half of May, the rain has eased but temperatures seem to have reverted to winter values and it is only now that reasonable numbers of the orchid are appearing.

We have also visited a house in Burry Port from where Philip Jones, the county mycological recorder, had reported fourteen flowering *A. morio* plants growing on the front lawn. These are proudly protected by the owner who religiously cuts the grass around them, presumably with scissors! (See front cover). All fourteen in this population are very dark coloured in contrast to the usual medium-purple of the majority of the Pembrey Burrows plants where there are also a few pink and one-or-two white individuals.

What a contrast to the situation at the cemetery in North Road, Whitland! Here, in 1989, 150 flowering *A. morio* plants together

with abundant Orchis mascula (Early-purple Orchid) were recorded by John Steer in an area of the unimproved neutral grassland peripheral to the graves. At the time the mowers respected the orchids by refraining from cutting the grass until the orchids had flowered. Several years later when checking the site. I was horrified to discover that the area was being mown much earlier. The man with the mower was adamant that he mowed around all the orchids but, of course, he was mowing most of them off before they had had a chance to show themselves. By 2004, a total of just nine small, part cut A. morio were in flower, the site having previously been mown. This year's check by Kath and I confirmed that mowing seems to be commencing even earlier with no sign of any A. morio plants after an hour's search although Kath did come across three tiny mangled spotted-leaved rosettes of O. mascula. One wonders how the chapel authorities reconcile their beliefs with this unnecessary destruction - after all, they are all God's creations......! (See image 10, page 62).

The situation is similar on many of our roadside verges where fortnightly mowing has exterminated all the Dactylorchids (*Dactylorhizas*) and *Anacamptis pyramidalis* (Pyramidal Orchid), but I'd better not start on that hobby-horse!

On a more encouraging note, yesterday we counted twenty flowering plants of *Silene gallica* (Small-flowered Catchfly) at its Burry Port Harbour site, despite an apparent apathy shown towards its management by the local authority, and where we thought they had exterminated it more than once in the

past few years. However, it appears that they have managed to destroy the nearby *Malva neglecta* (Dwarf Mallow) site for this year at least. Both are the only places where these species are known to grow in the county.

So, I encourage you all to brave the inclement weather and monitor at least the selected TPP sites and, if possible, visit other sites of TPP species in your county.

Remember that your County Recorder will always welcome help from you and will be more than happy to receive your records.

I hope to see you at some of this year's field excursions (listed on page 11) and especially look forward to the Llangollen AGM and Exhibition Meeting on $20^{th} - 22^{nd}$ June.

It is with great sadness that I have to report the death in March of Dafydd Davies of Rhandirmwyn (see image 2, inside front cover) where, for many years, he was the village's schoolmaster. He had a deep interest in natural history and I'm sure his enthusiasm must have sparked a similar interest in many of his pupils.

He first joined the BSBI in 1963 and over the years provided many detailed botanical records from the north-east Carmarthenshire and was probably the last botanist to see Juniperus communis (Common Juniper) growing wild in the county. He was very involved Carmarthenshire's natural history in the 1960s to 1980s and was active at a time which enabled him to meet some of the naturalists from an earlier generation such as John Brunker. He was always a really nice gentleman, who had a wide breadth of knowledge of local natural history and was always happy to provide details of his records in conversation.

Latterly, he became very occupied in the running of Cymdeithas Edward Llwyd which became upper-most in his natural history life in addition to promoting the Society's cultural and social aspects. He periodically reported to me the counts of *Hammarbya paludosa* (Bog Orchid) made by members of Cymdeithas who regularly visited its only Carmarthenshire site. Ian remembers very enjoyable days out with him on Mynydd Mallaen as well as at Pembrey Forest and Burrows and I last had the pleasure of his company in August 2005 when he led a

Wildlife Trust walk to the Nantymwyn Leadmine (see image 3 below). On this occasion, in his usual energetic fashion, he made a cracking pace until we arrived at the places he wanted to show the party, which included not only botanical treasures but also geological, ornithological and entomological features of interest.

He was truly a naturalist of the old-school having an interest and deep knowledge in all aspects of the subject! He will be sorely missed.

The 49th AGM of the BSBI in Wales, held at Dale Fort Field Studies Centre, Pembrokeshire on Saturday 13th August 2011.

1. Welcome

The Chairman, Delyth Williams welcomed everyone to Dale Fort. There were 38 people present including Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

2. Apologies for Absence

3. Minutes of 2010 AGM

Minutes of the 48th Annual General Meeting held at Hotel Cymyran, Valley, Anglesey on Saturday 12th June 2010 were approved as printed in Welsh Bulletin No.88.

4. Matters Arising

Trevor Evans asked why emphasis was placed on those not attending by listing apologies but no list of those present was made. Therefore Richard Pryce circulated a list for those present to sign.

5. Chairman's Statement

An Unusual Form of Viola odorata from Denbighshire

I came across this plant while inspecting a bridge at SJ 0386.7491 in early March 2012. It is striking because 'peach' is an unexpected colour break to find in a wild violet for this is most definitely a peach colour, and not a yellow (see image 1, inside front cover). It is even more surprising to find out that the characters of the plant correspond to Viola odorata (Sweet Violet). Native, but also a popular garden plant occurring in colours ranging from the typical mauve through to white. To get a colour break that is not a derivative of the typical range is extremely unusual in any flower and the ultimate prize of the plant breeder. Was this such a plant? It called for further research

I have been ably assisted in this, first by Mr. Mike Hardman, the BSBI referee for violets. who informed me that a form of V. odorata known as 'sulphurea' was available in the trade, and has been known for over 100 years. It was apparently, 'discovered by a postman on the edge of a wood in Indre, France around 1896. Typically, the horticultural nomenclature is complex and confused, with several different descriptions and spellings that all possibly relate to the same plant. It does appear that it is reliably true from seed, however, and at least one popular seed house supplies seeds of plants under this name, and which fit the description (although it is erroneously described as being yellow in colour, despite an accurate photograph that certainly looks peach to me). Plants of V. odorata var. 'sulphurea' are also available from the violet specialist Groves Nurseries, in Bridport, Dorset, so I contacted them for a second opinion. Mr. Clive Groves offers it as a species in its own right, called V. sulphurea.

There are arguments for and against this

view. The spur is purple in V. sulphurea, indicating that it is possible to derive peach from purple after all. On the other hand, the peach-coloured flower is odourless (or described by some as being foetid rather than sweet), and if a combination of scent and colour in a flower is tailored to attract a specific pollinator, then this one is clearly getting it wrong. This may account for its reliability from seed: it is not attracting the same pollinators. Equally though, violets are often cleistogamous, with the flowers pollinating while still in bud, so in this case a pollinator may not be that important. Whatever the case, the method of seed dispersal is the same: on inspection under the microscope, there are elaiosomes (oil bodies) on the seeds, and consequently they look like miniature wine jugs. These oil glands are attractive to ants, and they are the agents for the spread of the plant (myrmecochory).

Mr. Groves gives accounts of 'several people that have just found an odd plant in their garden'. One would not expect such random occurrence from ant vectors, and there are no records of it in the wild in Britain – at least none of which anyone was aware.

On balance, *V. odorata* var. 'sulphurea' seems a safe bet, and although its spontaneous appearance on the edge of a leafy lane to a bridge over the A55 is no less implausible than the original setting (less romantic, I'll admit) it is much more likely to be a garden escape. It is now restored to captivity: the small cutting I collected for examination has been planted in my own garden, where it appears to have retained the rampant vigour of the parent species (and which may be cause for regret later). Fellow botanists may note that the original plant is still where it was found.

Carmel Woods National Nature Reserve, Carmarthenshire (v.c.44), 21st May 2011

Carmel Woods NNR is a remarkable mixture of limestone grassland, ancient woodland and rock outcrops (including several old and recently disused quarries) and the only seasonal lake or turlough in Britain. The complex boundaries between these habitats reflect past human use and it was necessary to have a guide, Jamie Bevan, the Countryside Council for Wales's Warden, to help interpret this history – and prevent us from getting lost.

As ancient woodland, Carmel Woods has remarkably few old trees (a single patch of Ouercus robur (Pedunculate Oak)) and a canopy of predominantly young Fraxinus exelsior (Ash) and Acer pseudoplatanus (Sycamore) with a rich understorey of *Ilex* Corylus (Holly), aquifolium (Hazel), Crataegus monogyna (Hawthorn), Cornus sanguine (Dogwood), Euonymus europaeus (Spindle) and Hedera hibernica (Atlantic Ivy). There is a surprising absence of Tilia cordata (Small-leaved Lime). The canopy age and composition reveals a history of recent clearance and regrowth (with invasive Sycamore), but also conceals the long periods of continuous tree cover.

This was to be found, however, in the abundance of ancient coppice stools, coinciding very well with the distribution of long-lived and relatively immobile woodland floor specialists like *Mercurialis perennis* (Dog's Mercury) *Sanicula europaea* (Sanicle) and *Galium odoratum* (Woodruff). These species were also found to be highly concentrated in very thin-soiled, rocky areas

with abundant Asplenium scolopendrium both Polystichum (Hart's-tongue) and aculeatum Shield-fern) and P(Hard setiferum (Soft Shield-fern), indicating areas that had gone a long time without grazing In thin-soiled, very rocky areas (somewhat resembling limestone pavement with tree cover) this woodland floor community hosted several very local specialties, including Moerhingia trinervia (Three-nerved Sandwort), Lathraea squamaria (Toothwort), Convallaria majalis (Lily-of-the-valley) and, especially, locally abundant Paris quadrifolia (Herb-Paris). Two new colonies of Paris totalling over 70 flowering plants, were discovered on this visit but these were judged to be more likely previous oversights than recent arrivals. At least two people became lost in this part of Carmel Woods, searching for *Paris* and other plants.

Steady rain set in after lunch (where we had tried and failed to discern characters in the locally abundant Geranium robertianum (Herb-Robert) that could support calling it 'subspecies celticum' - reported from this site) and we therefore proceeded quickly through alternating species-rich grassland and Ash-Hazel woods towards the site for the rarest plant of the meeting. This was in a particularly isolated rocky knoll with a more open canopy of naturally stunted trees (including one or two *Taxus baccata* (Yew)), seemingly less disturbed than some of the woodlands visited in the morning. woodland floor here also had a more open composition (with abundant Hyacinthoides non-scripta (Bluebell), Asplenium adiantumnigrum (Black Spleenwort) and Conopodium majus (Pignut)) and it was here, after careful searching, that Richard and Kath Pryce finally located two small bushes of Daphne mezereun (Mezereon). Neither had any fruits and, even with the possibility of a few other plants, this seems like a precariously small

population for such a short-lived species, here at one of the most isolated stations in its range.

101 Rare Plants of Wales: Progress and request for last few pictures

We are preparing a popular guide to rare Welsh plants, to raise their profile in the public eye. Each species is allocated a brief account of about 250 words, in which a description, its habitat, distribution and a brief 'story' are given in addition to information on threats and conservation. Although brief, each account must be understandable to the general public, our target audience. Care will be taken not to disclose sensitive locations in order to protect vulnerable populations.

The visual appeal of this book is vital. A draft example of what pages may look like showing the photographs which are to be used is shown in image 11, inside back cover. We have had a fantastic response to our appeal for digital photographs but a few more are still required.

If anybody has good quality digital photographs for the species listed below they would be greatly appreciated.

They do not necessarily need to be taken in Wales, a good image is more important. All sources will be acknowledged and a copy of 101 Rare Plants of Wales is offered in return for any photographs we use.

The next plant to go extinct in Wales? Bulbous Meadow-grass (*Poa bulbosa* L.)

Poa bulbosa was first found in Wales at The Knap (also referred to as Cold Knap or Bull Cliff), near Barry, Glamorgan, by H.J. Riddelsdell on 26 June 1906: "The locality is a pebbly shore, with mud among the pebbles. In considerable quantity and in company with large quantities of Trifolium striatum etc." (Riddelsdell 1907). In 1911 Riddelsdell noted "Much increased since first saw it here: it extends a good half mile" (Riddelsdell 1912; NMW), and it was recorded regularly thereafter. However, Julian Woodman only saw about 40 plants in 2010 in two tiny patches (see image 13, back cover), Rebecca East, Karen Wilkinson and I saw 38 very dried up plants in 2011, and Clive Lovatt and I only saw 5 flowering plants in 2012 though more vegetative plants were present.

It was also recorded at nearby Porthkerry on the shingle ridge at about ST088.667 in June 1956 by A.E. Wade and was last collected there on 25 April 1987 by J.P. Curtis and G.

Hutchinson (NMW). Julian Woodman last saw it 1999 and searches in 2011 and 2012 failed to find it. An A.E. Wade record from Aberthaw in 1956 is probably a transcription error for Porthkerry. So, although once clearly abundant, Poa bulbosa has declined markedly and must be 'Critically Endangered' in Wales although it is considered of IUCN threat status 'Least Concern' in Britain. Unusually the decline. caused by loss of habitat, can be graphically illustrated from the history of The Knap and old postcards (Thomas 2010).

Before the docks were developed at Barry, The Knap was farmland owned by Lord Romily. The pebble ridge between Cold Knap and Bull Cliff formed a barrier between the sea and the low lying marshy ground associated with the Cadoxton River, and it would have been in this habitat that Riddelsdell found it (see image 4 below left).

Barry Council acquired The Knap in the 1920s, and built a promenade on top of the eastern part of the ridge using public funds from the Unemployed Grants Committee (see image 5, page 15). The area behind the promenade was developed as gardens, a swimming pool and lake.

A letter from H.J. Riddelsdell to Eleanor Vachell on 6 August 1929 (NMW) suggests that steps were being taken to protect the grass. Major Edgar Jones of Barry County School for Boys reported Mr. Hinchliffe and the Chairman of the Parks Committee were taking an active interest and planned to grow the grass in one of the beds in the municipal gardens. Later, Vachell (1936) reported that "Bulbous Meadow-grass (Poa bulbosa) at Cold Knap, lately threatened by the erection of a promenade and artificial lake in its only known Welsh habitat was saved from destruction by the exemplary action of the Barry District Council, who gave it sanctuary in the public gardens behind the new sea wall". I have been unable to trace any further mention of this and could find no plants in the gardens in 2011.

A 1940 map shows a small extension of the paved road west along the ridge, presumably as a car park. The ridge to the west of the sunken garden was further developed as a car

park after the war (see images 6 & 7 above) and paved and extended to the west in more recent years, removing much of the remaining area of suitable habitat of shingle mixed with finer sediment.

Poa bulbosa is on the brink of extinction in Wales. There is now virtually no suitable habitat left as the shingle mixed with finer material has been built on and the remaining large pebbles at the top of the beach provide no substrate for it to grow in (though Centranthus ruber with its deeper rooting system is spreading). The only realistic conservation action left seems to be to take it back into cultivation, but not at the municipal gardens.

We would like to introduce ourselves as the joint new BSBI Recorders for v.c.35 Monmouthshire

We are taking over from Trevor Evans who has been the Vice-County BSBI Recorder for an impressive 40 years. He wants to devote more of his time to fieldwork and less to sitting at a computer. We owe Trevor a huge vote of thanks for all he has done as Recorder over the last two decades and he leaves a wonderful legacy in his excellent *Flora of Monmouthshire*, which shows us the status and distribution of all species found in the vice-county, and in the Rare Plants Register for Monmouthshire. Trevor is a difficult act to follow and having two new Joint Recorders shows what an enormous amount of work he did single-handed.

We hope very much to involve all BSBI members in Monmouthshire (or from further afield) in the new Atlas and in the Threatened Plants Project in 2012. Of the ten species listed for 2012, three are found in the vice-county. One *Anacamptis morio* (Greenwinged Orchid) is quite widespread in the east of the county and the second *Bupleurum*

tenuissimum (Slender Hare's-ear) occurs along the coast between Chepstow and Cardiff (see Trevor's Atlas). The third is Persicaria minor (Small Water-pepper) which was recently found at Penpergwm Pond. Another species Ranunculus arvensis (Corn Buttercup) used to occur in arable fields in Monmouthshire but there have been no records since 1977. Please look out for this species too – it may just turn up somewhere. By the time you read this the flowering season for Anacamptis morio will be over but if you know of any site for this orchid or for the other threatened species then do please let us know.

We would love to hear from any of you who could take on a tetrad or two for recording for the new Atlas.

It would be very helpful if you were able to let us have an email address so that we can contact you as we hope to arrange one or more field meetings later this year.

Dale Fort, Pembrokeshire (v.c.45): BSBI Wales AGM 12th-14th August 2011

More than 45 members were present over the three days of field excursions in the far west of Wales. The Flora of the Dale area had been described in great detail by Martin George in *Field Studies* in 1961 after he had been at the Field Studies Council's (FSC) Dale Fort and in 1987 Juliet Brodie, also once deputy warden at Dale Fort, updated his work in an unpublished manuscript.

It was especially pleasing to have Dr. Polly Spencer-Vellacott, the first BSBI Welsh Officer, at the AGM field excursions.

Friday, 12thAugust: Watwick Bay and Kete, Dale

After registering at the superbly sited FSC Dale Fort Field Centre, built in 1856. members split into two groups. The longer walk followed the coast path from Dale Fort to Watwick Bay. After examining many plants of Carex distans (Distant Sedge) growing in crevices of the middle parts of the Old Red Sandstone raised beach rock platform, C. punctata (Dotted Sedge) was eventually found at Watwick Bay in damp crevices in the uppermost reaches of the rock platform. It has been known on these cliffs since 1953 when Frank W. Adams collected a specimen for Kew. Dic David and Tommie Warren Davis re-found it in 1974. The distinctive pink flowered Rubus ulmifolius (a Bramble) was one of its associates and this readily identifiable bramble was also found alongside the coast path. Some large plants of Asplenium marinum (Sea Spleenwort) were also examined near the C. punctata.

Atriplex littoralis (Grass-leaved Orache) was growing on low rocks at the upper limits of Watwick beach. Arable weeds seen on the edge of barley stubble by the coast path on the return journey included Kickxia elatine (Sharp-leaved Fluellen), Lamium hybridum, (Cut-leaved Dead-nettle), Spergula arvensis (Corn Spurrey) and Stachys arvensis (Field Woundwort). A hybrid willow Salix x holosericea (Silky-leaved Osier) was determined by Graham Kaye and Arthur Chater

Jane Warr took another group to Kete car park where a small stand of *Chamaemelum nobile* (Chamomile) was examined. Amongst the highlights of the walk were the many beautifully sculpted plants of *Cytisus scoparius* ssp. *maritimus* (Prostrate Broom) on the nearby Old Red Sandstone cliff top. Roadside plants examined included a fine clump of *Geranium pratense* (Meadow Crane's-bill) growing with the bramble *Rubus ulmifolius* and *Senecio erucifolius* (Hoary Ragwort).

In the evening a few members looked at the South African *Lampranthus falciformis* (Sickle-leaved Dewplant) at the tip of Dale Point. It had been introduced here in about 1930 but it was not until 1974 that Tommie Warren Davis obtained a determination from Dr. J.P. Rourke of Kirstenbosch Garden, Cape Province, South Africa. There was also a patch of *Erigeron glaucus* (Seaside Daisy) on the cliff lip whilst on the face below was a well-established stand of *Atriplex portulacoides* (Sea-purslane). Although this

shrub is normally a plant of saline mud and sand, Pembrokeshire has 16 widely scattered populations flourishing on rocky sea-cliffs as well as large stands in estuarine habitats.

Saturday, 13thAugust: Pickleridge and the Gann Estuary and West Dale Bay, Dale

The main excursion of the day was a visit to the shingle spit, saline lagoon and lower reaches of the small Gann Estuary at Dale with the kind permission of the Dale Castle Estate. This rich complex of coastal habitats has long been a haunt of botanists and was one of the favourite field excursions for the first resident Pembrokeshire BSBI recorder. Tommie Warren Davis, who lived nearby and owned the east side of the estuary. Enroute to the estuary a tiny stand of Fagopyron dibotrys (Tall Buckwheat) was seen from the cars at the roadside verge location where it was first recorded in 1960 and correctly identified by Ted Lousley in 1975. Until Arthur Chater's discovery of a thriving colony at Aber-porth, Cardiganshire (v.c.46), in 2010 the Dale location was thought to be the only location in the British Isles where this Asian plant was naturalised (see Exhibit Article, Welsh Bulletin No.89. page 14). Carex divisa (Divided Sedge) was inspected by the old limekilns where it was found by Juliet Brodie of Dale Fort in 1982. It only has one other Pembrokeshire location on the island of Skokholm. Unfortunately at the time of this excursion there were no flowering plants as it had been cut by a highway verge maintenance machine. After careful search, flowering Trifolium ornithopodioides (Bird's-foot Clover) was eventually found on the edge of the car park. Much mutual amusement was caused as a family were cooking breakfast right next to the spot where some 40 botanists went down on their hands and knees to examine the clover's tiny creamy white flowers!

The shingle ridge, known as Pickleridge, that fronts a small tidal lagoon yielded Medicago arabica (Spotted Medick). Erodium moschatum (Musk Stork's-bill) and flowers and leaves of Lycium barbarum (Duke of Argyll's Teaplant) were examined. At its distal end several tiny recurved shingle spits were explored and a healthy flowering patch of Chamaemelum nobile (Chamomile) was admired along with many plants of Trifolium scabrum (Rough Clover). Members spent comparing the time Limonium binervosum (Rock Sea-lavender) and L. humile (Lax-flowered Sea-lavender) plants that grew in close proximity where the shingle gave way to upper salt marsh.

Stuart Devonald then showed members flowering Calystegia sepium subspecies roseata (Hedge Bindweed) on the upper edge of the saltings near where he had first found it in 1987. Lunch was taken alongside some fine stands of Elymus atherica (Sea Couch) growing at the base of the breached salt marsh embankment. Some awned specimens were examined and much effort was made to try and find the hybrid with E. repens (Common Couch). Arthur Chater later checked pollen from three different stands and all were found to be virtually fully fertile. It is still possible that the hybrid is present as it is with both parents on the Teifi Estuary, near Cardigan.

At the rear of the lagoon a wet unmade farm track marked the boundary between extreme upper salt marsh and freshwater seepages coming out of the toe of the adjacent bank of fluvio-glacial sands. The wettest ruts in the track had flowering patches of *Catabrosa aquatica* (Whorl-grass), which is a very rare grass in Pembrokeshire. Flowering *Apium graveolens* (Wild Celery) and *Berula erecta* (Lesser Water-parsnip) grew at the edges of the track along with *Ranunculus sceleratus*

(Celery-leaved Buttercup). Tall specimens of *Parapholis strigosa* (Hard-grass) were seen in flower and *Juncus ranarius* (Frog Rush) was present on the track with *J. bufonius* (Toad Rush). In addition *J. subnodulosus* (Blunt-flowered Rush) was growing in the small fen at the rear of the tidal lagoon.

In the evening Jane Warr led a small group to inspect the fine clump of fruiting *Crambe maritima* (Sea-kale) at West Dale Bay. It had first been found there by Jon Hudson in 2003. Jane also showed some members the Dale Castle Estate walled garden.

Sunday, 14th August: West Hook Farm and Marloes Sands, Marloes

In glorious sunny weather members gathered at the National Trust owned West Hook Farm at the tip of the Marloes peninsula. The farmer had kindly allowed access to the margins of his spring barley fields where there were fine stands of Silene gallica (Small-flowered Catchfly). It had first been found on the farm by Fiona Gomersall in 2009 whilst Tommie Warren Davis had noted it on the adjacent farm. East Hook 1958. Misopates Farm. in orontium (Weasel's-snout) was also in flower. The highlight, apart from the stunning views out over the bright blue waters of St. Brides Bay, was a stand of 1,000's of flowering S. gallica in 20 x 7 paces of a gateway between two arable fields. S. gallica is still scattered in the coastal arable fields of Pembrokeshire. It has been found in 14 one km. squares since 2000. Lunch was held overlooking Marloes Sands, Gateholm and Skokholm islands. After lunch

members made a rapid march along the sands to inspect Rumex rupestris (Shore Dock) which is only accessible at low tide. It had first been found here at the south-east end of Marloes Sands in 2000 by Stephen and Ann Evans during a Plantlife survey of all suitable locations in Pembrokeshire. It had previously been known from the beach at Lydstep Haven in south Pembrokeshire between 1957 and 1970. Members were able to examine its distinctive fruits and to discuss its very exacting habitat requirements. It was located at extreme high water where it is rooted into sandy shingle that is irrigated by freshwater seeping out of the toe of the unstable 50m. sea-cliff. The larger colony, perhaps the parent colony, on a wet cliff face at the opposite end of the beach, is in a location that would be unsafe for a visiting group.

A detour on the return journey allowed members to see more *Chamaemelum nobile* (Chamomile), this time in the Horse Neck Field of Trehill, another National Trust farm. This stand had first been found by Stephen Evans in 1995 in short coastal grassland that was reverting from arable. There were also many scattered patches of flowering *Lotus subbiflorus* (Hairy Bird's–foot-trefoil) which had first been discovered in this field in 1995 by Alan Hale. It was the final "notable" plant examined by members before they returned to their cars for the long homeward journeys.

WELSH PLANT RECORDS – 2011

Welsh Plant Records are compiled by Gwynn Ellis, 41 Marlborough Road, Roath, Cardiff, CF23 5BU, from reports of BSBI vice-county Recorders to whom records should preferably be sent. Plants are listed for each vice-county in the order of D.H. Kent's *List of Vascular Plants of the British Isles* (1992) and *Supplements 1, 2 & 3* (1996 & 2000) the number in those lists preceding the name so that names changed since 1996 can be given without giving the former name. Latin names follow the 3rd edition of C.A. Stace's *New Flora of the British Isles* (2010) or, if not in that Flora, E.J. Clement & M.C. Foster's *Alien Plants of the British Isles* (1994). T.B. Ryves, E.J. Clement & M.C. Foster's *Alien Grasses of the British Isles* (1996) or Sell & Murrell's *Flora of Great Britain and Ireland* (1996-2009). Authorities for Latin names are not given unless the name is not in any of these works. English names are those in Stace (2010) or *English Names of Wild Flowers* ed. 2 (1986) by Dony *et al*, or, if not in either of those, Clement & Foster (1994), Ryves, Clement & Foster (1996) or Sell & Murrell (1996-2009). English names enclosed by square brackets do not occur in any of these books but have been used elsewhere. Welsh names are those in *Planhigion Blodeuol, Conwydd a Rhedyn*, published by Cymdeithas Edward Llwyd (2003).

The following symbols are used:

- * to indicate a new v.c. record; ⊗ to indicate an updated VCCC record.
- + to indicate a new hectad record; \oplus to indicate an updated hectad record; \ominus to indicate a new tetrad record
- † indicates archaeophyte; ‡ indicates neophyte; © indicates casual.
- †‡© before the species number: to indicate that the species is regarded as an archaeophyte, neophyte or casual at least somewhere in the British Isles.
- †‡© before the record: to indicate a species which although a native, archaeophyte or neophyte at least somewhere in the British Isles, is not so in the locality recorded.
 - [] to indicate that the record, previously published in error, should be deleted.
- ¤ to indicate an update to a rare or scarce taxon.
- Ø to indicate that the taxon is now believed to be extinct in the locality cited.
- N, S, E, W indicate points of the compass.

In general, only records which update the *Vice-county Census Catalogue* [VCCC] (2003) or the *New Atlas of the British & Irish Flora* (2002) will be listed. Other records are included at the discretion of the vice-county recorder. The minimum grid reference is to a hectad but, if supplied by the recorder, references to a 1km or even a 100m square may be included. A letter in parentheses following a grid reference indicates a tetrad.
