GENERAL FAIR TIME INFORMATION

- 1. <u>PASSES</u> Only exhibitors entering exhibits that require daily care will be provided admission credentials. In some cases the fair will perform daily care see department.
- 2. <u>BUILDING HOURS</u> The buildings are open from 4 PM 10 PM on opening day and Tuesday, October 11 and 10 AM 10:00 PM all other days.
- 3. <u>PREMIUMS</u> Award checks will be made payable to the exhibitor as indicated on the entry form and will be distributed to the exhibitor when the exhibit is released.
 - *Any Premiums under \$10.00 will be paid in cash, and MUST be signed for at the time the exhibit is released. Any Premiums over \$10.00 will be paid for with a check. Exhibitor will have the opportunity to cash the check at the time the exhibit is released. Any check not picked up when exhibits are released will become property of the fair and will be handled as a donation to the department where it was exhibited.
- 4. <u>AWARDS</u> Only judge's books will be used as evidence for payment or awards. Ribbons and tags will not be accepted.
- 5. <u>CHECKS</u> Entry checks that are returned for Non-Sufficient Funds (NSF) are subject to a \$30.00 fee for each check returned.
- 6. DECORATIONS All decorative material must be flameproof.
- 7. Reasonable precautions will be taken in the protection of exhibits. The Big Fresno Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage, whatever the cause. The exhibitor must arrange for insurance if it is desired.
- 8. Fair Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries or cancel awards, without claim for damages.
- 9. Fair Management will not be responsible for accidents, loss, fire, flood, theft, etc. that may occur to any of the exhibits at the fair, and the exhibitor shall hold the management harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accidents, loss, fire, flood, theft, etc. Presentation of entry form shall be deemed acceptance of this rule.

RULES & REGULATIONS

<u>State Rules Apply</u> As referred to in the Exhibitor Handbook, all state rules apply.

Entry Late entry forms will not be accepted and late entries will not be received. Entry fees are nonrefundable. NO EXCEPTIONS

Residence Open to residents of Fresno County.

<u>Age</u> Exhibitor must be 18 years old or older on the opening day of the Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS

Titles/Labeling The Artists name, address, division, class and title must appear on the back of the work when dropped off, or will not be accepted. Only 29 characters will be allowed for titles of entered work. This includes spaces. Quotation marks and apostrophes will not appear on the display identification tags. Data entry errors will be corrected. No other labeling changes will be permitted. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Division Selection</u> Please be sure to enter in the correct division based on your honest assessment of your experience.

<u>Original Work</u> All artwork submitted must be the work of the exhibitor and completed within two years prior to entering. Only original work submitted by an exhibitor is eligible to enter. Copies, assigned class projects, or work from kits, will not be accepted.

<u>Disqualification</u> The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry that is deemed not to be in the best interest of the Fair for exhibition. The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not conduct him or herself in a manner congruent with the temper, character and purpose of The Big Fresno Fair. In the case of disqualification by the Fresno Fair, its agents, or representatives, there will be no entry fee refunds. All monetary awards, ribbons and plaques will be subject to forfeiture. Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries exhibited. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Previously Entered Work</u> No artwork previously entered in The Big Fresno Fair are eligible for exhibit.

<u>Display</u> Entries selected for exhibit must remain on display for the duration of the Fair. Wet paintings will not be accepted for exhibition. <u>48" Maximum size for all paintings</u>. NO EXCEPTIONS! No promotional literature, such as business cards or flyers will be displayed with entries.

<u>Framing</u> Watercolor and drawing media entries require a frame. This must be furnished by the exhibitor and must be assembled and ready to hang at the time the item is received. The Big Fresno Fair does not provide framing materials.

<u>Hanging</u> All two and three-dimensional entries designed to hang must be wired or equipped for display. Three-dimensional entries need to have a base if necessary, for structural support and proper presentation.

<u>For Sale</u> An artist may set a price for each entry, or leave price blank. This will indicated the piece is not for sale. However, if piece is for sale, a price must be listed on the entry form at the time of submission. All inquiries regarding sale of entries will be referred directly to the artist to complete the sale. The Big Fresno Fair is not responsible for brokering the sales of exhibits.

<u>Demonstrating</u> A place is provided on the entry form for anyone interested in participating in the Fine Arts Department as a demonstrator or docent. The Fair encourages participation in either or both programs.

Judges' Discretion Judges are contracted and act as agents of The 21st District Agricultural Association, Big Fresno Fair. These individuals facilitate the juried exhibition. They retain the authority to, at their own discretion, move items to more appropriate divisions and, or classes. The judges also may disqualify any exhibit that is not a true representation of the category description in which it was entered.

<u>Placing</u> The judges may award a first, second, third or honorable mention placement according to merit, and if without merit the judges may make no award under any circumstance. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

<u>Best of Show</u> The judges shall award a "Best of Show." Winner of "Best of Show" becomes ineligible for 1ST place in that division. The 2nd place then moves to 1st, 3rd moves to 2nd and Honorable Mention moves to 3rd. Any accepted item entered by a Beginning or Advanced Artist will be eligible for

"Best of Show". Winners in this category will be awarded a ribbon and plaque.

<u>Popular Vote</u> People's Choice and Children's Choice Award winners are based upon ballots tendered by Fair guests. Winners will receive ribbons.

<u>Judges' Choice</u> The Judges will each select a Judge's Choice award winner. A ribbon and plaque will be awarded to each.

<u>Awards</u> Plaque awards will be given to Best of Show and Judges Choice winners.

Release of Liability The Big Fresno Fair will take every precaution possible for the safety and security of all entries; however, the fair assumes no responsibility, and cannot be held accountable for loss or damage. Upon this condition only, are entries accepted. If he or she should so desire, the artist may obtain insurance for any item. The Big Fresno Fair does not assume any responsibility for artwork not picked up on the scheduled release dates.

<u>Publicity</u> The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to use any print or piece exhibited for publicity purposes.

ADVANCED ARTIST

Any individual with extensive schooling and/or experience in the arena of visual arts is considered an Advanced Artist. This also includes individuals who commercially accepted payment for creative works, as a main source of income. An advertised business is considered an indicator of a professional in this field.



GENERAL INFORMATION

This marks the 31st year that The Gem and Mineral Department will be sponsored by the Big Fresno Fair. This department is intended to display the works associated with the Gem and Mineral hobby and includes exhibits from prospectors, lapidaries, mineral collectors, rock hounds, fossil collectors, metal smiths and jewelers.

The Gem & Mineral Department's goal is to create an exhibit reflecting the talent and artistry of the state. Competition builds quality, improving exhibitors' skills and igniting his or her personal satisfaction, while recognizing the Club's endless support.

A successful Gem & Mineral exhibit will depend on exhibitors' cooperation, assistance, and willingness to share knowledge and talents with over a half million fair visitors.

Locked cases will be provided for exhibits. On-going demonstrations will occur daily throughout the fair.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Residence Open to all California residents.

<u>Rules</u> A.F.M.S & C.F.M.S. rules apply for Competitive Exhibition.

Non-Competitive Eligibility

Non-Competitive entries are open to clubs, classes, individuals, & families. Clubs, dealers and professionals are especially invited. Please specify on entry form if entry is a non-competitive exhibit, the type of display, and any special needs.

All Competitive Exhibitors

"Exhibitor" is understood to mean either an individual or family, or group whose names shall be listed on the entry form. All work shall be personally done by exhibitor.

Open Division Qualifications (Adult)

Professionals, advanced collectors and those highly skilled in lapidary may ONLY exhibit in the open division. This also includes any exhibitors and/or immediate members of their households, who regularly buy, sell or advertise for sale, mineral specimens, gem material, custom lapidary or silver work, and those who receive pay regularly for teaching lapidary or jewelry.

<u>Amateur Division (Adult):</u> This division is provided for the non-professional hobbyist only.

<u>Adults</u> Juniors may not enter any adult divisions. The adult scorecards will also apply to the juniors.

<u>Junior Division</u> Please read all rules for the junior department on page 14 before completing an entry form. Junior exhibitors may enter any class they are eligible for.

<u>Double Entering</u> No exhibitor may enter both the Amateur and Open Divisions.

<u>Previous Awards</u> Any exhibitors who have been awarded 2 first place ribbons in the same class may not enter that class for a third time. Novice must move to Amateur Division and Amateur must move to the Open division. After winning (2) blue ribbons in the Open division the Exhibitor may not enter the same class for the third time.

<u>Claim Checks</u> Claim checks will be furnished when exhibits are delivered to the building.

<u>Display</u> Entries selected for exhibit must remain on display for the duration of the Fair. All exhibits MUST be left in place in the exact arrangements in which they were set up for the duration of the Fair.

Exhibit Released Exhibits are only to be removed upon presentation of claim check. At that time a gate release will be furnished to the exhibitor, which authorizes the exhibit to be removed upon presentation of claim check. The Fair is not responsible for exhibits left after 6PM on Monday, October 17, 2022.

Collective Entries Any or all members of a family living under one roof may compete individually or collectively. Any individual contributing to a collective family exhibit is ineligible to enter the same class as an individual exhibitor. Members of a family may also enter as individuals in other classes. A family member wishing to enter as an individual must submit a separate entry form.

<u>Membership</u> Current member in the California Federation of Mineralogical Society or any local Mineralogical Society is not a requirement for entry in this Department.

<u>Clubs</u> are NOT eligible in competitive classes.

<u>Out of Class Specimens</u> Lapidary in mineral exhibits, mineral in lapidary exhibits, and synthetic in mineral exhibits shall be considered out of class specimens and will be penalized in scoring.

Spraying/Coating Lapidary exhibits which have been sprayed or otherwise coated will not be judged. This rule does not apply to "doublets" or "triplets". However, such material must be properly labeled.

<u>Labeling</u> Name tags, initials, symbols, and club affiliations may appear in competitive exhibits provided they are face down during judging. Any identifying sign shall cause DISQUALIFICATION if not covered. Important: Names of all exhibitors showing in case(s) must be listed on entry form.

Labels should include the following information:

- Identification of mineral.
- Identification of associated minerals where significant. This applies to mineral classes only.
- Locality, as complete as possible.

<u>Managements' Rights</u> Management reserves the right to limit the amount of cases and space to exhibitors, and has the final decision on the placement of the cases.

<u>Cases Needed</u> Exhibitor must indicate on entry form the total number of cases needed. For special display problems, write a separate letter to the Superintendent of the Gem and Mineral Department.

<u>Original Work</u> All lapidary work must be the work of the exhibitor. All specimens must be the property of the exhibitor.

<u>Disqualification</u> Refusal to comply with the rules or any unethical conduct displayed may result in disqualification. Objections to the rules are not to be considered justification for complaint, but where an apparent error in evaluation or interpretations has been made, appeal may be made to Supervisor. Any protest must be made in accordance with State Rules.

<u>Judging</u> All entries will be judged using the American System of Judging. Entries will be judged on merit. Minimum Merit Point Scores are:

Cash awards will be given to exhibitors with the highest scores, above the division minimum. If score is below minimum merit points, it will be considered as insufficient merit. No award or ribbon given.

<u>Cases</u> All entries shall occupy one full case in accordance with class rules. Single entries will be displayed with other single entries in special display cases. Alterations to the basic construction of the cases are not permitted. Exhibitors are encouraged to use their own case if they have one.

<u>Locked Cases</u> Locked cases are available and will be assigned to exhibitors.

<u>Case Liners</u> All display cases should be lined by exhibitors. No sand or gravel allowed. Inside dimensions are very tight. Liners should be slightly smaller to avoid problems. Don't forget to allow for overlap of liner pieces. First liner piece inside case should be back, then bottom piece and sides last. The exhibitor should be aware that dimensions may vary slightly from case to case.

<u>Signs</u> Small identification placards should be placed in each case. These may also include the names of family members or the club exhibiting in each case. In order to assure uniformity and neatness, cards should be typed or lettered, not handwritten.

<u>State Rules</u> All State Rules Apply. Refer to section 2 of Handbook.

Best of Show The Outstanding Case Display in the Non-Competitive Displays will receive "Best of Show." A cash award will be given for first place; ribbons for second and third place. Cash awards sponsored by FGMS.

JUDGES' GUIDELINES

<u>Judging Panel</u> Qualified members of The California Federation of Mineralogical Societies and/or people from colleges and professional schools are chosen to be on the judging panel.

Labeling Labels will be judged on correctness of identification, spelling, and legibility. Accuracy and spelling of mineral, species and locality will also be factors. Neatness, size of label, etc. will be considered under showmanship. Labeling should be aimed at the general public. Pink Tourmaline is as acceptable as Tourmaline or Rubellite. All other things being equal, the labels with the most complete locality shall receive a higher score for labeling. This applies for both lapidary minerals and fossils. See other label requirements under general rules.

Showmanship Shall refer to the ability of the exhibitor to use material exhibited, background, lighting, arrangements, neatness, and labeling to create an attractive and interesting display.

<u>Quality of Material</u> Quality of material refers to the following properties: Color, crystal arrangement, color pattern, texture and brilliance, freedom from flaws, cracks and foreign material.

<u>Rarity</u> Rarity refers to the rarity of occurrence of the mineral, of mineral association or crystal form or habit.

<u>Orientation</u> The proper position and angular presentation of the specimen on its mount so that the central point of interest may be observed without further movement of the mount.

Workmanship This refers to the shaping, polishing, symmetry and general precision of the exhibited material. The ability to work in a wider variety and hardness of material will receive a relatively higher score.

<u>Variety of Work</u> Judging will be based on the variety of work exhibited. Cabochon, flats, faceted stones, transparencies, spheres, composite carvings and novelties shall be considered as different varieties. Variety of work in jewelry and metalwork shall be based on variety of techniques and surface finishes. <u>Originality of Design</u> Use of new designs as well as the ability to use old ideas for unique design.

<u>Variety of Material</u> Life formative units, locations worldwide, replacing material. Use of diverse kinds of material, colors, differing ranges, hardness.

Reference List A list of references is required to obtain the scientific name for each specimen. This list may cite publications, institutions or individuals used as the authority for this identification.

<u>Variety of Exceptional or Unusual Forms of Association</u> This includes physical features, minerals present, etc.

<u>Overall</u> In every class all other things being equal, the exhibit, which in the opinion of the judges, carries the most interest to the general public, shall receive the higher score.

<u>Techniques</u> Variety of work shall include, but not be limited to, the following techniques or finishes: Casting appliqué, engraving, forging, chasing, repousse, spinning, electroforming, etching, piercing, granulation metal inlay, scroll work (including chains), filigree, lamination, fusing, channel work, enameling, cloisonné, damascening, construction of bezels, prong mounting, ring & clasps and jump rings.

<u>Finishes</u> Antiquing, patinas, texturing (including satin & Florentine finishes), graving, electro plating and heat coloring are accepted finishes.



A wide variety of subjects are available to the exhibitor, such as prospecting, educational gold mining or assay equipment, faceted stones, & educational – cut and rough material. Stages must be shown: Lapidary and educational—cut and rough material must be shown also. Minerals, educational--Cabochons with corresponding rough. The minimum requirement is 10 artifacts, educational--fossils and educational parts.

Educational exhibits will be judged on the following:

<u>Educational Value</u> Clarity, effectiveness and excellence of exhibit, as well as how well the display teaches.

Showmanship Ability of exhibitor to use the material displayed, the background material and labeling (neatness and size) to create a display with sufficient impact to catch the eye, attract and hold the interest of even a casual viewer.

Labeling labels should be legible, correctly spelled and have specific information.

<u>State Rules Apply:</u> As referred to in the Exhibitor Handbook, all state rules apply.

Entry: Late entry forms will not be accepted and late entries will not be received. Entry fees are nonrefundable. **NO EXCEPTIONS**

Residence: Open to residents of Fresno County.

<u>Age:</u> Exhibitor must be 18 years old or older on the opening day of the Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Titles/Labeling:</u> The Photographer's name, address, division, class and title must appear on the back of the work, or will not be accepted. Only 29 characters will be allowed for titles of entered work. This spaces, quotation marks and apostrophes will not appear on the display identification tags. Data entry errors will be corrected. No other labeling changes will be permitted. NO EXCEPTIONS.

<u>Pick-Up of Exhibits:</u> Any exhibit not picked up by October 21, 2022 at 5PM will be disposed of by the Fair. All checks will be distributed at the time of exhibits pick up. Checks not picked up will NOT BE MAILED. Checks that are not claimed by the exhibitor or leader will be deemed a donation and will be returned to the department.

<u>Division Selection:</u> Please be sure to enter in the correct division based on your honest assessment of your experience.

EXHIBITORS MUST CHOOSE ONLY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING THREE DIVISIONS FOR ENTRIES:

- **1.) AMATEUR** A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession.
- 2.) EXPERIENCED A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession AND ALSO has extended knowledge and skill beyond novice or amateur photography AND/OR a person who has placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd or Best of Show in the Fresno Fairs Amateur photography division for 2 or more consecutive years.
- **3.) PROFESSIONAL:** A person who engages in an event or activity as a livelihood rather than a hobby.

<u>Original Work:</u> All photography submitted must be the work of the exhibitor. No duplicate prints will be allowed. Prints may be processed by a photo finisher. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Previously Entered Work:</u> No prints previously entered in The Big Fresno Fair are eligible for exhibit.

<u>Disqualification</u>: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry that is deemed not to be in the best interest of the Fair for exhibition. The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not conduct him or herself in a manner congruent with the temper, character and purpose of The Big Fresno Fair. In the case of disqualification by the Fresno Fair, its agents, or representatives, <u>THERE WILL BE NO ENTRY FEE REFUNDS</u>. All monetary awards, ribbons and plaques will be subject to forfeiture. Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries exhibited. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Display:</u> Entries selected for exhibit must remain on display for the duration of the Fair. Promotional literature, such as business cards and flyers will not be displayed with entries.

Framing & Mounting All photos must be mounted on a thin, flat piece of material such as foam core or mat board. This must be at least 1/16th of an inch thick, NO cardboard. NO glass or frames are allowed. NO names or signatures on the front of photographs or mats. Prints may otherwise be disqualified. Entrants in the Professional Division are exempt from this structure.

<u>Hanging:</u> All pictures must be equipped with a photo hanging tab. In the interest of show quality and protection of exhibits, all photographs must be ready to be hung when they are brought to the fairgrounds. Any improperly prepared photographs

may be disqualified. Hanging materials may be purchased at a local art/craft store. The Big Fresno Fair will be selling adhesive hooks at \$1.00 each in the building during receiving days only.



<u>Size Restriction:</u> The minimum size requirement for photos is 8×10 inches. The maximum size allowed is 16×20 inches. If an entrant chooses to include matting, the entire entry shall not exceed 16×20 inches and have no more than a 3 inch mat. 8×10 inches must be exposed for viewing.

<u>For Sale</u>: A photographer may set a price for each entry, or leave price blank. However if piece is for sale, a price must be listed on the entry form at the time of submission. All inquiries regarding sale of entries will be referred directly to the artist to complete the sale. The Big Fresno Fair is not responsible for brokering the sales of exhibits.

Judges' Discretion: Judges are contracted and act as agents of The 21st District Agricultural Association, Big Fresno Fair. These individuals facilitate the juried exhibition. They retain the authority to, at their own discretion, move items to more appropriate divisions and/or classes. The judges also may disqualify any exhibit that is not a true representation of the category description in which it was entered.

<u>Placing</u>: The judges may award a first, second, third or honorable mention placement according to merit, and, if without merit, the judges may make no award under any circumstance. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

Best of Show: The judges shall award a "Best of Show." Winner of "Best of Show" becomes ineligible for 1st place in that division. The 2nd place then moves to 1st, 3rd moves to 2nd and Honorable Mention moves to 3rd.

<u>Popular Vote:</u> People's Choice and Children's Choice Award winners are based upon ballots tendered by Fair guests. Winners will receive ribbons.

<u>Judges' Choice:</u> The Judges will each select a Judge's Choice award winner. A Plaque will be awarded to each.

Residence Open to residents of Fresno County.

<u>Age</u> Exhibitor must be 18 years old or older on the opening day of the Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS

ENTRY

Entry: Late entry forms will not be accepted, and late exhibits will not be received. Entry fees are non-refundable and are due at the time entry forms are submitted. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Signature:</u> The entrant's signature must appear on the entry form. The document is a legal record that indicates the exhibitor has read and agrees with the guidelines and requirements expressed in the 2022 Big Fresno Fair Exhibitor Handbook. It is necessary that the form be completed and signed before entry into The Big Fresno Fair exhibits competition. NO EXCEPTIONS

Any Other - Identify: In classes calling for "Any Other" or "Any Item", be sure to identify on the entry form the kind of article being entered. If article or type of work is listed in the numbered classes, the same type of work may NOT be entered in any other than listed class. An additional class may be created if more than 5 or more unique similar items are entered.

Special Contest Entry Forms: For the categories of Table Setting, Trim a Tree, list separately on standard Home Arts entry form. Group Special Education division use Home Arts Group Special Education form provided. On this form list group name and include contact person with phone number, list participants below. All other Special Education entries use standard Home Arts entry form. Home Arts entry forms are online or in the back of this Fair Exhibit book.

NO EXCEPTIONS

Receipt of Entry: Receipt of entry form is not acknowledged except in the Table Setting, and Trim-A-Tree Divisions. If an entry cannot be accepted, the entrant will be notified. The exhibitor will be responsible for classifying his/her own entry. Absolutely no articles will be accepted before or after the times specified. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>ID Tags & Check Claims:</u> Tags and claim checks for the identification of entries will be furnished when the exhibit items are delivered. Claim checks must be presented before articles will be returned at the close of the Fair Wednesday, October 19, 2022, through Thursday, October 20, 2022, 9 A.M. - 4 P.M.

<u>Display:</u> Entries selected for exhibit must remain on display for the duration of the Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS All articles accepted will be judged as many as possible will be displayed.

ELIGIBILITY

Level of Eligibility: An Amateur is an exhibitor who has not received remuneration over and above the monetary outlay required to produce the article exhibited. A Professional is an exhibitor who has received remuneration over and above the monetary outlay required to produce the article and can only enter specified classes.

Individuals/Organizations: Entries accepted from INDIVIDUALS only. Organizations may enter Table Setting Divisions, Quilts & Comforters, and Trim-A-Tree.

<u>Ineligible Exhibitors:</u> Individuals/Firms who earn their primary source of income from activities covered by the division/classes of this section are ineligible to enter.

<u>Division Selection:</u> Please be sure to enter in the correct division based on your honest assessment of your experience.

Completion of Projects: All articles entered must be the handiwork of exhibitor & completed within one year of the opening date of the Fair (October 2021 to current). If, in the opinion of management, an article has been previously entered, the right is reserved to withhold the item from judging and display.

Disqualification: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry that is deemed not to be in the best interest of the Fair, for exhibition. The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not conduct him or herself in a manner congruent with the temper, character and purpose of The Big Fresno Fair. In the case of disqualification by the Fresno Fair, its agents, or representatives, there will be no entry fee refunds. All monetary awards, ribbons and trophies will be subject to forfeiture. Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries exhibited. (Examples reasons for disqualification: ltem objectionable; soiled; requires more space than can be given; in conflict with exhibit requirements.) NO **EXCEPTIONS**

JUDGING

<u>Judging System:</u> Except where specified, the American System of Judging will be used.

This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class. Just because there is only one entry in that division, this does not automatically make it a 1st place winner.

<u>Proof of Placement:</u> Judge's book will only be used as evidence for payment of cash awards. Ribbons and tags are not accepted.

Age Requirements: Junior Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 as of January 1, 2022

<u>Designs per Class</u>; There may be no more than 15 entries with the same design per class per FFA teacher.

Entry Forms: All entries must be made ON-LINE except teach and group entries which should be submitted on the official entry forms furnished by fair management located in the back of the book. Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor and the instructor (parent/Guardian if independent).

Feature Exhibits: The Big Fresno Fair expects all 4-H and FFA members exhibiting at the fair to be actively involved in the design, construction & installation of all Feature Exhibits (booths) Instructors and adults may supervise only. Technical professionals will not be allowed during the installation. No cell phones allowed & no wandering about the building during construction and installation. Non-compliance with this rule will result in the following.

- First Concern Verbal Warning
- Second Concern Written Warning
- Third Concern Withholding of Premiums

<u>American System of Judging:</u> The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.

<u>Danish System of Judging:</u> The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first places, etc. as merited.

<u>Disqualification</u>: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry which is not in the best interest of the Fair & reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor(s) who conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner or who enters in an inappropriate Division, without discussion or justification. No payment of any awards will be made to individuals so disqualified.

<u>Completion of Entries:</u> All work must be completed prior to delivery.

Independent Exhibitors: Independent exhibitors must be age 9 or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2022, and may compete thru December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age. Independent exhibitors must have parent or guardian sign entry form. An independent exhibitor does not have to belong to any club or school.

Pick-Up of Exhibits; any exhibit not picked up by October 20, 2022, at 5 PM will be disposed of by the Fair. All checks will be distributed at the time of exhibits pick up. Checks not picked up will NOT BE MAILED. Checks that are not claimed by the exhibitor or leader will be deemed a donation and will be returned to the department.

All Fruit: should have original bloom. Nothing should be polished

Quality of Exhibits: The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, & such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for cash awards.

<u>Maturity Section 42515:</u> "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.

Overripe Section 42515: "Overripe" means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.

Production of Exhibit: Agriculture & Horticulture products MUST have been produced by the exhibitor.

<u>Varieties:</u> All varieties must be named on entry form. No substitutions will be allowed at time of entry or the entries will be disqualified.

Non-Listed Varieties: Varieties for which there are no classes listed in the Exhibitors Handbook cannot be entered for competition. Feel free to make suggestions.

<u>Disqualification:</u> Any entry not properly entered will not be judged.

<u>Rules:</u> Rules as to quality or quantity will be strictly adhered to.

Grains: All grains entered shall be untreated.



<u>Garden Limits</u> Due to space availability, the number of gardens may be limited on a first come, first serve basis.

<u>Bugs & Diseases</u> Exhibits must be free from injurious insects & diseases

Size Entries must be of market size.

Exhibit Display Plant material must remain on exhibit for the duration of the fair.

Substitutions will not be accepted.

<u>Delivery of Entries</u> All live plants must be delivered to the Greenhouse. Dry arrangements need to be delivered to Jr. Exhibits.

<u>Deadline</u> Deadline for garden entry forms is September 12th, 2022. Forms can be turned in by mail or in person to the exhibit office.

Eligibility Must be a FFA Chapter project. Individuals may not enter. Only one garden per chapter allowed.

Entry Fee Failure to complete garden will cause forfeiture of entry fee.

<u>Size</u> Size of the gardens is 10 feet wide by 12 feet deep. Gardens will not be located in the Greenhouse. Please contact Superintendent regarding placement for the 2022 year.

The gardens will be located indoors, partial shade or full sun. Please indicate on entry form garden sun requirements.

<u>Theme</u> The theme for the Garden Displays is an attractive garden landscape carefully considering take home elements and suitability for home display. Use of rock or other accessories is allowed.

<u>Construction</u> Garden display must be designed, constructed and installed by organization members. INSTRUCTORS & OTHER ADULTS MAY SUPERVISE ONLY. Technical professionals will not be allowed during installation.

Residence: All divisions open to residents of Fresno, Madera, Merced, Kings, and Tulare Counties, unless specified.

<u>Placing:</u> American System of Judging will be used. The judges shall award first, second or third, according to merit, and if without merit, the judge shall make no award under any circumstances. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

Entry Forms: Exhibits must be correctly entered on the entry form, including correct class descriptions where required.

Extra Information: No additional or handwritten identification or information allowed on exhibits.

<u>Disqualification</u>: Department Superintendent or Judges may disqualify any entry that is entered in the wrong category. All specimens must be listed under correct division and class number to be eligible for judging.

Exhibitor: An exhibitor is defined as a husband, wife and children under 18 years of age (unless married), and they shall be considered as being one exhibitor.

Entry Limit: When the number of plants or cut flowers in a class is indicated, the exhibit of any number greater disqualifies.

Exhibit Display: Dish Gardens, Potted Plants, Bonsai and Dried Arrangements remain on exhibit for the duration of the Fair.

<u>Ownership:</u> Potted Plants must have been in exhibitor's possession for at least three months. All specimens must be home-grown except where specified.

<u>Closed Judging:</u> Exhibitors are not allowed in the area during the judging of exhibits.

<u>Containers</u>: Containers and accessories are considered part of all exhibits and the composition will be judged as a whole (plants in oversized pots will be disqualified). All hanging plants must have a suitable hanger. Containers for the blooms will be furnished on day of entry.

<u>African Violets:</u> African Violets plants must be in bloom and remain on display during specified entry days.

<u>Fairs' Responsibility:</u> The Fresno Fair will not be responsible for exhibits not picked up on specified dates. The Fair is also NOT responsible for damaged plants.

<u>Watering:</u> All watering of plants will be done by staff members. Special written instructions may be given to staff on delivery day. Tags with instructions may be placed in container but should be positioned to back of pot and should be unobtrusive to Judges and viewing public. CLEARLY INDICATE FREQUENCY OF WATERING.

<u>Foliage:</u> All specimens of cut flowers must be shown with their own foliage.

<u>Wedging:</u> Wedging is used to allow Exhibitor to position a cut flower specimen in container at the correct height or facing Judges for best presentation. Wedging permitted only in Horticulture section and only to be used for cut specimens, not potted Horticulture specimens. Care should be used that wedging material is not distracting and should not protrude from rim of container.

<u>Disbudding:</u> The following flowers should be disbudded: Dahlias, except pompon, miniatures and singles, roses except floribundas, grandifloras, singles and miniatures.

Entry Changes: No changes to entry form will be accepted after received by clerk.

<u>Fire Proofing:</u> Flame retardant must be applied to all dry arrangements by order of state fire marshal.

<u>State Rules:</u> All State Rules Apply. Refer to section 2 of Handbook.

- 9. All measured ingredients lists become the sole property of the Big Fresno Fair. The Fair reserves the right to edit, adapt, copyright, publish and use any or all of the measured ingredients list for any purpose including publicity, promotion, or advertising with no compensation.
- 10. The Big Fresno Fair is not responsible for lost, stolen, illegible, misdirected or late entries. By entering the contest, exhibitor accepts and agrees to these requirements and the decisions of the judges, which shall be final.
