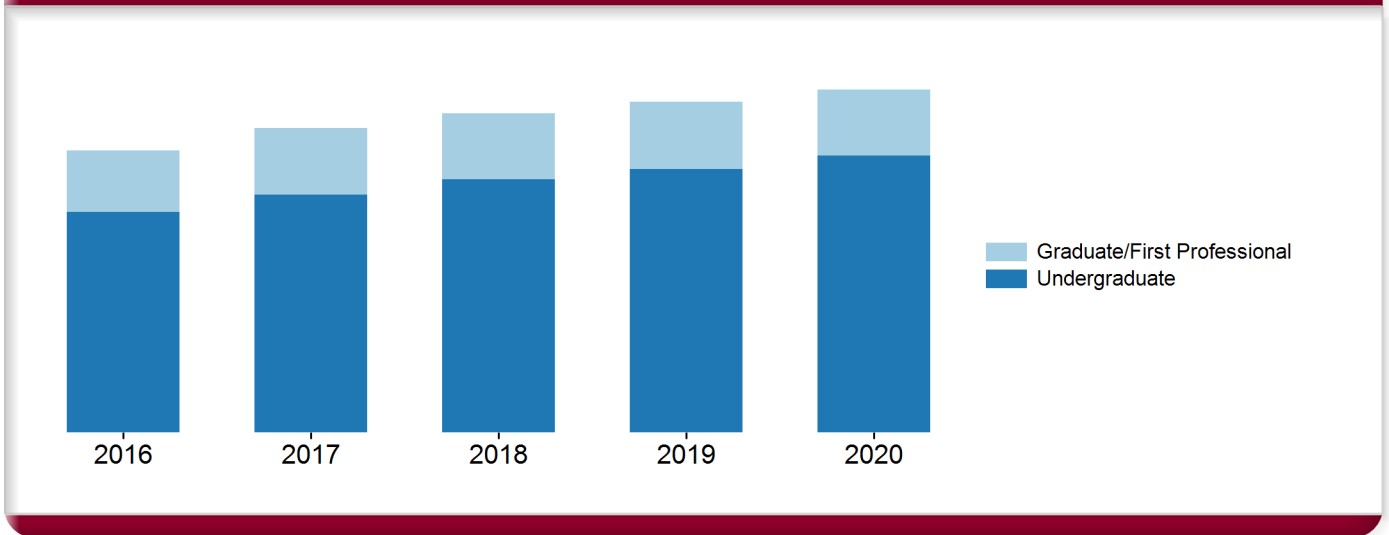

#### Fall Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



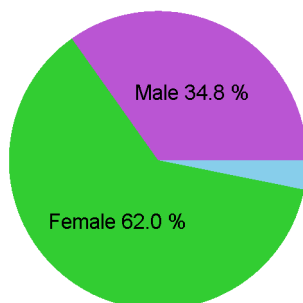

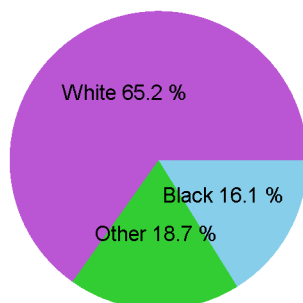

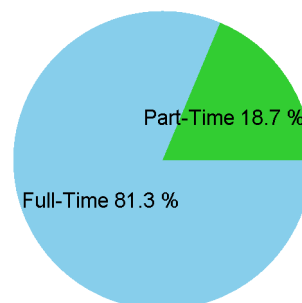
By Gender



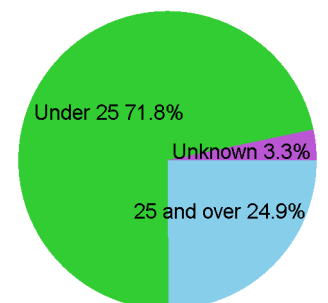
By Race








By Attendance Status



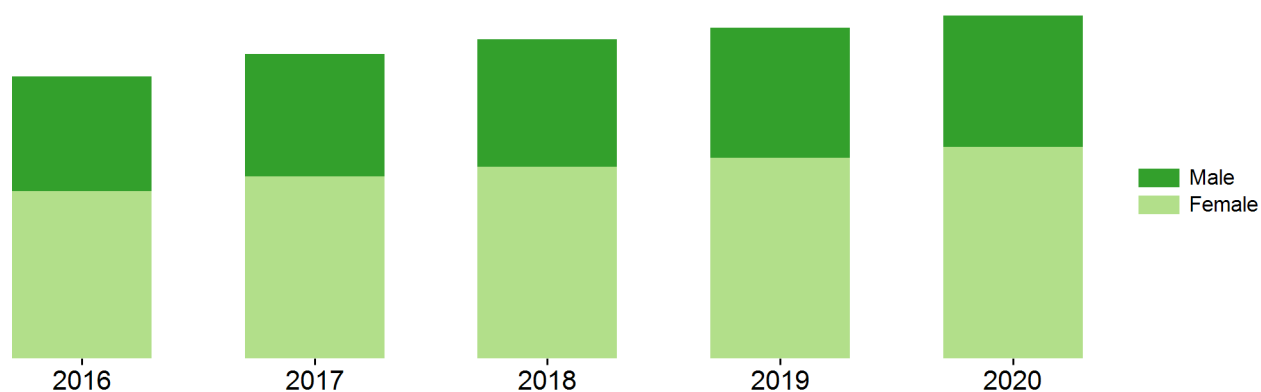

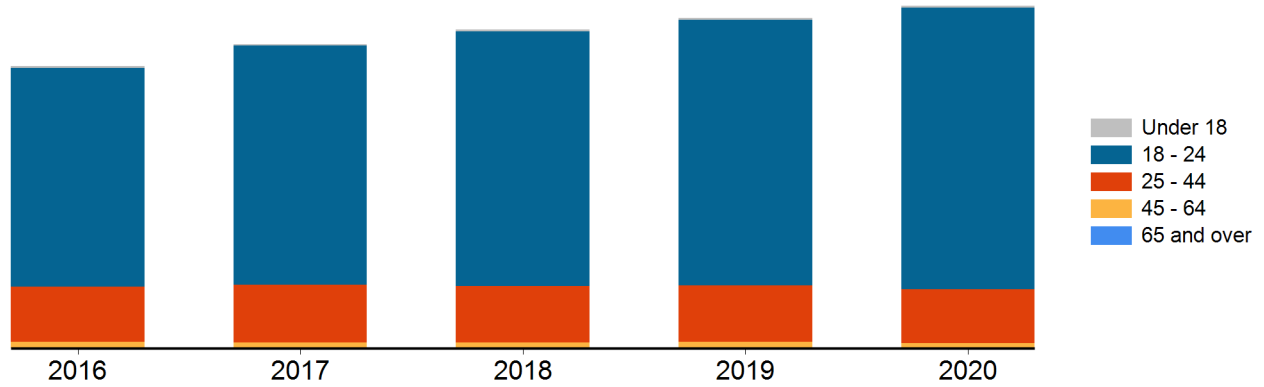

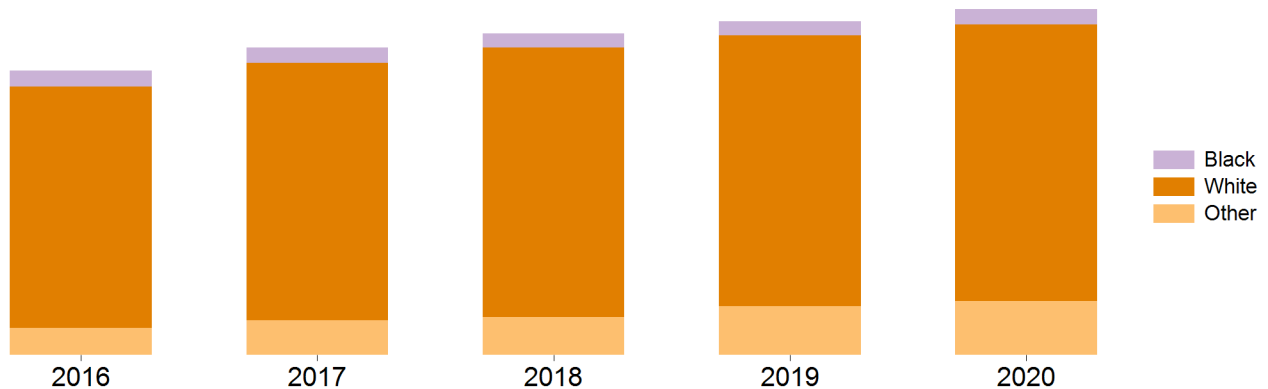

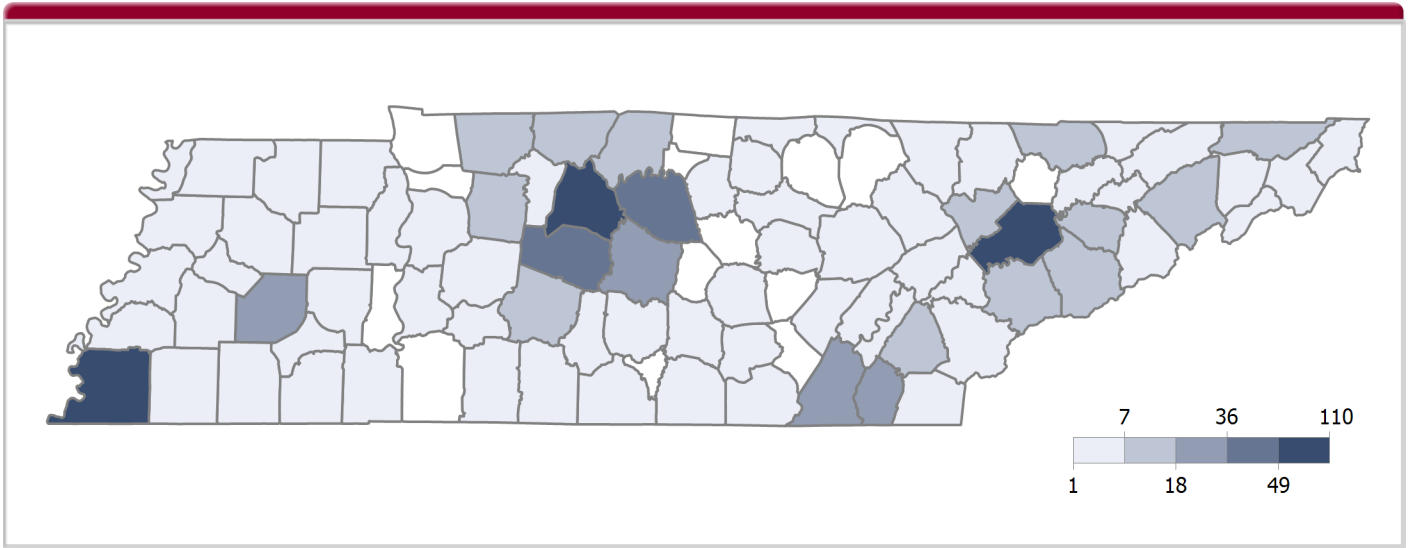
Fall Headcount by Race/Ethnicity - Five-Year Trend

Fall Headcount by County Map

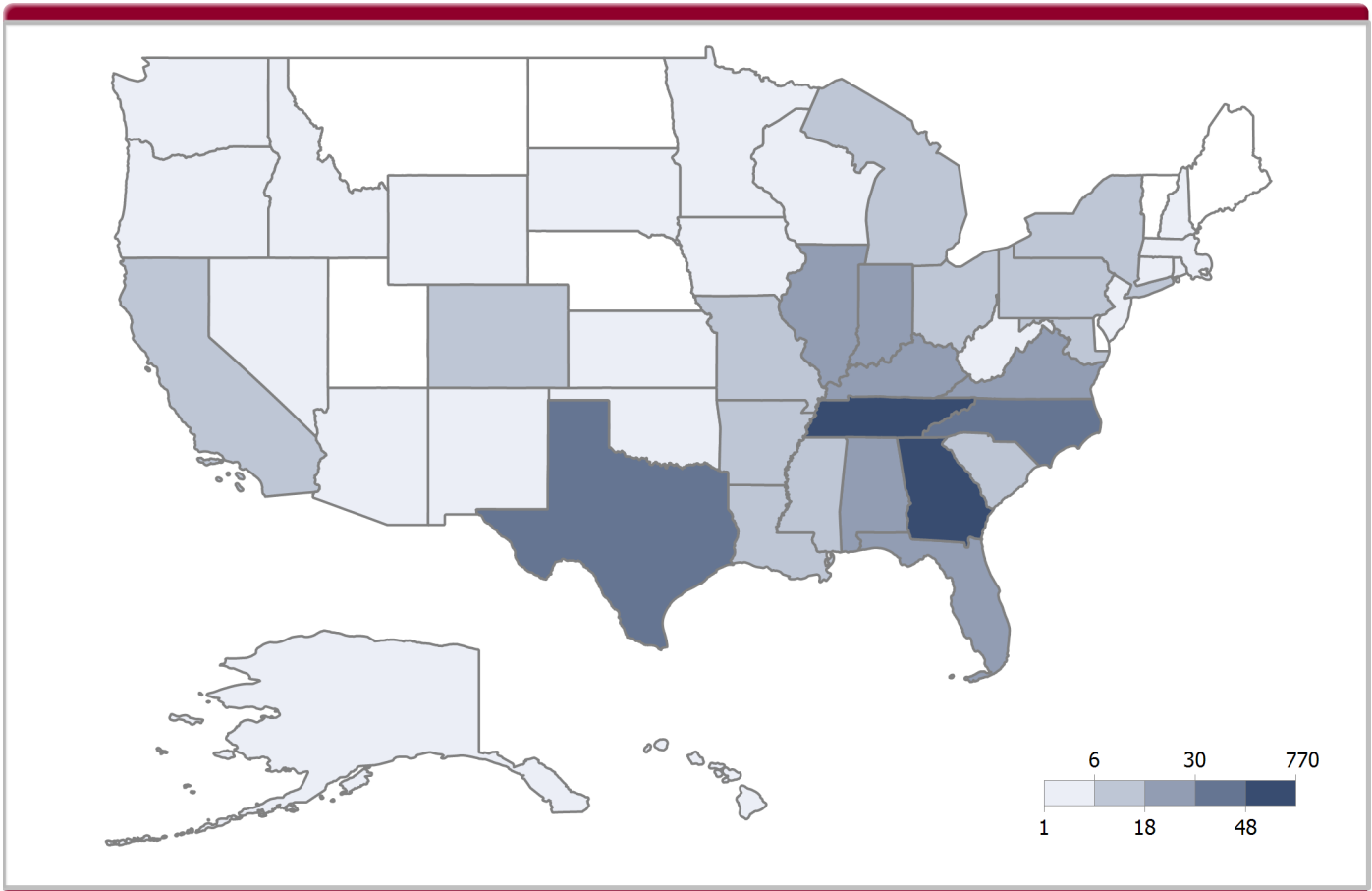
