Blind Invalid Shot in Back

Cancer Victim Murdered by His Brother in Considered Action

Allenston, Pa., March 9.—(AP)—"He asked me to shoot him. I pondered it. He often had asked me to do the same thing. I finally decided to do it."

With those words, Harold Mohr, 36, of nearby Coplay, was quoted by District Attorney Kenneth H. Mohr, as saying he shot and killed his 35-year-old brother, Walter, last night because "he was incurably ill of cancer and was blind."

Harold Mohr was charged with murder after making his verbal statement to Koch and frequently to kill him and insisted he never submit to hospitalization.

Dr. George S. Boyer, county coroner, said Walter was killed by a .20 caliber rifle fired into his back. Walter had been receiving treatment for cancer from a Coplay physician for the last six years.

A fourth brother, Raymond Mohr, told police he heard a shot about 7 p. m. and ran next door to the house where Walter and Harold lived with their father, Charles, a steel factory worker.

Walter's body was on a bed in a second floor bedroom, Koch quoted Raymond as saying, while Harold was sitting in the dining room.

Raymond summoned his brother, Ralph, who in turn notified Koch and asked that state police step into the investigation because of his relationship to Harold, an unemployed veteran of four and a half years with the U. S. Army in World War II.

Negro Chief Vows Fight On British-Imposed Exile

London, March 8.—(AP)—Seretse Khama, Oxford-educated Negro chief of the African tribe of Bechuanaland, has vowed to fight British action to exile him and his white British wife from his homeland.

The government's decision depriving the 37-year-old chief of the throne, given to him by a vote of the tribe, has threatened repercussions throughout the polyglot British commonwealth and even in the United Nations.

Commonwealth Relations Secretary Winston Churchill, announced in the House of Commons yesterday that Seretse was ordered not to return to his homeland in the British protectorate of Bechuanaland.

He also said he would go home soon in defiance of the exile order. He ordered his wife to stay in London. His wife, the former Ruth Williams who was once a London typist, has stayed behind in the mud but capital of Serowe awaiting the birth of their first baby.

Seretse told newsmen last night "I intend to fight the decision. He declared he would challenge it in court or possibly in the United Nations."

He also said he would go home soon in defiance of the exile order. He ordered his wife to stay in London. His wife, the former Ruth Williams who was once a London typist, has stayed behind in the mud but capital of Serowe awaiting the birth of their first baby.

Tragedy Avoided As Gear Buckles

Newark, N. J., March 8.—(AP)—A twin-engine C-46 transport plane with 54 persons aboard slid 300 feet in a safe belly landing, last night in rain and darkness at Newark Airport.

Airport authorities said the landing gear of the ship, bound from Miami to Newark, collapsed as the plane touched the runway.

Most of the 50 passengers thought it was merely a rough landing. Streams of gasoline from punctured tanks spilled onto the runway as the plane touched down.

A port of New York Authority police emergency crew brought a ladder to the plane door about six feet off the ground. Passengers were told not to smoke because of the pools of high-octane aviation gasoline.

The lights remained on in the cockpit and there was no panic or excitement.

The American Air Transport plane was on a non-scheduled non-stop flight from Miami.

Pilot William Averman of Miami told police there had been no indication that anything was wrong until the wheels touched the ground.

Then a warning horn in the cockpit began blaring, he said, and the gear slowly collapsed. The plane was going about 90 miles an hour when it touched down, airport officials estimated.
