Henneberger wins Robot Individual



Martin Henneberger of Coquitlam BC won the Summer NABC Robot Individual with a score of 68.62%. Henneberger had been in second place after the first two days by about 4 percentage points behind Fred Pollack, but

Henneberger's day three score of 67.52% put him over when Pollack could muster only 55.75%. Pollack of Laval QC finished second with 67.31%.



Sheng Li of New York won Flight B with 64.52%, just 0.06% ahead of Day 2 leader John Mayne of Modesto CA. Li had been second after two days. They finished seventh and eighth overall. Originally

from China, Li does freelance work in finance. "Robot bridge is a great way to keep in shape for 'real' bridge when I do not have a partner or time," he says.

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GNTs play QF round today

All four flights of the Grand National Teams will play their quarterfinal matches today.

In the Championship Flight, the local team led by Sheri Winestock (District 17) will battle the Texas-based team captained by Ira Hessel (D16). Pat McDevitt's New England squad (D25) will battle the Los Angeles team led by John Jones (D23). Warren Spector and company (Florida, D9) faces the NYC team (D24) captained by Joe Grue, and Jim Munday's Midsouth team (D10) will square off against the Southern California team (D22) led by Shailesh Gupta.

Although Winestock and Spector cruised in yesterday's Round of 16, winning their matches in just three quarters of play, there were several come-from behind wins for other quarterfinalists. Grue survived against D7's B. Wayne Stuart, advancing 119-115. Gupta got past Cam Doner's squad (D19) to win 145-142. Hessel also came from behind in their match against D21's Mark Ralph, winning 107-96.

Players who reside outside North America and who do not meet this criteria, but feel they are otherwise eligible to participate, must receive a waiver prior to the commencement of the contest.

For waiver information, please see the Director-in-Charge at the selling site at least one hour prior to the commencement of the event. Please note that players who have been waived into previous Life Master pairs do not have to reapply.

Hall of Fame inducts five players

At last night's induction ceremony for the ACBL Hall of Fame, five players became members of the Hall's Class of 2019. Peter Boyd, Bart Bramley and Judi Radin were chosen directly by the Hall of Fame electors for the Open category, while Patty Tucker received the Blackwood Award for her contributions to the game, and the late Michael Seamon received the von Zedtwitz Award in recognition of his bridge accomplishments. Additionally, Curtis Cheek received the Sidney H. Lazard Jr. Sportsmanship Award.

The event was emceed by David Berkowitz. The ceremony began with Marc Jacobus presenting Cheek for the sportsmanship honor.

"I met Curtis 30 years ago. He's a great opponent and a great person. He always introduced himself at the table, and he always smiled, but when play started, he was a killer. Curtis is what bridge is about."

Jacobus is also Cheek's father-in-law, a point that Cheek spoke about in his acceptance speech.

"My bridge family and my 'real' family are connected. I'm the luckiest guy in the world."

Cheek – a six-time NABC champion – spoke about a formative experience when he was very young that affected the way he thinks about table demeanor.

"I've played bridge 44 years. My dad taught me. But after playing just a little bit, I became somewhat arrogant about my skill and said something to me father at the table that was hurtful, and he never played again. I learned that calling myself a genius but describing my partner as stupid is wrong. And it's bad for the game."

Tucker, an NABC champion and a former Honorary Member of the Year – was presented by bridge partner and life partner Kevin Collins.

"Patty is a serial volunteer. She's worked with the American Bridge Teachers Association, Atlanta Youth Bridge, the Foundation for the Preservation and Advancement of Bridge, and many other groups. She's also an innovator, always looking to bring players into the game. Learn Bridge in a Day and Bridge in a Box were here ideas.

"When people ask, 'Where are the young players?' Patty is the one who did something about it, creating the Youth NABC, now in its 12th year. Patty has given lot of her time."

Tucker said, "It's not a solitary accomplishment. I've been helped by my unit, my district, by clubs in my area, by the ACBL. It really does take a village. There are many, many people who helped me over the year, not just my bridge family, but my personal family, who sacrificed, too. My parents told me that you can do anything or be anything depending on how

Take All Your Chances By Eddie Kantar

North (Dummy)

- **♠** A 10 7 6
- **♥** K 3 2
- ◆A62
- **♣** J 6 3

South (You)

♦ 3

West opens $2 \blacklozenge$, weak, partner passes, East bids $3 \blacklozenge$, you join in with $3 \spadesuit$, and partner is happy to boost you to $4 \spadesuit$. West leads the $\blacklozenge Q$. Plan the play.

After stripping diamonds and drawing trumps, you could take three finesses, and if just one of them worked (a rousing 87%), you would make your game. Those three finesses are leading up the ♣K, and if that loses, leading up to the ♣J, and if that loses, taking the heart finesse. Could you be so unlucky that all three finesses would lose?


You deserve to go down if you took the "three finesse line" when there is a 100% line available. After stripping diamonds and drawing trumps, play the ♥A, the ♥K and the ♥J. Whoever wins has to break clubs or give you a ruff and sluff. The most you can lose is two club tricks and a heart no matter how the clubs or heart honors are divided.

Notice that you have two equally divided side suits, clubs and hearts. It is more important to throw them in with a heart to force a club play than vice versa. Forcing a club play means you can't possibly lose more than two clubs and one heart. If you throw them in with a club to force a heart return, you could lose three clubs and a heart. (East wins the third club and West has the \P Q).

These are the throw-in steps:

(1)
Draw trumps leaving trumps in both hands.

(2) Coordinate the drawing of trumps with stripping a side suit (diamonds) if necessary.



- (3) Throw them in with an equal length side suit (hearts), at the same time stripping that suit from both your hand and dummy.
- (4) Sit back and wait for them to lead your "touchy" suit (clubs) or give you a ruff and sluff. The full deal:

Tip No. 1: With touchy side suits (there are oodles), the idea is to force the opponents to lead the suit first.

Tip No. 2: If your only losers are in a touchy suit, strip the hand, if possible, before attacking the suit. Good things can happen. Very good things. Wonderful things.

Entry fees

A valid ACBL player number is required to play in all events at the NABC.

Players must be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in

order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Grand National Teams (Championship Flight), von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, Spingold Knockout Teams, Wagar Women's Pairs, Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, Wernher Open Pairs, Freeman Mixed Board-A-Match Teams and the Roth Open Swiss Teams. The entry fees for these contests are \$30 per player per session. For team events, this means \$120 per team per session for four-person teams, \$150 per team per session for five-person teams, and \$180 per team per session for six-person teams. When screens are in use, there is an additional fee of \$10 per pair or \$20 per team per session.

Note: Only ACBL members are eligible to play in NABC+ events. \$1.50 per person per session benefits the International Fund.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Grand National Teams (Flights A, B & C), the 0–6000 and 0–2500 Mini-Spingold Knockouts, the 0–10,000 NABC Pairs, the 0–10,000 Mixed Swiss Teams, the Bruce LM–6000 Pairs, the Young 0–2500 Pairs and the Bean Red Ribbon Pairs. The entry fee is \$22 per player per session. For the team events, this means \$88 per team per session for teams of four, \$110 per team per session for teams of five, and \$132 per team per session for teams of six. (The GNT Flights A, B & C have no fee the first two days of the contest.) When screens are in use, there is an additional fee of \$10 per pair or \$20 per team per

session.

Regional events are \$20 per player per session for ACBL members, and \$24 for lapsed members. For multi-session team events of three sessions or more, the entry fee is \$80, \$100 or \$120 for teams of four, five or six, respectively. For team events of one or two sessions, the entry fee is \$80 per session.

Events with a masterpoint limit of 300 or lower are \$15 per player per session for ACBL members, \$19 for lapsed members.

Bridge Bucks and check cashing

Bridge Bucks and check-cashing services will be available in the Gracia Ballroom on the third floor from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Check-cashing limit is \$500.

Players may purchase Bridge Bucks using all major credit cards.

Don't wait in line! Buy your entries in advance for all national-level events at BridgeWinners.com.

Entries must be purchased by 10 a.m. the day of the event EXCEPT for events that require preregistration, in which case the ACBL deadline, or the earlier of the two, applies.

A nice feature: You can buy entries in advance and be charged for the total number of sessions played after the event is over.

"Bridge will exist

"Bridge will exist forever, but what I want is for bridge to thrive and grow."

Justin Lall presented 16-time NABC champion Seamon for the von Zedtwitz Award.

"Michael was a good friend and partner. He was so good even Jimmy Cayne couldn't fire him!" Lall quipped.

"The first time we played in a knockout match, Michael told me to never take my foot off the gas because you never know what's happening at the other table. He made his teammates feel empowered and liberated to play their best. He wasn't interested in winning postmortems but rather in getting his teammates to play their best.

"It's amazing how natural and easy card play was to him; but he always wanted to win the right way. It was an honor and a privilege to play with him."

play with him."
Michael's

sister, Janice Seamon-Molson, said that she and Michael grew up in a bridge-playing family: the extended Seamon family is one of the great bridge dynasties. Their parents played at all the nationals. One of her earliest memories was falling asleep on a couch at midnight in the lobby of the Americana Hotel in Miami; her parents were still discussing hands from the evening session with friends. But when Michael started taking an interest in the game, Janice did, too, "in self-defense."

"Michael became more and more brilliant at the game. As we got older, we played together rarely, but I once asked him to play in a national mixed pairs with me. He said no at first, but I kept at him, so he said that we could play, but that if our score after the first session wasn't above average, we would withdraw. I agreed. So we played and had a nice set: a 69%. Michael, however, insisted that we withdraw. When I objected – we were well above average – he said that average for us was 72%! And we withdrew."

Boyd was presented by longtime partner Steve Robinson.

"We started playing in 1980. At that time, I was six feet tall and had a full head of hair," joked the diminutive, balding Robinson, who went on to tell many stories of the partnerships successes and failures over the years.

"But Peter is a highly intelligent, fully educated man, and it has been my pleasure to play with him for the past 39 years."

Although Boyd is a 17-time NABC champion and former world champion, he opened his remarks by praising his wife, Ellen Klosson, who he met through bridge. The duo plays together infrequently, but the relationship has a place of primacy in Boyd's life.

"Bridge is my social world, and it gives me a great sense of accomplishment. My day job exists merely to support my bridge habit." Boyd thanked Robinson for choosing to play with him four decades ago, and he noted that Robinson was right when he says that bridge is a game, and that everyone should have fun.

Seventeen-time NABC champion Bramley was presented by Bob Hamman. Hamman said that Bramley's record speaks for itself. "Bart's an excellent player, and this honor is long overdue."

Bart's brother, Richard Bramley, was a copresenter, and he regaled the audience of tales from their childhood.

"I realized early on that I wasn't going to be as smart as Bart. He got the brains, but I got the looks," Richard joked. He wrapped up his remarks by saying, "I'm very proud of my big brother."

Bart began his remarks by discussing his parents.

"I got interested in bridge by watching my dad play with three other men when I was 5. I was hooked by the time I was 10, the year my father died. My mother was a reluctant participant early on, but got addicted in retirement.

In college, Bramley joined the ACBL in 1965 while attending MIT in Cambridge MA.

"It was the last generation saturated with bridge players," he said, reeling off a list of players from his college years, before pointing out one in particular: Ken Lebensold, who was in attendance last evening.

"Ken was a fully formed player even at 22, but he happily shared his knowledge. His influence on us at MIT was profound."

As Bramley advanced as a player, he played with many of the game's greats. Early on, he met Vic Mitchell (also a Hall of Famer) who, in turn, introduced Bramley to other top players.

"Vic started me in pro bridge. Later, I partnered Lou Bluhm, the first truly great player I ever played with. I also partnered Hugh Ross, John Sutherlin, and Sidney Lazard. Sidney was the greatest man I've ever known; he was magnificent in every respect."

Among Bramley's partners who are still alive today, he mentioned several including Ross Grabel, with whom he won his first NABC title in 1980, Bob Hamman, a great friend and also his boss for 16 years, and Kit Woolsey "who's never boring."

Finally, Bramley thanked his wife, Judy.
"I couldn't have done any of this without her. She's been with me for all of my greatest achievements in bridge and life. Judy has always been my biggest fan."

Four-time world champions and 16-time NABC winner Radin was co-presented by longtime friend and partner Valerie Westheimer and by her husband, Michael Radin. Both praised Judi for her role as a top player – not just a top female player.

"Judi is a pioneer in women's bridge and in getting respect for women in the game," said Michael.

Judi spent much of her acceptance speech detailing the many great relationships she's had in the game, starting with ex-husband John Solodar.

"John was my first boyfriend. He brought me to New York, got me students to play with so that I could pay for my education, and introduced me to several important people, such as Kathie Wei-Sender.

Her teammates at the women's world championships included the greats of the game such as Gail Greenberg, Jacqui Mitchell, Carol Sanders, Betty Ann Kennedy, Lynn Deas and Beth Palmer.

"I've been very lucky playing with great clients and friends over the years. I've dreamed about being in the Hall of Fame for many years, but I thought it was never going to come. Tonight, you completed all my bridge dreams."



Life Master Pairs begins today

The von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs is a six-session event with two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions. It is restricted to Life Masters. At stake is the von Zedtwitz Gold Cup. In 1930.



Waldemar von

Zedtwitz donated the Gold Cup, which was presented to the winners of the Life Master Pairs. The first winners: von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims.

Waldemar von Zedtwitz (1896–1984), ACBL president emeritus, was president of the ACBL in 1948 and of its parent organization, the American Bridge League, in 1932. He was named Honorary Member by the ABL in 1931.

When dissension threatened to break up the ACBL in 1948, the contesting factions agreed to von Zedtwitz as president and chairman with carte blanche power. He is credited with saving the ACBL. In 1949, upon the League's rehabilitation, he immediately returned his carte blanche power to the Board of Directors.

He helped found the World Bridge Federation and played a major role in the formation of the ACBL Charity Foundation.

As a player, von Zedtwitz was noted for his versatility in playing with exponents of different systems. He was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master (he was No. 4) when the category was created in 1936.

Von Zedtwitz won many national auction bridge championships and nearly all the contract bridge championships. He and Barbara Brier won the World Mixed Pairs in 1970 when von Zedtwitz was 74 and legally blind.



Mini-Life Master Pairs Begin Today

2018 Young 0–2500 Life Master Pairs winners Eric Gettleman and Paul Holmes.

The David Bruce LM-6000 Pairs is open to players who have earned Life Master status and have won up to 6000 masterpoints. The upper limit changed in 2017; it was previously 5000.



Young 0-2500 Pairs is open to players who have won up to 2500 masterpoints. Before 2017 the limit for this event was 1500 masterpoints.

The events are named in honor of two of ACBL's all-time great players, both members of the ACBL Hall of Fame.

David Bruce (1900–1965) was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master; in fact, he was #1. A tremendously successful player in the early '30s, he was known as a soothing partner but an unsettling opponent. Bruce played with Oswald Jacoby and Howard Schenken on the first of the outstanding teams, the Four Horsemen, captained by P. Hal Sims.

In 1933 with Schenken, Jacoby and Dick Frey (joined shortly afterward by Michael Gottlieb), he organized the Four Aces. This team took the leadership in competition and held it for the next

Sally Young (1906–1970) was Life Master #17 and the first woman to earn the rank. Young earned success in open and women's events. She is the only woman to "threepeat" in the Reisinger. Young



and teammates John Crawford, Charles Goren and Charles Solomon won in 1937 and 1938. They added B. Jay Becker to the squad in 1939 and won again.

Young also won the Reisinger in 1947 with

teammates Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes. They remain the only all-women's team to win a major open team event.



Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. The convention card must include the first and last name of each member of the partnership, and the cards must be identical.


If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

The Grand National Teams is a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating.

In 1985, the event was subdivided into three separate events: Flights A, B and C. Another change came in 2001 when the GNT Championship Flight (for players with more than 5000 masterpoints) was created. Effective 2014, Flight A changed from being capped at 5000 masterpoints to having an upper limit of 6000.

The winners of the Championship Flight are honored by the Morehead Trophy, donated by The New York Times in memory of its longtime bridge editor, Albert H. Morehead. The winners of Flight A are honored by the Goldman Trophy, named in honor of the late Bobby Goldman.

Albert H. Morehead

Morehead (1909–1966) was born in Flintstone GA and educated at Baylor and Harvard. Ely Culbertson hired him in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst and made him technical editor



of The Bridge World in 1933.

He proved so invaluable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of The New York Times with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the Times late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.


He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the International Laws of Contract Bridge. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation — the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

Bobby Goldman

Bobby Goldman (1938–1999), who became a member of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility, enjoyed a stellar career as a player, author and theorist. His tournament



record is impressive. He earned four world titles (the Bermuda Bowl in 1970, 1971 and 1979 and the World Mixed Teams in 1972) and 19 North

American championships: the Life Master Men's Pairs (1964); the Life Master Pairs (1968); the Open BAM Teams (1993); the Men's Teams (1968, 1989 and 1991); the Spingold Knockout Teams (1969, 1978, 1983, 1986 and 1988); the Reisinger BAM Teams (1970, 1976 and 1980); the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams (1971, 1973, 1978, 1997 and 1998). Goldman also had 13 second-place finishes in NABC events.

At the time of his induction into the Hall of Fame, Goldman was an ACBL Grand Life Master with more than 25,700 masterpoints, and ranked ninth on the all-time list of masterpoint holders. He was also a WBF World Grand Master.

Goldman authored several books on the game, including Aces Scientific and Winners and Losers at the Bridge Table. His contributions to bidding theory include Super Gerber, Exclusion Blackwood and Goldman after Stayman. He was one of the principal architects of the Aces Scientific System.

Goldman served as ACBL recorder from 1986–1988 and was a longtime member of the Competitions and Conventions Committee. His views on the game helped shape the modern-day Alert procedure, the ACBL convention chart, ethics and the appeals process.

Goldman was honored by the ACBL by being named the 1999 Honorary Member, presented for long and meritorious service to bridge.

Goldman's early career was distinguished by his association with the now-famous Aces, the professional, Texas-based team created by businessman Ira Corn for the purpose of winning world bridge championships. Goldman was a member of the successful squad until 1974.





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Appealing a ruling

Players in NABC+ events who want to appeal a director's ruling initiate the process by speaking with the director who delivered the original ruling. The table director will fill out paperwork regarding the appeal, and the appellants will explain what they believe to be wrong with the initial ruling. From there, the case may be handled by a variety of means. When the appeals reviewer receives the case, the circumstances of that particular case will determine whether the case can be resolved by the original staff (in the case of misapplication of Law or regulation, for instance), a panel of directors, or even a committee-type hearing

Use of the bidding box – Alerts and Announcements

which could include bridge

experts.

When using bidding boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.


Qualifications for teams participating in the Grand National Teams Flights B and C were earned in local-level events earlier this year. Flight B is 0–2500 masterpoints and Flight C is non-Life Masters up to 500 masterpoints.

Flight B winners are honored by the Sheinwold Trophy while the names of Flight C winners are honored by the Mac Nab Trophy.

Alfred Sheinwold

Alfred Sheinwold (1912–1997) was one of the greatest bridge writers in the history of the game. He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

His syndicated bridge column was considered by



many to be the best. He had a knack for getting his point across to even the least experienced players. He managed this by making sure that every column had only one main point, marking it easier for his readers to focus.


"You could read a Sheinwold column and know in an instant that nobody else could have written it," said Frank Stewart, co-author of the column. "He enlightened and entertained players through seven decades and earned millions of fans."

Sheinwold was an editor of The Bridge World from 1934 to 1963 and editor of The Bridge Bulletin from 1953 to 1958. He was also the author of perhaps the most successful bridge book ever written, 5 Weeks to Winning Bridge, a book that sold in the millions.

Sheinwold served as chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission from 1964 to 1975, as chairman of the appeals committees at NABCs and as chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors from 1970 to 1973. He was named ACBL Honorary Member of the Year in 1983.

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

Results reported in the Daily Bulletin are subject to change because of score changes or corrections. The masterpoint awards as shown are, therefore, also subject to change.

NABC Electronic Device Policy

Except by permission of the director in charge, any electronic equipment or device capable of receiving or sending an electronic signal, or capable of communicating in any way, may not be operated or functioning in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session and must remain off at all times.



The above restrictions apply to all players, captains, coaches, kibitzers and play recorders except those persons granted permission by the ACBL, and are in force throughout any playing session or segment of play. Further restrictions and requirements

apply in events involving live internet and/or yugraph coverage.

A violation of any of the above restrictions will result in an automatic penalty, pursuant to Law 91 of the Laws of Duplicate Bridge.

NABC+ events

- First offense of any kind (ringing, answering or initiating a call, texting or browsing) in a session: One full board, 12 IMPs or 20% of the maximum available VPs per match, at the respective form of scoring.
- Second offense in the same session or third offense within the event, disqualification of the pair or team from the event.

Other events

- First offense, in the same session ringing only: one-quarter board, 3 IMPs or 1 VP, at the respective form of scoring; first offense in the same session answering or initiating a call, texting or browsing: one-half board, 6 IMPs or 2 VPs, at the respective form of scoring.
- Second offense in the same session: two full boards, 20 IMPs or 50% of the maximum available VPs per match, at the respective form of scoring.
- Third offense in the event: disqualification of the pair or team from the event.

Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

This policy applies to all events at NABCs.

Notice of binding arbitration



Entries

A valid ACBL player number is required to play in all events at the NABC.

All North American championships with no upper masterpoint limit \$30 per player per session

(For team events, this means \$120 per team per session for four-person teams, \$150 per team per session for five-person teams, and \$180 per team per session for six-person teams. Only ACBL members current on their dues and service fees are eligible to play in NABC+ events. \$1.50 per person per session benefits the International Fund.)

Other North American championships \$22 per player per session

(For the team events, this means \$88 per team per session for teams of four, \$110 per team per session for teams of five, and \$132 per team per session for teams of six. Only ACBL members current on their dues and service fees are eligible to play in these events.)

Be Scent-sitive!

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances (colognes or perfumes). Many ACBL clubs, units and districts have adopted policies that prohibit players from wearing fragrances. The ACBL has not issued an official policy on the matter, preferring instead to appeal to the goodwill of its members to refrain from using fragrances.

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem.

The ACBL asks everyone to give this issue serious consideration. If you're going to play in a club or a tournament, please don't wear cologne, perfume or scented lotions.

2019 Annual General Membership Meeting

The ACBL's General Membership Meeting, held annually, will take place in the Gracia Ballroom on the third floor of The Cosmopolitan beginning at 9 a.m. (or shortly thereafter) on Sunday, July 21, 2019. The agenda includes reports from the ACBL Executive Director, Chief Financial Officer and In-House Counsel. Additionally, proposals from the membership in proper form will be accepted if a quorum is present. This meeting has been duly called according to ACBL Bylaws.

Determination of Quorum

A quorum for the annual meeting is the lower of (1) at least 250 ACBL members representing a minimum of 13 Districts or (2) ACBL members entitled to cast 1/10th of the total number of votes entitled to be cast at the General Membership Meeting. To determine the "total number of votes entitled to be cast", we look at the number of ACBL members in good standing on June 15, 2019. Ten percent of that number is greater than 250. As a result, a quorum for the 2019 General Membership Meeting is 250 ACBL members from at least 13 Districts. As many members in any District may attend as are interested but, for quorum purposes, no District may comprise more than 20% of the 250-member minimum. This means that only the first 50 members from any

one District will be counted towards the quorum to ensure representation across the entire ACBL membership. The General Membership Meeting will take place even if a quorum is not present.

Sign-in Required

Sign-in will begin at approximately 8:15 a.m. outside the meeting room. ACBL Members who attend the meeting and wish to be counted towards the quorum must sign in by 9:15 a.m. and receive a bright orange voting paddle. No proxies are permitted, and you may not "loan" your voting paddle to another person. You may attend the meeting, be physically present yet choose to not be counted towards the quorum by bypassing the sign-in station. Sign-in will close at 9:15 a.m. with no exceptions. Latecomers will not be counted towards the quorum.

The sign-in station for the General Membership Meeting will be separate from that for the Board of Governors' meeting. Members of the Board of Governors must also sign in for the General Membership Meeting in order to be counted.

Action by ACBL Membership

If a quorum is present, the act of a majority of members voting at the meeting will be the act of the voting membership, unless the issue or question on which the membership is voting is one which, by New York law, the ACBL's Certificate of Incorporation or its Bylaws, requires a different vote. If any one of those documents requires a different voting percentage for passage, that document will control the question or issue. If no quorum is present, no official actions may occur.

The practical requirements and effect of any member proposal or official vote will be determined by New York law, ACBL's Certificate of Incorporation, ACBL Bylaws or some other ACBL regulation and cannot be described in this article with any particularity. If you are looking for the requirements for an effective proposal or the impact of any anticipated vote, please refer to these documents prior to the meeting or contact In-House Counsel via email at linda.dunn@acbl.org.

To calculate a majority of those voting at the meeting, each question will require a yay, nay or abstention vote. Attendees are encouraged to assist us in counting votes by holding high your orange voting paddle until each count is concluded.

Please return your voting paddles to the marked box located at the back of the room at the conclusion of the meeting.

Unless otherwise noted: Three-flight open events are stratified as A/X (6000+/0-6000), B/C (1500-3000/0-1500) and Gold Rush (300-750/200-300/0-200). Two-flight open events are stratified as A/B/C (3000+/1500-3000/0-1500) and Gold Rush (300-750/200-300/0-200) or as A/X/Y (6000+/4000-6000/0-4000) and B/C/D (1500-3000/750-1500/0-750) if there is no Gold Rush.

One-flight open events are stratified as A (3000+), B (750-3000) and C (0-750). Stratification is based on averaging the masterpoints of a pair or team. Eligibility for limited events will be based on the point holding of the highest player, so no player with more than 3000 may play in B/C events nor the Bracketed B Teams, no player with more than 750 may play in Gold Rush events, and no player with more than 300 may play in 299er events.

BOLD, UPPER CASE = NABC+ events. UPPER CASE = NABC events.

**International Fund

In NABC+ events, \$1.50 (per person, per session) of each entry fee will be allocated to the ACBL International Fund. These funds are used to underwrite part of the expenses of ACBL players who participate in international competition.

Slow play

Slow play, especially habitual slow play, is a violation of law and subject to penalty. When a pair has fallen behind, it is incumbent on them to make up the time lost as quickly as possible whether at fault or not. All players are expected to make a concerted effort to catch up when they have fallen behind, regardless of the reason for their lateness.

In the absence of compelling evidence to the contrary, the director should presume that a pair finishing a round late by more than two or three minutes on more than one occasion during a session is responsible for the lateness. There is a strong expectation that the director will penalize such a pair. The size of a penalty will tend to increase for subsequent instances of slow play and for chronic or egregious slow play.

While warnings typically will be given before a penalty is assessed, failure to do so in no way limits the director's authority to issue a penalty.

Players are expected to be aware, in a general sense, of time used and remaining in a segment in which they are playing regardless of whether a clock is in use or a time announcement has been made. An excuse of "no announcement" or "no clock immediately visible" will not be considered persuasive.

In consultation with the DIC of the tournament, the TD may require that a particular pair not play in a specified segment, not play against a specified pair or not play together as a pair. The foregoing is expected to be applied only due to egregious circumstances or to unduly repetitious offenders.

An appeal of an action taken by a TD with regard to time may be taken to the Director in

Charge of the tournament, and no further. For NABC+ KO events, the TD is charged with the responsibility to ensure that each KO match segment finishes within the allotted time. While a time monitor may be employed, the lack of a monitor in no way limits the TD's authority to apply one or more of the remedies listed below.

The TD may choose to ignore an occasional minor late finish. The TD may remove one or more boards from a segment. The TD may award no score (when neither team is more at fault), an assigned score (when a result already exists at one table which the TD wishes to preserve) or an artificial score in IMPs. Every effort should be made to remove boards before they can be played at either table, but not having done so does not preclude removing one or more later.
